Executive Summary

One of the key components of the Accelerating Sustainable Agriculture Program (ASAP) funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) has been the strengthening and expansion of a network of privately-owned Ag Depots where farmers can obtain agricultural inputs and learn about best practices for a wide range of agricultural production activities.

Several AgDepots already existed before ASAP started operating in 2006. With the support of ASAP, however, their number has grown to 370 AgDepots located across 26 provinces of Afghanistan.

With ASAP's support, AgDepots have created 993 fulltime employment opportunities. Each AgDepot has extended its services to an average of 1,050 households, benefiting a total of 391,934 households in all. ASAP estimates that each AgDepot has the potential of serving between 1,000 and 1,500 farmers. ASAP helped create 12 regional AgDepot Associations that bring together 194 individual AgDepot owners to address common concerns.

The purpose of this study is to measure the economic impact of AgDepots, and to determine their sustainability without ASAP support after ASAP concludes in September 2011.

Separate surveys were conducted of AgDepot owners, and the farmers who benefits from the goods and services supplied by AgDepots. Findings included:

- Training programs in how to use new agricultural products and equipment were viewed by both AgDepot owners and farmers as very beneficial;
- Since ASAP started supporting the AgDepots, their sales rose from about \$2.5 million annually to \$10.2 million.
- 181 AgDepot owners participated in the Agfairs organized by ASAP and the Ministry of Agriculture Livestock and Irrigation (MAIL) where they created business relations with national agricultural input companies.
- Over 80% of the AgDepots suggest that production has increased and quality of produce has been improved due to the services, inputs/tools and trainings they provided to the farmers.
- AgFairs and other fairs and exhibitions developed by ASAP helped 50% of AgDepot owners establish links with bigger national agriculture input companies.
- 98% of the farmers surveyed said that they purchase agriculture inputs and tools from the AgDepots.
- 89% of the farmers said they had been introduced to new methods and technology by the AgDepots.

- 90% of the farmers stated that their production has increased due to the services/inputs provided by the AgDepots.

Background: Accelerating Sustainable Agriculture Program (ASAP)

The Accelerating Sustainable Agriculture Program (ASAP) is funded by the United States Agency for

International Development (USAID) to revitalize Afghanistan's agricultural sector and to improve global competitiveness of the country's agribusiness. ASAP is a nationwide program that provides strategic support to Afghanistan's public and private sectors with the overarching goals of improving agriculture production, increasing sales of agriculture products, creating new jobs and introducing modern agriculture technologies and practices.

It is implemented in close coordination with the Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock (MAIL). ASAP began in November 2006, and will conclude in September 2011. ASAP is managed by Chemonics International.

ASAP have two primary objectives:

Objective 1: Increase agricultural sector jobs and income by

- improving farmers' access to inputs
- establishing effective extension services, and
- Invigorating agribusinesses by increasing linkages between farmers, markets, credit, and trade corridors.

Objective 2: Increase Afghans' confidence in their government by

- Strengthening the capacity of the Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation, and Livestock to deliver services and promote private sector and farmer associations.

I. Strengthening the AgDepot Network

One of the initiatives developed by ASAP to achieve its two objectives has been to strengthen AgDepots as a means of disseminating inputs and best practices across a wide variety of agricultural activities in Afghanistan.

AgDepots are privately owned rural farm stores that provide agricultural inputs and services to farmers to improve the quality and size of their production. Starting in late 2006 ASAP expanded a small existing network to 300 AgDepots in 19 provinces in the northern, northwestern and northeastern regions of Afghanistan. In 2010, that network was expanded further with an additional 73 AgDepots into seven southern and eastern provinces.

ASAP estimates that each AgDepot has the potential of serving between 1,000 and 1,500 farmers. ASAP has used the AgDepot system to introduce Afghanistan farmers to improved agriculture methods and to boost their productivity, through new technologies such as grape trellising, soil testing in laboratories, laser land leveling and drip- and flexi-flume irrigation.

The AgDepot network saw solid demand for their products as farmers sought out high quality agricultural services and inputs, including pesticides, fertilizer and seeds, to increase the quality and quantity of their harvest. As an example of how widely used the AgDepots are, 287 AgDepots generated \$2,834,959 in gross sales in 2010 alone.

To help the AgDepots increase their business and diversify their services, ASAP in 2010 provided AgDepot owners with equipment that included 160 power sprayers, 199 seeders and 274 augurs. The AgDepots also provided training in the use and maintenance of these devices with the goal of helping farmers both increase their productivity and move into higher-value perennial horticultural crops.

