Program Summary

1. Duration: the period of the agreement is September 19,2012 to September 18,2018
2. Objectives: LAU to enroll as of fall 2013, 85 academically qualified and financially needy male and female students with demonstrated potential for leadership and civic engagement from both rural and urban areas, representing Lebanon's diverse confessional makeup.
3. Scope:
 - a. These students may be enrolled in one the following 11 majors: Biology, Business, Chemistry, Communication Arts, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Mathematics, Nursing, Nutrition, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, Civil Engineering, Computer Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Industrial Engineering and Mechanical Engineering,
 - b. The award will cover: Tuition fees for the duration of the program including one preparatory year if needed, Medical Insurance, Book allowance, Student housing or Transportation Allowance, a Monthly Stipend for a maximum of 11 months per year and a Laptop.
4. Key Activities and Phases:
 - a. Advertisement and production
 - b. Recruitment
 - c. Orientation
 - d. Housing and other facilities
 - e. Intensive English and Tutoring
 - f. Academic Formation
 - g. Extra-curricular activities and Leadership
 - h. Career Development and Internships

Detailed Progress

I - Dissemination

a. Ministry of Education and Higher Education

On October 24, 2012 Vice President for Student Development and Enrollment Management sent a letter to the Director of the Ministry of Education for his support and authorization to start visiting public high schools.

On November 30, 2012 an official memo was issued by the Ministry of Education accepting our request and asking us to coordinate with school principals directly.

b. Newspaper advertisements (Annex 1)

On November 20 we received USAID approval on the newspaper advertisement content and outlets. We started advertising USP III accordingly in four leading Arabic newspapers:

- An Nahar (November 22, December 21, January 3, February 14)
- As Safir (November 28, January 21, January 30, February 20)
- Al Balad (December 4, February 7)
- L'Orient le jour (December 27, January 9)

c. Brochures and applications

In October and November 2012 LAU designed and printed 7000 flyers (Annex 2), 1000 posters (Annex 3) and 4900 Admission and Financial Aid applications (Annex 4). These advertising documents were sent and distributed to public high schools during the recruitment visits. These documents were cleared and approved by USAID on November 13.

In February 2013 LAU printed additional 2000 flyers and 1000 Admission and Financial Aid applications which were as well distributed during school visits in order to ensure that maximum number of students receive a reference document about the program.

d. Web

www.lau.edu.lb/usp was updated to reflect USP III new modified recruitment conditions and application. The address was promoted in our newspaper advertisements, was communicated to all public high schools, and was added to USP publications (brochures and applications).

The web was updated to reflect the extended application deadline of April 30, 2013.

e. Alumni and friends

In January 2013 an email announcing USP III and all its relevant information was sent electronically to our Alumni and friends.

II- Visiting public high schools

During quarter one, quarter two and April 2013, LAU visited 243 public high schools across the different regions of Lebanon. During these visits LAU admission personnel met 17,341 students and distributed 659 posters, 7754 flyers and 4992 admission and financial aid applications. Attached below are pictures of public high schools visited (Annex 5) and some showing LAU personnel presenting and discussing USP III with public high school students.

III- Receiving students' applications

Contacts with public high schools and their principals were totally blocked between February 22nd and March 22nd due to the public strike. About 30% of the schools could not be visited and very few applications were received since students could not get their grades from their schools. In conjunction with USAID, the application deadline was extended from March 31, 2013 to April 30, 2013. This extension allowed us to complete the school visits and gave students time to collect their grades and submit their applications.

By mid-March 2013, 398 applications were received. As of March 22nd LAU admission offices started to contact the visited schools to inform them about the deadline extension and to

encourage Principals/students to apply for the program. By end of April 2013 the total number of applications received was 845 distributed among governorates and mixed between male and female applicants.

The Admissions offices reviewed all applications, contacted students to provide the missing information, and conducted a due diligence check for all program requirements. Around mid-May 769 applications out of the 845 were completed and ready to be considered for the first selection phase.

IV- Collaboration with the Ministry of Education

The Ministry of Education provided a great support in scheduling appointments with non-cooperative schools and making sure USP III applications were distributed to all interested students.

V- Running LAU Entrance Exams

Applicants were grouped by major and a minimum high school average was set for every major for the applicant to qualify for the next selection phase).

In total 665 students were called by the Admission offices in both campuses and were asked to register for the exams. These 665 applicants were fairly distributed by gender, geographic region and major. The IDs of applicants shortlisted for exams were posted on USP website.

