B. Short Description

USAID/Kenya has provided assistance to the University of Nairobi, Veterinary Faculty, under previous projects. This assistance has consisted of the construction of classrooms and laboratory facilities and the establishment of a sound under-graduate training program.

Accomplishments of the Veterinary Faculty during the period of AID assistance have been quite satisfactory. However, the pace of Kenyanization of the academic staff has necessarily been slow, because the stream of graduates has lagged four years behind initial enrollment. There have been thus far relatively few graduates with the academic interest and capacity for further training to meet high level research and teaching needs. The pool of graduates now is growing large enough to justify intensified efforts to expand training of Kenyans for such high level positions. Furthermore, appropriate graduate training requires a blend of local and overseas academic and research training. As the only veterinary faculty now operating in Eastern Africa the Veterinary Faculty of the University of Nairobi appears to be the best place to develop such a graduate training program.

1. Purpose

The purpose of this project is to assist the University of Nairobi in the further development of its veterinary faculty. Particular emphasis will be given to the area of clinical studies and improvement of programs of post graduate training and research. This will be designed to help fill the high level veterinary teaching and research requirements of English-speaking countries in Africa.

1. AID will provide fiscal year 1971 funds to cover the costs of participant training in the U.S. for the initial year of proposed, three-year Masters and Ph.D. programs at an American university for two Kenyan participants. It is anticipated that they would commence their training at the beginning of the 1971-72 school year (September 1971).

2. AID will also provide funds to cover one half the international travel costs, and all costs of travel from port of entry in U.S. to the universities selected for training.

3. U.S. training for all participants under this project will be limited to regular course work and associated research. Ph.D. dissertation research, preparation, and the accompanying oral examination will normally take place at the University of Nairobi.

C. Commodities (twelve months funding)

AID will provide up to \$20,000 from FY-71 funds for the purchase of library books, technical publications and research equipment. III. GOVERNMENT OF KENYA CONTRIBUTION

The University will establish a special account and will deposit in this account the following schedule of monthly payments (or the equivalent in quarterly payments):

For the financial year 1973 (commencing July 1, 1972) the University will agree to pay into this account a total of Shillings 8,000/- per month in lieu of direct payment of base salaries to each of four U.S. technicians.

For the financial year 1974 (commencing July 1, 1973) and thereafter for the life of this project except as modified in Section III A4 below, the University will agree to pay into this account shillings 12,000/- per month, in lieu of direct payment of base salaries to each of six U.S. technicians.

b. The equivalent in Kenya shillings of the monthly housing allowances for each of six U.S. technicians.

The amount in each case will be equal to the monthly housing allowance for faculty at the senior lecturer level. Currently the allowances set out in "Schedule G" of the memorandum to University Staff from the Acting Registrar (New College Housing Policy) dated 2 July, 1970 shall apply.

The period covered by these payments will commence on July 1, 1971 for technicians actually in residence in Nairobi as of that date. For technicians whose initial arrivals are subsequent to that date payments in lieu of housing will commence upon notification to the University by the technician that housing has been secured.

c. The total University contribution in this account during FY 1972 will be the equivalent of approximately \$21,000.

2. The monies accrued in this account will be used to pay all local costs connected with this project. In general, the types of costs covered will include the following: reimbursement of U.S. technicians for local travel costs, purchase of local supplies in support of the activities of the U.S. technicians, payment for short-term secretarial or administrative assistance deemed necessary by the project Chief of Party in consultation with the Head of the Department and the Dean of the Faculty, research grants, post graduate awards, vacation employment and fellowships for professional improvement of Kenya citizen staff members as well as for travel costs to help establish contact between Kenyan members of the Veterinary Faculty and fellow scientists in Africa and elsewhere.

The overall success or failure of this project ultimately depends on replacing U.S. technicians with qualified Kenyans. Unless participants are properly selected, adequately trained and returned to the Veterinary faculty on a timely basis the principal objective of the project - the development of a self-perpetuating graduate studies program at the Veterinary Faculty, operating with a high degree of excellence - will not have been achieved.

1. Selection

The University will select two highly qualified candidates for three year graduate training programs at a U.S. university leading to Master's and PhD degrees. This selection shall be with the participation and concurrence of the project Chief of Party.

Should there not be, in the first year of the project, prospective Kenyan candidates with sufficiently high qualifications, the selection will be deferred pending the identification of suitable candidates. Should this occur the University and Chief of Party will supply the USAID Mission with a brief written statement for the record stating that no candidates with suitable qualifications could be identified.

In no case, however, shall there have been fewer than six candidates selected and sent for training in the U.S. by September, 1973.

2. Transportation

The University will provide one half the round trip international air fare from Nairobi to port of entry into the U.S. for each participant

A. Academic Staff: \$399,000 of continuation contract funding for:

- One microbiologist
- One parasitologist
- One clinical pharmacologist
- One clinical surgeon (large animals)
- One expert in clinical laboratory medicine
- One expert in clinical preventive medicine.

It is anticipated that the parasitology and clinical laboratory medicine positions will be phased out at the end of the 1975/1976 academic year. The four remaining positions will be terminated at the end of this project in July 1978.

AID agrees that personnel supplied in these technical specialities should be acceptable to the University of Nairobi and be qualified to teach at the graduate level. They also should be qualified to organize and manage graduate research programs.

The technician who serves as Chief of Party will sit on the Advisory Committee of the Faculty.

B. Participants.

It is anticipated that two participants will begin long-term graduate training at a U.S. University during the 1974/75 academic

Individual agreements (PIO/P's) for each participant will describe each program and the commitment on the part of the GOK, the University of Nairobi, and the participant that he will be assigned to the staff of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine upon his return to Kenya. Five participants will continue their graduate training in the United States during the 1974/75 contract year. \$59,000 is provided in the contract for these purposes.

It is anticipated that the research element of participants' graduate programs will be continued in Kenya. One participant returned to the University of Nairobi in early 1974 to complete his research requirements for a doctoral degree and a second is scheduled to return in late 1974. \$1,055 is provided to fund the remaining costs of the returnee's program in the U.S.

AID anticipates, subject to the availability of funds, that an additional four participant grants will be made available in FY 1975 to complete the training element of this project.

C. Commodities

AID will finance under the U.S. University's contract the procurement of approximately \$19,000 worth of books, technical publications and laboratory equipment for use in support of research and laboratory experimental work at the University of Nairobi.

III. Government of Kenya Contribution

The University of Nairobi on behalf of the Government of Kenya agrees to provide the following support for U.S. technicians:

A. Special Account

1. The University will deposit into a special account during the 1974-1975 contract year (starting July 1, 1974) the equivalent of the base salary for a Senior Lecturer for each of the technicians provided under this project. The Senior Lecturer salary scale currently begins at KSh2,256 per year, or Shs.3,760 per month. Actual expenditures shall be approved by the Chief of Party and the Dean of the Faculty.
6. A quarterly statement of expenditures will be sent to the Controller, USAID Mission to Kenya, and the Ministry of Finance.
7. AID maintains the right to audit this account as part of its normal auditing functions.
8. When Kenyan counterpart to the U.S. technicians have been selected and are on the job or when a participant has returned to complete his doctoral thesis and given the status of tutorial fellow, the amount of money being paid into the special account by the University will be reduced by an amount equivalent to that paid in salaries to the Kenyan counterparts or tutorial fellow.
