

9. PURPOSE  
Technical Advisory, Liaison and General Support Services

10. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED

This RSSA provides funding for general support for AID programs from and through the Office of Education. Services break down into four main categories:

15% of time - Preparation of an annual report describing all AID overseas educational projects entitled A Survey of A.I.D. Educational Cooperation with Developing Countries.

25% of time - Five or six annual distributions of around 50 packets of materials to AID and other educational officers in less developed countries as well as AID/Washington offices. Items are both purchased and obtained gratis; determination of the contents of the packets rests with the Office of Education which consults with TA/EHR as needed.

30% of time - Handling 60 - 75 inquiries from the field and Washington each year regarding various educational problems. Field inquiries largely come in through AID and are predominantly from Latin America, Asia, and Africa in that order.

30% of time - General liaison and coordination. The Office of Education periodically sponsors various new and innovative educational programs. Through the AID contact officer under this RSSA, AID is able to keep up-to-date on these activities and obtain assistance in determining their applicability for developing nations, particularly AID's priority areas: technology, non-formal education and research. OE is in a position to assist in identifying scarce-category educational specialists to fill AID-funded positions and coordinate exchange of materials between the document reference centers of AID and OE. This RSSA also facilitates access to the Educational Clearing House and manpower research technology.

U.S.O.E. personnel will participate in an evaluative review in May, 1974. Semi-annual reports will be sent to the Bureau for Technical Assistance, TA/EHR, following the format on attachment -A.

3) It assists in maintaining awareness of the most significant developments in professional educational literature so as to correlate current educational developments and thinking with the objectives of AID, both in Washington and in the field. In particular it provides a linkage with the nationwide Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC).

4) From a variety of sources it provides education advisors (or human resource development officers) and in some cases Ministries of Education, with a flow of significant educational publications and documents. These documents are selected so that they support AID educational policy formulations, contribute to AID staff development, and provide expert findings on the three educational KPAs.

5) This support activity also provides an annual survey of AID educational activities with the developing countries, indicating objectives of the projects, funding, and progress. Assistance is provided on an ad hoc basis with related surveys and studies. It responds to special requests from AID overseas missions for professional educational materials and supportive services.

15% of time - Preparation of an annual report describing all A.I.D. overseas educational projects entitled A Survey of A.I.D. Educational Cooperation with Developing Countries.

25% of time - Five or six annual distributions of around 50 packets of materials to A.I.D. and other educational officers in less developed countries as well as AID/Washington offices. Items are both purchased and obtained gratis; determination of the contents of the packets rests with the Office of Education which consults with TA/EHR as needed.

30% of time - Handling ~~cases~~ inquiries from the field and Washington each year regarding various educational problems. Field inquiries largely come in through A.I.D. and are predominately from Latin America, Asia, and Africa in that order.

30% of time - General liaison and coordination. The Office of Education periodically sponsors various new and innovative educational programs. Through the A.I.D. contact officer funded under this RSSA, A.I.D. is able to keep up to date on these activities and obtain assistance in determining their applicability for developing nations, particularly A.I.D.'s priority areas of technology, non-formal education and research. OE is in a position to assist in identifying scarce-category educational specialists to fill AID-funded positions and coordinate exchange of materials between the document reference centers of A.I.D. and OE. This RSSA also facilitates access to the Educational Clearing House and manpower research technology. Office of Education personnel will participate in an evaluative review in May 1974. Semi-annual reports will be sent A.I.D., TA/EHR, and CM/PAS, following the format of Attachment.

The OE experts will identify, purchase and distribute to Mission and Regional Bureau education and human resources development personnel in at least three and not more than four packets, professional literature and other materials designed to keep field officers abreast of the field of education, to broaden their outlook and to provide examples of new innovative programs.

#### B. Assistance with Conferences/Seminars and Workshops

As required, the OE will assist with the above activities by providing materials, identifying and providing for the services of conference speakers and other leadership personnel and arranging for the participation of LDC people.

#### C. Specialized Technical Assistance

As needed, OE will make available short term specialized technical assistance to Missions and Regional Bureaus in various areas. The OE will pay personnel

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

This activity is designed to provide continuing, professional indepth, liaison between the educational elements of AID (TAE, Regions, USAIDs), and the U.S. Office of Education. Drawing on the wide range of professional resources of the U.S. Office of Education, it provides support for the Agency's educational programs in several ways:

1) It insures access to a wide variety of Office of Education specialists and through them to professional associations and institutions for the purpose of identifying resources, developments, and innovations that can contribute to AID's educational assistance objectives.

2) It serves to identify U.S. programs and research that have relevance for AID's educational programs in the developing countries, and similarly it identifies AID programs and overseas projects that may be relevant for utilization in domestic education programs.

3) It assists in maintaining awareness of the most significant developments in professional educational literature so as to correlate current educational developments and thinking with the objectives of AID, both in Washington and in the field. In particular it provides a linkage with the nationwide Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC).

4) From a variety of sources it provides education advisors (or human resource development officers) and in some cases Ministries of Education, with a flow of significant educational publications and documents. These documents are selected so that they support AID educational policy formulations, contribute to AID staff development, and provide expert findings on the three educational KPAs.

5) This support activity also provides assistance on an ad hoc basis with related surveys, studies, and conferences. It responds to special requests from AID overseas missions for professional educational materials and supportive services.

6) The services described above are performed under the supervision of TA/EHR.
