



Total ODA Disbursements 2010-2012 (USD millions):





ORGANIZATIONAL OVERVIEW & LEADERSHIP

- ◆ The Canadian Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade, and Development (DFATD) is led by the Minister for International Cooperation and La Francophonie, Christian Paradis.



ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENTS

- ◆ On March 21st, 2013, Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper announced his intentions to amalgamate CIDA and the Department of International Trade and Development to create a Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade, and Development (DFATD).
- ◆ The creation of DFATD is not budget-related, rather an effort to improve policy coherence between Canada's development, diplomacy, and trade objectives.
- ◆ In total, Canada's ODA budget is set to shrink from approximately \$5 billion in 2011 to \$4.6 billion by 2014

SECTORAL PRIORITIES

- ◆ DFATD has **three priority themes** 1) increasing food security; 2) securing the future of children and youth; and 3) stimulating sustainable economic growth.
- ◆ **The Muskoka Initiative:** In June 2010, Canada led G8 and non G8 leaders to commit \$7.3 billion to mobilize global action to reduce maternal and infant mortality and improve the health of mothers and children in the world's poorest countries. In support, Canada is providing \$1.1 billion in new funding over the next five years.
- ◆ Canada is also providing \$1.75 billion in ongoing spending on maternal and child health programming, a total contribution of \$2.85 billion over the next five years.
- ◆ Canada has shown strong commitment to the **New Alliance for Food Security and Nutrition**. Canada has disbursed 100% of their AFSI pledge to date (\$168.83 million as of 2012)

GEOGRAPHIC PRIORITIES

- ◆ In 2009, as part of their **Aid Effectiveness Agenda**, the Government of Canada announced that it will be focusing 80 percent of bilateral resources in 20 countries of focus.
- ◆ Canada is the second largest bilateral donor to Haiti. Between 2006 and 2012, Canada committed more than \$1 billion towards Haiti.
- ◆ Due to cuts in foreign aid by 2014, CIDA is eliminating programs in Bolivia, Pakistan, Mozambique, Ethiopia, Tanzania, and South Africa






