In Southern Afghanistan the SIKA Program is referred to as the “Subat Program,” using the Pashto word for stability.

The Monthly Report is “designed to keep On-site Monitors, the Platform and MRRD informed of all ongoing program information and results disaggregated by Intermediate Results (IR) in narrative format, along with province and district with GPS coordinates included for each project conducted. Monthly reports also will include a section that outlines how the contract objective and Intermediate Results have been achieved that month and measure effectiveness in reaching program indicators. Additionally Monthly Reports shall be designed to be reported to Provincial and District Entities for their continual awareness of how the program is performing in their Districts.”

## HIGHLIGHTS

### PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

The status of grant applications at the end of MAR-14 is shown in Table 1 below. In total, USAID has approved 19 projects in Daman, 33 projects in Arghandab, 10 in Tirin Kot, 13 in Chora, three in Dihrawud, 10 in Qalat, five in Shahjoy, 13 in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, 10 in Bost, and six in Garmser. The total value of these 122 projects is \$3.8 million.

The grants pipeline currently encompasses 366 grants valued at \$13.0 million. Fifty-nine grants are in progress, valued at \$1.5 million, and 12 grants valued at \$273 thousand have been completed. Further information on the grants pipeline can be found in Annex A: Grants Activities Summary.

During the reporting period, there was marginal improvement in the processing of requests for vetting of prospective CDC grantees. Twenty vetting requests were submitted in MAR-14, bringing the total number of requests to-date to 131. Sixty-seven have been returned eligible, four have been deemed

ineligible, and 60 are pending with the Vetting Support Unit. However, Program has yet to receive any vetting eligibility notices for the 38 submitted during February and March.

**Community Forums (CFs)** On 12-MAR-14, the last series of Governance and Stability Community Forums (CFs) was completed in Zaranj District, Nimroz Province. In total, 312 community councilmen from 168 community development councils (CDCs) in 10 clusters participated. The forums produced 49 problem statements related to the five common sources of instability (SOIs): inadequate water resources management; inadequate access to locations; institutions and services; natural disaster; lack of jobs and job skills; and poor to non-functioning government institutions were identified. The feasibility of the proposed project solutions were evaluated and prioritized by cluster assemblymen and community councilmen working together. Initially 18 project concept notes (PCNs) were drafted and submitted to the district grants team for further processing.

**Certificates of Completion for CFs** PRRDs hosted two Town Hall events in Kang District, Nimroz on 30-MAR-14 and in Nad Ali, Hilmand on 29-MAR-14 to acknowledge completion of Governance and Stability Community Forums by DDAs and CDCs. In Kang, 311 people participated in the event, including 170 community leaders who received certificates. The Deputy Provincial Governor thanked the Program for bridging the gap between the people and the government and “for arranging meetings between local representatives and provincial entities, giving the local people a chance to share their problems and enabling them to find effective solutions for these problems.”

In Nad Ali, 120 participants from DDAs, DCCs and CDCs were acknowledged for their participation in the Community Forums. The event was hosted by Eng. Mohammad Ibrahim, Nad Ali District Governor and Kala Khan, District Community Council Director. The DCC director stated that he was pleased that the new PRRD program has facilitated “five rounds of Community Forums, which enhanced the knowledge and problem-solving skills of the DDA, DCC and CDC members.” Both events were covered by the local media.

**International Women’s Day** On 08-MAR-14, Subat Program joined in the celebration of the International Women’s Day in the region. Events were hosted by DoWA and supported by Subat in Bost and Nahri Sarraj districts of Hilmand Province and in Zabul Province on 08-MAR-14. In Uruzgan, the celebration took place on 09-MAR-14. In these events, 170 people participated in Zabul, 150 in Nahri Sarraj, 200 in Bost, and 150 in Uruzgan. The provincial governors along with other prominent personalities led the celebrations. All of the Women’s Day events were covered by national media. Hilmand DoWA Director Jamila Niazi noted, “The (Subat) Program has already conducted trainings for women on stability programs, and now the women themselves find solutions to address the sources of instability.”

In Nimroz Province, the celebration of International Women’s Day was held on 13-MAR-14, with the Provincial Governor hosting. About 250 people participated in the event. Among the participants was the Governor. Amir Mohammad Akhudzada, former Governor Ghulam Dastagir Azad, Deputy Police

Commander Nader, Director of PRRD/Nimroz Eng. Khalilurahman, all of the DoWA staff, and a large number of government representatives.

## KANDAHAR PROVINCIAL MONTHLY REVIEW

The PMU head facilitated a coordination meeting between PRRD, Sector Services Director, District Governors of both Daman and Arghandab districts, DDA Chairmen of both districts and the Program team on 31-MAR-14. The aim of the meeting was to produce coordination protocols and structure a joint monitoring committee for grant projects in Daman and Arghandab districts.

Meeting attendees agreed upon the following:

- The committee will be responsible for visiting the project after the completion of each milestone.
- The milestones should be monitored by the committee.
- The program team will inform the committee members three days prior to the site visits.
- The Sector Services Director will issue an official letter and introduce their representative to District Governor and Program team.

## OBJECTIVES AND INTERMEDIATE RESULTS REVIEW

### CONTRACT OBJECTIVES

The Program Objective is: *“to assist GIROA officials at the district and provincial levels to respond to the population’s development and governance concerns to better instill confidence and build stability.”*

### IRI STABILITY ANALYSIS

**Overall Objective:** Provincial and District Entities increasingly address sources of instability and take measures to respond to the population’s development and governance concerns.

#### ACTIVITY I.1 HIRE AND TRAIN STABILITY SPECIALISTS TEAM

At present, all necessary governance and stability specialist have been hired and trained.

#### ACTIVITY I.2 CONDUCT TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT) FOR SIKA AND GIROA STAFF

A fourth formal Training of Trainers (TOT) was planned for late March 2014 at the Kandahar City Regional Office for PRRD District Social Workers (DSWs), but was postponed due to the presidential election in early April. The TOT has been rescheduled for late April 2014.

