COMPONENT 2 - IMPROVE LEGAL EDUCATION AND SERVICES

Result 2.1: Support Iraqi NGOs Working in Priority Access to Justice Areas to Improve their Administrative and Substantive Capacity to Support Vulnerable Populations

A2J linked 8 new grantees implementing legal clinic activities in Basrah with Mercy Corps CAPIII women's awareness and inclusion literacy classes based on target beneficiaries and geographic location. This coordination between the two programs represents an effort to provide more comprehensive assistance to many of the over 1,000 women attending the classes who are widows, divorcees, and IDPs and have expressed a need for assistance with obtaining IDs, accessing government benefits, and certifying their marriages. The A2J program funded grantees will provide awareness raising sessions and direct service provision to the women in the literacy classes as soon as they begin work in June.

Preparations for the upcoming five-day training workshop on Legal Clinic Best Practices in Erbil June 2-7 have been finalized. Invitations to new NGO grantees implementing legal clinics were distributed and 22 participants from 7 NGOs are expected to attend.

A2J completed a site visit to Baghdad Women Association (BWA) on May 17 in Baghdad. The legal clinic, which began implementing legal clinic activities this month, provides legal support services to vulnerable women especially those suffering from domestic violence and those with unregistered marriages. A2J provided BWA with technical assistance on reporting protocols, legal case documentation, legal case confidentiality and beneficiary's privacy, archiving document related to cases classification, power of attorney, and legal clinic networking.



A2J continued rolling out close-out reports that measure the progress of organizational capacity and direct legal service provision of current legal clinic grantees through the grant life cycle. Reports on Mercy Hands, and Al-Rahma are now completed. Both organizations, which were provided with dedicated technical support from A2J, showed marked improvement in their service provision and record keeping.

A2J-Erbil conducted a site visit to Warvin NGO in Erbil to follow-up grant start-up and provide technical assistance with lessons learned from previous grantees. The most important issues discussed were:

- Confidentiality of all information and no uploading of photos/stories of beneficiaries, particularly those under 18 years old, without written consent of the beneficiary or the minor’s guardian.
- No political issues on NGO websites, especially under USAID/IA2J logos.
- Ongoing coordination with the ERO legal adviser.

A2J-Basrah is worked with Al-Arqam Cultural Charity Association, Al-Meameen Humanitarian Association and Al-Rawaby Humanitarian Organization on their work plans for grant implementation. The work plans should reflect all information related to the first four months of project activities and are to be submitted to Access to Justice Program prior to the signing of the grant agreement. The work plans will be included as part of their agreements.

A2J-Basrah provided the Iraqi Future Association with technical assistance in the second phase of their grant application. Jusour Youth Organization (Dhi Qar Province) was also assisted in preparing their GSF forms that will be submitted to the grant department by the end of this week.

Success Story

Rukaia is an orphan woman from poor family, forced by economic necessity to marry a man in an unregistered ceremony 15 years her senior. Rukaia was victimized by domestic violence in her marriage, and this led her to flee her husband and to return to her brother's house. She was divorced by her husband and continues to reside with her brother. Unfortunately, as it was an unregistered marriage, she is not eligible for alimony or government benefits for divorced women in economic need.

Rukaia's brother heard about the Fatema House Association Baghdad legal clinic and the services it offers to women who need assistance with legal matters. He met with a lawyer who began legal proceedings to register his sister's marriage then filed a petition in court against the former husband so that Rukaia could receive alimony.

In a country like Iraq where poverty often keeps women from seeking assistance on issues related to violence against women, the Fatema house Baghdad legal clinic provides valuable services to women who would otherwise fall through the cracks of the justice system.

2.2: Work with Iraqi legal professional associations (primarily the Iraqi Bar Association and Jurist Union and their subsidiaries) to increase administrative and substantive capacity for empowering lawyers and other legal professionals to assist vulnerable or disadvantaged populations

A2J finalized preparations for the upcoming human rights training for legal professionals that will be held at the IBA headquarters from June 7-9. Fifty new lawyers are expected to attend.

A2J completed a site visit to the IBA on May 22 in order to assess their progress on grant related activities designed to improve the skills of new lawyers to serve vulnerable populations.



A2J worked with the IBA to strengthen their communication, documentation and reporting skills.

