



II. Activity Objectives

Refer to Project Proposal (PROP) dated August 19, 1968 and Agreement No. 255, Agriculture Advisory Services, dated December 6, 1968.

In addition this project is designed to assist the Ministry of Agriculture in increasing the efficiency, operational and maintenance capabilities of the Ministry's spray services. The project is also designed to provide USAID liaison to the Desert Locust Control Organization for East Africa, and to assist prospective investors in the investigation of potential agricultural projects. These services will be provided under the terms of a Participating Agency Service Agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In order to fulfill these services a new Cessna twin engine aircraft will be procured. Title for the Aircraft will remain with USAID/Ethiopia until such time as it is mutually agreed to transfer title to the Ministry of Agriculture for their spray service requirements.

III. Course of Action


Refer to the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) dated June 30, 1968 a course of action mutually agreed upon by the Ministry of Agriculture and USAID/Ethiopia. IV. Progress to Date

In 1965 the Ministry requested advisory services to assist in the planning effort. In FY 1966 the USAID provided the services of three advisors to assist the Ministry in the reorganization and expansion of its Agricultural Economics Department, in the establishment of a Planning Unit, in Marketing, and in the development of agricultural sector plans.

One of the principal targets of the project has been to establish and have fully operational by November 1972 an Agricultural Economics and Statistics Department within the Ministry. This Department was to have the capability of providing synthesized data and carrying out required studies in a timely manner. Such data and studies were envisaged as necessary to establish



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an economic base for planning for agricultural development. At the request of Minister of Agriculture in January, 1967, the Project advisors prepared an organization chart for the Department and made recommendations for operational procedures and personnel requirements. These were submitted to the Ministry in June 1967. At that time the Ministry accepted in principle the need for establishing a functional Department along with a Planning Unit. Although the Department has not yet become fully operational in all aspects because of a very limited number of qualified personnel and because of budgetary constraints, work is being carried on.


In January 1969, a farm management study was initiated in the Ada District of Shoa Province. This study is still in progress and is expected to continue. Plans have been made for a study of crop forecasting by the Statistical Division. At the present time a number of participants have been selected to study various aspects of Agricultural Economics to staff the Department in order to carry out the broader scope of required studies. Through FY 1969 twenty-one participants have been programmed for training.

The Planning Unit has become functional and works with the project advisors in planning regional development projects.

Another project objective has been to assist the Ethiopian Grain Corporation to develop the capability to administer a program of purchasing, handling, storing, distributing, and marketing grain throughout Ethiopia. In June and July 1966 USAID funded an in-depth study of the EGC. Recommendations were made to assist the EGC management to plan for future growth and expanded commercial operations. The EGC has achieved a place of leadership in grain marketing and processing in Ethiopia. It is the only one of the group of grain dealers in the Empire which has established and utilizes a grain grades and standards basis for purchasing grain. This system is used throughout the EGC organization and its efforts are expected to penetrate the overall national system in due time.

The Livestock and Meat Board began to function in June 1964. After an initial period of establishing management and operating plans, policies and procedures, the Livestock and Meat Board has steadily improved its efficiency in discharging its responsibilities in the area of livestock development. All phases of LMB activities related to management, marketing, processing, distribution, transportation and warehousing have been improved.




VI. Special ProvisionsA. Local Currency Costs


B. Commodities

2. The Ministry of Agriculture will be responsible and liable for handling AID-financed commodity shipments from the point of entry in Ethiopia (port, airport, post office, railhead, etc.) to the point of delivery at the project site, and for maintaining adequate records to document the receipt and delivery of each shipment. Also, the Ministry will be responsible for the prompt performance of, and payment of costs for, import formalities, inland transportation, reconciliation of shipments, and prompt submission of receiving reports to USAID/Ethiopia for each shipment received.

a) The Ministry of Agriculture accepts responsibility for clearing all AID financed commodities from the port of entry (port, railhead, post office, airport, etc.) within ninety days from the date of discharge from the vessel. Failing this, the cargo will be considered "distressed" and eligible for refund claim action. The Ministry will verify port clearance of each shipment by furnishing a copy of the forwarding waybill or a duly authorized statement giving the dates on which the shipment arrived and was cleared.


b) The Ministry of Agriculture agrees that shipments delivered to project sites will be opened and inspected promptly and the condition of the goods will be noted in the "Receiving Report" form provided by AID. The original and one copy of the "Receiving Report" will be returned to the USAID within sixty days of port clearance. Failing this, project delivery will be considered delinquent and the shipment eligible for refund claim action. Losses, shortages, or damages will be indicated in the "Receiving Report" and any action resulting therefrom will be supported with evidence to substantiate the claim.

