<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will improve the visibility of the local government, by enabling the Amuru District Education Office to provide quality education to pupils of Amuru-Alero primary school. The children of this particular school who were displaced during the LRA insurgency are currently returning to their villages. This grant will build confidence among IDPs returning to their original homes that the local government is capable of providing education to their children. Rehabilitating Amuru-Alero will encourage additional pupils to enroll. The lack of adequate infrastructure has been discouraging many families who fled during the war, from returning home.</p> <p>It is therefore proposed that NUTI through its support to GoU's Peace, Recovery and Development Plan contribute to the transition to peace in Northern Uganda by increasing citizen confidence in the GoU. The grant will provide technical assistance and retain the services of a construction contractor to rehabilitate of the primary school, teachers houses, and provide adequate water and sanitation facilities for the students and teachers. In collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Amuru district local government officials, the communities will contribute water, gravel and unskilled labor toward the construction.</p>

<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: The relative peace prevailing in northern Uganda has enabled IDPs to return to their homes and as a result, it is important for government to extend services to people. The twenty years of war in Northern Uganda caused a lot of destruction on physical infrastructure including government offices that were being used by the army as barracks. This administration block is dilapidated and has made it difficult for the people to access services. The administration block houses a number of government officials who cannot deliver services diligently due to the poor infrastructure.</p> <p>The Local Council officials approached the Northern Uganda Transition Initiative (NUTI) office for assistance such that their administration block is rehabilitated to a usable condition.</p> <p>Purongo Sub-County had a very high rate of rebel activity during the war. Most structures in this particular sub-county were destroyed in the conflict. This activity will support the rehabilitation of the sub-county administrative facilities to better enhance the capabilities of local government.</p>								
CAS011	Support to a SWOT analysis of 10 Radio Stations in Northern Uganda

<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will be a precursor to the capacity development, ICT and equipment support NUTI will provide to radio stations in Northern Uganda. It will form the basis upon which support to their personnel training and institutional capacity building needs will be considered. The grant will, through a SWOT analysis, support the carrying out of a wide assessment of available ICT infrastructure, equipment, training, content, programming and management in 10 radio stations in northern Uganda. Once the analysis is done, existing gaps will be identified and the appropriate remedies such as mentoring in ICT and radio equipment will be provided. Where it is found that management skills are lacking and training gaps exist, organizational development mentoring and tailor-made training will be provided to the radio stations. The assessment will also involve analyzing radio stations content and programming against acceptable professional benchmarks and where it is established that gaps exist, appropriate help will be provided. This grant will therefore support the first step towards building the capacity of radio stations in Northern Uganda to be able to effectively disseminate information relevant to peace, recovery and development. The grantee will be Northern Uganda Media Club (NUMEC) and will be coordinated by NUTI.</p>

<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: The grant will support rehabilitation of play grounds in 11 primary schools each in a sub county in Gulu district and also provide such usables as foot balls, net balls, nets, and goal posts. This activity will encourage unity by regular competitions among schools and the community at large. This grant will demonstrate the government's ability through the sports office the ability to provide the strategic activities that promote welfare of pupils through sports and then peace and reconciliation in general.</p>

<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will support the office of Community services in the Gulu District Local Government (GDLG) to organize cultural revival activities at both Sub-county and District level through the use of the arts as a way of celebrating peace and building relationships between people who have returned to their villages. The grant will provide logistical support to 11 sub-counties in Gulu whose administration will identify and mobilize five groups per sub-county to take part in a cultural gala characterized by music and dance competitions leading to the award of practical prizes such as Oxen, Ox ploughs and Bicycles which will be useful to the winning sub-counties. This grant will support the music and dance competitions in the sub-counties of Lalogi, Odek, Lakwana, Paicho, Patiko, Awach, Bungatira, Ongako, Koro, Bobi and Palaro and thereafter a grand finale will be held at Gulu District headquarters in Kaunda grounds. The office of the community services manager in close collaboration with Community Development Officers (CDOs) and sub-county officials will ensure community participation and organize the cultural gala and NUTI will provide the necessary resources.</p>

<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will enable NUTI to measure the impact of its small grant activities in northern Uganda by carrying out a perceptions and media listenership survey in the four Acholi districts. Uganda's leading survey firm, the Steadman Group, will be contracted through this grant to design the survey tools, methodology, carry out the survey, and provide a comprehensive report on the findings. The survey will be carried out in the four districts NUTI intends to target. The Steadman Group will work closely with the NUTI team in the design of the survey and analysis of the results, which will be used to inform how NUTI targets its activities both in terms of geographic area and programmatic interventions.</p>

