Five Year Program for Afghanistan Students
Leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The faculty of the College of Nursing recommend that a five year program be implemented for the seven Afghanistan students who will be trained as nurses at the University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. The admission and progress of students is outlined below:

1. Students will apply for admission to the University of Nebraska at Omaha.
2. Following the satisfactory completion of all first year courses outlined in the proposed program, the students will be admitted to the College of Nursing of the University of Nebraska Medical Center.^{1/}
3. Following the satisfactory completion of the second and third years of the program the students will be awarded the degree of Associate of Science in Nursing.^{2/}
4. Prior to enrolling in the Baccalaureate Program all students must take the State Board of Nursing examinations and be licensed as Registered Nurses in Nebraska. (See College of Nursing Bulletin p. 16)
5. Upon satisfactory completion of the last two years of the program the students will be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

Faculty of the College of Nursing believe that the proposed program has the following strengths that will make it possible for these students to successfully complete the program and to prepare them as competent practitioners upon their return to Afghanistan.

1. The first year when students will be enrolled at the University of Nebraska at Omaha will be a year of orientation to American language and culture and to competing with students at the University level.
2. The scheduling for the summer, fall and spring terms will lighten the load for each term and yet enable the students to complete a full academic year load.

1/ Students must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (C). Courses in which a student receives a "D" or "F" may be repeated one time only.

2/ A minimum grade of "C" is required in all nursing courses before the student can progress to the next nursing course.

3. The provision of a full time assistant instructor during the fall and spring semesters of the second and third year is essential since these students will require special assistance with Learning Center assignments, supervision in the hospital, and preparation for the State Board examinations. (These are national examinations and because of language differences the students will require additional help).

This additional instructional assistance is essential. Students with language and cultural differences find it extremely difficult to assess patient needs, teach patients regarding their care, and plan for the home care of patients. Only with extremely close supervision is it possible to provide adequate physical and psychological care of patients in the hospitals used by the University. Without such instructional help the University of Nebraska College of Nursing would be unable to accept these students since Nebraska legislators are unwilling to have faculty devote excessive amounts of time in teaching non-resident students.

4. The provision of a half time faculty member with a Master's degree in nursing during the fall and spring of the fourth and fifth year will make it possible to provide additional supervision in hospital and community nursing assignments and to plan and offer a 6 credit Directed Study experience that will focus on the specific needs of these students when they return to Afghanistan.

This course will help students who will return to teaching and supervisory positions to plan courses for students to supervise student experience and to evaluate both theory and practice.

A major program goal of the RGA/USAID joint efforts in Afghanistan is to encourage and assist the mobilization, wise investment and efficient management of public and private resources directed toward achieving a sharply increased rate of economic and social growth. To accomplish this goal, a large number of Afghans with the knowledge and skills required for effective leadership and administration are needed. In particular, Afghans now need the skills of policy problem analysis, management of institutional growth, and leadership of public opinion on economic issues.

The above goal can best be met by a government-wide approach. Although USAID/Afghanistan and other donors have provided considerable training for hundreds of Afghans over the years, the overwhelming majority of that training has been in specific technical specialties. Afghan staff and leadership equipped with the attitudes, knowledge and skills required for competent economic analysis, effective policy formulation, and management -- i. e., those skills required for the governance of a developing economy -- remain in very short supply.

Full details of this project are outlined in the PROP dated May 24, 1971, and this Project Agreement is concerned with the managerial and economic training elements of the project.

A. Project Target

To select RGA officials of high potential now in, or shortly slated for, responsible managerial or administrative positions and to provide them with the analytical skills, techniques, and knowledge oriented toward the practical problems of government policy formulation, program analysis, management and administration and other aspects of public leadership. Then, to return them to Afghanistan to use those skills at progressively higher levels and positions of responsibility in the government to accelerate Afghan development.

