## **COMPONENT 1 - IMPROVE KNOWLEDGE OF LEGAL REMEDIES**

### **Result 1.1: Partner Civil Society Organizations, Professional Organizations, and Government Partners Launch Strategic Communication Campaign That Effectively Delivers Priority Access to Justice Messages to Targeted Vulnerable Populations**

On August 15<sup>th</sup>, the Access to Justice-Erbil Regional Office (A2J-Erbil) attended a training session on media empowerment and awareness for 40 media staff in Sulaymaniyah. The course, which started on August 7<sup>th</sup>, is being conducted by A2J grantee Hataw Organization and will be given two days a week for six weeks.

### **Result 1.4: Effective Monitoring and Evaluation of Implementing Partner Public Awareness Campaigns**

**Perception Survey:** Relief International (RI) conducted three focus group discussions (FGD) in Salah ad Din, Diwaniyah, and Anbar. The groups were comprised of government officials, NGO and media representatives, lawyers, journalists, and citizens. The groups discussed ways to raise awareness of human rights through civil society organizations (CSOs), classification of vulnerable groups, difficulties in accessing justice, and empowering civil society. FGD members agreed on a number of recommendations to improve vulnerable persons' access to rights including: awareness-raising campaigns on legal rights and respect for human rights, additional legal aid clinics, more involvement from governmental departments and the establishment of new departments, creation of a culture of respect for human rights in Iraqi society, and additional support to the Ministry of Human Rights (MOHR) and the Human Rights Commission to increase their effectiveness.

Data gathering for the perception survey is ongoing, with approximately 13,830 people from all provinces having participated thus far. The survey has been completed in 12 provinces.

**COMPONENT 2 - IMPROVE LEGAL EDUCATION AND SERVICES**

**Result 2.1: Support Iraqi NGOs Working in Priority Access to Justice Areas to Improve their Administrative and Substantive Capacity to Support Vulnerable Populations**

USAID Deputy Mission Director, David Harden, and Slavica Radosevic, USAID COR, met with seven A2J grantees and a representative from the Iraqi Bar Association (IBA) on August 16 in the A2J Baghdad office. The NGO representatives discussed challenges in implementing their projects and opportunities for funding. The Deputy Mission Director encouraged them to aggregate their efforts to better serve vulnerable populations.

*Success Story*

In Iraq, as in many countries, one parent must give written permission for the other parent to travel outside of the country with their child. These laws were originally enacted to combat child abduction, but they present special difficulties for divorced parents whose former spouses have left without a trace.

L.Y. was divorced from her husband without her consent. Her son, M.S., is six years old and became quadriplegic after his respiratory problems led to permanent brain damage. When he needed medical treatment outside of Iraq, the authorities refused to issue him a passport since L.Y. didn't have proof of the father's consent. Without the proper custody paperwork, L.Y. could do nothing to help her son, and since the father had disappeared, she could not even get his signature on the necessary papers.

Through the USAID Access to Justice Program, the Sayed Al-Shuhdaa Organization received a grant to fund a legal clinic in Basrah. The clinic proposed that a custody case be filed so L.Y. could travel with her minor son for treatment. The clinic helped L.Y. establish power of attorney in order to obtain a document certifying her custody of the child, which was accepted by the Iraqi authorities and enabled both her and M.S. to leave Iraq to get the much-needed medical care.

**Result 2.2: Work with Iraqi legal professional association (primarily the Iraqi Bar Association and Jurist Union and their subsidiaries) to increase administrative and substantive capacity for empowering lawyers and other legal professional to assist vulnerable or disadvantage population.**

The A2J Erbil office worked with the Kurdistan Bar Association (KBA) to complete their documents for close-out of their grant.

**Result 2.4: Support Development of Programs and Modernization of Academic and Practical Curriculum Related to Extending Access to Justice to Vulnerable Population at Law Schools in Iraqi Universities in Key Location throughout Iraq.**

A2J visited Al-Nahrain Law School, Baghdad, on August 12 in preparation of their grant application for a law school legal clinic. The team met with the Dean about legal clinic work, training of law students to provide legal assistance to vulnerable populations, lawyers' roles in a clinic, and case classification.

### **COMPONENT 3 - ADVOCACY AND IMPROVED GOVERNMENT SERVICES**

#### **Result 3.1: Support Partners in Reviewing Processes and Procedures for Reform of Policies, Regulations, and Legislation as they Relate to Vulnerable Populations.**

USAID officials and the A2J team met with the Deputy Minister of Labor and Social Affairs, Mr. Dara Rasheed, Mr. Dhafer Mohammed, Head of MOLSA Legal Directorate, and Mr. Harith Mosa, Manager of MOLSA Juvenile Reform Directorate, to discuss the USAID Democracy and Governance portfolio for Iraq and A2J activities. Mr. Rasheed was presented for his consideration with a draft Cooperation Agreement between the Ministry and A2J. Both parties verbally pledged mutual collaboration in many areas including formation of a technical committee and will meet again to sign the cooperation agreement. Following the meeting, Component 3 provided comments on a paper that Mr. Rasheed had prepared on Gender-Based Violence and human trafficking.