	<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will increase the knowledge and information residents in northern Uganda have on such important issues as the national Peace, Recovery, and Development Plan (PRDP), the IDP return policy and the northern Uganda camp phase out policy initiated by the Office of the Prime Minister (OPM) so citizens can make better informed decisions about what to do with their lives during the transition from emergency to peace and recovery in the region. Information campaigns of this nature are crucial at this time because of the dearth of information regular citizens have access to. This grant will fund a multi-faceted information campaign including radio shows, posters, and other media outlets with the aim of disseminating timely and accurate information to the IDP population in northern Uganda as well as citizens who have already returned home so war-affected communities are better aware of their rights. Residents in all four districts of the Acholi Sub-region will be targeted (Gulu, Pader, Kitgum, and Amuru). The grantee is the United Nations High Commission for Human Rights (UNHCR), and will be coordinated with government officials, journalists, and other media outlets.</p>

	<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: The relative peace prevailing in northern Uganda has enabled IDPs to return to their homes and a result, it is important for the government to extend services like education facilities to the people. The twenty years of war in northern Uganda caused a lot of destruction on physical infrastructure including school structures like classrooms that were being used by the rebels as barracks. This led to the displacement of several schools and eventually affected enrollment of pupils. This grant will among other things, encourage high numbers of pupils to get enrolled for primary school education where lack of infrastructure has discouraged many families who fled during the war, from returning home. Patira primary school is an important school to target because there are lots of parents are returning home and leaving their children in the camps mainly due to lack of sufficient facilities in return schools. This intervention in this area will help encourage more children to return and re-unite with their families.</p>

	<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: This grant will enhance the efficiency of Gulu District's operations and its effectiveness at disseminating information by enabling it to produce voluminous documents on time for important meetings, including district council meetings. The grant will provide the Gulu District with a heavy duty photocopier and a 24-month maintenance contract. The photocopier will be placed in the district's Chief Finance Officer's reception area where it will be accessible to the district's 12 departments. The district staff and councilors will benefit directly from this intervention as they will no longer have to waste time moving to other offices to make copies of their documents.</p>

The meeting will help in identifying existing weaknesses and gaps in station managerial policies, trainings, programming and infrastructure and in the process bring out views, opinions and suggestions on appropriate interventions for mitigation. It will provide a general overview of the state of the media in the region and thus provide useful clues on how best interventions in the media sector can be tailored to achieve the best results.</p>

The Gulu District Council through the District Speaker will distribute the statutes and will collaborate closely with the Ministry of Local Government and the USAID Linkages project.</p>

	<p>ACTIVITY SUMMARY: The local government is struggling to rehabilitate the infrastructure of schools as they moved from displaced sites and return to their original sites. This grant will enable the Gulu District Water Office to demonstrate its commitment to supporting the return process by rehabilitating a bore hole and providing clean water in one of the schools that recently returned. The borehole at Opaya Primary School, with a current enrollment of over 300 students, will also serve neighboring communities in Padiwe parish, where over 3,000 IDPs have returned. The Gulu District Water Office will implement this grant in collaboration with the District Education and Sports Office and Bobi sub-county officials.</p>

Residents of Odek feel that they have been financially marginalized by the local and central government because they live in the birthplace of Joseph Kony, head of the Lord's Resistance Army. The Gulu District and Odek sub-county governments will develop the list and specifications for the furniture required and oversee the Odek Youth Education Park, a vocational training center established by the Norwegian Refugee Council, to make the furniture.

The grant will make the procurement of necessary equipments and items that the camp clean up team finds necessary to execute their work. The ceremonies will be carried out in areas where massacres occurred and other areas the traditional leaders identify as central, to maximize participation, and symbolic, to maximize the impact. Ker Kwaro, the Acholi Kingdom will lead these activities in close coordination with Gulu and Amuru's District Reconciliation and Peace teams.

Odek is the birthplace of the Lord's Resistance Army leader Joseph Kony and was marginalized throughout the war, but as a result of the prevailing peace is receiving among the highest numbers of returning formerly displaced families in Gulu District, putting a strain on existing infrastructure. The District Engineer's office will oversee the execution of the rehabilitation working closely with the sub-county staff and District Health Office.</p>

The new building will be located within the town of Gulu, which is a central location to government offices as well as local commerce; the building will be a tangible sign to residents of the presence and relevance of the District Administration. Through this grant, NUTI will provide stop-gap support toward limited operational costs, short term technical assistance to improve the organizational management and enhance the technical expertise, and rehabilitate the Ker Kwaro premises. Ker Kwaro Acholi will engage with and carry out appropriate traditional ceremonies including cleansing, reburial, and mediation in communities throughout Amuru, Gulu, and Kitgum Districts.</p>

By providing expert trainers and logistical support for outreach activities, this grant will increase the capacity of the District Reconciliation and Peace Team (DRPT) which is a local government body to resolve land conflicts and reconcile communities in Amuru district.