B. Course of Action

To select and train Afghan personnel with demonstrated potential in analytical skills of economics, policy formulation, and administration. They will be sent to the United States for non-degree programs usually of 12 to 24 months duration. Occasionally, a participant may earn an M. S. degree, but the entire emphasis in this program is on the acquisition of skills for governmental

application in management, policy development, and other aspects of public leadership. The attainment of degrees is purely secondary, and only incidental to the training. Most of these participants would be given about an academic year of graduate-level academic studies in economic analysis, management, or some combination thereof, aimed primarily at the development of analytical, problem-solving skills and management ability. The academic studies generally would be preceded or followed by an on-the-job experience related to their academic studies and their application to Afghan problems.

It is estimated that during the life of the project some two-thirds of the candidates would come from the Ministries most directly concerned with economic development (and especially from planning and budget staffs, and large operational programs), but not excluding anyone viewed as President-level material. Other candidates in line for roles of senior policy or management importance in the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Interior, Information, etc., also would be eligible. Initially, the candidates will come from the central government organizations primarily; but it is planned that eventually a considerable number of candidates from provincial government priority areas (such as governors and sub-governors, provincial fiscal directors, etc.) can be included.

The principal criteria for selection are ability, past performance, and promise of superior future performance. Indicators of outstanding ability are: (1) a good university record with the possession of at least a B. A. degree; (2) a good record on the job which would be evidenced by work performance and promotions; (3) judgment of senior people that the person under consideration has strong growth potential; and (4) a sufficient experience actually on the job (probably five years) to demonstrate ability. The intention is to select people who already have demonstrated performance based on ability and a capacity to rise in the Government service on the basis of merit. Opportunity for selection will be available to reasonably mature people from all parts and all ethnic groups of Afghanistan. It is anticipated that most candidates will be in the 30-40 year age group.

All personnel selected will have completed their military obligation or will be exempt for reasons other than having been selected for training under this or other training activities. Since the language of training will be English, a solid working knowledge is required. It may be acquired after initial selection but must be demonstrated prior to departure for the United States.

The National Coordinating Committee, composed of Deputy Ministers with the addition of the President of Civil Service from the Prime Ministry, under the chairmanship of the Minister of Planning and with the Deputy Minister of Planning as the alternate chairman, will serve as the Selection Committee for this project. For purposes of selecting candidates under this project, the President of Civil Service will also act as Secretary to the Committee. The Secretariate will be composed of personnel from the Civil Service Department; and all nominations for training put forth by the government ministries and agencies will be sent initially to the Secretariate for review, for the administration of appropriate tests, and for the development of proposed programs of training. The USAID Public Administration Officer and the USAID Training Officer will be available to the Secretary and to the Committee for regular counsel and advice on the appropriateness of nominees and proposed programs of training.

The Committee will establish the selection criteria as noted herein, provide public notice of the program, establish priorities, determine final selection of candidates, generally approve training programs, determine the initial placement of returned trainees, and periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the program.

C. U.S. Contributions

Participants - In U.S. FY 1972 programs will be developed for this Training. Up to nine participants will depart, hopefully in September 1972, for individual programs in the specialties for which they are selected for a duration of not less than twelve (12) months and not more than twenty-four (24) months, with the understanding that the second year of training, if so planned, will be only where warranted and progress has been satisfactory. Participants will be sought for training in policy development, program analysis, economic analysis, management of institutional growth, and leadership of public opinion on economic issues. FY 72 funding will finance one year of training.

The RGA has embarked on a program of upgrading its legal institutions by training of personnel to enable them to work within the present system more effectively in a manner consistent with the requirements of development.

The RGA has expressed a twofold need: (i) to increase the competence of legal personnel in order to improve the functioning of the judicial machinery which now is inhibited by a lack of well-trained lawyers, and (ii) to give its lawyers a greater capacity to adapt existing Afghan substantive and procedural law to meet the demands of the 1984 Constitution and general economic and social changes. The legal personnel in whose training the RGA is primarily interested include members of the Judiciary, an independent branch of the RGA; officers of the Ministry of Justice, a department within the Executive branch; and members of the two law faculties of Kabul University.

A. Activity Target

To train and upgrade RGA legal officials, teachers of law, and members of the Judiciary in modern legal methodology and procedures.

