What is See Me, Share My World?

See Me, Share My World: Understanding the Third World through Children's Art, is a global education project of PLAN International USA.

It is a supplementary teaching unit designed for upper elementary grades. The unit centers around a vibrant collection of children's artwork from Colombia, Honduras, India, Sierra Leone, and Thailand. These drawings create a compelling portrait of daily life in developing countries as seen through the eyes of children.

The drawings, each with an explanation by the artist, serve as an entry point and reference for classroom activities. This personal perspective provides a unique and exciting learning experience for students and their teachers.

See Me, Share My World has been proven a success in over 100 schools nationwide. **See Me, Share My World** is available to schools, libraries, and museums.

The See Me, Share My World teaching packet includes:

- The Comprehensive Teacher Handbook is a 28 page guide with specific teaching methods covering the themes of Global Kinship, Food, Education, Health, Work, Festivals, and Games. The handbook presents objectives, presentation procedures, background information, and a variety of stimulating activities.
- A set of 8 laminated pieces of colorful student artwork done by children living in Third World countries. Each 11" x 14" print includes a map and background information about the artwork on the reverse side.

- A set of 8 laminated 11" x 14" black and white photographs depict daily life in the Third World countries with related data on the reverse side.
- 48 reproducible student activity sheets cover a broad range of topics and skills. Each is designed to be fun as well as educational.
- 30-minute training video presents live footage of the program in use in the classroom, and interviews of students and teachers who have participated in the program.


