I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A. PROJECT GOAL AND OBJECTIVES

CCF's project "Supporting Orphans and Vulnerable Children" is aimed at reducing the number of children in Belarus being institutionalized in state-administered orphanages and boarding schools. The program's goal is to prevent institutionalization in selected communities of Belarus by supporting a cultural environment conducive to at-home family care and also to move children out of institutions into less restrictive environments when prior circumstances necessitate removal from their family home. The project targets 'social orphans,' i.e., children whose parents are living, but are unable to provide proper care, or children who have been denied parental rights. The project's activities focus on working with families and social service professionals to maintain and reintegrate children within their original family units.

This component has three main objectives:

- To improve access to and further develop an integrated system of community-based prevention and rehabilitation services for families as well as institutionalized and at-risk children.
- To improve the quality of training and education available to social service providers and awareness of community members surrounding the development of favorable family environments for children.
- To provide technical assistance to the Belarus Ministry of Education (MOE) in order to strengthen the national regulatory and methodological base promoting de-institutionalization and to disseminate key learnings of the project throughout Belarus to build a foundation for replication and sustainability.

B. PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

This quarter project activity was focused on expansion and sustainability of project interventions.

The number of children using alternative type care almost exceeds its annual target. In the first six months of Year 4 the number of children using alternative family type care reached 798 people (99.7% of its annual target). Two communities (Chausy and Zhodino) demonstrate sustainability of project intervention and maintain a 0% level of entry into institutions. The children's shelter in Chaussy town was closed due to the evident success of early prevention of child maltreatment and a significant decrease in the number of children removed from their families. A large number of resource families recruited and trained on PRIDE methodology replaced the shelter's services. The trained foster parents provide immediate safe placement for children if necessary.

This quarter a success story about Chaussy's achievements in family type service development was published in USAID's agency-wide newsletter entitled *Frontlines*.

Service utilization increased significantly and exceeded targets. The number of new community-based services in the first six months of Year 4 reached **243** (against **198** annual target). Numbers of meaningfully served children also exceeded its planned annual level and reached **3,323** people (**143%** of the annual target).

In the first six months of Year 4, **799** children- orphans (**176%** of the annual target) improved their life skills at CCF Life Skills development programs.

419 specialists and child protection specialists and foster parents from more than 80 geographic locations took part in CCF replication and capacity building events- a training course on child protection developed in partnership with the US based Institute for Human Services (IHS), PRIDE model for foster and adoptive parents, Parenting Skills enhancement program and Life Skills Education for orphans.

Local state institutions, specialists and authorities demonstrated high level of support to CCF initiatives.

Despite significant deterioration of our economic situation and deficiency of financial resources approximately 85% of alumni of CCF training and dissemination activity started their own groups and activities with orphans and families at risk. Local Educational departments fully covered the costs of these services.

Two workshops with US experts from Institute for Human Services (IHS) were another project highlight. The issue of sexual abuse of children was discussed for the first time in Belarus and helped Belorussian specialists

to recognize the existence of this problem in Belarus. Opportunities for protective measures for children were discussed.

A new level of partnership has been established with the Academy of Post-Diploma Education (Minsk). CCF's training program on Family-Centered Approach in Child Protection Services was tested in one of the groups of child protection specialists representing 16 new geographic locations all over Belarus. CCF and the Academy shared costs for the training activity.

UNICEF and Ministry of Education invited CCF-Belarus to become a member of an Expert Group for the preparation of the National Report on reform of the Child Protection System.

In summary thus far:

- **Thirty seven** small grants are in the process of implementation;
- **44 new community based prevention and rehabilitation services** were created.
- **419 people** took part in project capacity building events; **52%** of them were trained within small grants;
- The total number of project **direct beneficiaries** of prevention and rehabilitation services as well as the training program for local specialists this quarter was **2,175 people**;
- **183 organizations (compared to 105 planned)** benefited from the project by the end of this quarter.
- **Eight new communities** financially supported implementation of new community-based prevention services as the follow-up of CCF capacity building events.

LESSONS LEARNED

- Mobilization of local community resources for implementation of the Parenting Skills Enhancement Program and Life Skills program in non-assisted communities demonstrated the real interest of the local authorities to new services development and the availability of local resources.

