(1) The Ministry of Public Works will provide the technical and administrative staff to the engineering firm as needed to complete the activities within the specified period. (2) The Contractor and the U.S. Contract personnel shall be subject to the General Agreement effective July 1, 1957.

19A Scope of Technical Services (Contd.)

To provide the necessary advisory services to the MPW for determining overall highway needs based on a functional highway classification. This work will be tailored to reflect the local conditions and needs of Jordan and must be sufficiently flexible so as to be responsive to changing economic facts and plans.

The objectives of these services shall be as follows:

1. Recommendations for revisions of the functional classifications of roads on the present highway system.
2. Recommendations for revisions to the present standards for the various classes of roads.
3. A presentation to the National Planning Council (NPC) and MPW of alternative plans for various levels of highway improvements.
4. The development of a Master Plan for improving the highway system to such a predetermined level as determined by NPC and MPW in step 3 above. This plan shall include both a short range program of approximately 5 years and a long range program of 20 years. The short range program shall involve a priority ranking of specific projects whereas the long range program shall group projects into general time frames. For the fulfillment of the above objectives, engineering and administrative decisions shall be provided by the MPW at the proper time during the study in order to establish and substantiate roadway classification, standards, and level of service, etc.

19B Description

Generally, the services shall follow a pattern as follows:

Inventory (Maximum use shall be made of the information which is available in the MPW).

1. Accumulate physical data. Existing highways and structures shall be listed along with such information as length of segment, location, terrain, geometrics, width of payment, width of shoulders, surface, types, etc.
2. Collect information on the condition of the highways such as rideability, structural condition and drainage.
3. Obtain traffic counts and composition of traffic.

4. Perform necessary origin and destination surveys.
5. Obtain average safe speed and data necessary for capacity considerations.

FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION

1. Review existing classification of highways in Jordan.
2. Determine criteria for functional classification that is appropriate for Jordan and apply the criteria to the existing and proposed road network.
3. Recommend changes in the present classification system.

HIGHWAY NEEDS

1. Determine present deficiencies on each of the existing highway systems.
2. Determine the present need for added new facilities.
3. Determine the anticipated future deficiencies on the existing highway system.
4. Determine the future need for added new facilities.

SUMMARIZATION OF NEEDS AND PRESENTATION

The functional highway classification study and the highway needs study, shall be conducted in a coordinated manner and presented as a package to the NPC and MFW showing alternatives that represent realistic courses of action for achieving specified objectives in highway improvement and expansion. The NPC and MFW shall then decide what they are willing to pay for in terms of highway standards and levels of service for the various classes of roads. The study shall then proceed into the priority analysis.

GENERAL PRIORITIES

The Consultant shall develop general priorities for the total master plan and schedule these priorities into time frames of several years throughout the plan.

SHORT RANGE PROGRAM

The Consultant shall develop a system which will identify the relative priority of individual highway projects. In identifying priorities, consideration will be given to the internal rate of return methods, sufficiency ratings, etc.. and any other tools that are considered applicable.

1. Project Description

This Project Agreement provides U.S. grant assistance to the Government of Jordan for the purpose of carrying out feasibility studies for developing, selecting and/or evaluating capital development and development related projects. Such studies may comprise all aspects preceding the implementation phase; viz; technical and economic evaluation, establishment of definitive cost estimates, and, in special cases, the preparation of detailed designs and specifications.

2. USAID Contributions and Responsibilities Under This Agreement

A.
