


Feeding Nigerian Refugees

Increased violence and conflict in Nigeria continues to drive thousands of displaced families into neighboring countries Niger, Cameroon and Chad. Approximately **1.2 million people have been displaced** within the country and **more than 192,000 have fled** across the country's borders, according to UNHCR. USAID's Office of Food for Peace (FFP) is providing much-needed food assistance to refugees to address emergency needs and reduce the strain placed on host communities. To date in Fiscal Year 2015, FFP has contributed almost **\$18 million** to the UN World Food Program for operations assisting Nigerian refugees in Niger, Cameroon and Chad. This assistance includes food, cash, or vouchers and supports food-for-asset activities to protect assets and prevent malnutrition.