CHALLENGES/ CONSTRAINTS

- Due to the global economic and financial crises exchange, devaluation of the Belarusian ruble in the first 3 months of 2009 reached 20%. As a result the recipients of OVC small grants faced a budget deficiency because their budgets were prepared with consideration of the previous exchange rate. To ensure successful achievement of planned goals and objectives CCF-Belarus negotiated some project adjustments with affected sub-grantees.

II. ACTIVITIES

OBJECTIVE 1

To improve access to and further develop an integrated system of community-based prevention and rehabilitation services for families as well as institutionalized and at-risk children.

- **38 small grants** were in the process of implementation this quarter.
- **44** community based prevention and rehabilitation services were created.
- **2,564 people** (parents, orphans and children at risk, parents of children with disabilities, children with special needs, alcohol addicted and co-dependant relatives, victims of domestic violence) benefited from prevention and rehabilitation services. **83%** of them were served through small grants.
- Nine (9) new communities started Life Skills and Parenting Skills Enhancement Programs without financial support from CCF.
- **363** orphans and children at risk were enrolled in Life Skills training program this quarter.
- **81%** of orphans reported improvement of knowledge and skills related to Life Skills trainings.

Parenting Skills Enhancement Program

The Parenting Skills Enhancement Program was continued via small grants in Kobrin, Orsha and Chausy.

As a result:

- **Forty three (43) groups of parents (494 people)** have been working on Parenting Skills Enhancement Program in 8 communities; 48% of the groups were completed.

- **58% of groups** were implemented through a small grants scheme while **42%** were solely supported through the budgets of local Educational Departments.

82 % of trained parents reported better understanding of the reasons of children's misbehavior and using non-violent methods of discipline; **82%** of trained parents assessed themselves as "responsible parents"; **87%** of trained parents reported maintaining optimal emotional contacts with their children; **63%** of parents reported using methods of stress management and self-regulation in their daily life.

- **A Parents' club** was organized in Chaussy out of the most active parents who completed training course.

Play groups were organized **for three hundred sixty four (364)** children in Chausy, Kobrin, Orsha, Slavgorod and Smorgon while their parents were at parenting classes. Unique developmental programs were prepared by community trainers to develop children's talents.

Parents say:

A mother of 7 year old girl:

"...Training program cleared up the reasons of child's misbehavior. ...It helped me to understand the reasons why my son did not do what adults want him to do. Now I try to find the reason first and as a result use proper methods of managing his behavior... After program completion I stopped beating my child for doing something wrong...I found out for myself that good discipline can be established not by shouting and slapping but by using positive methods and techniques that we learned at the classes..."

Life Skills Program

CCF Life Skills Program helps institutionalized teenagers to develop their knowledge and skills that are crucial for their further independent life. The program includes issues of planning and achieving life goals, effective decision making, stress management, violence prevention, effective communication, gender roles and stereotypes, safe parenting and positive family relationships, self-esteem and values, conflict resolution, job seeking, budget management. Along with education classes orphaned children practiced their domestic skills (sewing, carpentry, cooking) at social apartments and workshops equipped by the project.

This quarter **NGO “Fialta”** started Life Skills training course for **41 orphans** from SOS-Youth Home within small grant to promote successful social adaptation of teens.

Health Education and Substance Abuse Prevention Program

The Health Education and Substance Abuse Prevention program was 100% implemented through small grants in 4 communities (Chausy, Kobrin, Volozhin and Smorgon). This quarter **four hundred forty six (446) children** were in training. Approximately 24% of all the participants have completed the course.

As a result 82% of schoolchildren participating in the program reported improvement of knowledge and skills on HIV/AIDS issues, drug abuse, reproductive health, responsible behavior, life values and attitudes.

Services for families of children with disabilities via small grants.

The National NGO BelAPDiMI has continued their innovative project aimed at prevention of parents' rejection of newborns with disabilities. As a result **48 parents** of children who have disabilities gained access to phone counseling, legal, information and psychological assistance. Individual habilitation plans were developed in partnership with parents.

Computer classes, printing workshop activities and theater studio were served for **20 children with special needs** within small grant of Kobrin Branch of NGO BelAPDiMI.

