### **Applications received, pre-award grants processing and disbursement of funds**

- Citizens' Voice Project signed 1 grant agreement, bringing the total number of partner organizations under the Project to 125.
- Citizens' Voice Project committed US \$22,279 during the reporting period, raising the total committed amount to US \$8,261,924.
- Citizens' Voice Project disbursed US \$526,640 during the reporting period, raising the total disbursed amount to US \$2,800,417.

### **Monitoring and Evaluation**

- The Project conducted 1 operational and 65 programmatic post-award visits, while cumulative figures stand at 32 and 121 respectively.

### **Capacity Building**

- 85 persons from 42 organizations participated in Quick Impact Trainings on voice and accountability.
- 79 persons from 41 Cycle 5 partner organizations received training on financial management, procurement and human resource management.

### **Other events and meetings**

- A Communications and External Relations (CER) Program Officer represented the project at a seminar titled 'Election Situation in Tribal Areas' conducted by 'Democracy Reporting International' at Marriot Hotel, Islamabad on April 2, 2013.
- On April 4, 2013, two CER Program Officers attended a conference on "International Standards in Election Observation" organized by the Aurat Foundation, Democracy Reporting International, Free and Fair Election Network, Human Rights Commission of Pakistan, National Democratic Institute, Special Talent Exchange Program and United Nations Development Program.
- CER Unit attended the Communications Working Group meeting conducted by DOCs at Islamabad Club on April 16, 2013.
- Manager CER and Network Administrator attended training for Implementing Partners on Pak Info database on April 16, 2013.
- Manager CER attended Voter and Civic Education Group (VEG) meeting held at IEFS office on April 22, 2013.
- CER Unit held a meeting with COR Nazeer Mahar and Colin Cram on April 26, 2013 to discuss project outreach, election related activities, success stories and events to project sub-grantee work.
- CER Program Officer attended a seminar organized by 'Consumer Rights Commission of Pakistan', a partner organization working on Energy Sector Reforms on April 29, 2013. The seminar was titled 'Natural Gas Initiative – National Consultation'.
- Director Finance, Grants and Compliance, Director Capacity Building & Organizational Development and Manager CER participated in a radio program, "Tea Time with US", on April 30, 2013. Two beneficiaries also participated in the program and talked about their experiences with partner organizations working on Energy Sector Reforms and Water Rights. Aired live between 6 to 7 pm on FM Power 99, there seemed to be genuine interest in the show and multiple calls were received throughout the program.

## 1. Monitoring, Evaluation and Research

### 1.1 Program Development and Research

Program Development and Research (PDR) Unit completed the Urdu version questionnaire for Semi-Structured Interview (SSI) and Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) for Grants Cycle 1. In order to conduct these FGDs, three teams were constituted to visit the grantees. Field visits were conducted from April 21, 2013 to April 30, 2013. SSIs were carried out with CEO/Chairman, Program Manager, and Field Staff of the grantee and line department or focal person who was engaged during the project. FGDs were carried out with the beneficiaries of the project.

## 2. Finance, Grants and Compliance

### 2.1. Grants

#### 2.1.1. Post-Award Reviews

- During the month, the Grants Unit issued a task order to AASR-GT for post award financial monitoring and follow up on Capacity Action Plan of 1 grantee relating to 'Citizens' Oversight of Municipal Services' under Cycle 1. The need for this review was necessitated due to non-submission of financial reports by the grantee for a long time while the activities under the grant continued as per plan. It was important to determine whether there were capacity gaps related to financial record keeping and control or whether the activities were being funded by the organization itself or under another grant. The results of this exercise are awaited.
- Meetings were held with two grantees i.e. AGHE and AJKRSP for issues being faced by them with respect to implementation. The Unit advised them to submit formal requests for well thought out modifications required in their work plans. AGHE was facing issues with the GB government while AJKRSP was undergoing management crisis and reportedly a suit was filed in the court at AJK for reversal of management changeover imposed by the AJK government on AJKRSP.
- M&E Manager was advised to prepare a summary of complaints and their status for the information of USAID/OIG. Progress is underway on this matter.