A new governance and stability program activity, which was developed and tested by the Governance and Stability team, has been approved for implementation. The new program activity is entitled “Stability Technical Assistance Sessions,” or STAS. This new program activity will require training for SIKA and MRRD staff. The IR1 team developed a formal STAS TOT for SIKA personnel, which has been scheduled for 12-14-APR-2014, following the presidential election. The training will include how to deliver the Periodic Stabilization Review (PSR), to be approved for external as well as internal use.

#### ACTIVITY I.3 UPDATE STABILITY WORKSHOP FRAMEWORKS WITH LESSONS LEARNED

During the reporting period, no additional updates were made to the governance and stability community forums, due to the development, testing, training and implementation of Stability Technical Assistance Sessions (STAS) by the Governance and Stability Team Lead. Additionally, the primary governance and stability community forums finished in all 14 program districts. As such, revisions to the remaining forum materials are not immediately imperative. The Team Lead is tentatively planning to complete revisions to the remaining forum materials during Afghanization exercise periods in April and May, prior to full Afghanization in mid-July-14.

#### **ACTIVITY 1.4 DELIVER STABILITY ANALYSIS WORKSHOPS FOR EACH APPROVED DISTRICT AS NEEDED**

On 12-MAR-14, Governance and Stability Community Forums (CFs) finished in Zaranj District, Nimroz Province, bringing the primary SIKA South program activity to completion in all Program districts. In Zaranj, which was the last and only district still conducting Community Forums in MAR-14, 312 community representatives, representing 168 Community Development Councils from 10 clusters, participated in the CFs. Forty-nine (49) SOIs were identified and prioritized in the forums. Solutions for eighteen (18) of those SOIs were developed into Project Concept Notes (PCNs) and were submitted to the Grants team for further development and processing.

#### **ACTIVITY 1.5 INVOLVE PRRD STAFF IN STABILITY WORKSHOPS**

District Social Workers from the Nahri Sarraj and Zaranj districts were mostly absent from the district centers. When present, the PRRD DSWs chose not to participate in the MRRD community forums. PRRD DSW absenteeism continues to be the norm for activity 1.5. For additional information, see the DSW Trainings and Program Participation Status table in Annex C of this document.

#### **ACTIVITY 1.6 PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO DISTRICT ENTITIES IN UNDERSTANDING, MONITORING AND REPORTING STABILIZATION ISSUES AND TRENDS**

After being under development for several months, this activity has completed testing and was approved for implementation by the COP. The Stability Technical Assistance Sessions (STAS) are now intended to achieve the objectives of Activity 1.6. STAS forums will provide the District Government Officers, the District Development Assemblies, and the program grantees of the Community Development Councilmen the opportunity to: a) address their governance-related sources of instability and b) develop, monitor, and report on district stability trends on a monthly basis.

The District Entity Engagement Profile (DEEP) activities were completed in the Uruzgan districts of Tirin Kot, Chora, and Dihrawud and an initial draft was submitted from Daman District, Kandahar. Governance and Stability Program Officers conducted initial analyses and began conducting follow-up research activities necessary for determining a district's Engagement Profile Score. Engagement Profiles and Capacity Score Indexes from the Capacity Building Unit Assessments will both be utilized in STAS Forums and Periodic Stabilization Reviews.

The three Zabul district teams and the Arghandab district team are eight weeks behind in conducting the DEEP study, as these teams failed to conduct observations during FEB and MAR-2014. Following multiple discussions, these teams have assured the Regional Office Deputy Managers and Provincial Management Unit Heads that they will complete the study no later than the end of second week of April. The Helmand and Nimroz districts are on a separate STAS schedule because community forums and SOI database updates were completed at later dates than other districts.

#### **ACTIVITY 1.7 FACILITATE INTER-DISTRICT DISTRICT ENTITY MEETINGS TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION AND BEST PRACTICES IN CONNECTION WITH GOVERNANCE AND STABILITY COMMUNITY FORUMS.**

This is a possible future activity and will be dependent upon STAS Forum processes, progress toward addressing governance SOIs, stability trends, reporting capacity, and funding.

## ACTIVITY 1.8 ORGANIZE PERIODIC STABILIZATION REVIEW MEETINGS WITH IRI TEAM LEADER, STABILITY SPECIALISTS AND M&E STAFF

By MAR-2014, the Governance and Stability team has completed a majority of the formatting and data collection tasks needed to develop the presentations for this activity:

- The Periodic Stabilization Review (PSR) power point presentation for Zabul has been finalized, translated to Pashto, except for the completion of the DEEP Study by Zabul district teams.
- The PSR for presentation for Uruzgan was completed and submitted for translation to Pashto.
- The PSR presentation for Kandahar was drafted; the review process began in MAR-2014.
- Hilmand and Nimroz stability teams started SOI data compilation for their respective PSRs. See above table which outlines the core SOIs assessed from the database of over 1300 problem statements generated through all of the community forums in the five provinces.

As they are completed, these presentations will be presented at the Regional Office, as well as at the PMU offices.

## ACTIVITY 1.9 IMPLEMENT GENDER PILOT ACTIVITIES

During MAR-14, no governance and stabilization community forums were conducted exclusively for PRRD DDA Women’s Advisory Committees (WAC) in any of the districts. However, in Nimroz, where women are already mainstreamed into the community development process, female members of the Kang and Zaranj districts attended and participated in community forums.

## IR2 ACCESS TO GIROA SERVICES

**Overall Objective:** Provincial and district entities understand what organizations and provincial line departments work within their geographic areas, what kind of services they provide, and how the population can access those services.

## ACTIVITY 2.1 PROVIDE TRAINING TO PROVINCIAL LINE DIRECTORATES TO IMPROVE THEIR CAPACITY TO COLLECT, MANAGE AND REPORT INFORMATION ABOUT PROJECTS AND SERVICES

The team in Hilmand held a coordination meeting with 11 Directors or representatives from the Education, Agriculture, Public Health, Public Works Affairs, PRRD, Economy, Labor, Disaster Management, Women’s Affairs and Sector Services directorates. During the meeting, the Access to GIROA Services team invited line directorate officers to the Nahri Sarraj workshops and disseminated contact lists. The primary objective of the meeting was to develop a strategy to better produce service reports for residents of rural areas. Such reports will allow rural populaces to benefit from the government resources and services, ease communication, and improve linkages between the people and the government.

