

Dear Mr. Kaya:

We are writing in reply to your letter No. 588 dated May 21, 1973 which covered a number of important subjects in connection with the implementation of the Livestock Loan, particularly the extension of certain terminal dates as set forth in the Loan Agreement.

First, we have reviewed the proposed loan agreement which the Entente Fund plans to sign with the Government of Ivory Coast in connection with the construction of several slaughterhouses in Ivory Coast in accordance with the project approved by the Council of Ministers of the Entente Livestock Community on April 12, 1972. While it differs from the model form agreed to by the Ministers for Subloans under the project, it is a distinct improvement over that model, and appears to be a sound legal and financial document. This type of agreement therefore meets AID requirements, and it is agreed that it may be used as a model for loan agreements to be negotiated for other projects to be financed under the loan. We will appreciate receiving a conformed copy of loan agreements as soon as they are executed.

We also wish to acknowledge receipt of a copy of the contract between the Government and BEMTD for preparation of the IFB's and construction supervision of the Ivorian Slaughterhouses, and were pleased to see that implementation of this project is scheduled to begin in August, and that the Cotonou slaughterhouse and Niger cattle trail projects should begin in October 1973.

This brings us to the very important consideration of the extension of various terminal dates contained in the Loan Agreement. First, it is noted under Section 7.04 of the Agreement, that no Letter of Commitment or other commitment documents for the first tranche of the Loan shall be issued in response to requests received by AID after twenty-four (24) months from the date of execution of the Agreement, which was May 12, 1971. The expiration date was therefore May 12, 1973. It is further noted, however, that three projects for a total of approximately \$2.3 million have been duly approved by the Council of Ministers, and that construction of all three are to be underway this fall. Since the Conditions Precedent for the First Tranche have been met, and in view of the advancement of the three approved projects, we hereby agree to your request to extend the terminal date for requesting commitment documents for the first tranche for a period of eighteen (18) months to November 12, 1974, to take into account any contingencies. At the same time, A.I.D. hereby agrees to your request that the final date of disbursement for the first tranche be extended. This date is thus extended for a period of twelve (12) months beyond the 36 month period stated in the Loan Agreement, or to May 12, 1975.

We have had numerous discussions with you and members of your staff in the past several weeks regarding the overall implementation of the livestock program. Several positive actions are underway, and within this context, you have requested AID to consider the extension of the terminal dates for meeting the Conditions Precedent for the second tranche of the loan which is in the amount of \$4 million. This date likewise expired on May 12, 1973 as set forth in Section 3.03 of the Loan Agreement.

In resume, the Conditions Precedent for the Second Tranche are (a) a plan for the utilization of the funds from the second tranche; (b) executed agreements by all the member states to programs of cooperation for statistics, fiscal and customs policy, health regulation, licensing of merchants, price, and other areas deemed necessary to effective implementation of the program; and (c) evidence of formation of a Consultative Committee for multi-donor assistance to the member states including committed and financial assistance by other donors of sufficient magnitude to permit new investments to result in increased commercialization of livestock.

As pointed out in your letter, a protocol has been signed for statistics, and made operative by the introduction of the "cattle passport". Other signed protocols cover sanitary measures, quality of meat, categories of meat, and cattle trails within the Community. The last three mentioned protocols are of the type considered required for successful program implementation, although not specifically named in the Loan Agreement. You confirm our understanding that the important protocol involving fiscal and customs agreement has been elaborated by the experts of the ELC secretariat, and will be presented at the next meeting of the Council of Ministers for approval. You have indicated that the licensing of merchants protocol is being prepared and will be finalized once the results of the statistics program are analyzed.

This leaves outstanding the question of a protocol on prices, which is perhaps the most difficult of all. We know that the ELC has been giving considerable attention to this matter, and that talks have been held between the countries at both the technical and ministerial levels. It was realized during the negotiations of the Loan Agreement that this subject would require much study and negotiation, before a satisfactory solution could be found. Your letter indicates that the importing countries are not opposed in principle to an increase in the price of meat if such an increase is for the benefit of the producers and results in an increase in production. In order to help assure that such would be the result of price increases, you state that the member countries have requested an exhaustive study on this subject and the structure of prices of cattle and meat, and that once the terms of reference are established, AID may be asked to finance the actual study.