As part of its strategy to strengthen the existing AgDepot network, ASAP completed the establishment of 12 regional AgDepot Associations that bring together 194 individual AgDepot owners in Logar, Ghazni, Baghlan, Kunduz, Bamyan, Farah, Herat, Ghor Parwan, Kapisa, Badghis and Wardak provinces. Each regional Association has an average membership of 12 AgDepots.

1. The purposes of the regional AgDepot associations are to:

- advocate for the shared interests of AgDepot members to the government of Afghanistan;
- communicate the association's mission of private sector goods and services delivery to Afghan growers to increase quantity and quality of products;

- serve members through continuing education, mentoring, agriculture technology innovation and promotion, ongoing business training, annual conventions and sponsorship of commercial licenses for pesticide application;
- act as buyers cooperative to procure goods and services that meet the business needs of members; and
- act as a legal conduit with appropriate checks and balances, through which resources can be passed to AgDepots that in turn are sold at varying levels of subsidy, to farmers to foster production of high quality crops.

II. Purpose and Methodology

The purpose of this study is to measure the economic impact and sustainability of AgDepots. The study used two questionnaires. One was designed to survey the AgDepot owners, the other, the farmers who benefited from the AgDepots.

The questionnaires were drafted by ZALA and submitted to ASAP whose comments were incorporated in the final version that was then translated into Dari and Pashto. (Copies of the questionnaires are included as an Annex.)

The survey questionnaire focused on cost-benefit analysis of the AgDepots in order to show the amount of income generated for both owners and farmers, against the costs involved.

The survey questionnaire for AgDepot owners includes nine quantitative and 42 qualitative questions. All 370 AgDepot owners were interviewed, and completed the questionnaires.

The survey questionnaire for farmers was conducted with a sample of 45 farmers from across the 26 provinces where the AgDepots operate.

Originally it was proposed that this study would also include Case-study and Focus Groups of 15 AgDepot owners of varying by business size. The plan was to gather them in Kabul where they would have been interviewed. Despite several attempts to do this, the AgDepot owners were unwilling to participate. This was reported to ASAP's M&E team. Hence, this study is based entirely on the field survey and the observations of our surveyors in the field.

Further information provided by ASAP's Monitoring and Evaluation Unit is also included. In areas where security was not a concern, survey teams travelled to each AgDepot. In areas with high security risks, the AgDepot owners were gathered in regional centers and interviewed there.

It took two-and one-half months to complete the survey. During the field work, our members reported serious security issues in Kandahar province. The field workers' visit there coincided with the murder of Hamid Wali Karzai, a powerful figure in the southern Afghanistan. In such areas, implementating any development projects is challenging.

1. Target Population

This survey was designed to target each AgDepot owner assisted by ASAP. There are a total of 370 AgDepots in 26 provinces. All these 370 AgDepot owners were interviewed and the questionnaires were filled. In areas where security was not a concern, our survey teams travelled to each AgDepot, but in areas with high security risks, the AgDepots were gathered to a nearby town or regional centers and interviewed them.

2. Target Locations


This economic impact study was conducted in 26 provinces of Afghanistan. List of provinces with the number and percentage of total AgDepot owners is demonstrated in the chart below.


III. Result: AgDepot Owners

The levels of education of the AgDepot owners, along with their work experience, are listed below.




AgDepot owners - filling the survey questionnaire - Balkh

AgDepot Owners' Education Levels



More than 48% of the AgDepot owners were highschool graduates, and more than 12% had attended university and received bachelor degrees. Most of these AgDepot owners had full- or some short-term academic programs focused on agriculture and livestock. About 10% of the AgDepot owners have never attended formal school.

ASAP Support Start Dates



The figure above shows peak point at the end of 2006 and the beginning of 2007. This is the time when ASAP accelerated supporting these AgDepots and reaching out to


them. As the years follow 2007, more AgDepots have been identified and supports were provided until recent year of 2011.

Some of these AgDepots have long before existed. The detail list of AgDepots with their information is attached to this report as an annex where the actual start of some of the AgDepots go beyond Taliban and Mujahideen time (1990s).