Once approved, these reports will be printed in booklets and posters. The National Disaster Management Authority did not participate in these workshops, as their staff was busy assisting flood-affected families in the field.

This milestone has been achieved in Kandahar. The Zabul, Uruzgan, and Hilmand services reports have been finalized and forwarded for management and COR review, pending text translation. This milestone should be achieved by APR 204 in the three aforementioned provinces.

The Zabul Provincial Governor approved the services report for Zabul, and the Uruzgan PRRD director approved the services report for the Uruzgan Province.

## ACTIVITY 2.2 ASSIST PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT ENTITIES TO ESTABLISH PRODUCTIVE RELATIONS

The team delivered Access to GIROA Services workshops in Zabul, to Qalat District Women Advisory Committee (WAC) members and Hilmand, Nahri Saraj DDA and CDC members.

On 03 and 04-MAR-14, 10 WAC members and seven Directorate Line Officers (DLOs) participated in the workshop, which was delivered to the Qalat District WAC. This workshop trained local female representatives to communicate and coordinate gender-related services with GIROA, and to advocate better for gender-based services in their communities.

Officers from seven line directorates participated in the WAC's Access to GIROA services workshops, including PRRD, Sector Services, Agriculture, Economy and Disaster Management. By encouraging the participation of GIROA officials, the program has been able to update the WAC members on women's services available in their area, improve familiarity with the line directorates, and foster knowledge about requisitions process and government job opportunities for women.

Similarly, the team delivered an Access to GIROA services workshop to the Hilmand, Nahri Saraj District. Fifteen DLOs and 120 DDA and CDC members participated from 17 to 20-MAR-14. The table below highlights the activities of this workshop.

During the Access to GIROA Services workshop, participants learned how to develop requisitions, submit requisitions to the appropriate line directorate, and liaise with GIROA officials. They developed lists of their needs and priorities in order to provide this information to the government. The DDA and CDC members who participated in the workshop also received contact lists of GIROA officials.

The Directorate Line Officers (DLOs) explained their roles in their respective directorates, as well as their directorates' activities in the Nahri Sarraj District. Additionally, a question and answer session was conducted between the participants and the GIROA officials.

*“This is a very good workshop, we didn’t even know these directorates before because we used to go to foreign forces (PRT) and other non-government organizations for help but now you have taught us and introduced us the government which we can benefit from it and solve our problems by the government, before this we used to complain from the government that why they are not doing anything for us and we didn’t know how to request from government- but now, we have learnt all things these and ways of accessing.”*

This milestone has been achieved in all SIKa-South targeted provinces. During the reporting period, the contact list was updated for all five targeted provinces in order to include the latest information about the line directorates.

### **MILESTONE 2D SERVICE FAIRS HELD IN EACH SIKa SOUTH APPROVED DISTRICT TO DISSEMINATE INFORMATION VIA DIRECTORATE REPRESENTATIVES, DISPLAYS AND THE GIROA SERVICES REPORTS TO BE DISTRIBUTED AS BOOKLETS AND POSTERS.**

This milestone has been achieved in the targeted districts. Additionally, the team is planning fairs to introduce the services reports for Zabul, Uruzgan, and Hilmand. These services reports have been finalized and are ready for publication and dissemination.

### **ACTIVITY 2.3 HOLD A QUARTERLY REVIEW MEETING TO EVALUATE PROGRESS AND RESULTS AND MAKE ADJUSTMENTS AS WARRANTED**

The team is in the process of collecting data about the achievements, results, challenges, and lessons learned. Adjustments will be introduced as necessary, and the QPR will be edited accordingly during APR-14.

### **ACTIVITY 2.4 INSTITUTIONALIZE THE PROJECTS AND SERVICES REPORT WITH GIROA COUNTERPARTS (PRRD)**

PRRD representatives and staff alike participated in the Access to GIROA Service Fairs/workshops. After the completion of this program, the PRRD representatives will be able to lead these activities.

### **ACTIVITY 2.5 IMPLEMENT GENDER PILOT ACTIVITIES**

The team delivered Access to GIROA Service Workshops to the Qalat WAC on 03 and 04-MAR-14, with 10 WAC members and seven DLOs in attendance. The WAC members received orientation about GIROA services, and learned the process for accessing these services in their communities. ## **IR3 COMMUNICATION AND OUTREACH**

**Overall Objective:** Provincial authorities improve their ability to communicate with district entities in order to help them better understand their population's needs and prioritize basic service delivery interventions.

### **ACTIVITY 3.1 PERIODICALLY COLLECT EXISTING POPULATION/DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH**

Relevant population and demographic data were periodically collected and made available.

### **ACTIVITY 3.2 IDENTIFY COMMUNICATIONS MANAGEMENT NEEDS FOR PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT ENTITIES**

The communications capacity assessment is a component of the overall capacity assessments initiative of the Capacity Building Unit. Assessments were conducted this month for the Women's Advisory Committees (WACs) of Arghandab, Kandahar, Qalat, Zabul, Tirin Kot, Uruzgan and Bost, Hilmand, as well as for Zaranj's DDA and Kang's DDA and DGO in Nimroz. See the Capacity Building section for the complete report.

### **ACTIVITY 3.3 ASSIST TO DEVELOP COMMUNICATION STRATEGIES TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM TEAMS**

The Communications and Outreach team continuously supported program teams in their respective projects. Such projects include using radio and television to publically promote ongoing grants projects, and conducting community forums and workshops. The team supported program teams and units in developing materials such as the Access to GIRoA Services Catalogues and service posters for Hilmand, Uruzgan and Zabul provinces. These catalogues and posters were completed this month and are now being reviewed. The team also took photos of the grants projects to document progress. Additionally, the team designed and produced a myriad of program advocacy and publicity materials. A complete list of media mechanisms used to promote Subat activities can be found in Activity 3.6.

### **ACTIVITY 3.4 DEVELOP COMMUNICATIONS AND OUTREACH TRAINING GUIDE**

The Communications and Outreach Training Guide serves as the team's manual when conducting training workshops for provincial and district entities. The team adopts a flexible approach, tailoring trainings according to the profile of the participants. For example, modules were tailored and simplified based on participants' literacy level, as well as their familiarity with traditional communications practices and media usage.