The NGO “Belarusian Children’s Hospice” has completed the project on home-based services for young parents raising children with special needs in Minsk and Pinsk town (Brest oblast). **Eighty two (82) young parents and 46 children with disabilities** participated in Family Club activity, training on specifics of the relationships in a family raising a child with a disability, and accessed home-based care.

NGO «Belarusian public union of Riding and Hippo therapy» continued integration and rehabilitation activity for children with disabilities and orphaned children from boarding schools.

Slavgorod State Habilitation Center has started home visitation program (Portage model) for children with disabilities. The results will be available next quarter.

Other prevention and rehabilitation services developed through small grants:

- **Public Information Campaigns on Child Abuse and Neglect**

Public awareness information campaigns on child abuse and neglect prevention in Smorgon, Kirovsk, and Brest were supported via small grants. This quarter the projects were registered by the Department of Humanitarian Aids and started preparatory activities.

- **Family type care for orphans**

Implementation of new projects on PRIDE model for prospective foster parents has been started in Kobrin, Kirovsk and Brest regions.

This quarter *twenty three (23) candidates for foster and adoptive parents* completed PRIDE pre-service program in Orsha and Zhodino. *One hundred and ten (110) active foster parents* were trained on PRIDE in-service modules.

Parents gained knowledge on understanding the relationship between a child's needs and behavior, using discipline techniques for promoting positive behavior; understanding factors affecting self-esteem and creating necessary conditions for positive self-esteem development.

- **Rehabilitation of alcohol addictive parents through Anonymous Alcoholic's (AA) 12-step program**

The project by the NGO "Mothers against Drugs" on development of AA programs was completed in Orsha, Kobrin, Zhodino and Volozhin. It was focused at AA rehabilitation services provision for parents with serious alcohol problems to prevent removal of children from their families. As a result 4 groups provided self-support services for *30 alcohol addicted people* and *11 co-dependant relatives* while *41 people* received psychological counseling on alcohol related problems. After the project completion, leaders of AA groups will continue service provision using community resources.

- **Domestic violence (DV) prevention**

Service development for victims of domestic violence was started within small grants in Bragin, Volozhin and Kobrin. As a result *69 women* received access to telephone and individual counseling, self-help group activity, and group therapy. As practice shows public awareness about a problem of domestic violence is still low. In order to raise awareness, a series of educational events and publications in mass media supplemented DV services development. The total number of people reached through information campaigns was *6,789 people*.

- **Rehabilitation services for imprisoned mothers and their children**

The NGO "Penitentiary Health" continued a project aimed at improving attachment between imprisoned mothers and their babies raised at the specialized baby house. As a result *26 children* from the baby house participated in playgroup activity with their mothers to support attachment and empathy development. Fifty mothers serving a sentence in Gomel Colony received Life Skills training mainly focused on safe parenting issues and attachment development.

- **Rehabilitation services for families at risk**

Smorgon social-pedagogic center continued their innovative project "First steps of motherhood". Rehabilitation services for mothers from disadvantaged families were provided based on Marte Meo therapy for *26 disadvantaged mothers their children* from 0-3 years old. To improve communication between a mother and a child, specialists made videos of interaction between them. Mutual assessment of video materials helped mothers to identify their strengths and areas for improvements. *Thirty seven (37) expectant mothers* from the risk group passed training on effective parenting to prevent their refusal of their newborn.

- The local foundation "Center for Support of Rural Development and Entrepreneurship of Stolin District" opened a day-care center for children at risk living in rural areas. *71 children* from disadvantaged families received support from the day care center; *46 parents* received psychological counseling on safe parenting.

- **Facility-based Computer Database**

This quarter the software development was completed. It is expected to be installed in local child protection institutions next quarter.

OBJECTIVE 2

To improve the quality of training and education available to social service providers and to raise awareness of community members surrounding the development of favorable family environments for children.

- **131 participants** took part in **10 capacity building events** conducted by CCF
- **231 community specialists** were trained through small grants by partner organizations.
- **90 %** of the participants (against 85% planned) reported improvements of specific knowledge and skills
- **85%** participants (against 60% planned) reported practical use of obtained knowledge and skills in services for family and children.

Achieving sustainability through development of national trainer's resources

Capacity building for PRIDE Trainer's team

Five (5) trainers took part in advanced level capacity building workshops (**29th – 30th of January; 16th - 17th of February, 2009**). As a result participants completed adaptation of PRIDE pre-service program (PRIDE Book and PRIDE Trainers Guide) to the national context.