Question: How did you find out about ASAP support? When the AgDepot owners were asked this question, the three most common responses were the following:

- 36% of AgDepot owners found out about the initiative through friends.
- 34% said that ASAP had identified them, and then equipped them with the right knowledge, equipment and market to successfully develop their AgDepot. and
- 18% stated that they learned about AgDepot at AgFairs conducted by ASAP AgFairs provide access to people already involved in agriculture and inform them about new programs and initiatives.

Question: ASAP supported you with? ASAP’s AgDepot unit provided a list of the types of assistance that ASAP delivered to the AgDepots, such as agriculture inputs, furniture and equipment, store repairing, trainings, business linkages and tractors. The survey confirmed that all the AgDepots received such assistance.

Question: What Agriculture products and services do you provide? The study shows that about 200 AgDepot owners provided trainings and tools as well as agriculture inputs to the farmers. But 170 other AgDepots provided only agricultural inputs to the farmers.

Question: What trainings did you receive from ASAP? In response to this question, 355 responses listed the following trainings as beneficial:

- market awareness, harvesting and marketing of cashmere;
- marketing and creation of business linkages;
- operation of tractors, sprayers and other agriculture tools and machinery;
- improved irrigation methods;
- harvesting, sorting and grading;
- understanding the benefits and use of agriculture inputs such as urea, fertilizers, and drugs/medicine;
- understanding both harmful and useful insects;
- soil sampling, seeding and reaping wheat; and
- understanding of the environmental impacts on agriculture and specific produce.



- understanding of high quality medicine and other agriculture inputs;
- more knowledge of insects;
- sales and marketing;
- soil sampling and learning basics of geology;

Out of 370 responses, 15 were left blank. This could mean that these AgDepot owners did not receive any training or perhaps, they thought the trainings were not useful.

Question: Were the trainings useful? As can be seen in the chart, 317 AgDepot owners thought the trainings were very useful. Over 270 AgDepot owners thought that the following trainings should be repeated:



- learning more about diseases;
- veterinary trainings;
- learning more about new methods and technology; and
- repeated training on cashmere awareness, harvesting and its sales.

A few AgDepot owners stated that they feel they need to visit other countries with a developed agriculture sector in order to understand the new methods and technologies they are introducing.

Question: What specific Support did you receive from ASAP on linking you with international and national Agriculture input companies? Over 50% of the responses show that AgFairs and other fairs/exhibitions by ASAP helped the AgDepot owners create links with bigger national agriculture input companies such as Durukhshan, Noor brothers, Hirawe, Sahraye and DCA. Over 100 AgDepot owners did not answer this question and about 50 other did not respond correctly.

Question: Which company (ies) provide you inputs, tools and new technology? The majority of AgDepot owners have business relations with the following companies and NGOs:

- Durukhshan
- Noor Hirawe
- Sahraye
- DCA
- AVA
- JDA
- ASIA
- Shirwan
- Khalid
- Rahmani
- Bawar
- Noor Moqeem, and
- Hedayat agriculture input company

Question: Please mention any other support you have received from ASAP and how did it help you? More than 90% of the AgDepot owners said that ASAP supported them with tractors, computers, sprayers, scissors, cameras, repairs to their stores and effective trainings. They noted that they were very useful to their business and their relations with the farmers.

1. Increased Sales

Question: Total annual gross sales before ASAP support? Total annual sales before ASAP intervention were more than \$2.5 million.

Question: Total annual gross sales after ASAP support? As soon as ASAP started providing support, the annual sales increased to over \$ 4.5 million on average. These figures are not precise since small business such as AgDepots do not have the skills-

needed for book keeping according to standard accounting procedures, however, these figures are the outcome of their traditional way of their book keeping which in times could be very accurate.

Question: Total in US\$ - sales increased since ASAP interventions? Since ASAP began supporting the AgDepots, the total gross sales increased about \$10.2 million.

Question: What specific ASAP support helped increase your sales? When asked the reason for their increased sales, more than 90% of the 330 AgDepot owners who responded said that trainings were very useful along with repairs to the store and the receipt of tractors. Some mentioned marketing, high quality agriculture inputs and tools. 40 AgDepot owners did not answer this question.

Question: Your cost of Increased Sales in US\$ - per year? These increased sales required added costs. The survey found that on average an AgDepot owner spent a little less than \$5,000 in the past five years to increase their sales. ASAP spent \$6,200 per AgDepot in that time to help boost sales as noted above. In total, all the AgDepots have so far spent \$ 1.8 million of their own to increase sales, and ASAP has contributed about \$2.3 million to them.