In connection with the formulation of a plan for utilization of the second tranche funds, we have also discussed this matter on a number of occasions, and of course this was included in your talks in Washington the last of March. We are all agreed that this is a priority question, and that the Entente Fund, ELC, the national livestock services, will all be giving considerable attention to this matter. In this context, we have noted the letter sent by the Entente Fund on May 9 to the appropriate ministers in each of the countries requesting that definitive plans be drawn up for the projects proposed for AID financing, and reiterating the willingness of both AID and FAC to provide the necessary


experts to finalize the technical studies and prepare the IFB's for project implementation. We understand that this will be one of the subjects of discussion at the next meeting of the Council of Ministers in July.

We agree with your position that progress is being made in regard to the Consultative Committee, and that the meeting in Brussels in December 1972, can serve to provide greater liaison among the donors. This should result in further understandings at the meeting of the Committee to be held later in 1973 and which inter alia is expected to examine the possibilities of a multi-donor, regional animal health program within the framework of the ELC.

Taking all of the above into consideration, and assuming that within the next few months further progress in these areas can be made, we are pleased to inform you that A.I.D. hereby agrees to the extension of the terminal date for meeting the Conditions Precedent for the second tranche of the loan for a period of nine months to February 12, 1974. We would expect that all of the Conditions Precedent with the possible exception of the protocol on prices could be satisfied considerably in advance of this date. We also agree that projects to be financed from the second tranche, as well as overruns of projects approved under the first tranche may be considered for financing at this time, and requests for commitment documents made on a case by case basis even though the Conditions Precedent for the second tranche have not yet been met.

We believe that the above decisions are in line with the general tenor of your conversations with AID officials in Washington during your recent visit there. We look forward to working closely with the Entente Fund on these problems and are hopeful that significant progress can be made between now and the end of the year.

WHEREAS, the Council has requested the services of a marketing economist as an advisor, and the services of the Contractor may be usefully employed for that purpose, and the Agency for International Development (hereinafter called "A.I.D."), has undertaken by agreement with said Council to provide such assistance; and



1. The purpose of this contract is to provide one (1) Livestock Economist (Contractor) as requested by the Secretariat of the Mutual Aid and Loan Guaranty Fund, Council of the Entente States (Secretariat).

2. The Contractor shall supply technical assistance to the Secretariat as required in carrying out a regional multi-donor program designed to develop an Entente States Economic Community for Livestock and Meat, which involves improving the quality and increasing the numbers and marketing of cattle.

5. In conjunction with the services of the Ministry, establish and implement effective procedures for organizing, analyzing and scheduling inputs, in order that information may be distributed to appropriate offices in a concise and timely manner.

6. Evaluate and compare import statistics of cattle deficient countries and the export statistics of cattle and meat producing surplus countries of the Entente and associated States.

7. Assist as required to develop and implement administrative procedures and control forms including cattle inoculation records, passports, identification tags and/or marks, bills of lading, etc., with the objective of facilitating import and/or export of cattle and meat products through international border customs stations and other appropriate points.

8. Study the current cattle production and meat marketing price structure with the objective of identifying elements relevant to livestock and meat marketing in the Entente Livestock Community (ELC) and associated States.

9. Train one (1) or more local technicians, preferably member(s) of the Division of Statistics and Information of the Community Secretariat in the methods and techniques of Livestock Marketing Specialist as such personnel may be recommended for such training by the Secretariat.

11. Assist the Computer Specialist, if available, to program and process such information and data inputs. Prepare such information for distribution as may be required.

12. Prepare and submit verbal and/or written reports in such form and content as may be requested by the Secretariat, from time to time, during the term of this contract.

C. Orientation and Consultation

1. The Contractor shall attend the Foreign Service Institute (F.S.I.) Washington, D. C., for the purpose of receiving French language training and instruction beginning on or about August 23, 1971, and continuing for a period not to exceed twenty (20) consecutive weeks.
