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NEDS 2015 Errata and Clarifications

1. Interviewer Manual, page 12.

We expect to interview at least 30,000 parent/guardians to collect data on 60,000 to 72,000 children age 4 – 16 nation-wide.

2. Interviewer Manual, page 36.

Fourth bullet, second sentence. Change Code 8 to Code 105, Unoccupied/Demolished HHQ.

Last bullet, second sentence. Change code 108 to 109, HHQ Nobody Home.

3. Interviewer Manual, page 43.

First bullet under List of Result Codes. Change all codes of 108 to 109, Nobody Home.

4. Interviewer Manual, page 46.

Sixth bullet, under Final Codes. Add the word “Final” to Code 203 Final PGQ R Ineligible.

5. Interviewer Manual, page 48.

Add the word “Other” to each statement so each reads as follows:

Code 210 Final Other ECQ R Nonresponse

Code 210 Final Other PGQ R Nonresponse

Code 210 Final Other LAQ R Nonresponse

6. Interviewer Manual, page 75. Lump sum.

A parent or guardian will not understand the term “lump sum.” This term is used for training purposes only. It is important is that you conceptually understand what is meant by this term.

When two or more individual school expenses are combined with another this is considered a lump sum. If a parent tells you that two or more school level expenses are combined, you will record -6 for each school level expense in which the parent says are combined. At the end of this section, there will be a new screen with a new question in the tablet that asks for you to record the total for all combined expenditures.

7. Interviewer Manual, page 75. Food and Beverage.

If the parent reports that she purchases food or other snacks in bulk for the child to take to school, you should include these costs in the total school expense for food and beverage.

For the final questionnaire for the main field work, we will no longer capture food and beverage related expenses on two screens, but instead use only one screen similar to the other questions in this section. You will need to calculate whether the school level food and beverage expenses are daily, weekly, term, monthly or yearly.

8. Interviewer Manual, page 76. Transportation.

If the parent reports that the household pays a driver to take the child or children to school in addition to running other household errands, you should code this as Private Vehicle.

Also for the final questionnaire for the main field work, we will no longer capture transportation related expenses on two screens, but instead use only one screen similar to the other questions in this section. You will need to calculate whether the school level transportation expenses are daily, weekly, term, monthly or yearly.

9. **Interviewer Manual, page 77. New Subsection, Total School Expenditures.**

The final questionnaire for the main field work will automatically calculate a total for all school level expenditures. You will see a new screen that displays the total calculated amount. You should ask the parent if this sounds about right. We want to display this total to catch any errors that the parent or interviewer may have made. As necessary, you should swipe back through this section to correct any entries.

10. **Household Questionnaire.**

At the very end of the Household Questionnaire you will record the name of the owner of the house and his/her address.

12. **Household Questionnaire Question-by-Question Specifications.**

LPG stands for liquid petroleum gas. It is the most common form of cooking gas in Nigeria.

13. **Household Questionnaire Question-by-Question Specification.**

If the HHQ respondent reports that the main source of drinking water is pure water, code bottled water.

14. **Literacy Assessment Question-by-Question Specifications.**

If the adult or child says “don’t know” when asked if the sentence he or she read is true or false, code false.

15. **Reminders:**

You must complete the ECQ before the PGQ. The only flexibility is with the administration of the LAQ

Swipe at the top of each screen to avoid introducing errors when moving forward or backwards.