Capacity building for Life Skills Trainer's team

▪ **Six (6) trainers** on Life Skills took part in additional capacity building workshop on **18th-19th of February, 2009**. The participants were acquainted with both updated and newly developed Modules within Life Skills program and improved M&E system. New topics on health and hygiene, preparing for family life, successful family conflict resolution are already incorporated into Life skills training curriculum on the community level.

Capacity building for sub-grantees

Workshop "Project Management" was conducted on **2nd-3rd of March, 2009** for organizations implementing small grants awarded in the Year 4 (**12 people**). Participants gained knowledge about the project life cycle, planning and reporting tools, M&E, CCF procurement policy, and effective HR management. Each trainee has created a project folder with all required documentation, revised monitoring and evaluation forms with indicators by goals and objective as well as improved quarterly reports submitted to CCF-Belarus office.

Parent's Association development

Workshop "NGO basics" in Chausy and Volozhin (**20-21st of January; 16-17th of March, 2009**) and experience exchange visit to NGO "Belarusian Children's Hospice" (**10-11th of February, 2009**) helped to develop capacity and mobilize parents' resources. **Thirty six (36) participants** from local branches of NGO BelAPDIIMI, as well as specialists from community Habilitation Centers and Territorial Centers of Social Protection of Population received knowledge on NGO basics, types of resources, and methods of resources mobilization.

As a result of this capacity building program parents from Zhodino and Chausy branches initiated and carried out follow up events for **176 people**. The events aimed at engagement of parents raising children with disabilities into NGO activity. Volozhin branch of BelAPDIIMI has started Parents' Club as a result of the exchange visit to NGO "Belarusian Children's Hospice" (*for more information, please, see Annex 2*).

Training activity provided through small grants

This quarter partner organizations trained **231 child protection specialists** within their small grants. The training programs were offered to child protection specialists, teachers of boarding schools, and health care providers and covered issues of a **family-centered approach to child protection** services, health education and substance abuse prevention, and care and support to children with disabilities.

OBJECTIVE 3

To provide technical assistance to the Ministry of Education in Belarus in order to strengthen the national regulatory and methodological base in the area of de-institutionalization and family support and to disseminate key learnings of the project throughout Belarus to build a foundation for replication and sustainability.

This quarter CCF-Belarus focused its efforts on countrywide dissemination and replication of the project achievements.

- **94%** of all specialists from five new communities trained on the parenting program last quarter started new community-based prevention service using local resources.

- New partnership with Association of Foster Parents resulted in their active participation in PRIDE dissemination activity.

- The Academy of Post-Diploma Education piloted the training program on Family-Centered Approach to Child Protective Services into their curriculum. The CCF trainers' team helped to carry out this activity for the first group of child protection specialists from **16 geographic locations**. Institute for Human Services, CCF’s partner in child protection development, made an in-kind contribution in the form of 1,000 copies of books “Field Guide to Child Welfare” (Volume 1 and Volume 2). These books contain information on identification of child abuse and neglect cases, risk assessment, case planning, family engagement and other topics included in the training program on a family-centered approach to child protection. The books were distributed among child protection specialists.

IV. PROJECT MANAGEMENT & STAFF DEVELOPMENT

CCF-Belarus has held weekly project review meetings in Minsk. These meetings strengthened project management, performance, and integration leading to enhanced cooperation and communication between project staff.

On the 19-20th of March 2009, Marina Ananenko, CCF-Belarus’ Project manager and Nadezhda Karaseva, CCF-Belarus’ Child Protection Specialist, took part in the international conference “Family, Child, Society: Problems and Solutions” in Petersburg (Russia).

Project Overall Impact

Indicator I. Number of children using alternative care

Indicator I measures the number of orphans and sheltered children who use alternative care (foster families, guardianship, adoption).

In the first half of the 4th year of the project **85** children from five target communities – Zhodino-**11**, Orsha-**37**, and Kobrin-**19**, Chausy-**10**, and Volozhin-**8** - were using alternative care as a result of community-based prevention and rehabilitation services initiated by the project. The total number of children who have been enjoying alternative care from the beginning of the CCF OVC Project is now **798**.