### **ACTIVITY 3.5 CONDUCT ROLLING COMMUNICATION AND OUTREACH TRAINING ACTIVITIES FOR PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT ENTITIES**

No training activities were delivered this month. As of 31-MAR-14, a total of 37 communications and outreach training activities have been conducted as follows: Kandahar-13, Hilmand-7, Uruzgan-7, and Zabul-10. Training activities are being prepared in the remaining districts, which are planned to be completed by the end of the base period. Training activities will start in Nimroz in APR-14.

### **ACTIVITY 3.6 ASSIST PROVINCIAL AUTHORITIES AND DISTRICT ENTITIES TO PREPARE AND IMPLEMENT COMMUNICATIONS ACTIVITIES**

A total of 29 media and publicity activities were conducted this month; nine town hall events, 10 radio and television news and interviews with grants beneficiaries and workshop participants including important DDA announcements, four poster designs, and six collateral materials for IR2 Service Projects. A total of 37 persons were interviewed for broadcast for these media activities. Four regular meetings were also hosted by PRRD with district entities to facilitate effective communication and immediate feedback on issues governing PRRD partnership with the districts.

**Town Hall Events.** The Subat Program joined in celebrating the International Women’s Day. Events were held in Bost and Nahri Sarraj districts of Hilmand and in Zabul on 08-MAR-14. The celebration took place in Uruzgan on 09-MAR-14 and in Nimroz on 13-MAR-14. In these events, approximately 170 people participated in Zabul, 150 in Nahri Saraj, 200 in Bost, 150 in Uruzgan, and 250 in Nimroz, where prominent individuals from the provinces led the celebrations.

Four town hall events acknowledging district leaders’ participation in Community Forums were held in Arghandab, Kandahar (18-MAR-14), in Kang, Nimroz (19-MAR-14), Nad Ali, Hilmand (29-MAR-14) and in Zaranj, Nimroz (30-MAR-14). In Arghandab, 18 women participated in a closed event, 10 of whom were from the Arghandab WAC. Seven participants were key female community representatives of Arghandab District, and one was a NABDP representative.

In Kang, the PRRD director and the district governor led the event, which was attended by approximately 160 people, 20 of whom were women.

In Nad Ali, 120 DDAs, DCCs, and CDCs were acknowledged for their participation in the Community Forums in an event that was hosted by the district governor and DCC director.

In Zaranj, 311 residents participated in the event, including 170 community leaders who received certificates. The deputy provincial governor of Nimroz, the Nimroz PRRD director, the DDA head, and government representatives lead the event. The events in Hilmand and Nimroz were extensively covered by the local media, with 21 people interviewed by local radio and television about the event.

**Radio/TV news and interviews.** Ten news broadcasts and interviews about the Program were aired across the region. Four of these media events took place in Uruzgan, while Kandahar, Nimroz, and Zabul each witnessed two media events. During the broadcasts, a total of 16 workshop participants and grants beneficiaries were interviewed. These interviews addressed a range of Program activities, including capacity building workshops, Service Report writing workshops, inauguration and close out of various grants projects, and district announcements.

In Kandahar, the Arghandab District Governor visited irrigation canal project sites in the Shuyen Wasat and Khosraw Sulfla villages on 18-MARCH-14 (SSKDAG025). Once completed, these irrigation canals will provide water to local farms, increasing the quantity of arable land. In an interview for Radio Killid, a local villager said that the canal will be extremely advantageous for farmers.

The Daman district entities hosted a close-out ceremony for the construction of a stone masonry wall (SSKDM017) on 31-MAR-14. In an interview, Sayed Abdul Ghafoor Agha stated that, “The stone masonry wall will protect the areas from rains and water from the river. It will also protect the village of Haji Amir Lalai Kalai including the market and the main road.” The news and interviews were aired by Radio Killid on 01-APR-14.

In Nimroz, RTA radio and television interviewed community forum participants in Zaranj on 11-MAR-14. CDC cluster chairman Ramatullah articulated his dedication to participating in the forums, explaining that he had learned a great deal during these workshops.

On 23-MAR-14, RTA also aired an interview of Jumma Khan Sultani from the Economic Department of Nimroz about his insights from the IR2 workshop.

In Uruzgan, the RTA reported the CB-led training for DEs in Dihrawud on 08-MAR-14 and interviewed participants. Malik Jan Gul, DDA member of Dihrawud, said he hopes that his community’s participation in these workshops will improve governance in his locality.

On 15-MAR-14, RTA aired the news at the start of the irrigation drainage grant project in Tirin Kot. Malak Muhammad Zia, head of Dayke Labage cluster, said, “This is good project for the people of this village – a project that they themselves selected.”

On 27-MAR-14, the Dihrawud District Governor, Haji Aminullah Khan, announced through RTA the elections of the new DDA chairman and deputy, Haji Bahawdin and Malik Abdul Malik, respectively.


On 30-MAR-14, at the CB-led workshops in Tirin Kot, the Subat Program awarded certificates to those who participated in the series of community forums. Haji Malik Milam Farooq, the DDA secretary, beamed, “It made us all very happy. We participated in those workshops for three months! These certificates are gifts that we will show to our families.”

In Zabul, Tarnak Radio in Qalat and Surghar Radio in Shahjoy aired news and interviews on 30-MAR-14 about the CB-led workshops conducted for Qalat DDA and DSWs. Qalat DDA Head Abdul Ali was very pleased with workshop, saying that “these are all very useful for DDA because we will be running the projects ourselves.” RTA Zabul also reported on the PRRD meetings with the districts on 25-MAR-14 with interviews with selected participants.

**ACTIVITY 3.6 CONTINUED: PRRD and District Entity (DE) Meetings.** Four planning meetings were conducted this month between PRRD with DEs. In Uruzgan, the second meeting took place on 04-MAR-14 in Dihrawud. The PRRD Director and program managers met with DDA members and tribal elders with the Dihrawud district governor. The main agenda of the meeting was the selection of the new DDA Chairman, as the incumbent had resigned few days earlier. The PRRD program managers also explained the planned and ongoing activities in Dihrawud, including those of the Subat Program.