3. The Ministry of Agriculture will be responsible for the prompt initiation and prosecution of claims for loss or damage of commodity shipments from suppliers to the project site.

4. The Ministry of Agriculture will be responsible for the continuing maintenance, repair, recurring operational and support costs for all AID financed commodities provided under this Project Agreement. The Ministry will be responsible for an adequate property management system to show identification, maintenance, repair, operation, utilization, location and assignment of AID financed commodities.

5. Marine Insurance may be provided for the commodities authorized under this Project Agreement only in compliance with paragraph 201.13(b) (3) of AID Regulation 1.

III. COURSE OF ACTION

Refer to the project documents listed above and to the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) dated June 30, 1969 that outlines the course of action mutually agreed upon by the Ministry of Agriculture and USAID/Ethiopia. The Mission is preparing a revised PIP to reflect current inputs and objectives of this project.

Work programmed for FY 1971 includes the USAID/E assisting in the re-organization of the Ministry of Agriculture's Machinery Pool. Lack of managerial personnel and inadequate budgeting have hampered the effectiveness of the Machinery Pool as a support unit for the Ministry's agricultural development activities, e.g., the Regional Livestock Development Project. USAID/E will provide salary topping for two IEG contract personnel (a General Manager and a Mechanic Supervisor) to assist in implementing the necessary changes at the Machinery Pool.

An Agricultural Marketing Advisor funded under this project in FY 1971 will be responsible for establishing an agricultural marketing research capability in the Planning Unit of the Ministry of Agriculture. Also, he will assist the Ethiopian Grain Corporation in designing techniques for gathering statistical inputs to be used in market analysis; and will be developing a strategy for the Grain Corporation to become a vital marketing enterprise responsible to both the public and private sectors.

During FY 1971 an Agronomy Advisor is being provided for this project. His primary objective will be to work with the IEG Institute of Agricultural Research in conducting varietal testing and field trials on crops to be utilized at the Ada, Shashemene and other area development project sites.

Also in FY 1971 one OPEX Agricultural Credit Specialist will be assigned to the new Ethiopian Development Corporation to assist with the organization and administration of an agricultural credit program for farmers in Ethiopia.

USAID Agricultural Advisors assigned to this project will continue to assist all IEG ministries and agencies concerned with agriculture in the development of organizational structures which can support and administer Ethiopian agricultural development; and, are assisting the IEG in making economic evaluations and appraisals of various alternative approaches to the implementation of plans for agricultural development, particularly those presented in the Third Five Year Development Plan.

IV. PROGRESS TO DATE

A Planning Unit has been established in the Ministry and is rapidly developing its capability to plan for agricultural development. It is staffed by a well-qualified agricultural economist as head of the Unit, an expatriate seconded from FAO, two agricultural economics graduates from Alemaya and the USAID/E Agricultural Economics Advisor. This phase of the project is on target.

The Department of Economics and Statistics has been merged with the Planning Unit in order to better coordinate the economic and statistical research with development planning. This action will also provide better utilization of available trained manpower.

During FY 1970, an interministerial committee was appointed to prepare the project application for the Ada District Area Development Project. All documentation for the Shashemene Agricultural Development Project has been completed.

I. BACKGROUND

The high Priority accorded by the Imperial Ethiopian Government and the USAID/E to the agricultural sector, is reflected below in this Program Agreement which will provide advisory services, participant training and commodities to the Ministry of Agriculture.


The Economic Research Division of the Planning and Programming Department, under the guidance of the Agricultural Economics (Marketing) Advisor, has initiated a market structure survey. The findings of this study will be the basis for determining marketing policies and programs to meet these policy objectives.

Documentation for the Ada and Shashemene projects, under the guidance of the Agricultural Advisor has been completed.

The Institute of Agricultural Research, with the assistance of the contract Agronomist (funded in FY 1971) established five trial plots in the Shashemene/Avassa area to test varietal adaptations, optimum planting dates, and fertilizer responses of maize, wheat, teff and haricot beans. The data resulting from these verification trials will be used to improve yields in conjunction with activities of agricultural development projects.