Two exam sessions were planned and done, the first one in Byblos campus on June 8, 2013 and the second one in Beirut campus on June 15, 2013.

Out of the 665 applicants, 596 took the SE exam and 593 took the EEE. 35% of the students who submitted the EEE exam were eliminated because they scored below the minimum acceptable grade of 400. Results were entered in the applicants' database, the admission directors reviewed them and selected potential candidate who did not pass the EEE and asked them to repeat it in July in order to confirm their English level and maintain a wide diversity in the pool of qualified applicants and meet the gender / geographic distribution requirements. The second round of LAU entrance exams was organized on July 16, 2013. A total of 43 students were scheduled to take the sophomore and English Entrance exams and 335 students were scheduled to repeat the English entrance exam.

VI- TV Interview

On Friday April 26, Future television hosted the director for the Outreach and Civic Engagement unit to talk about the partnership between LAU and the Hariri Foundation for Sustainable Human Development and about the USP program.

VII - Students Selection and Enrollment

- Students with test results below LAU admission requirements were eliminated.
- LAU called the academically top 307 students for selection and financial aid interviews.
- The aim of the selection interview was to assess applicants' potential leadership skills, community service activities, social engagement and communication skills.
- To facilitate this task a scorecard was developed and students were graded separately by each committee member. Grades were later consolidated and averages calculated.
- Two selection interviewing committees were formed, one in each Campus.
- The aim of the financial aid interview was to assess and confirm the financial status of each applicant.
- Financial aid interviews were led by the Financial Aid Director of every Campus and were done on the same day of the selection interview.
- Beirut campus interviews were held on August 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, and 12; Byblos campus interviews were held on August 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 12 and 13.
- On Aug 19, the selection committee met and selected 85 applicants for acceptance. Another 31 applicants were placed on the waiting list.
- On August 26, the 85 applicants were called, congratulated and informed about their acceptance, some of them informed us that they will join AUB instead and were immediately replaced.
- On Sep 2nd finalists IDs were posted on USP webpage.

VIII- Career Counseling Workshop:

Applicants placed on the finalists and waiting lists were invited to attend a career counseling workshop on Friday August 23 in Beirut campus. The workshop addressed topics related to:

- The different themes or interests types based on Holland's theory
- The ways to identify individual interests
- The majors that match each theme
- The potential careers associated with different majors

This workshop was led by LAU career guidance professionals in both campuses, and was attended by LAU USP management and representatives from the different schools.

IX – Students Orientation and Registration

USP III students underwent 2 types of orientation: a specific orientation (organized by the Outreach & Civic Engagement unit) which took place on September 4, 2013 and on September 28, 2013 as well as their general orientation (organized by the Deans of Students' offices in both Beirut and Byblos) which was during the week of September 10-13 in Beirut and September 16-17 in Byblos, depending on the students' major and class.

September 4, 2013: (Beirut Campus- Business Building 903):

On this day, students received all sorts of information pertaining to the specifics of their grant as

well as their rights and responsibilities towards it. They got introduced to USAID and its programs in Lebanon, their contact people at the university, the Outreach and Civic Engagement unit (OCE) which will be in charge of developing their leadership capacities and their well-being, as well as got a chance to ask any questions that they still had regarding the scholarship and LAU in general . Below was the schedule of the day:

Tuesday September 10 – Friday September 13, 2013 (Beirut Campus)
Monday September 16 – Tuesday September 17, 2013 (Byblos Campus)

Students came on one day for their general orientation depending on major and campus. On the day of orientation, they received the LAU orientation package, and their contract sheets. They were initiated to LAU with a movie, a welcoming from the Dean of Students and a presentation that included information as to the different services provided by the Dean of Student's Office, Financial Aid, and outreach and civic engagement services. Moreover the day included an online presentation and hands on training on advising and registration procedures, a session on discovering the major and potential related careers, and a campus tour.

Saturday, September 28 – Learning through Interactive Games - (Byblos Campus- Frem 201)

Students underwent in this day a series of team building, leadership and group formation exercises in addition to a workshop on Household Finances. This was extremely important so as to form a coherent group of students, build a sense of community, create an “ensemble” and initiate them to the program.

The workshop was introduced by the Program Director (executive director of outreach and civic engagement-) and was given by USP and OCE staff with a significant contribution of the USP I and II students and a cohort of OCE student leaders.