Indicator II. Number of children returned to biological family

In Half-Year 4 the number of children from 5 target communities who were returned to biological family as a result of community based prevention and rehabilitation services initiated by the project is **92**: Zhodino-16, Orsha-20, Kobrin-22, Chausy-5, and Volozhin-29.

It is worth paying special attention to the fact here that on January 01, 2009 the shelter in Chausy was closed, so there are no more sheltered children in this community.

Indicator III. Ratio of children prevented from being institutionalized

The indicator shows the percentage of children who were sent to boarding schools after being sheltered. During the first half of the project's fourth year this percent by targeted communities is as follows: Zhodino-0% (0% annual target), Orsha-20,3% (20% annual target), Kobrin-10,8% (6% annual target), Chausy-0% (0% annual target), and Volozhin-2,2% (6% annual target).

Objective 1

Indicator 1.0. Number of children (sex-disaggregated) that have been meaningfully served.

In the first half of Year 4 due to the services started in the community within the CCF-supported project **437** children (243 boys and 194 girls) received one or more need-based services on a regular/long-term basis. The planned value for the indicator for Year 4 is 360.

Objective 2

Indicator 2.0. Number of both the individuals and organizations assisted by OVC project to increase their technical capacity/ability to advocate for/provide services to vulnerable children

In Half-Year 4 groups of individuals were trained in the topics identified in the communities as most important to fill in the gaps in dealing with the issues that cause risky situations for children if not properly handled.

The topics/areas of special attention are as follows: Family Group Conference, Working with Traumatized Children and Children who experienced Sexual Abuse, Safe Care/Home Visiting, Health Education and Substance Abuse Prevention, PRIDE Advanced Course, PRIDE pre-service and in-service courses by CCF and local trainers, Child Protection, Proposal Writing, Project Management, Monitoring and Evaluation of Projects, as well as Development of Parents' Associations Workshops for Zhodino, Orsha, Chausy.

Organizations were assisted by CCF through trainings, grants, equipment and other materials provision.

Objective 3

Indicator 3.1. Number of regulatory and methodological documents/ standards/ criteria developed;

Indicator 3.2. Action Plan as a common framework for incorporation of developed documents into practice is available.

Action Plan is developed and it describes the steps and timeframe for the creation of necessary legal child protection documents.

Indicator 3.3. Number of stakeholders reached through project's dissemination and replication activities.

In 1st half of Year 4 dissemination and replication activities/trainings focused on Child Protection, PRIDE, Life Skills, and Parenting covered 184 specialists from different regions of Belarus.

In addition to the specialists 197 parents were served by local trainers trained at CCF.

In addition, 293 copies of book “Field Guide in Child Protection” were distributed.

Thus, the value for this indicator is **674**.

CCF-Belarus mobilizes parents' associations to develop services for children with disabilities and their families

To engage parents of children with disabilities and to empower them for active participation in services development on the local level, CCF-Belarus started a program which includes a series of capacity building activities for the local branches of the Belarusian Association of Assistance to Disabled Children and Youth (BelAPDiMI) located in Zhodino, Chausy, Volozhin, and Kobrin.

The target group of this program is local stakeholders involved in services development for children with disabilities and their families on the local level. Among them were representatives of territorial centers of social protection of population, habilitation centers, members of the local BelAPDiMI branches, parents of children with disabilities.

The program was started with the **training "NGO basics"**. During the training the participants learned about the legal aspects of NGO activity, goal-oriented planning, and resources mobilization to achieve the goal. It was a unique opportunity for them to listen to the needs of mothers raising children with disabilities while planning the activities, to discuss joint expectations, and coordinate plans.



An exchange visit to the NGO "Belarusian Children's Hospice" was organized to expand the palette of the existing services on the local level, to familiarize the participants with methods of engagement of families having children with disabilities into NGO activity, as well as development of partnership with parents and specialists.

The participants were acquainted with the services provided at the Family Club and the Day-Care Center for terminally ill children, and with methods of family's engagement.

As a result:

- 36 people took part in the capacity building program;
- 176 people including children and young people with disabilities, as well as their parents took part in follow-up events in Zhodino and Chausy.
- A family club for parents of disabled children has started its activity in Chausy.