The ASAP contribution includes neither the costs of administering the project, nor organizing trainings and AgFairs, which obviously have had an impact in increase sales.

Question: What is your monthly income? On average each AgDepot owner’s income is \$703 per month. This is considerably higher than the salary of a government employee or local NGO, private business employee.

Question: How many customers do you receive on average everyday? Each AgDepot on average receives 27 customers daily. Some AgDepot owners are also selling livestock medicine and providing veterinary services. Hence, some of those 27 customers may actually be coming to get medicine and services for their livestock. In any event, almost all the farmers in Afghanistan own domesticated animals, mostly cows, sheep and goats so it is hard to separate agriculture from livestock in Afghanistan.

Question: Future sales without ASAP support? When the AgDepot owners were asked about their future sales projections and their future plans, the majority of them were hopeful that they will continue their business. On their sales projections, 44% said that their sales will stay the same with not much increase in the future. 41% were discouraged with the fact that ASAP is ending and no more support will be given to them, at least by ASAP. Other programs or projects may come in the future to help them out, but that is not certain. 15% of the AgDepot owners were very excited about their future sales and mentioned that their sales will increase without any external support.

Question: What specific actions you think the government of Afghanistan or other aid agencies should take to increase sales of your AgDepot? Over 90% of the responses to the question of what else do they expect from aid agencies, listed the following assistance needed:

- Access to funds – loans and grants.
- More training is needed on diseases, better medicine, improved techniques, marketing, customer relations/satisfactions and better technology.
- More assistance from the government and aid agencies
- A few responses said that peace and security could increase sales and agriculture production.
- Freezers and solar power systems
- Some mentioned that making new AgDepots and marketing them is needed to satisfy the increasing demand.

Fewer than 10% of AgDepot owners provided no comment to this question. On the other hand, more than 90% of the respondents said that they have plans to improve their sales in the future. Among their future goals are:

- improving their customer relations;
- bringing more quality medicine and agriculture inputs/tools, and providing better services at a very reasonable prices;
- training more farmers on improved methods and new technology;
- increasing the number of new customers by promoting their business;
- securing further support from aid agencies and the government;
- opening new AgDepots and investing more in existing AgDepots since they think it is a very viable and profitable business; and
- developing business relations with more national and international agriculture input companies in order to get better quality at competitive prices.

IV. Result : Increased Employment

ASAP's AgDepot project was successful in creating more jobs and providing workers with trainings.

Question: Number of employees before ASAP Interventions? Before ASAP started supporting the AgDepots, each AgDepot averaged 1.89 employees, with total employment by all AgDepots of 706.

Question: Number of Employees after ASAP interventions? After ASAP began supporting these AgDepots, the number of employees has increased to 2.65 per each AgDepot. In total, ASAP's assistance and support has influenced the creation of 993 employment opportunities within the AgDepots.

Question: Number of households benefited due to ASAP support to your Agdepot? Data provided by the AgDepot owners states that on average each AgDepot has extended its services to 1,050 households. In total, 391,934 households benefited from AgDepots.

Question: Number of farmers received trainings through your Agdepot? These AgDepots have received numerous trainings from ASAP. Those trainings were both on technical issues and business related subjects such as marketing and business linkages. In turn, these AgDepots reported that each AgDepot on average has trained 574 farmers. In total, the AgDepots have provided trainings to 214,264 farmers in 26 provinces.

Training is on the top of the list when AgDepot owners speak of their satisfaction with ASAP's assistance. Most of them listed training as a key element that helped them with increased sales. Also training was the first thing they asked for when the surveyors asked them for further support they need. Training farmers not only increased the knowledge of farmers on improved methods and better technology, but it also helped strengthen the relationships between AgDepots and farmers.

V. Result : Impact of AgFairs

ASAP has lead and organized several AgFairs in the past five years. AgFairs provide a great opportunity for farmers, AgDepots, Veterinary Field Units, Agribusinesses and other Governmental and NGOs focusing on Agriculture in Afghanistan and also International

businesses and aid agencies to better understand Afghanistan's Agriculture, production and challenges. It is also a great opportunity for Afghan produce to get introduced nationally and globally.

Question: Name & number of AgFairs attended due to ASAP support? AgDepot owners participated in several Agfairs. Out of 370 AgDepot owners, 180 said that they have participated in the Agfairs organized by ASAP and the Ministry of Agriculture Livestock and Irrigation (MAIL). Some of the Agfairs that they mentioned were held in Badam Bagh (Kabul), Kunduz, Mazar-e-Sharif, and Herat. Some mentioned more specifically the specialized Cashmere, Pomegranate and Tractor AgFairs.

