1. When was the support service initiated and how much longer is it anticipated that it will continue?

Response: This project was initiated in FY 1974. It is currently approved through FY 1977 and will be considered for extension in FY 1977 by TAB and the Regional Bureaus.

2. What indication of field interest and need was the project based on?

Response: This project is mainly to provide accessibility to Agricultural Economists from the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Special studies are prepared for AIB to meet requests. Occasional field visits are made to assist Missions in special short-term program areas.

3. How are utilization requests initiated and what is the mechanism for field use?

Response: Utilization requests in AID/W are in response to needs that are difficult for regular staff to prepare in addition to assigned project management functions. Field requests originate with Missions or Bureaus or may be in support of ongoing TAB activities.

4. How is the TAB-funded project budget developed, and do Missions and Regional Bureaus pay over and above the cost to TAB for the services requested?

Response: The budget is developed in TA/AG in relation to the expected requests to be made on USDA. Annual approval is submitted through TA/FP.

5. How is the field informed of the availability of the services and when was the most recent notification distributed?

Response: Bureaus are informed of services available and integrate these resources into Mission requirements. Service efforts are a mix of regular and RSSA staff as related to demands and capabilities.

6. What Missions have used the services in the last two years?

SUBJECT: Use of RSSAs for Program Development and Support

Mr. Levick, AA/TA, has approved continuation of small RSSA with the USDA Economic Research Service as a Program Development and Support activity requiring annual AA/TA review and approval rather than a Project Paper. You may wish to request approval of the following activities using this procedure as well:

1. Maternal and Child Health RSSA
2. Fertilizer RSSA with TVA
3. possible new RSSA with NOAA

Please note however that there are limitations as to what can be done in this type of RSSA:

- the RSSAs will be used only for program development and support activities;
- the personnel will be under the direct supervision and guidance of TA Technical Offices. (More self contained operations such as the USDA group under the Food and Nutrition Technical Support project or the Ag Information RSSA will continue to be projectized and require a project paper;
- an annual work plan and budget must be submitted to TA/PPU no later than March 31 to allow consideration and approval by AA/TA of the level of support in sufficient time to inform the RSSA agency of any desired changes well in advance of the new fiscal year. (FY 76 approval will suffice for the Interim Quarter this year).

Please submit any such requests for approval of program development and support RSSAs to AA/TA through TA/PPU.

MEMORANDUM

Problem: What documentation and approvals are required for the approval of RSSA-implemented "projects" which consist entirely of technical services of other Government agencies provided at TAB direction and under TAB control.

Discussion: The Technical Assistance Bureau is financing two RSSAs which provide skilled professionals to perform technical services for AID missions and AID/W under the direction of TAB technical offices. The Maternal and Child Health Project began in FY 1968; the Agricultural Planning and Support Services Project began in FY 1974. Both were initiated and have been continued as technical support activities.

About two years ago Dr. Bernstein decided that budget reviews held traditionally at the beginning of a fiscal year were not an appropriate forum to examine RSSAs and PASAs. He asked the Program Office to devise a new procedure which would permit them to be examined and approved sufficiently in advance of a fiscal year to permit any necessary changes prior to signature of a new annual agreement. The Program Office, in turn, requested that PROPs be drafted for each project being implemented through a RSSA or PASA. This process has proceeded slowly but we now have PROPs on all projects except the two discussed in this memo, Agriculture Information, the National Library of Medicine and OIH.

We believe there is a clear distinction between other RSSA/PASA projects and the two under discussion. Resources under other projects are managed by the participating U.S. government agency. The ERS and the PHS/CHS resources are managed respectively by TA/AGR and TA/N. We have no difficulty with this since the technical personnel involved are performing functions which clearly are program oriented, i.e. professional advice and services in the development, implementation and/or evaluation of technical assistance, research and development activities.

The question is the type of program documentation required in order to set levels of activity and to approve funding for these purposes. The Program Office had requested that PROPs (or PPs) be prepared and presented for review and comment by the R&DC as a way of determining Agency support and need for such services. It has been suggested that this full treatment is not necessary for approval of limited services of a clearly program development and support nature.