In Zabul, the third regular meeting was held on 25-MAR-14 in PRRD/Zabul. The PRRD Director and program managers met with DDA and CDC members of Qalat, Tarnak Wa Jaldak, and Shahjoy. The meeting focused on the impact of the upcoming elections on project implementation in said districts, as well as the status of ongoing projects in the districts. RTA Zabul covered the event, interviewing participants.

In Kandahar, two regular meetings were hosted by PRRD on 25-MAR-14 and 31-MAR-14. During the first meeting, the PRRD and DDA members from Daman and Arghandab discussed the status of projects in their areas. At the second meeting, which was attended by PRRD program representatives and the SWG director, participants established a mechanism for effectively monitoring project performance. The meeting concluded with an agreement that a committee should be established consisting of PRRD, IDLG, DG, DDA, Subat program representatives, and a grantee to monitor and evaluate the projects.

#### ACTIVITY 3.7 PERIODICALLY EVALUATE PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT ENTITY COMMUNICATIONS CAPABILITIES

Following the capacity assessments, presentations were held to garner feedback from the PRRD and district entities. This feedback activity will complete the first-round of the capacity assessments. The Capacity Building team is leading these activities, which include communication capabilities assessments. Please see the Capacity Building section for further information.

#### ACTIVITY 3.8 IMPLEMENT GENDER PILOT ACTIVITIES

The first event acknowledging WAC's participation in Community Forums was conducted in Arghandab, Kandahar on 18-MAR-14, with 18 participants in attendance. A NABDP representative spoke at the event, encouraging women to unify in order to identify and address their common difficulties. She also called on the women to share what they learned to encourage others to participate in future workshops. One WAC member found the forums very useful, and stated that she hoped to attend other livelihoods trainings. "Those who reside in Naqibi Mena are mostly widows. Hopefully Subat Program can help us provide them livelihood," said Mumtaza, participant at the event.

#### IR4 GOVERNMENT SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

**Overall Objective:** Provincial authorities are able to improve basic service delivery by using GIRoA, CDCs, DDAs and ASOP DCCs, which gain capacity to plan, design, implement and monitor projects, with a focus on labor-intensive projects or productive infrastructure.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.1 SUBMIT GRANTS MANUAL AND ACTIVITY FLOW CHART FOR USAID**

The Grants Manual was approved by USAID (13-MAY-13). An amendment to the grants manual was approved in FEB-14 to provide an alternate process in the event that the Provincial Development Council does not meet to review Project Concept Notes in a timely manner.

USAID also has approved the Environmental Compliance Plan (18-JUN-13). The submissions of environmental compliance documents for individual projects to USAID and their approvals are proceeding smoothly.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.2 CONDUCT INITIAL DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH AND ASSESSMENTS IN COMMUNITIES AND DISTRICTS**

The initial research and assessments in all SIKA South districts have been completed.

The Grants team continued to collaborate with the Central Support Unit and the Governance and Stability staff members to gather information regarding participating CDCs to certify if they are not blacklisted by NSP or otherwise ineligible to receive community development projects. This purpose is to minimize the number of CDCs that may be rejected later by the Vetting Support Unit.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.3 WORK WITH DISTRICT ENTITIES TO IDENTIFY DPP PROJECTS**

Preparation of Project Concept Notes (PCNs) in the new districts continued at a rapid pace during MAR-14. In the following 12 districts, there were 345 PCNs at various stages of preparation: Qalat (32), Tarnak Wa Jaldak (25), Shahjoy (18), Bost (47), Tirin Kot (37), Chora (37), Dihrawud (32), Garmser (38), Nad Ali (24), Nahri Saraaj (20), Zaranj (17), and Kang (14). These PCNs have total estimated value of \$11,426,658. There were 34 PCNs produced in MAR-14.

Small-scale infrastructure projects continue to be the predominate project type. Some clusters have requested vocational training, but the Program decided to consolidate all such projects at the district level for efficiency and equity, and to free up resources for other projects in the cluster. The respective DDAs will be the grantees for these projects, under close collaboration with DoLSA and other relevant agencies. The most requested vocational trainings have been motorcycle maintenance and repair projects.

The approvals of PCNs by the DDAs and DGs in the four new districts (Nahri Saraaj, Zaranj, Nad Ali, and Kang) continued at a much more rapid pace than was experienced in other earlier Districts. This is due to the lessons learned by the grants teams from the earlier districts, as well as to heightened interest and collaboration by the district entities.

After completion of the Community Forums for Women's Advisory Committees (WACs), female representatives proposed a variety of projects. In Bost, Tirin Kot and Qalat Districts the PRRD and DOWA have approved the following types of projects: Bost--curtain sewing and handicrafts; Tirin Kot—cooking skills; and Qalat—bead weaving and public awareness workshops. These PCNs are under review by the Kabul office before submission to USAID for approval.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.4 DISTRICT ENTITIES PRESENT PROJECT CONCEPT NOTES FOR GIROA PROVINCIAL APPROVALS**

All 90 Project Concept Notes (PCN) developed by Arghandab and Daman districts in Kandahar were either approved or rejected by the DDAs/DGs, PRRD, SWG, PDC and the Governor's office in earlier months. Of these, provincial authorities approved 39 PCNs in Arghandab and 36 in Daman.

In total, the estimated value of all PCNs that have been approved by the provincial authorities is \$12,514,595.79. It is important to note that not all of these proposed projects will fully develop into grant projects.

Of the PCNs under preparation in the new districts, eight projects were approved at the provincial level during the month. The experience of the current districts is that PRRD and Sector Working Group

approvals have been obtained much quicker than was the case in Kandahar Province. However, the issue of PDC review was a problem in most new provinces, due to infrequent meetings of those committees. Letters confirming PDC review have now been obtained in Zabul and Uruzgan. In Hilmand (Bost and Garmser), the PDC decided not to review the projects and instead the Program obtained PG and DCC project review letters. The Program’s Grants Manual underwent a draft revision and was approved by USAID in order to allow Governors’ Offices to review PCNs if the PDC meeting schedules would delay the Program excessively.

