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BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

While working on promotion investments to the hydropower sector with potential investors, international financial institutions and Georgian energy stakeholders, USAID HPEP identified a number of issues that need to be resolved to create a solid trading platform for Georgia to sell power to neighboring countries, Eastern Europe and Turkey, which would be the main stimulus for boosting private investments. Turkey's power market is based on EU energy legislation, such that Turkey has enacted and implemented specific EU-compliant rules and procedures. This means that any non-EU country that Turkey trades with must, in turn, also comply with a subset of key EU rules.

Through the conference, HPEP contributes to its goal of facilitating private sector development of Georgia's hydropower resources that are environmentally, socially and economically sound. By linking buyers and sellers of cross-border clean energy, HIPP anticipates to enhance the potential for regional electricity trade, thereby contributing to economic and social development and energy security.

The event was organized specifically for regional energy sector representatives. The goals of the event include: connect electricity sellers and off-takers to facilitate the trade of clean energy across an international border, including into competitive power markets, build capacity of Georgian attendees so they better understand international electricity trading, review ongoing reforms in the Georgian energy sector, discuss financing opportunities for new HPPs, review Georgian Energy

Policy/Strategy, enable international power market players and regional counterparts to share their views and experiences with one another, include young female leaders in Georgian energy sector and look forward to a balanced representation from both male and female presenters.

Themes

The Conference had excellent presentations and lively discussions among members of the audience and speakers. Questions below were raised around the following topics:

Capacity allocation rules, congestion management and interconnection capacity auctioning rules – currently and in the future

Explicit and Implicit Auctions/Turkey-Georgia Market Coupling and first steps toward Day Ahead Market in Georgia

Export/Import rules and regulations

Regional price trends and trade opportunities.

Uses of EFET master agreements and differences between ESA and EFET.

Outcomes

HPEP 3rd Cross Border Electricity Trading Conference participants acknowledged high importance of implementing GEMM 2015 as Turkey continues its rapid move toward full energy market liberalization and harmonization with the European Union, and therefore Georgia should also adopt many legislative and market-based reforms to keep pace with the regional developments and enable electricity producers benefit from trading in the Turkish and European electricity markets where electricity demand is quickly outstripping their ability to supply.

The Conference provided a golden opportunity for informal meetings and exchanging information between the government and business representatives from Georgian, Azerbaijani, Turkish, European, and other regional countries' energy sectors. Multiple B2B meetings took place during the Conference.

Conference participants highly appreciated USAID/HPEP's efforts to build capacity of the energy stakeholders for promoting the development of competitive electricity market in Georgia and the whole region. Based on the feedback of the Conference participates the organization and the scope of the conference was excellent.

Third Cross-Border Electricity Trading Conference is opened

On July 10, 2014 at 10:00 o'clock Deputy Ministers of Energy, Mariam Valishvili and Illia Eloshvili, and USAID/Caucasus Mission Director, Stephen Haykin opened the third Cross-Border Electricity Trading Conference at Sheraton Metechi Palace Hotel, Tbilisi. A two-day Conference is held by the U.S. Government-supported Power and Energy Planning Project (HPEP) to promote private sector development in Georgia's clean energy industry.

The Conference targets regional energy sector representatives and aim to: connect electricity suppliers with off-takers to facilitate regional clean energy trade. The Conference is to facilitate discussions on ongoing reforms in the energy sector, financing opportunities for new HPPs, and Georgian Energy Policy and Strategy.