#### 2.1.2. Award of Grants

- One grant was awarded during the month under thematic area 'Citizens Voice for Free Fair and Peaceful Elections' under Cycle 5 for Punjab. After the award of 41 grants in March 2013, the project requested approval of another 42 grants under cycle 5 and 1 grant for media cum elections under cycle 4 on March 14, 2013. Given the status of incremental funding, USAID only approved 23 grants for cycle 5 and 1 media cum elections grant for cycle 5. This approval was still subject to availability of incremental funding. USAID provided incremental funding of \$1.25 million on April 9, 2013. However, it was not optimal to award grants due to shortage of remaining time.

\*\* Difference of 18 between approved and signed grants is due to the fact that 4 have been put on hold by USAID pending increase in obligated amount for the project and revision of design for these grants due to changed circumstances, 8 have been put on hold by the project for several reasons including performance issues related to an already existing grant, reassessment of capacity and awaited reference checks and 6 applicants withdrew the application.

### 2.1.3. Modification to Award of Grants

13 modifications to the awards under Cycle 1 and 2 were made during the month. These modifications relate to no cost extensions and increase in obligated amount. 2 of these modifications are under thematic area “Citizens’ Oversight of Municipal Services”, 4 under “Improving Water Rights”, 4 under “Improving Water Rights” and 3 under “Citizens’ Voice for Effective Legislative Governance”. The remaining amount of grants, assessed to remain un-utilized was also de-obligated in certain cases. The no-cost extensions were already anticipated due to delay in provision of first advance payment for these grants which resulted in delayed start-up. The project could not pay advance due to delay in receipt of funds from USAID which was due to their internal procedural requirements.

### 2.1.4. Post Award Orientation

Two sessions of post award orientation were carried out for 24 awardees under Cycle 3. These sessions included presentations related to the Letter of Grant (LoG), M&E and Financial Reporting.

### 2.1.5. Technical Assistance to Sub-awardees

Existing sub-awardees were provided technical assistance in the areas of financial management, record keeping and reporting on a daily basis. The TAF team and project team for grants coordinated with sub-awardees for any issues that they faced and guided them about the required standards of record keeping and reporting for USAID grants.

### 2.1.6 Process Improvements

This month, the project had to process the first batch of grants to be closed out. This provided an opportunity to review and improve the checklist and intimation letters from subawards manual. Accordingly, the close out forms were revised and improved. GMIS was also updated by the MIS team for inclusion of close out tab in the system.

A review of grantee communication and complaints was carried out as a follow up of an informal complaint by one of the grantees. The following recommendations were made and work is in progress on these:

- One important issue that was identified was that the M&E field visit observations were not shared with the grantee. This needs to be institutionalized in the spirit of teamwork and transparency that M&E team should bring back their filled checklist and notes, discuss points with the grantee and communicate these back in writing to the grantees to solicit their inputs as well as follow up on any agreed upon corrective actions.
- It may also be considered that the M&E checklist be shared with the grantees in advance so that the expectations could be managed. The M&E team can however go beyond the checklist to a reasonable extent if some irregularities are discovered.
- Direct feedback and complaint mechanism system on GMIS should be put in place immediately and grantees should be notified of the same. In the absence of this, we are not providing a channel to our grantees which may cause frustration among them. Also, the complaints should be linked with the performance management system of our staff.
- The focal person(s) nominated in a complaint should be rotated and the new focal person must remain vigilant of any hidden issues and immediately perform an M&E visit of the grantee to build rapport and make efforts diligently to find out whether the complaint was genuine, misunderstood or malafide. This vigilance will be very helpful for the project to avert or manage any consequences of malafide complaints.
- There should be some senior level interaction with the grantees, other than focal points so that if there are issues with focal points or their managers, other mechanisms are available. The feedback form would do the needful. However, senior management interaction has its own value other than monitoring and issue related exercises.
- An interpersonal communications training needs to be provided to all staff working with grantees, since although the staff is experienced, interpersonal communication is not something that is everyone’s strength.
- Rotation of focal points or at least reviews independent of focal points should be considered.