The two vocational training projects in Daman district for motorcycle maintenance/repair and plumbing skills were awarded on 12-FEB-14. These trainings have not yet started due to inadequate budget provision for trainees’ transportation allowance. A solution to this problem was arrived at after consultations with DOLSA, DDA at the District Governor’s office in Daman. DOLSA agreed to provide the planned motorcycle repair and plumbing courses in three months instead of the planned four months. This arrangement allowed to a portion of the budget to be reallocated for the trainees’ travel allowance. The grants modification process is underway to receive necessary approvals to implement the trainings in the Daman and Arghandab districts.

**ACTIVITY 4.6 COORDINATE WITH PRRD, NSP AND NABDP**

The Grants teams in all the districts continue to coordinate with NSP and NABDP, mainly through attendance at weekly or bi-weekly PRRD/NSP/NABDP coordination meetings at the PRRD offices. Frequent meetings were held with other government ministries, such as DoLSA, IDLG and MoE. The teams also participated in ad hoc coordination meetings with USAID, PRRD, NSP and NABDP, and attend the plenary PDC meetings conducted by the Governors.

With the staffing completed in the expansion districts and provinces (Uruzgan, Zabul, Hilmand and Nimroz), Grants teams in those districts/provinces are attending coordination meetings with the DDAs/DGs, PRRDs, NSP officers, NABDP officers, other provincial ministry officers and the DDAs/DGs/communities.

**ACTIVITY 4.7 PROVIDE CAPACITY BUILDING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO HELP DISTRICT ENTITIES PREPARE GRANT APPLICATION PACKAGES FOR PRIORITY PROJECTS**

The Program assisted district entities with preparing 19 grants application packages in Daman District and 31 applications in Arghandab district.

In the new districts, following the USAID approvals of PCNs, there are now 28 grant application packages being prepared in Tirin Kot, 15 in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, 29 in Bost, 33 in Garmser, 24 in Chora, 15 in Shahjoy, 30 in Dihrawud, 26 in Qalat, and 13 in Nad Ali.

There is still concern about the ability of the engineering component to produce grant application packages in a timely manner. The engineering component was completing grant application packages at an approximate rate of two packages per week per district. To address this issue, smartphones were issued to each field engineer for the purpose of taking GPS coordinates of project sites, and AutoCad software was provided to all field engineers. As a result, the rate at which the engineering component is producing grant application package increased by the end of the month. These tools will hopefully continue to have a positive impact on the technical preparation of grant application packages.

Training of grantees is discussed below under Activity 4.10.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.8 OBTAIN PROJECT APPROVAL(S)**

GRC approvals of grant application packages accelerated considerably, with 27 packages approved during the reporting period. The total number of grant application packages approved by GRC to date has reached 124, with 19 in Daman, 33 in Arghandab, 11 in Bost, 13 in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, seven in Garmser, 10 in Tirin Kot, 13 in Chora, 10 in Qalat, and five in Shahjoy.

USAID approved 41 grant application packages in March, with conditions — two in Tirin Kot, eight in Chora, three in Dihrawud, four in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, five in Qalat, three in Shahjoy, six in Garmser, and 10 in Bost. There are now a total of 19 projects in Daman, 33 projects in Arghandab, 10 in Tirin Kot, 13 in Chora, three in Dihrawud, 10 in Qalat, five in Shahjoy and 13 in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, 10 in Bost, and six in Garmser.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.9 PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, GRANTS AND SUB-AWARDS TO HELP DISTRICT ENTITIES AND OTHER PROJECT IMPLEMENTING PARTNERS TO IMPLEMENT APPROVED PROJECTS**

Nineteen new grant agreements were awarded this month following the provision of Grants Implementation Training for the CDC grantees and DDAs. Three of the awards were in Daman District, three in Qalat, nine in Tarnak Wa Jaldak, two in Chora, and two in Garmser, with a total Program contribution value of \$363,984.

Two projects were completed this month but have yet to be closed out. They are as follows: SSKDDM017— Construction of retaining wall by Sahibzada CDC, Arghandab; and SSKDAG027— Construction and Repairing of Siphons implemented by Jazah CDC.

There were 26 milestone payments made in MAR-14, totaling \$161,674. Total disbursements to date are \$616,097.

#### **ACTIVITY 4.10 PROVIDE CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING TO DISTRICT ENTITIES AND PRRD TO MANAGE PROGRAMS**

During the reporting period, the Grants team conducted four grants application trainings for CDC grantees in Nad Ali and Tirin Kot (refer the table below). This training enables CDC grantee representatives to compile grants application packages for the approved PCNs.

Twelve grantee orientation trainings were conducted for CDC grantees in Daman, Chora, Qalat, and Tarnak Wa Jaldak (refer the table below). This training equips CDC and DDA representatives with grant implementation and monitoring skills.

#### ACTIVITY 4.14 IMPLEMENT GENDER PILOT ACTIVITIES

The Community Development Officer, Gender Specialist continues to coordinate with provincial officers to implement the newly created gender plan. She assisted in the development of Women Advisory Committee PCNs for Tirin Kot, Bost and Arghandab Districts, as described in Activity 4.3. She is also assisting in the final versions of the WAC PCNs.

#### ADDITIONAL RESULTS: CAPACITY BUILDING

##### ACTIVITY 5.1 ASSESS CAPACITY, IDENTIFY GAPS AND PREPARE CAPACITY BUILDING PLANS

Following the introductory meetings last month, the team finalized a series of assessment interviews for Zaranj and Kang DDAs and DGOs in Nimroz province. Likewise, the team, in collaboration with the gender specialists, conducted assessment interviews for the four pilot DDA Women's Advisory Committees (WACs) in Arghandab, Zabul Qalat, Tirin Kot and Bost districts. The table below outlines these activities.

The initial draft capacity assessment reports, including the main findings and recommendations, were compiled and are now being reviewed. It is anticipated that these capacity assessment reports will be completed in April. Upon completion, there will be a series of follow up feedback and priority setting meetings where the main findings and recommendations will be presented to the PEs and DEs for validation before preparing the corresponding capacity building plans and training schedules to be approved by respective PRD Directors, District Governors, DDA Chairmen, and Chairpersons of the DDA WACs before implementation.