B. Course of Action

To select and train RGA officials from the Judiciary; Faculty of Islamic Law; and the Faculty of (Commercial) Law and Political Science; and the Ministry of Justice. The latter will be dealing primarily with criminal law and procedure, legislative drafting, and legal research. These officials will undertake legal training in the U.S. for a period from 12-18 months, to be programmed together initially with the training period left flexible to cover individual needs of the varied group. A U.S. university law school will be contracted to carry out the training, with a common basic program for all three distinct groups and then later separation of those groups for individual training. Upon satisfactory evaluation of the initial group experience, subsequent groups of similar trainees will be sent annually to the U.S. as a continuation of the project planned to extend for a minimum of five years. It is not a degree program, nor a regular legal academic studies program, but rather a direct tutorial study and seminar program to meet Afghan specialized legal needs and not to provide 'American lawyers' to Afghanistan. There will also be considerable field visits and experience combined with the studies.

The U.S. University coordinator is expected to visit Afghanistan each year to review and evaluate the project with the appropriate RGA and USAID officials.

During these visits he will review the specifics of the training offered with each of the RGA legal institutions and also the special training needs of each participant.

The Mission expects to begin this project activity with the training of nine people. It will probably be June of 1973 before the first group will be in training. The initial group will be scheduled for 18 months. We may find it necessary to adjust this period of training for various individuals based on experience. Secondly, we would then program nine or more participants each year, subject to available funding, starting in January 1974, again for about 18 months each, subject also to evaluation of the program and necessary adjustments of the period of training. Dispatch of the third group will be contingent on satisfactory performance as determined by an evaluation of such factors as participant selection, performance and RGA support.

A selection committee will be designated within each legal institution, i.e., the Judiciary, the Ministry of Justice, the Faculty of Islamic Law, and the Faculty of Law and Political Science, to select the legal training participants. Representatives of these committees would meet jointly with the President of Civil Service, and representatives of the Ministry of Planning and USAID to review priorities in the program and balance among major areas of concentration.

The principal criteria for selection are ability, past performance, and promise of superior future performance. Indicators of outstanding ability are: (1) a good university record with the possession of at least a B.A. degree; (2) a good record on the job which would be evidenced by work performance and promotions; (3) relative score on examinations in social studies given in Dari; (4) judgment of senior people that the person under consideration has strong growth potential; and (5) a sufficient experience actually on the job to demonstrate ability. The intention is to select people who already have demonstrated performance based on ability and a capacity to rise in the Government service on the basis of merit. We anticipate that most candidates will be in the 25-40 year age group.

All personnel selected will have completed their military obligations or will be exempt for reasons other than their having been selected for training under this

A. Background

Although USAID/Afghanistan and other donors have provided considerable training for hundreds of Afghans over the years, the overwhelming majority of that training has been in narrow technical specialties. Afghan staff and leadership equipped with the attitudes, knowledge and skills required for competent economic analysis, effective policy formulation, and management, i. e., skills required for a developing economy, remain in critically short supply. There is, in addition, (1) a shortage of competent and well-grounded lawyers inhibiting the present functioning of judicial machinery, (2) the need to provide lawyers with a greater capacity to adapt existing laws to meet demands of economic and social change.

B. Project Target

To select GOA officials of high potential now holding, or shortly slated for, responsible managerial, legal, or administrative positions, and to provide them with the analytical skills, techniques, and knowledge oriented toward the practical problems of government policy formulation, program analysis, management and administration and other aspects of public leadership, and to train and upgrade legal officials, teachers of law, and members of the Judiciary in modern legal methodology and procedures.

C. Course of Action

The course of action is divided into 1) management and economic analysis and 2) legal and judicial management.

1. Management and Economic Analysis

To select and train Afghan personnel who have a demonstrated potential in analytic skills in management or in economics and policy formulation. They will be sent to the United States or third country for non-degree programs of six to twelve months duration. Training emphasis will be directed toward the development or accentuation of skills related toward development management; project analysis, development and implementation; and policy development.

Prior to departure, where appropriate, participants or teams of single-ministry participants will be assigned a project or problem to which the deputy minister or minister wishes solution. A work plan will be completed by the participant and approved by the appropriate president and the deputy minister or the minister. Projects will focus on reaching and assisting the disadvantaged poor in clear and demonstrable ways.

