PROJECT SUMMARY

In Davao Oriental, Plan International is currently implementing a project entitled “*Increasing Community Disaster Preparedness*” in the areas affected by Typhoon Bopha in December 2012. The project aims to increase the awareness, knowledge and skills of vulnerable communities on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management as well as on Climate Change Adaptation.

During the first phase, Plan focused in increasing the disaster preparedness and response capability of 12 vulnerable barangays in Typhoon Bopha-affected coastal municipalities of Baganga, Cateel, and Boston. By focusing on enhancing the disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) capacities of local government units (LGUs) at the barangay and municipal levels, the project enhanced the resilience of the target barangays through community and school-based DRRM interventions.

In the second phase, the project has employed similar approaches to expand the geographic scope, impact and achievement of the project’s objectives to 16 new barangays (4 in Baganga; 2 in Boston; 4 in Cateel; and 6 in a new expansion municipality of Caraga). As in the project’s first phase, the targeted barangays are still recovering from the impacts of Typhoon Bopha, remain highly vulnerable to the impacts of natural disasters, and do not have functioning Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BDRRMC). The extension phase is increasing the preparedness and response capacities among localities and their vulnerable populations, introducing these benefits to an expansion municipality (Caraga), and strengthening partnerships with local government units and community organizations in Davao Oriental.

SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS

During the reporting period, several activities were conducted with support from the key Government DRR Stakeholders underscoring disaster preparedness and climate change adaptation in the areas covered by the project. Below are the specific activities for this period:

DRR Local Champions Training. The second batch of DRR Local Champions Training was conducted on April 14 to 16, 2015 with a total of forty eight (48) participants (*female: 24; male: 24*) from the covered barangays of Caraga, Cateel, and Boston who successfully completed the training modules. The DRR and CCA champions were trained on how to facilitate disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation orientation more effectively to different types of audiences. After the training, the participants conducted awareness-raising activities in their respective barangays to help mainstream DRR and CCA in the schools and communities.

Sitio-Based Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) Symposia. The Sitio-based DRR and CCA Symposia were conducted by the trained DRR Champions in their respective barangays. A total of three thousand four hundred twenty four (3,424) individuals (*male: 1,290; female: 2,000; boys: 56; girls: 78*) from the covered barangays of Caraga, Baganga, Cateel and Boston were reached during the sitio-based DRR and CCA symposia. The activity aims to increase the awareness of the community people on the potential hazards that are present in their communities as well as to provide orientation on disaster mitigation and early warning systems.

Barangay Special General Assembly. The general assembly is an essential part to ensure that community members are consulted and participate on the development of contingency plans. A total of three thousand three hundred seventy one (3,371) individuals have participated in the Barangay General Assembly in the covered barangays last April and May 2015. In addition, an induction ceremony was also administered to the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee to formally recognize them and be known to the community members.

Training on Contingency Planning and Emergency Operations Management. A total of twenty eight (28) members of the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) of Caraga (*males-16; females-12*) have attended the training on contingency planning and emergency

operations management on May 27 to 29, 2015 which was conducted by Plan International in partnership with the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (PDRRMC) and the Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP). The activity aims to increase the knowledge of the MDRRMC on disaster mitigation and management and to fully understand their roles and functions.

Community Emergency Drills and Simulations. The community and school-based emergency drill and simulations were conducted to test the contingency plans and to enhance the awareness of community members on how to respond during actual emergencies. A total of four thousand four hundred forty five (4,445) individuals (*female: 2,170; male: 1,521; girls: 397; boys: 357*) individuals from the target barangays of Baganga (Lucod, Mikit, Batawan, and Lambajon), Cateel (Baybay, San Vicente, Alegria, San Miguel), Boston (Caatihan and Carmen), and three of the six target barangays of Caraga (San Jose, San Antonio, Lamiawan) have participated in the community drill. The trained ERT members together with the BDRRMCs led the exercises which focus on the early warning systems, designated evacuation centers, search and rescue operations, camp management, and coordination mechanisms during disasters.

Training of Teachers on the Utilization of Self-Learning Kits. One of the components/pillars of the comprehensive school safety program is the integration of DRR and CCA which is also an essential mechanism to mainstream DRR and CCA in schools. In Davao Oriental, a total of ninety five (95) primary school teachers (*female: 65; male: 30*) were trained on the utilization and management of the self-learning kits which were developed by thirty one (31) curriculum teacher writers.

Result 1. To improve the capacity of local governments to respond to disaster events and to effectively reduce risks through local ordinances, PPAs (programs, projects and activities) and resource mobilization for DRR

Activity 1: Orientation on the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 (Republic Act No. 10121) and the Climate Change Law, including the National DRRM Framework and Plan

28 members of the MDRRMC of Caraga (*male-16; female-12*) were provided with orientation on Republic Act 10121, National Framework on disaster risk reduction, and the National Framework on the Climate Change Adaptation strategy during the Training on Contingency Planning and Emergency Operations Management last May 27 to 29, 2015. The activity was in collaboration with the PDRRMC and the Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP).