### 2.1.6. Other Capacity Building and Supportive Initiatives

Certain administrative tasks were carried out to support project workflow with respect to contractual matters:

- Joint review of subcontractor invoices was conducted with the TDEA Secretariat, Compliance and Project teams.

- Review of draft invoices for the period to USAID and coordination of routine tasks with respect to project financial management.
- Review of TAF 209 (Grantee financial reports) and provision of guidance on resolving outstanding issues.
- Coordination with USAID OAA/OFM and OD&G for different information required by them.
- Review and clearance of request for advance payment and financial reports for the period.
- Review and submission of monthly grants report to USAID.
- Advise to COP about process improvements in respect of solicitation, selection and outreach.
- Revised the budget forecast of TAF's component of CVP for FY-13.
- Coordination and provision of information to AASR-GT for routine compliance matters.
- Review of accruals for the quarter ended March 31, 2012 for submission to USAID.
- Review and submission of the realignment and no-cost extension request for the project to TDEA.
- Support operations department with procurement planning and guidance on obtaining tax exemptions.
- Security Manager of the project attended an orientation on Security SOPs at TAF office for his capacity building.


## 2.2. Finance



#### 3.1. Partners' Training

##### 3.1.1. Quick Impact Trainings (QIT)

##### Finance, HR and Procurement Trainings

During the month training for Grant Cycle 5 grantees was conducted from April 9 to April 11, 2013. Total of 41 organizations attended this training session being represented by 79 participants.

### **Programmatic Trainings**

During the month, various QITs were implemented under the theme of free, fair and peaceful elections, in line with the increasing needs and demands for elections related process. Three day training was held for CSOs in Multan and Karachi from April 3 to April 9, 2013, similar trainings were executed in Islamabad on the same dates. Another day-long session was organized at The Asia Foundation (TAF) Office on April 19, 2013 where three participants attended the training including one member from INSAAF Network and 2 from NRDP (partner organization). This makes a total of 42 organizations which participated in these trainings with 85 participants trained.

- The OTI Database was reworked to take into account USAID requirements of the post award phase. Numerous meetings with NRSP representatives were carried out for the purpose. Data is being updated as per the new requirements and will be submitted to USAID in due course.

#### 5.3 GMIS

Following tasks were performed with regards to GMIS:

- MSF indicators module was added for PakInfo.
- District spending module was added for PakInfo.
- PDR module was added for PakInfo.
- A module for M&E was designed and developed to add field activities.
- Close out table, related section filters and hide option were added.

### 6. Communications and External Relations

During the reporting period, Communications and External Relations (CER) unit completed the following key tasks:

- A Communications and External Relations (CER) Program Officer represented the project at a seminar titled 'Election Situation in Tribal Areas' conducted by 'Democracy Reporting International' at Marriot Hotel, Islamabad on April 2, 2013.
- On April 4, 2013, two CER Program Officers attended a conference on "International Standards in Election Observation" organized by the Aurat Foundation, Democracy Reporting International, Free and Fair Election Network, Human Rights Commission of Pakistan, National Democratic Institute, Special Talent Exchange Program and United Nations Development Program.
- CER Unit attended the Communications Working Group meeting conducted by DOCs at Islamabad Club on April 16, 2013.

