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

- Exchange students from Canada work alongside Malian teachers for 4 to 6 weeks.
- The pair of in-class teachers are grouped with counterparts from the local teacher training college.
- Master classes in teaching offered at the local college.
- Regular debriefing sessions with specialists from SFU.
- Degree credit for Canadian participants and certificates for Malian participants.