Activity 2: Support creation of BDRRMC in each of sixteen (16) target barangays.

In support to the creation of BDRRMC in the sixteen (16) target barangays, an induction ceremony was done with the members of the BDRRMCs through the MDRRMC Action Officers during the barangay special general to formally recognized them as the structure mandated to ensure preparedness and resiliency at the barangay level. The BDRRMCs has also issued an executive order to support the creation of their committee. (*Please see attached scanned copy of Executive Orders in Annex B*)

Activity 3: Training on hazards, vulnerability and capacity analysis and local disaster risk reduction and management planning.

Activity completed. Accomplishment reported in the previous quarterly report.

Activity 4: Training on contingency planning and emergency operations management.

28 members of the MDRRMC of Caraga (*male-16; female-12*) have participated in the Training on Contingency Planning and Emergency Operations Management last May 27 to 29, 2015 which was in collaboration with the PDRRMC and Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP). The contingency plan of the municipality of Caraga is now on its second reading.

Activity 5: Organization of Emergency Response Teams (ERTs).

The Emergency Response Teams (ERTs) who were trained on Mountain Search and Rescue Operation (MOSAR) and Water Search and Rescue Operation (WASAR) respectively were provided with ERT equipment and uniforms which will be used during disaster and emergency situations. A total of one hundred seventy (170) ERTs were provided with equipment and uniforms and four (4) target barangays: San Miguel and San Vicente in Cateel, Lamiawan and Poblacion in Caraga, were given a one-unit rescue boat which were also used during the community emergency drills and simulations to test its quality and capacity.

Activity 6: Training of ERTs.

Activity completed. Accomplishment reported in the previous quarterly report.

Activity 7: Conduct of emergency drills.

4,445 individuals have participated in the community and school-based emergency drills in the fifteen target barangays of the project: San Miguel, San Jose, Lamiawan, San Antonio, Don Leon Balante in Caraga; Mikit, Lambajon, Lucod, and Batawan in Baganga; San Miguel, San Vicente, Alegria, and Baybay in Cateel; Carmen and Caatihan in Boston (Barangay Poblacion, Caraga is not included since their community drill is scheduled on July 18). The objective of the activity is to simulate and test the

contingency plans that were developed by the BDRRMCs as well as to increase the awareness of the community people on the warning systems, evacuation routes and identified sites, and coordination mechanisms during disasters and emergencies. In the same manner, as part of the continuous partnership with the provincial and municipal stakeholders, the Philippine Coast Guard, PDRRMC, MDRRMC, and PNP were part of the evaluation panel who carefully observed and assessed the execution of drills.

Result 3: To increase the awareness and understanding of local populations (including women, children, the elderly, and other vulnerable groups), on hazards confronting their communities, and develop their capacities to participate in DRR activities

Activity 1. Orient communities on DRRM and CCA

The Sitio-based DRR and CCA Symposia were conducted by the trained DRR Champions in their respective barangays. A total of three thousand four hundred twenty four (3,424) individuals (*male: 1,290; female: 2,000; boys: 56; girls: 78*) from the covered barangays of Caraga, Baganga, Cateel and Boston were reached during the sitio-based DRR and CCA symposia. The activity aims to increase the awareness of the community people on the potential hazards that are present in their communities as well as to provide orientation on disaster mitigation and early warning systems.

Activity 2. Develop local champions on DRR and CCA.

The second batch of DRR Local Champions Training was conducted on April 14 to 16, 2015 with a total of forty eight (48) participants (*Male: 24; Female: 24*) from the covered barangays of Caraga, Cateel, and Boston who successfully completed the training modules. The DRR and CCA champions were trained on how to facilitate disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation orientation more effectively to different types of audiences. After the training, the participants conducted awareness-raising activities in their respective barangays to help mainstream DRR and CCA in the schools and communities.

Activity 3. Support the advocacy works of DRR and CCA champions.

In support to the advocacy works of DRR champions, IEC materials were distributed to them which they can use in the conduct of sitio-based DRR and CCA symposia in their respective barangays. One of the good practices worth sharing was the integration of DRR to the Family Development Sessions (FDS) of the *Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino* Program (4Ps) in Baganga. It is also noteworthy to mention that some of the DRR champions were invited by religious groups and other sectors to provide orientation on DRR and CCA.

Activity 4. Document learning and good practices on DRR and CCA.

In Barangay Alegria, Municipality of Cateel, the BDRRMC displays IEC materials in a strategic area where people can see and read important information on DRR and CCA.

In the Municipality of Baganga, DRR and CCA were integrated in the Family Development Sessions (FDS) of the *Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino* Program (4Ps) of the Department of Social Welfare and Development. The DRR Champions coordinates with the Municipal Link Officers of 4Ps in the conduct of FDS. Furthermore, the DRR Champions were also invited by religious groups and other sectors to provide orientation on DRR and CCA during their assemblies.