Result 2.4: Support Development of Programs and Modernization of Academic and Practical Curriculum Related to Extending Access to Justice to Vulnerable Populations at Law Schools in Iraqi Universities in Key Locations throughout Iraq



A2J completed two site visits to the Baghdad Law School legal clinic on May 20 and 23. Baghdad Law School completed the 15 unit legal clinic course in an intensive week extended session. In addition, 37 students are involved in the work of the clinic, which provided legal consultation for 3 vulnerable cases. A2J is assisting the legal clinic in drafting a work plan in order to ensure they meet their grant targets.

A2J completed a site visit to Al-Nahrain Law School on May 20 to further discuss the establishment of a grant funded law school legal clinic at the university. A2J provided technical assistance guidance to the school on how to submit the grant summary form. The law school council approved the creation of a legal clinic at the school, which was one of the recommendations from the Curriculum Development Conference held in Erbil earlier this month.

A2J-Erbil met with Salahaddin Law School to discuss the ending of their current grant and submitting a new GSF for re-consideration that will address all issues of concern regarding their current grant, which was not managed well by the school-appointed program manager. The meeting was very positive; the school agreed to provide the following for next semester:

- Provide three permanent teachers to assist at the clinic;
- Provide two permanent staff to manage the administration of the legal clinic;
- Add two new supervisors to the legal clinic to support the activities;
- The Law School Dean will work with the Salahaddin University Scientific and Curriculum Development committee to formally add participation in the legal clinic into the Syllabus of Law School for the coming semester.

COMPONENT 3 - ADVOCACY AND IMPROVED GOVERNMENT SERVICES

Result 3.1: Support Partners in Reviewing Processes and Procedures for Reform of Policies, Regulations, and Legislation as they Relate to Vulnerable Populations

A2J provided substantial technical comments and suggestions to the Iraqi Model Women grant proposal for advocacy on strengthening Iraq’s draft Social Welfare Law. The Social Welfare Law is important legislation because it will address key issues of benefits for several classes of vulnerable populations, notably Iraq’s large widow population.

A2J also researched treatment of widows’ benefits with particular focus on the history of countries emerging from conflict, as requested of Access to Justice by Sabah Al Kaburi, the Legal Advisor to the President of Parliament.

At the IBA’s request, A2J coordinated with them on rescheduling the visibility moot court on disabilities law which had been scheduled for May 30. The request was due to the unavailability of the IBA President. Current prospects for rescheduling are for later in June.

A2J-Erbil is coordinating with the Kurdistan Regional Government’s Directorate of Displacement and Migration on accomplishing recommendations from the Access to Justice Roundtable meeting in Erbil on April 18th. With the support of the program, the Directorate will submit a report to the Erbil Governorate to change the procedure for IDPs applying for residency in Erbil in terms of having Kurdish personal sponsor, developing the facilities at the check points, etc.

Following the recent site visit with KURDS to check progress on their grant efforts for disabilities advocacy, A2J received and reviewed a new KURDS action plan with revisions on the timing of advocacy aspects that had been suggested during the meeting. KURDS has proposed that its first radio and TV debate (in the form of a round table) be conducted by the end of May in Dohuk. The featured guest will be Mr. Nasrat, the Director of Zheen Association for People with Disabilities in Dohuk. The debate will focus on people with disabilities and their role in society and their process in drafting a law on disabilities in the Kurdistan Region and lobbying for its acceptance.

GRANTS ADMINISTRATION

The Grants team and A2J-Erbil completed a Grant Application/Proposal Writing training for 10 NGOs (2 from Sulaymaniyah, 2 from Kirkuk, 1 from Dohuk, 2 from Mosul and 3 from Erbil) on May 21-22 at the Van Royal Hotel in Erbil. The total number of participants was 20 (8 females, 12 males).



OPERATIONS

Marwa Al-Hamdani will join the A2J Program in June as the Finance Assistant. With this recruitment we now have a full finance and administration team in place.

The contract with East Studio for the first phase of the awareness campaign was signed this week. Design work on campaign materials and messages is commencing this coming week. Designs and messages will be reviewed by both the Program team and USAID before proceeding with broadcasting and disseminating.

Proposals for the second phase of the awareness campaign were incomplete and all bidders were requested to submit complete proposals according to RFA. We expect full proposals to be submitted by COB on May 27.