(The following discussion will cover the Ag. Planning and Support project only, but we wanted you to be aware of the implications for the MCHS project and also the proposed RSSA with NOAA for technical services in fisheries which would be directly analogous.)

The attached Project Paper was presented by the Office of Agriculture in support of services to be provided to the Economic and Sector Planning Division of TA/AGR at a cost of \$147,500. Additionally, ERS provides under this project the half-time services of Dr. Dana Dalrymple to the Assistant Director for Research, TA/AGR, (\$36,150) and the services of Dr. Ronald Tinnemeler to assist TA/DA in its technical assistance to the regional bureaus and missions (\$6,200). The total cost of this project in FY 1976 will be \$240,000.

We do not believe that the attached project paper is adequate in itself as justification for the services. Together with the three attached PIO/Ts, however, we believe that adequate justification is provided for services to be performed during FY 1976.

If you concur that a project paper is not required for this type of program development and support activity being performed under the direct supervision and guidance of TA technical offices, we recommend that you authorize Program Office signature of the attached three PIO/Ts with the following caveats:

1. The RSSA's will be used only for program development and support activities. Discrete research or technical assistance activities other than those which are short term in nature will be proposed and approved through normal program documentation procedures.
2. An annual plan should be submitted for approval to AA/TA through TA/PPU no later than March 31, 1976, for the following fiscal year for this project and any other projects approved in this fashion as program development and support activities.

We will pass on your decision regarding this memorandum to TA/AGR and TA/N for their guidance in seeking approvals for the MCHS and proposed NOAA RSSAs.

SUBJECT: RSSA 1-78 Agribusiness Support

Problem: Your approval is required for a 12-month extension to cover FY 1979 of the USDA RSSA 1-78 which provides personnel to expand the efforts of the Agribusiness Office. In addition, the RSSA is revised in order to expand services to include more field support in the development and design of agribusiness projects. This funding is carried in project 931-0060, Agricultural Planning and Support Services.

Discussion: Since the current emphasis on agribusiness is a new effort in A.I.D., expanded services by DS/AGR to the field are needed. USDA has experience and resources readily available that can be drawn upon to supply the input. As a fund of knowledge is developed in this area, field Missions need to be advised. Missions will need additional help in determining areas to develop, and focusing on these areas which are a constraint to development of agribusiness in the rural areas. ~~Help in project design is another point where specialized professionals are needed.~~ The USDA component will provide these needed inputs, especially in the economic and policy constraints of agribusiness projects.

Generation of specific development projects presents a formidable problem. The need for assistance at the professional level is clearly evident. Experienced USDA resources can contribute to bear on agribusiness matters of A.I.D. field interest.

The RSSA is planned to provide one regular worker, plus several experts on short time TDY to meet needs of the field. This provides flexibility in response to requests in that experts used can be selected for particular problem areas.

Recommendation: That you indicate your approval of the proposed 12-month extension of RSSA 1-78 by signing the PAF in the space provided.

SUBJECT Dana Dalrymple

Problem: Request for approval to extend RSSA 2-75 with the USDA from July 1, 1976 to September 30, 1977 (IQ and FY 77) for program development and support activities.

Discussion: In accordance with the memorandum from Fritz to Levick, dated November 21, 1975 (Tab A), TA/AGR is required to submit an annual plan for your approval on any RSSA activities planned for the upcoming fiscal years. This request, then, is to seek your approval for extension of the above RSSA for the services of Dana Dalrymple and secretarial support. TAB presently pays 40% of the costs of this support with the remainder funded by PPC. The proposed scope of services for the IQ (Tab B) and FY 77 (Tab C) are attached. Please note that TAB's share (\$10,534) of the costs during the IQ have increased to 60% due mainly to the additional time required in support of TA/AGR for work on the International Centers Week and the World Food Study. Beginning in FY 77, our share will fall to 50% (amounting to \$37,545). We will not revert to the present 40/60 arrangement because Dr. Dalrymple will be spending more time on research support activities (updating bulletins, etc.) for the Office of Agriculture than was true in FY 76.