The PDRRMC, Plan International, and PBSP collaborate during the training with the MDRRMC of Caraga on May 27 to 29, 2015. PBSP provided inputs on the National Framework of DRR and facilitated the review of the DRRM plan as well as the contingency plan while Plan International facilitated the workshop on crafting the contingency plan based on the standard template.

The MDRRMC of Boston received the award of “**Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG)**” from the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG). The SGLG symbolizes integrity and good performance of the local government. One of its indicators is the preparedness of the local government in disasters and calamities and it is worth mentioning that the Municipality of Boston has

trained ERTs and their contingency plan which was crafted during the Phase 1 of the ICDP project is in place which gave them a high score and won the SGLG award. Furthermore, the contingency plan of Boston, through the joint project of the Office of the Civil Defense Region XI and PBSP, will be used as a model throughout the Philippines.

The MDRRMC of Baganga has prepared their application for Climate-Adaptive and Disaster-Resilient Cities and Municipalities (CLAD) Award, a project initiated by Senator Loren Legarda that seeks to honor cities and municipalities that have excelled in climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction (CCA-DRR) by incorporating relevant laws in their local development plans. As of now, their pertinent documents are on its second review.

Result 4: To link local communities and government units with key government DRRM technical stakeholders for the development of Community-Based Early Warning Systems (CBEWS).

Activity 1: Establishment of Community-Based Early Warning Systems

The installation of flood level indicator device in the target areas identified is on-going. This device will provide early warning signal to the community residents especially those who are situated near the riverbanks should water level rises during heavy rains.

Activity 2: Integrate CBEWS practices and learnings into local planning, procedures, and policies.

The Community-Based Early Warning System was integrated to the contingency plans of the sixteen (16) target barangays: Carmen and Caatihan in Boston; San Miguel, San Vicente, Alegria, and Baybay in Cateel; Lucod, Mikit, Batawan, and Lambajon in Baganga; DL Balante, Lamiawan, San Jose, San Miguel, San Antonio and Poblacion in Caraga; and one (1) municipal level which is the Municipality of Caraga.

CHALLENGES

- Availability of schedule of school and community partners in the conduct of activities due to town fiestas and other events in the community. Since most of target barangays had their town fiestas on the months of May and June, the community-based activities such as general assembly and community emergency drills were moved to other dates. Nonetheless, these activities were still conducted within the timeline this quarter.
- Unpredictable weather has delayed activities in the project areas especially in the upland and hard to reach remote areas. When heavy rain pours, the roads are difficult to pass and water level in waterways rise.
- Security threat in Boston, Cateel, and Tarragona. Last May 2015, there were reported encounters between the PNP and the New People's Army in some barangays of Boston, Cateel, and Tarragona (outside the covered barangays of Plan). To ensure that staff are safe and to avoid being trapped should encounter escalates to other barangays, staff were advised not to travel to the target areas until the situation becomes stable and when the alert is lifted by the PNP.
- Rotational brownout in the target areas. This affects the conduct of training activities since the Community Development Facilitators had to borrow or rent generator sets so that they can continue and pushed through with the activities that they have scheduled.

COORDINATION/ FACILITATING FACTORS

- The project continues and maintains a good relationship with the Barangay Council and community stakeholders. They have helped in the mobilization of people to ensure that there is high level of participation during the community-based activities (i.e., sitio-based DRR symposia, barangay general assembly, and community emergency drill and simulation)
- Engaged the DOST, Philippine Coastguard Southeastern Mindanao, and PDRRMC in the assessment and selection of communities for the installation of Manual Water Level Gauge and provision of Rescue boats.

- Strong partnership and collaboration with the Philippine Coastguard Southern Mindanao, PDRRMC, Philippine Army, Philippine National Police, MDRRMC, and PBSP in the conduct of community-based activities such as MDRRMC training for Caraga, sitio-based DRR and CCA symposia, and community emergency drills and simulations.
- Participated in the inter-agency meeting led by the PDRRMC to share and learn the good practices on DRR and CCA in Davao Oriental and explore possible collaboration in future activities. The inter-agency meeting was participated by various NGOs: Handicapped International under its SURGE project, Plan International, and PBSP.
- Strong support of the Department of Education Division of Davao Oriental during the conduct of Teachers Training on the Utilization of Self-Learning Kits last July 01 to 04, 2015. As a form of their support to the activity, the Division of Davao Oriental has issued a memorandum to charge the transportation of teacher participants to DepEd through their MOOE. The SLKs will be distributed to the covered schools by July 2015.

PROCUREMENT

The project has completed the procurement for ERT equipment, ERT uniforms, rescue boats, flood level indicator device and warning bells, and IEC materials on early warning messages. These were already distributed to the target barangays for Phase 2.

The DRR Self-Learning Kits will be reproduced and turned-over to the target schools by July 2015.
