

Three Main Types of Training



1. Forest Carbon project development



- Trained CI staff & partners in many of our country offices

- Online training materials & courses developed w/ Multi-NGO group

- Supported development and testing of Training of Trainers course

- 30 trainings with over 1000 people in 19 countries trained so far

2. REDD+ Readiness Planning



3. Training for community & indigenous peoples representatives and organizations



1. Forest Carbon Project Development Training



- **Objective:** introduce project developers to the basics of climate change science, policy, markets, and project development
- Originally developed for CI country staff working on site-level projects
- **Audience:** broad mix NGO partners, government reps, and other stakeholders
- Delivered 10 trainings to >350 people in Brazil, Costa Rica, Peru, DR Congo, Ecuador, Indonesia, Liberia, EG and Madagascar from 2007-2010
- Respond to requests from CI field programs or project opportunities

Multi-NGO Partnership



- Partnership formed between international conservation NGOs to deliver a series of similar trainings in geographies of mutual interest to stimulate policy development and field action.
- Joint trainings delivered in Bali, DRC, Guatemala, Peru, >200 participants

Online Introductory Course on REDD+

- **Objectives** increase understanding and engagement in REDD+ policy negotiations at the national and international levels.
- Provides a basic level of understanding regarding the REDD+ concept
- Consists of 4 modules covering the essential aspects of the scientific, technical, political, financial, social and environmental issues related to REDD+ design and implementation
- Provides a course certificate to participants for successful completion

2. REDD Readiness trainings

- **Objective**: promote national level dialogues on participation in REDD+
- Prepare for participation in mechanisms such as World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF)
- **Audience**: key government officials and CSO working on REDD+ Readiness
- Topics include:
 - Intro to REDD+ Readiness,
 - international readiness initiatives,
 - examples of national strategies,
 - technical MRV issues,
 - working sessions (roadmap)
- CI has co-facilitated events in Peru, Guatemala, Liberia, Suriname, Ecuador, Chiapas-Mexico, Equatorial Guinea




3. Local Stakeholder trainings

- **Objective**: strengthen understanding & participation of IPs and other local stakeholders in climate change issues related to forests and adaptation
- **Audience**: Local NGOs; indigenous organizations, local government, local community leaders
- Adapted a community focused forest carbon project course
 - Piloted in DRC April 2009
- **Evolved into a Training of Trainers Course**
 - **Piloted in Guyana in Nov 2009**
- ToT materials produced including presentations & training manuals, available in eight languages



Training of Trainers: Climate Change & the Role of Forests





4. Developing tools to support stakeholder engagement accountability