Building on the previous month's preparatory work on the capacity score indices, the team completed the process of assigning the scores and compiling the initial draft reports for the DDAs and DGOs. The scoring is conducted based the various qualitative summary reports of the key findings and recommendations obtained from previous capacity assessments. It represents an ongoing effort and should be treated as a live document to be used after completion of each round of assessments. The capacity score index is a useful tool for providing baseline information on whether or not there is improvement after the trainings. The draft reports are being reviewed and will be finalized in APR-14.

The team continued providing assistance to the IR1 team on the ongoing District Entity Engagement Profile (DEEP) process in preparation for the Stability Technical Assistance Sessions and shared DGO assessment information. See Activity 1.6 for more details.

### **ACTIVITY 5.2 DEVELOP CAPACITY BUILDING MATERIALS AND EXPERTISE**

The team held a coordination meeting with the representatives of the IDLG's Capacity Institutional Development Directorate (CIDD) on 02-MAR-14 at the IDLG offices in Kabul. The discussion revolved around the need ensure proper coordination between the SIKA South Program and the IDLG on all issues of capacity building and technical assistance and ensure that their activities are aligned with the IDLG's "Capacity Building Thematic Areas Guideline for Sub National Governance Entities 2014 – 2017." During the meeting, the team also provided an update of both the planned and ongoing capacity building activities for DGOs and Provincial line directorates and demonstrated that most of the adapted training materials are aligned with the IDLG curriculum and training approaches. The Program will strive to put arrangements in place to ensure that the GIRoA recommended training materials will be adapted and restructured to form its core training curriculum and activities. The program will also compile and share the adapted training materials, source materials, capacity assessment reports, and the capacity score index

results with the IDLG. Similarly, IDLG will share with the team the latest recommended training materials to be adapted for the planned and ongoing trainings.

The team continued developing the training materials (modules/presentations, trainer’s manuals and handouts) for the scheduled trainings for DEs and PEs in Kandahar, Zabul and Uruzgan provinces. The materials were adapted from multiple sources, notably the standard IDLG, MRRD/NANBDP operational manual Afghanistan Civil Service Commission (ACSC), Ministry of Finance and other GIRoA entities’ curriculum and materials.

The team also organized and conducted the practical delivery methodologies and techniques Training of Trainers (TOTs) sessions where the materials were adapted, reviewed, and modified. The TOT process also provided an opportunity for the trainers to develop confidence in public speaking. It also enabled them to grasp and understand some of the technical concepts of the training program and set up a system for coordinating and managing the trainings. Likewise, the team continued reviewing and finalizing the necessary training materials and practical tools for the ongoing and planned post-training follow-up on-the-job trainings and technical assistance support for Arghandab and Daman DGOs in Kandahar.

### **ACTIVITY 5.3 DELIVER TRAINING AND OTHER CAPACITY BUILDING SUPPORT**

Building on last month’s momentum, the team conducted various trainings and capacity building support activities for DDA members, DGO staff and provincial line directorate staff in Kandahar, Uruzgan, and Zabul provinces. The main focus of the capacity building activities is to enhance the trainees’ individual skills development to enable them to improve their competency, working systems and procedures and effectively carry out their job requirements through improved service delivery.

Apart from one training that was conducted on 09-10-MAR-14, the rest of the capacity building program for PRRD/Kandahar and selected provincial line directorates was not implemented as planned on 17-MAR-14, forcing the postponement of the trainings. The PRRD staff boycotted the trainings, demanding transportation allowances as a condition for the resumption of training. At a follow-up meeting with the PRRD Kandahar on 25-MAR-14, it was agreed that the training program will resume in APR-14 according to the revised schedule outlined in below:

In the reporting period, the team also continued providing post-training follow-up technical support for DGOs in Kandahar province to ensure ongoing learning in the work place. Picking up from last month's initial support, the team conducted an on-the-job training titled "Report Writing" on 01-MAR-14 for the Finance and Administration Section of Arghandab DGO. The existing manual reporting systems and processes had insufficient format, structure, and content prior to the implementation of the training. Using templates adapted from the prescribed standard IDLG Office procedures Manual for District Governor Office, the team demonstrated to the DGO administrative staff on how to prepare and submit weekly, monthly, quarterly, and annual performance reports to the Provincial Governor's Office (PGO) and other GIRoA institutions. The trainers explained the value of quality reports and then coached and watched the trainee write sample reports with the introduction, main body and conclusion depending on the specific needs and priorities.

In preparation for follow-up on-the-job training and coaching sessions, the team met with Arghandab District Governor on 08-MAR-14 and provided him with an update of the completed on-the-job training sessions, as well as the schedule for future trainings. Overall, he expressed satisfaction with the technical support provided thus far and requested that the next session should focus on the "Technical Sector Section" of the DGO. However, the planned on-the-job training support for Arghandab was suspended due to security concerns and election campaigns and will resume in the second week of APR-14.

Similarly, in the absence of the Daman District Governor, the team met with the DGO Executive Manager on 25-MAR-14 at the district center and discussed the plan for post-training capacity building support. It was agreed that a series of on-the-job trainings will be conducted starting with the Administration and Finance Section in early APR-14. Apart from Arghandab and Daman DGOs, there will be future supplementary technical assistance support in the form of on-the-job trainings for other DEs and PEs in Hilmand, Nimroz, Uruzgan and Zabul provinces after the trainings. Such follow-up activities will reinforce lessons learned and will ensure that trainees continue to augment their job-related skills.

#### **ACTIVITY 5.4 EVALUATE RESULTS FOR CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT**

In the preparation for the next round of DDA and DGO trainings in Uruzgan and Zabul provinces, the team continued developing, reviewing and updating the training materials. Modifications to the training sessions were based on the trainees' feedback, suggestions, and comments from both pre- and post-training evaluations, which were conducted during initial round of trainings. Similarly, the program will strive to ensure that the revised curricula are aligned with the recommendation of the IDLG, MRRD and other GIRoA entities. This process of continuously revising training materials ensures that improved subject matter and delivery methodologies are incorporated into future versions.