Internal Control Procedures

I- Compliance with Eligibility Requirements Process:

LAU advertised the program in four leading newspapers and visited all public high schools of Lebanon to provide equal opportunity to all potential beneficiaries. Non-cooperative schools were reported to the ministry of education and re-contacted to schedule visits.

Throughout the selection process LAU ensured the scholarship is given only to eligible undergraduate students in different ways:

1. The eligibility requirements were detailed in the flyer under the section “Who could Join USP III”
2. They were listed on USP website <http://www.lau.edu.lb/usp>
3. They were explained to students by the admission team during school visits
4. Applications received were checked by the admission team for compliance with each of the below criteria:
 - a. “Be enrolled in a public high school for at least the last 2 years of secondary education and expected to complete the baccalaureate degree during summer 2013”: official school transcripts proving the student has been enrolled in an official school for the last 2 years of secondary education and the last year of academic year 2012 -2013
 - b. “Be a Lebanese Citizen”: copy of the official Lebanese ID
 - c. “Not be registered at any university or have completed studies at any university”: official school transcript proving the student is registered in academic year 2012 – 2013

- d. *“Is not holder of an America Citizenship”*: this was addressed in the application question number 7 as well as in the final admission letter in which the student certified that he does not hold a US citizenship and that if this information is proven wrongful he/she will be dismissed from the program.

If any of the above document is not available the application is placed on hold and the student is re-contacted, if the student provides the missing documents the application is processed, if the student misses to provide the missing documents, the application is placed on hold and he/she will not be considered in the next selection phases.

5. Also received applications were reviewed by the financial aid team who ensured all required supporting documents were attached to it, such as parent’s employment letter, salary certification, owned property, rent contracts, family civil record, insurance and loan contracts... Missing documents were identified and communicated to students for completeness. Every file was studied separately; data related to parents work, number of siblings, income, expense and assets owned was entered into a system which returned a financial aid assessment for each case (High need, Average need, Low need). Students shortlisted for interviews were invited with their parents for a financial aid interview which aimed to better understand their financial aid situation and clarify any conflict in their files. The system assessment and the financial aid director assessment /comments after the interview were added to the students’ database and were considered as one key element during the final selection phase.
6. SAT scores were verified by the admission staff: the student was asked to send an official copy of his grades directly to LAU, if not he was asked to share his username name and password with the admission team so that they validate the scores online.
7. Internal sophomore and English Entrance exams were corrected and graded by a separate dedicated LAU testing team; results were shared with the selection committee and included in the student database.
8. When calling the shortlisted students to schedule an interview LAU asked about their results, if below 12/20 no interview was scheduled and the student name was removed from the database.
9. Before signing the final acceptance / admission letter the student was asked to present an official transcript of his Lebanese Baccalaureate exam results in order to ensure they scored no less than 12/20.
10. During the interview several questions were raised to understand the student involvement in service and community activities such as: “name any extra-curricular activity that made during the last two years”, “what is the social/civic cause that you feel like defending and promoting”, “name one thing in your community that you would like to change”.
11. The acceptance letter signed by the student before enrollment clarified that they have to register as full-time students at all times.

12. Finally, when enrolled the program coordinator and his team check continuously the academic performance of USP scholars and ensure they are registered as full-time students.

Challenges during Year I

Several challenges were faced during quarter I and addressed in collaboration with the AOR:

- Students in certain schools in Zahle and Nabatieh complained that their school principals are informing them that they do not have enough USP III applications to hand out despite the fact that an ample number of applications were distributed by the Admission personnel. To overcome this issue LAU admission team distributed during school visits a document with Admissions' offices coordinates and the website where the application can be downloaded. (Annex 6)
- About 30% of public schools were not yet visited when the teachers' strike moved forward in a prevailing deadlock, preventing LAU from communicating the scholarship directly to students and preventing students from completing their files and submitting their applications. Several possibilities were explored and discussed with USAID including:
 - a. Extending the application deadline,
 - b. Rescheduling the entrance exams,
 - c. Re-printing USP III poster and distributing it to municipalities and local youth clubs
 - d. Using existing TV platform to promote the program
 - e. Asking current USP students to promote the program in their areas,
 - f. Placing USP III posters in all Liban Post and OMT offices,
 - g. Re-sending an e-mail about the program to LAU alumni,
 - h. Involving some NGOs in advertising the scholarship,
 - i. Using Facebook more aggressively.

The strike was called off on March 22nd and a decision to extend the application deadline was agreed upon. Furthermore, LAU admission team called all schools informing them that the application deadline has been extended.