Logistical and transportation problems as well as insecurity issues might be the reason why 24 AgDepot owners stated that they had not attended any AgFairs, and 166 others failed to answer whether they had attended any Agfairs. Some of these AgDepots are in very rural areas. and in some cases in very insecure areas.

Question: Name and number of Business linkages produced due to AgFairs? As a result of attending these AgFairs, the AgDepot owners established business relations with national agricultural input companies. The following companies were listed in 149 responses stating that AgDepot owners now have business relations with the following companies and organizations. It is worth mentioning that most of the AgDepot owners listed more than one company/organization therefore, the database did not calculate percentage by company, however Durukhshan and Noor brothers were mentioned by the majority of the Agdepot owners:

Question: Were AgFairs helpful? Suggestions? Of the AgDepot owners who attended AgFairs, 165 stated that they were very satisfied with the outcomes. They said that AgFairs provided them a great opportunity, not only to create business relations with suppliers, but also to find more customers.

Question: Do you think such Fairs and trips should continue? If yes, do you suggest any changes? Most of these AgDepot owners suggested that such AgFairs should continue in the future. They also said that such AgFairs should be organized in each province's center, so this way an equal opportunity will be given to all the individuals, organizations and businesses involved in the agriculture sector. However, 199 responses were left blank, and eight responses were negative on this issue.

VI. Result: Agriculture Inputs, Tools and New Technology

Agriculture is a main source of income for 80% of the Afghan population. However, Afghan farmers have been using very old, traditional methods and techniques which limits increasing production and quality, and thus exports. Supporting AgDepots to provide the right kind of inputs, tools and introducing the new technology has been a critical element in ASAP's initiative.

Question: Please list the agriculture inputs you provide to farmers? When the AgDepot owners were asked to list the inputs, tools and new technology they have provided to the farmers, they noted the following:

- Urea
- Fertilizer
- Modified seeds
- Anti-warm/insects drugs
- Sprayer
- Seeder
- Saw and scissors
- Tractors – obviously the AgDepots do not have many tractors to sell but they provide services with the tractor they were given
- Pump
- Reaping machine
- Drill

- Gloves, masks, glasses and boots
- Press machines
- And all those inputs and tools that are used in the farms throughout these 26 provinces

Question: Where do you get the inputs from? These AgDepot owners purchase these inputs and tools from three different markets. 40% of the AgDepot owners said that they purchase their supplies from the local market at the center of their province or a neighboring province. 57% of the AgDepots purchase their supplies from the national market. This could be the capital Kabul, or regional centers such as Mazar, Herat, Kunduz, Jalalabad, and Kandahar city. Only 3% of the AgDepots have access to international market – mostly Pakistan and China.

Question: What is the quality of your inputs? The survey showed that the AgDepot owners are keen to provide quality products and services. When asked about the quality of their inputs and tools, 50% of them said they were pleased with the quality they provide to farmers. 47% were not so sure, and they suggested that they only provide reasonable quality products. Only 3% criticized the quality of their products, and said the quality was low.

As mentioned, Afghanistan imports the majority of products needed from Pakistan, China and Iran. In the AgDepots case too, the inputs and tools come from either Pakistan or China. The quality of products coming from these two countries are considered extremely low. The AgDepot owners were also not satisfied from the quality of inputs they receive from these countries. As mentioned above, only 3% of the AgDepot owners have access to international market so this suggests that such inputs and tools with low quality is imported by the bigger national input/tools companies. The key to eliminate the quality problem is to convince the bigger distributing companies not to import low quality of inputs and tools. The government has the authority and power to implement rules and control quality, but nothing has been done so far.


Question: Where do you get these tools from? In the case of procuring tools, 36% purchase their tools from the local market. 60% purchase their tools from the national market while 4% of the AgDepot owners purchase their tools from international markets.

Question: Did you receive trainings on new technology and improved methods? Please list them. The AgDepot owners were asked to list the name of trainings they received so far from ASAP's AgDepot program:

- Training on operations of tractors, seeder, sprayer, and scissors
- Training on cutting branches, grape vines and other
- Seeding in time, grafting the trees – apples and almonds
- Training on improved methods of irrigation and water supply to the farms
- Operation of pumps



Question: Did you train farmers on the new technology and improved methods? Then the AgDepot owners were asked if they have passed on the skills and knowledge they learnt from the above training, to the farmers. 69% said yes and named all the above trainings. 24% not answered and 7% said no.



