4. Identification of hazardous areas and populations-at-risk.
5. Improvements in currently available datasets.

## SUB-SECTOR: COORDINATION

---

### INDICATOR 1

*Number of organizations coordinating relief operations, and through these entities, the number of implementing organizations coordinated through these efforts and reported upon through this project.*

Examples of the work undertaken during the reporting period for the Clusters include:

- Food Security and Agriculture Cluster:
  - iMMAP developed the database, data entry forms, and procedures for the Spring Assessment in collaboration with FAO and WFP/VAM.
  - iMMAP continued to participate in the Early Warning Information Working Group of the FSAC and iMMAP products appeared consistently in the Early Warning Update Newsletter.
  - iMMAP began work on a drought map using remote sensing satellite data following a consultative process with OCHA and FSAC. The analysis is ongoing.
  - An analysis of the new Landcover Map created by FAO and MAIL was initiated with an accompanying document to highlight the differences with the previous 1994 Landcover map.
  - iMMAP provided assistance to the USDA/UCDavis/Salam Watandar eAfghanistan program with the production of a telephone assistance map.
  - iMMAP has continued to produce regular flood risk maps at the request of the FSAC Early Warning Group
  
- Protection Cluster:
  - A third CARE database for school incidents was finalized and data entry completed. This database was used to monitor security incidents related to educational facilities in the preparation of an upcoming UNICEF report to the UN Security Council.
  - iMMAP continued to provide regular database support to the UNHCR IDP/Population Movement Tracking data system with the development of new and revised reports, queries, and templates.
  - Continued development, modification, and maintenance of CPI projects for people with disabilities OASIS database
  - Completed the Kabul Informal Settlements Atlas in collaboration with Solidarites and the Protection Cluster.
  - In cooperation with Human Rights Watch, the mapping of female detention was completed.
  - Delivered 5 separate indicators for the Protection Cluster's CHAP 2014 document.
  - Provided advisory services, prepared security incident data, and finalized ranking for the HLP sub-cluster for the CHAP 2014 vulnerability ranking
  - Created a data plan with Solidarites on KIS winter planning and supporting data sets.
  - Initiated the secondment of staff to the Protection Cluster via UNHCR for 2014 deployment.
  
- Education Cluster:
  - iMMAP completed two updates of the education Who What Where map which was also used in the CHAP MYR.
  - The Save the Children DRR mapping of education facilities was completed for Sari Pul and Faryab provinces.
  - Advisory and mapping services provided to the Cluster and the MoE on school closures mapping.
  - Produced the BEACON CBE schools map.

- Conducted a workshop for MoE in conjunction with Save the Children on school mapping in 6 provinces.
- Support to the Cluster for CHAP 2014 (the cluster was subsequently closed).
- Created an initial FOCUS school projects map.
- iMMAP began assistance to the World Bank/MoE DT3 school mapping project, including new MoUs with CoAR, and JACK.

**SUB-SECTOR: INFORMATION MANAGEMENT**

**INDICATOR 1**

*Number of organizations utilizing common information management services.*

As of the end of this reporting period, OASIS was used by 79 organizations with 162 installations, and approximately 148 trained users. Organizations use this common platform for security updates and mapping, but also for:

- UNHCR for agency specific programmatic information with the common operating picture delivered through OASIS.
- A custom application was developed for ANDMA for natural disaster data management and reporting.
- The MRRD adopted OASIS for its internal project reporting on natural disasters and response.
- Common data systems were developed for the ERM Consortium (Medair, ACF, Solidarites, People in Need, Mission East) used to monitor disasters, shocks, coping strategies, and responses in Disaster Risk Reduction Programs (DRR). Also used as a knowledge base during period of high staff turnover.

iMMP continues to expand the OASIS database. A total of 118,555 security incidents reside in the database, and 23,391 new incidents were entered in the reporting period. This database allows humanitarian actors to obtain updated and historical information concerning the security situation in their areas of operation and create maps and reports of security incidents.

**OBJECTIVE TWO OUTPUTS AGAINST INDICATORS**

---

*Enhance and integrate current databases of humanitarian projects and activities and support distribution of related information in near real-time.*

Using data from partners' projects and activities, iMMAP has created and distributed 224 new maps during the reporting period (Annex 1). Most of these maps are available on the iMMAP website, except for those containing sensitive information.

In support of DRR data coordination, the following datasets have been either/or cleaned, enhanced, and mapped by iMMAP: MRRD Disasters, IOM Reported Incidents, ERM Reported Incidents, Populations, and Assisted figures, INTERSOS DRR survey. ANDMA disaster database, and Flood Risk Priority (FSAC).

## OBJECTIVE THREE OUTPUTS AGAINST INDICATORS

---

*Provide a Common Operating Picture of humanitarian data and baseline indicators of the humanitarian situation.*

### NARRATIVE

In this reporting period, iMMAP continued to focus on the interoperability of the Common Operating Picture developed in the previous phases of the project . In addition, iMMAP has initiated a sub-project of this objective to develop a Common Operating Picture for Disasters in Afghanistan. The vision of this project is to enable DRR actors operating in Afghanistan to review, analyze and map current and recent disaster data for programming planning and support.

The databases that have been newly developed or enhanced during the reporting period are:

- International Organization for Migration (IOM): The Non-food Items [NFI] distribution database and IDP database were updated and mapped. iMMAP continues to work with IOM to assist with NFI and natural disaster IDP information.
- The Emergency Response Management (ERM) Consortium: Medair, ACF, Solidarites, People in Need, and Mission East: a common database on disaster risk profiling was developed. Following the implementation of the hazard mapping module, iMMAP has developed maps to track the humanitarian assistance provided to communities affected by natural disasters. iMMAP has ended the training program for ERM data managers due to the high turnover of staff.
- UNHCR continues to request assistance from iMMAP to update and modify the IDP tracking and reporting system in OASIS. iMMAP provided advisory and technical assistance on site to enhance the system.

## OBJECTIVE FOUR OUTPUTS AGAINST INDICATORS

---

*Identification of hazardous areas and populations at risk.*

### NARRATIVE

In this reporting period efforts have continued to promote data sharing and standards among different sources containing information about disaster, hazards, populations, and risk (e.g. IOM, FSAC, NGOs, Government). The following activities and/or data sets have contributed to mapping hazard areas and populations at risk.

- Common Operating Picture for Disaster Risk Reduction: The combined datasets were published in the form of provincial disaster maps/atlasses.
- IOM: In the current reporting period iMMAP has updated and mapped the IOM disaster database on selected disaster-affected IDPs. These data sets have formed the backbone of the COP DRR and were used to populate the ANDMA database.
- ERM: iMMAP continually provides assistance to the ERM group with information management, advisory services, and mapping. The activities in this reporting period were centered on updating the information in the database, the preparation of new maps, and briefings/orientation to new incoming staff.
- ANDMA: iMMAP delivered the ANDMA disaster database as agreed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual MoU.
- MRRD / Social Protection Department: MRRD database of disasters and responses is being used daily by MRRD. iMMAP has continued to publish these maps in both English and Dari.