The Mechanic Supervisor at the Ministry of Agriculture's motor pool (funded in FY 1971 for 24 months), has introduced an effective system for the procurement, storage, and issuance of spare parts. In addition, a machine shop has been made operational, and vehicle repair facilities have been renovated. Warehousing procedures, including inventory



IV. COURSE OF ACTION

B. The contractor, with the assistance of the Ministry of Agriculture, shall be responsible for all matters relating to obtaining Ethiopian identity cards, driver's licenses, entry and re-entry visas, and all other documents required in the performance of his work.

4. IEG Counterparts

The Planning and Programming Department of the Ministry of Agriculture agrees to identify and assign a qualified employee to serve as counterpart to the host country contractor and to replace him upon his departure from Ethiopia, if not earlier. The Ministry of Agriculture and USAID agree to review the readiness of the counterpart employee to assume the duties of the AID financed contractor before the expiration of the contract period, and in any event not later than 12 months after arrival of the latter.

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- a/ In the event the contractor has accumulated official vacation leave which he has not been able to use for valid official reasons, Trans Century shall pay the OPEX contractor a lump sum amount at the end of the contractor's tour. 1. MISSION APPRECIATES STRAIGHTFORWARD ANALYSIS. TRANSITIONAL NATURE SUBJECT PROJECT CONTAINED DRAFT PROJECT AUTHORIZATION AND PROP REVISION WHICH SUBMITTED MISSION FOR COMMENT. WOULD APPRECIATE, HOWEVER, IF FOLLOWING ADDITIONS/CLARIFICATIONS COULD BE INCORPORATED INTO FINAL DOCUMENTS.

2. COMMENTS ON PROP REV. 2:

A. STRONGLY BELIEVE THAT MODEST AMOUNT FLEXIBILITY MUST BE BUILT INTO B. STRATEGY (AND FUNDING) TO PERMIT USAID RECRUIT ONE OR TWO ADDITIONAL SALARY SUPPLEMENTED PERSONNEL FOR MINAG PLANNING PROGRAMMING UNIT THIS FY. AT MOMENT, MINAG HAS IDENTIFIED NEED FOR AGRIC ECON (EVALUATION) TO SET UP EVALUATION UNIT AND INSTALL SYSTEM. USAID OF OPINION THAT THIS POSITION IS INDEED CRITICAL AND THAT PROVISION SHOULD BE MADE FOR IT IN FY 72 TO ENABLE US PROCEED ONCE IEG REQUEST RECEIVED. IN ADDITION, RELIEVE SCOPE AND FUNDS SHOULD COVER PROBABLE NEED OBTAIN TDY AID SPECIALISTS AND CONSULTANTS DURING REMAINING TWO YEARS OF PROJECT AS MAY BE REQUIRED. THIS IS MOST IMPORTANT FOR PROJECT THAT DOES, IN FACT, LINK ALL ACTIVITIES IN AG SECTOR AND WHICH NECESSARY ENABLE CONTINUED PLANNING AND PROGRAM REFINEMENTS IN SECTOR BY MINAG AND USAID TO OCCUR.

B. PER MISSION "TRANSITION PLANS" PREFER REASSIGN DIRECT-HIRE AND PASA PERSONNEL TO OTHER PROJECTS JULY 1, 1972 TO THE EXTENT THE RELEVANT NEW PROJECTS HAVE COME INTO BEING INSTEAD OF BY

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ESTIMATED DATES OF PROJECTION INITIATION WHICH UNCERTAIN.
(P. 4).

C. REFERENCE TO PARTICIPANTS IN AG EXTENSION AND PLANT PROTECTION (P. 2) SHOULD MAKE CLEAR THESE CONTINUING SINCE WE NOT PROGRAMMING ANY NEW STARTS.

3. COMMENTS ON PROJECT AUTHORIZATION: SUGGEST INCLUDING ONLY GENERAL REFERENCE TO MISSION'S INTENT TO SUBMIT NEW PROP APRIL 1972 FOR FOLLOW-ON PROJECT (P. 3). WHILE SUPPORT TO MINAG P & P UNIT AND INITIATION OF PROVINCIAL AGRIC PLANNING WILL POSSIBLY BE MAJOR FOCUS NEW PROJECT, THE FULL AND PRECISE SCOPE TO BE PROPOSED WILL PROBABLY NOT BE DETERMINED UNTIL SPRING OF 1972 WHEN PROP DEVELOPED. THEREFORE SUGGEST LANGUAGE IN FIRST SENTENCE BE MADE MORE FLEXIBLE.