Recommendation: That you approve the extension of the USDA RSSA 2-75 for Dana Dalrymple from July 1, 1976 to September 30, 1977.

Problem: Approval required for subject project for FY 1978.

Discussion: Referenced memorandum approved a mechanism for approving RSSA implementing "projects" which consist entirely of technical services of other government agencies provided at TAB direction and under TAB control. The mechanism provides for approval by the AA/TA of such projects based on the following conditions:

1. The RSSA's will be used only for program development and support activities. Discrete research or technical assistance activities other than those which are short term in nature will be proposed and approved through normal documentation procedures.
2. An annual plan should be submitted for approval to AA/TA through TA/PPU no later than March 31, 1977, for the following fiscal year for this project and any other projects approved in this fashion as program development and support activities.

Attached are two TA/AGR proposals to continue existing RSSA's during FY 1978.

1. AGR/ESP - two full time Agricultural Economists and 12 man months of TDY services, and half time services of Dr. Dalrymple and a secretary.
2. AGR/F - 3 fisheries advisors and 8 man months of services. This is an increase of one full time staff member over FY 1977.

These proposals were held by PPU pending results of the AA/TA review in June.

Please note that in June we provided \$16,809 under this project for RSSA 2-77 for the continued services of Mr. Bob Wack thru October 25, 1977. This additional funding under this project was necessary because of delays in approving the Farmer to Farmer project. Upon approval of the Farmer to Farmer project, funding under RSSA 2-77 for Mr. Wack's services in FY 78 will be provided under that project.

Problem: Successful initiation and implementation of the Farmer-to-Farmer program will require that someone at AID/W be assigned to the program on a nearly full-time basis. This memorandum requests your approval to proceed with assignment of Mr. Robert Wack, a U.S.D.A. employee presently working in the AID-financed international training program.

Discussion: As you know, my understanding with Mr. Murphy about the Farmer-to-Farmer program included the need for some one person to spend nearly full time on it, at least through the early experimental years. When we were unable to find a suitable candidate on AID rolls, I asked Jim Blume to search USDA, the universities, or other possible sources. He later suggested Bob Wack, formerly in the University of Illinois Extension Service and University of Illinois contract employee in Sierra Leone. For the last six years he has been a U.S.D.A. employee, assigned to the AID-financed International Training Program. He is a GS-13.

Len Otto, Jim Blume and I described the program to him at a luncheon session and checked him out informally with Ollie Bauman at U.S.D.A. and Prof. Bill Thompson at the University of Illinois. After Wack indicated interest in joining the program, we brought him back for a second interview which, at Mr. Murphy's request, was participated in by both himself and Bill Parks and which lasted more than an hour. I think we are all agreed that Wack appears to be well qualified for the job by virtue of experience and temperament.

Since the Murphy meeting, I have had a roundtable discussion with Wack, Blume, Dave Mein and John Gunning on how we might engage Wack's services. The details of the procedure are not yet clear but can be worked out administratively when we have your authorization to go ahead. We hope we can engage Wack's services without using an AID ceiling, preferably through a program-funded PASA.

We discussed organizational alternatives, particularly whether Wack should be assigned to this office or to TA/AGR. Our tentative conclusion is that assignment to this office, in a position related to the Title XII group, is probably the most logical.

I am not ready to suggest a title for Wack at this time but can suggest his function in general terms. I see him as AID's point man on the Farmer-to-Farmer program, reporting to me, and concerned with the following:

1. Following through with the Missions and universities on the six projects for which we have already initiated discussions
2. Looking for other university contract projects which appear to have Farmer-to-Farmer possibilities.
3. Looking for other means of utilizing Farmer-to-Farmer personnel.
4. Accumulating and transferring knowledge re administrative arrangements to facilitate some consistency in the way we treat Farmer-to-Farmer personnel.
5. Maintaining a continuing evaluation of Farmer-to-Farmer utilization, starting soon after the first recruits reach the field.
6. Providing a point of contact with TA/AGR and the regions.
7. Looking for success stories in agriculture (a Murphy request).

Recommendation: That you authorize Dave Mein to proceed with procurement of the services of H. Robert Wack for the purposes outlined above.