The participants will receive at least half of their training period in classroom instruction. Emphasis will be on problem-solving through case study/project completion techniques. They will be exposed to the elements of administration, such as finance, personnel, organization and management, records, problem identification and solution, and communications. They will further participate in seminar activities directed toward management theories and practices. The above will be followed by on-the-job training and observation programs where they will be exposed to not only economic analytic methods, but the application of modern management practices.

Most candidates will be drawn from permanent members of those GOA ministries most directly connected with economic and technical assistance. The remainder will be drawn from the planning and budgeting staffs of those ministries peripheral in nature to the economic ministries.

The principal criteria for selection are ability, past performance, and career potential. Indicators, but not necessary conditions, of outstanding ability are: 1) a good university record with the possession of at least a B.A. degree, 2) a good employment record evidenced by performance and promotions, 3) judgment, in writing, by senior officials that the person under consideration has strong growth potential, 4) personal or position grade of 5 or higher, 5) sufficient on-job experience (preferably five years or more) to demonstrate ability and 6) age between 30 and 40 years.

The National Coordinating Committee, composed of deputy ministers under the chairmanship of the Deputy Minister of Planning, will serve as the Selection Committee. The Secretariat will be composed of personnel from the Ministry of Planning. All nominations for training put forth by the government ministries and agencies will be sent initially to the Secretariat for review. The USAID Public Administration Officer and the USAID Training Officer will be available to the Secretary and the Committee for regular counsel on the appropriateness of nominees and proposed programs of training.

2. Legal and Judicial Management

To select and train GOA officials from four legal areas: the prosecutor and judiciary branches of the Ministry of Justice, the Faculties of Law and Political Science (Hakook), and the Faculty of Islamic Law (Shariat) of Kabul University. Training will be based in an American Law School. Special emphasis will be placed on the role of law in development. Participants will be introduced to the various elements of the U.S. legal system. Stress will be placed on legal terminology, legal research and drafting; modern litigation procedures; and modernization of legal systems with emphasis on Afghan needs.

These officials will undertake legal training in the U.S. for a 12-18 month period. Initially they will be programmed together, with flexibility built in to cover individual needs of the varied group. It is not a degree program, nor a regular legal academic studies program, nor to provide "American lawyers" to Afghanistan, but rather a directed tutorial study and seminar program to meet Afghan specialized legal needs. Field visits and experience will be combined with the studies.

Principal criteria for selection are ability, past performance, and promise of superior future performance. Indicators, but not necessary conditions, of outstanding ability are: (1) a good university record with the possession of at least a B.A. in Law (2) a good record in a position utilizing the legal background, whether in teaching or application, (3) judgement, in writing, of senior people that the person under consideration has strong growth potential, (4) sufficient on-job experience to demonstrate ability, and (5) age between 25 and 40 years.

The committee chairman will have responsibility for dissemination of program information, initial review of nominations, administrative control as necessary, generally approving training programs, initial placement of returned trainees, and evaluation of program effectiveness.

3. Both management and legal candidates must have completed military obligations or be permanently exempt for legitimate reasons. Since the language of training will be English, full command of English is a requirement. D. U.S. Contribution

Participants

During FY 1974, twenty new candidates will be funded for U.S. training. Departures will be divided between August 1974 and January 1975. Duration of training will be 6-12 months. Annual costs are \$342,000.

In addition Mr. Ghulam Momen, a Director in the Department of Technical and Economic Cooperation, was sent to the Fourth Advanced Seminar in Participant Training under obligating PIO/P 306-123-1-40038 at cost of \$2,700.

Under authority of M.O. 712.4 Section III A.3.a, a waiver is hereby granted for the delayed issuance of PIO/Ps in the amount of \$342,000. This waiver is required to provide time necessary for the selection of qualified candidates for the required training programs. This amount will be supported by necessary PIO/Ps by June 30, 1974.

Contract Services

A contract was awarded to George Washington University in June 1973 in the amount of \$386,365 (of which only \$152,000 were provided in FY 1973) for implementation of the Legal and Judicial Management training program in the U.S. Nine incumbent trainees will finish in late CY 1974. Nine new candidates are expected to begin in June 1974. Remaining costs hereunder are \$234,365.