Question: What new methods are used by the farmers due to your trainings and services? Over 60% of the AgDepot owners confirmed that the farmers are now using all the new methods, tools and technology with the right kind of inputs. They said they are working closely with the farmers, train them and suggest the right kind of inputs and tools and the timing for their farming activities. Less than 30% of the AgDepot owners did not respond to this question.

Question: What other inputs, tools and/or technology can be introduced to increase quantity and improve quality of agriculture produce. 83% answered and listed these:

- High quality inputs
- Enough water plus improved systems of irrigation
- Automatic Sprayers
- Multi-functional tractors
- Black and White Urea
- Import from International market
- Better quality of seeds

VII. Result: Increased Production due to AgDepots

Question: Please list the names of produce increased in quantity and quality improved due to your agriculture inputs and tools?

Over 80% of the AgDepots suggest that production has increased and quality of produce has been improved due to the services, inputs/tools and trainings they provided to the farmers. The following list is the names of produce increased in production and improved in quality. It was not possible to get more specific or get yields in metric tons or measure the improved quality in anyway since the AgDepots did not have any record nor had they conducted a survey of their own areas to measure it specifically.

However, the list below is entirely based on the understanding of the AgDepots and their communications with the farmers:

- Wheat
- Apples
- Watermelon
- Grapes
- Onions
- Berry
- Tomato
- Potato
- Pear
- Apricot
- Corn
- Rice
- Okra
- Green Beans
- Almond
- Pomegranate

About 15% of the AgDepot owners did not cite anything from the above list.

Question: What else can be done through Agdepots to improve quality and increase quantity of agriculture produce in Afghanistan? Over 85% responded and suggested that the key elements to increasing production and improving quality are:


Better quality of inputs and tools

Enough water with improved irrigation systems

More knowledge – trainings to AgDepots and farmers

The AgDepot owners also suggested a few things to the Government of Afghanistan in order to increase the sales of AgDepots, in turn increase Agriculture production and improve quality:


- Enough water – solve irrigation bottlenecks
- Control quality of imports (inputs/tools and machinery)
- Provide electricity
- Provide access to loans – to farmers and AgDepot owners
- Should provide a comprehensive and practical plan for the country's Agriculture sector
- Support AgDepots – provide trainings to AgDepot owners and farmers
- Develop and implement awareness programs – on TV and Radio
- Control corruption and bureaucracy in customs
- Provide security
- Pave roads – this is very essential for giving timely access to the farmers in order for their produce to reach markets in time.



VIII. Result: Farmers' Responses

In order to confirm that the AgDepot owners did provide useful services and inputs/tools to the farmers, 44 farmers from the following provinces were sampled:

1. Baghlan
2. Balkh
3. Farah
4. Faryab
5. Helmand
6. Kabul
7. Khost
8. Kunar
9. Laghman
10. Logar
11. Nangarhar
12. Nemroz, and
13. Paktia



Question: How much land do you own and please list name of your produce? On average these farmers own seven jeribs of land. Each jerib is 2,000 square meters. This is quite a sizable piece of land for a farmer in Afghanistan. These farmers listed the following agricultural products that their land produces:

- Grapes
- Wheat
- Onions
- Potato
- Corn
- Tomato
- Beans
- Rice
- Vegetable
- Apples
- Apricot
- Pomegranate

Question: Are you familiar with AgDepots? When the farmers were asked about their familiarity with AgDepots, about 84% of them responded positively and said they know AgDepots very well.

Question: Do you purchase inputs and tools from the AgDepots? 98% of the farmers from the sample surveyed said that they purchase agriculture inputs and tools from the AgDepots. Even though the sample surveyed was only 44 individuals, but the high rate of 98% is very encouraging since it shows nearly full awareness of farmers about where to get the inputs and tools from. They seem to have a very tight business relation with AgDepot owners.

Question: Did you receive training from the AgDepots? Again the high rate of confirmation about receiving trainings from the AgDepots shows that the AgDepots – farmers relations are solid, and that this model could be used for any future trainings.


Question: Did Agdepot introduce a new method or technology to you? If yes, what? 89% of the farmers said they had been introduced to new methods and technology by the AgDepots.