- Manager CER and Network Administrator attended training for Implementing Partners on Pak Info database on April 16, 2013.
- Manager CER attended Voter and Civic Education Group (VEG) meeting held at IEFS office on April 22, 2013.
- CER Unit held a meeting with COR Nazeer Mahar and Colin Cram on April 26, 2013 to discuss project outreach, election related activities, success stories and events to project sub-grantee work.
- CER Program Officer attended a seminar organized by 'Consumer Rights Commission of Pakistan', a partner organization working on Energy Sector Reforms on April 29, 2013. The seminar was titled 'Natural Gas Initiative – National Consultation'.
- As an ongoing activity, events calendar of the project and sub-grantees were updated and shared with USAID for the month of April, 2013.
- Communications Unit reviewed and approved 234 submissions of advocacy, IEC and BCC materials for USAID Branding and Marking Compliance.
- Feedback and complaint forms for sub-grantee organizations were completed. Subsequently they will also be uploaded on the new project website.
- Communications Unit is working on developing a resource center at the project office. This will include publications produced by sub-grantees like training manuals, IEC material, reports and any other project related material and activity photographs. In this regard the unit has started collecting the documents.
- Communications Unit prepared weekly reports on election-related activities titled Election News.
- The Unit prepared design, layout and content of the new website.
- Director Finance, Grants and Compliance, Director Capacity Building & Organizational Development and Manager CER participated in a radio program, "Tea Time with US", on April 30, 2013. Two beneficiaries also participated in the program and talked about their experiences with partner organizations working on Energy Sector Reforms and Water Rights. Aired live between 6 to 7 pm on FM Power 99, there seemed to be genuine interest in the show and multiple calls were received throughout the program.
- The Unit prepared two success stories of sub-grantee organizations i.e. of Damaan and The Network which have been submitted to USAID and progress is underway for other success stories.

## 7. Election Information Monitoring System (EIMS)

### Election Web Portal

Election Web Portal [www.electionpakistan.org](http://www.electionpakistan.org) was launched on April 11, 2013, carrying comprehensive election-related information including, but not limited to the following:

- **Election History:** Provides relevant statistics about voter registration, voter turnout, votes polled to parties and constituency-based results since 1970.
- **Observation Findings:** Provides information about elections violations on a daily basis.
- **Citizens' Comments:** Concerns of citizens reported about the administration of the 2013 General Elections to FAFEN and/or the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and corrective action sought from state authorities.
- **Vote Rationally:** Provides score cards of all Members of the National Assembly (MNAs) 2008-2013, as well as candidates' asset statements and other resources to help citizens scrutinize and assess elected representatives' past performance and financial transparency.
- **Election Resources:** Provides importance resources such as The Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Election Commission of Pakistan Code of Conduct, Election Laws etc.
- **Election Developments:** Provides information on election developments like political parties' manifestos, seat adjustments and other important current news on elections.

The Election Web Portal generated immense interest in the general population and a total of 287,729 hits were received by the end of April 2013. The key statistics are as follows:

#### **Integration of EIMS with Punjab Government, KP Government and DAWN Online Portal**

EIMS was integrated with Punjab Government’s Election Monitoring Cell through Punjab Information Technology Board. They also started using Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) reports to take corrective measures. A formal Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is also being contemplated.

EIMS was also integrated with the KP Government and all election-related information provided by FAFEN was made available on the Information Department’s website. Additionally, KP Government also solicited support to deploy an online election complaints receiving mechanism. Besides this, Dawn’s Online Portal also began using information shared through FAFEN’s tweets on their homepage. A formal MoU was also signed.

#### **Complaints Mechanism for National Commission on Status of Women**

EIMS developed a complaints mechanism for the National Commission on Status of Women (NCSW) and integrated it within the Election Web Portal. This enabled NCSW to receive complaints from across Pakistan on violations of women’s electoral rights. A formal MoU was signed with NCSW.

### **8. Challenges Faced**

During the month of April, the project faced and responded to certain challenges. The most significant of these are highlighted below:

- The Security condition was a key challenge for the Project as well as partner organizations especially with regard to election-related activities. The M&E team faced security challenges in conducting field visits to Balochistan, KP and certain parts of Sindh, and special measures had to be taken to ensure their safety. Visits also had to be delayed in light of the security conditions.
- In several instances, grantees were unable to conduct election-related activities such as setting up election camps and organizing candidates’ forums, due to prevailing security situation. Citizens’ Voice Project is taking steps to respond to needs of adjustment/amendment in the contracts in these cases, so that funds provided through our grants are efficiently used towards the set objectives. However, progress may have been affected because of this.