## ACTIVITY 5.5 IMPLEMENT GENDER PILOT ACTIVITIES

As noted in Activity 5.1, the team, in collaboration with the gender specialists, conducted capacity interviews with the membership of the four pilot DDA Women’s Advisory Committees (WACs) in Arghandab, Zabul Qalat, Tirin Kot and Bost districts. These assessments have clearly revealed that women are not actively involved in the management and decision-making processes, due in part to capacity shortfalls. Therefore, given the acknowledgement that women would typically require more support to function effectively within the context of the DDA or the elected or selected Advisory Committees, a proportionately larger share of the capacity-building activities should be focused on female participants.

Next month, the team will finalize the assessment reports, conduct feedback and priority setting meetings, create the corresponding capacity building plans, develop the required training materials adapted from the standard IDLG and MRRD curricula and guidelines, and deliver the trainings. These gender-based capacity building activities for both the WACs and mainstream DDAs have three overriding objectives:

- To build women’s capacity to plan, organize, lead, and participate in community meetings and activities by training them on the following topics: management and leadership, budgeting, project development and implementation, and M&E.
- To help ensure that women become better advocates for women and family-focused projects, which will help ensure that such projects will be included in the DDP, in turn helping ensure funding for women and family-focused projects.
- To build the image of women as valuable leaders who should be a part of the DDA.

### ADDITIONAL RESULTS: M&E CONSIDERATIONS

In preparation for a revision to the Performance Management Plan (PMP), new indicators have been identified for IR1 (1.7), IR4 (4.8), and the CBU (5.1, 5.2, 5.3, and 5.4). These additional indicators are currently being reviewed internally before submission to USAID for final review and approval.

A Focus Group was conducted in DoWA/Kandahar, with 10 women in attendance. The results of the FG are pending translation and will be disseminated upon finalization.

In the Zaranj District, an M&E Officer attended each of the Community Forum events in order to register participants, observe the proceedings, and conduct interviews. Attendees expressed satisfaction with the Subat Program, expressed newfound knowledge about government services, and discussed techniques for identifying SOIs in their communities.

*“The program was perfect and valuable for the participants. The people didn’t know about SUBAT program before, but now they know and are aware how to work on SOIs. In addition, now we know how to work for our society, and the women have been inspired to join social program and vocational trainings.”*

Likewise, an M&E Officer attended four district entity workshops for Access to GIROA Services (IR2) in Nahri Sarraj. In the Zaranj District, an M&E Officer attended four of provincial entity workshops. During these workshops, 21 Pre- and 21 Post-event interviews were performed. The interviews have been compiled and were made available to the Access to GIROA Services team for consideration.

The Zaranj M&E Officer attended a Town Hall meeting, recording the attendance of approximately 150 individuals.

As part of the ongoing grants monitoring process, the M&E unit conducted several site visits in Arghandab, Daman, Qalat, Tarnak Wa Jaldak, Tirin Kot, and Chora districts in order to monitor and assess the progress of the grants.

## **ADDITIONAL RESULTS: GENDER CONSIDERATIONS**

International Women’s Day was celebrated on 08-MAR-14 in Zabul and Uruzgan and on 13-MAR-14 in Nimroz. Please refer to the highlights section for more detail.

In Arghandab District, Kandahar, the team delivered Access to GIROA Services (IR2) workshops to the Qalat WAC on 03 and 04-MAR-14, with 10 Women’s Advisory Committee (WAC) members and seven Directorate Line Officers in attendance. The WAC members received orientation about GIROA services, and learned the process for accessing these services in their communities.

A Town Hall event (IR3) on 18-MAR-14 acknowledged the Arghandab WAC’ completion of Governance and Stability Community Forums. A NABDP representative spoke at the event, encouraging women to unify in order to identify and address their common difficulties. She also called on the women to share what they learned to encourage others to participate in future workshops. One WAC member found the forums very useful, and stated that she hoped to attend other livelihoods trainings. “Those who reside in Naqibi Mena are mostly widows. Hopefully Subat Program can help us provide them livelihood,” said Mumtaza, participant at the event.

The Community Development Officer (IR4), Gender Specialist continues to coordinate with provincial officers to implement the newly created gender plan. She assisted in the development of Women Advisory Committee PCNs for Tirin Kot, Bost and Arghandab Districts, as described in Activity 4.3. She is also assisting in the final versions of the WAC PCNs.

### Protection Wall Keep Kuchis Safe

Bai Khan and 30 members of his family live in tents on the plains of Daman District in Kandahar Province. Khan moves his family, property and herds of sheep and goats to places where they can earn money and where the fields are green for his animals to graze. In winter, Daman is the best place to be, he advised, because it is warmer and there is a community-built protection wall constructed in the area that keeps their shelters safe from heavy flooding. The Khans are *Kuchis*, Afghanistan's nomadic population.



**Bai Khan and his *Kuchi* family feel safe settling in the plains of Daman in Kandahar after the construction of the gabion wall that protect his family, animals, and shelter away from sudden surge of flooding in the area.**

The 760-meter gabion protection wall was built by the Daman community in partnership with Subat Program and financial support from SIKA South. Local leaders, in consultation with community residents, determined solutions to problems in their communities. Under this program implemented by the Provincial Rural Rehabilitation and Development directorate, the community contributed to the construction of the gabion walls by providing the labor of 23 villagers. Apart from protecting the land from flooding, the protection wall also reduces soil erosion, thereby increasing the productivity of farms in the area. The gabion protection wall benefit 85 families around the villages of Ghra Kalai, Kshata Kalai, Haji Muhammad Shah Kalai, and Zakir Abad in Daman District. It also protects the temporary settlers in the area, like the nomadic *Kuchis*.

*Kuchis*, like Bai Khan's family, settle in Kandahar Province during winters and migrate to Zabul or Ghazni provinces for summers. Their basic food supplies are flour, tea, and sugar that they buy with the 300 Afghanis earned from daily labor. To illustrate the value of this protection wall, Bai Khan told the story about women of his tribe who bought food and supplies in the city and failed to come home one night due to a surge of flooding the area. With the protection wall, Bai Khan is confident that it will not happen again. Asked if he is returning to Daman for next winter, he replied "Of course. We always return to places where we are safe."