Question: Are the prices offered for inputs, tools and other products by Agdepot, reasonable? Then the question was raised about the prices. The majority of the farmers were happy with the prices and said they were reasonable. Only 16% of the farmers said they were not pleased with the prices.

Question: What specific items do you purchase from the Agdepots? 68% said all the inputs and tools. Please see the pie below.

Question: Are you happy with Agdepot products and services? 84% of the farmers in the sample were satisfied with AgDepots creation and their services/products. 16% were not pleased, but did not mention any reasons. One reason could be their lack of access to the AgDepots, higher prices or their perception of poor quality of services/products they receive from the AgDepot owners.

Question: In total Kg, how much did the support and inputs from Agdept increased your produce last year? On average, the farmers surveyed said that their production increased by a bit over 1.2 metric ton. A few of the responses did not mention increase production in metric tons, but over 90% of the responses were positive and said that their production has increased due to the services/inputs provided by the AgDepots.



Question: What do you suggest for improvement of Agdepots? What other products and services do you need? The farmers suggested that the AgDepots should provide better quality of inputs/tools, they should provide us more training, better quality of seeds, the AgDepots should have better customer relations, the prices should be reasonable, the AgDepots should be placed nearby our farms and the number of AgDepots should increase. These were the advice from the farmers to AgDepot owners for sustainability and success of the AgDepot owners.

Question: How can the Government of Afghanistan help you increase your agriculture produce and improve its quality? The farmers also suggested a few things to the Government of Afghanistan and aid agencies. They said we need more water, high quality of inputs and tools, better security, access to loans, more AgDepot stores, literacy courses and find customers for Afghan produce within and outside the country. One farmer suggested that the Government should stop farmers from growing opium, and should convince them to grow Halal produce. Narcotics are prohibited in Islam.

IX. Conclusions

The purpose of this study was to measure the economic impact of AgDepots, and to determine their sustainability without ASAP support after ASAP concludes in September 2011.

Separate surveys were conducted of AgDepot owners, and the farmers who benefits from the goods and services supplied by AgDepots.

Findings and conclusions included:

- 370 Agriculture input/tools stores were visited in 26 provinces. They were interviewed and questionnaires were filled out. A sample of 45 farmers were also visited and interviewed in provinces where AgDepots are active to cross check the findings.
- 36% of the AgDepots found out about ASAP support through friends and 34% of them were identified and approached by ASAP in order to provide support to them.
- Training programs in how to use new agricultural products and equipment were viewed by both AgDepot owners and farmers as very beneficial. 72% of the AgDepot owners were very happy with the trainings and they thought it would best to repeat these trainings
- Since ASAP started supporting the AgDepots, their sales rose from about \$2.5 million annually to \$4.2 million. \$10.1 million was total gross sales increased due to ASAP support in the last five years.

- Net income calculated after subtracting both ASAP and AgDepots cost was about \$19 million in the last five years.
- 44% of the AgDepots suggested that their future sales will remain the same without ASAP support. 15% thought their sales will increase in the future and 41% thought that they need more support in order to maintain their sales in the future. In fact, over 90% AgDepots reported that they have future plans to increase their sales without any external support.
- With ASAP's support, AgDepots have created 993 fulltime employment opportunities. Each AgDepot has extended its services to an average of 1,050 households, benefiting a total of 391,934 households in all.
- Each Agdepot on average has trained 574 farmers. In total, the AgDepots have trained 214,264 farmers in 26 provinces. 70% of the farmers interviewed confirmed that they received trainings from the AgDepots.
- 85% of the AgDepots suggested that 1) Better quality of inputs/tools, 2) Enough water and improved irrigation systems, and 3) More knowledge – trainings to AgDepots and farmers are the key elements to increasing production and improving quality.
- 181 AgDepot owners participated in the Agfairs organized by ASAP and the Ministry of Agriculture Livestock and Irrigation (MAIL) where they created business relations with national agricultural input companies.
- Over 80% of the AgDepots suggest that production has increased and quality of produce has been improved due to the services, inputs/tools and trainings they provided to the farmers.
- AgFairs and other fairs and exhibitions developed by ASAP helped 50% of AgDepot owners establish links with bigger national agriculture input companies.
- 98% of the farmers surveyed said that they purchase agriculture inputs and tools from the AgDepots.
- 89% of the farmers said they had been introduced to new methods and technology by the AgDepots.
- 90% of the farmers stated that their production has increased due to the services/inputs provided by the AgDepots
