

## ICED University Data Bank

### Summary

The original PROP approved \$30,000 as AID's contribution, through a PASA with HEW, to the maintenance of, and for the use of, the International Council for Educational Development's University Data Bank, for FY 1971. Most of this first year was spent in completing the narrative program descriptions of some 2200 international programs of U.S. universities. The last 600 of these are expected to arrive at AID within the next two weeks. Three sets of these will be maintained in the Agency; one by Institution/Program, one by Subject Matter, and one by Country or Region. We also have Data Printout Sheets which show, for each program, numbers of faculty, students, foreign nationals involved both here and overseas, and other participating departments of the university among other things.

The updating of the initial listing was also started this winter and will continue to be an ongoing function.

In addition to the above printouts, the Data Bank has also produced a Directory of Area Studies on U.S. Campuses and a Directory of International Offices on U.S. Campuses, multiple copies of which are being distributed to the appropriate AID offices. ICED also plans to publish an Annual Report (in addition to annual reports to contributors) which will not only contain statistical summaries of types of international activities in U.S. four-year colleges and universities, but will also analyze the implications of these statistics for U.S. higher education.

In addition to the routine outputs mentioned above, the Data Bank has responded to several AID requests for specific information: TA/SSS requested a list of institutions having urban development programs with

an international comparative dimension; TA/RUR requested a list of institutions having international agriculture programs as well as related area studies programs, in order to coordinate Peace Corps agriculture training program with AID technical assistance experience; AFR requested a list of predominantly black colleges having international or African studies programs as well as overseas experience; EA/TECH requested a list of AID-university contractors having Asian area studies programs; the LA Bureau requested a listing of institutions having Latin American/Brazilian programs.

We have had but one meeting with representatives of other AID bureaus and offices having an interest in the Data Bank, to describe the present and potential characteristics of the Data Bank, and to discuss its potential use. As soon as the remainder of the program descriptions arrive and can be organized into their respective indices, an Instruction Manual for Agency utilization will be prepared by TA/RUR and distributed to AID/W and USAID's office and bureau designees will be identified and oriented, and procedures will be established for processing requests for Data Bank resources.

While this first year of activity under AID's contribution has been primarily concerned with initial groundwork, both the actual and potential utility of the Data Bank has been demonstrated sufficiently to continue AID's contribution of \$30,000 for FY 1972, to be made available to HEW through a PASA for ultimate disbursement to ICED. A more complete review and assessment of the Data Bank's operational utility to AID will be

reported on in April 1972. TA/RUR will continue to provide the necessary backstopping for the project as well as the liaison with ICED.

To provide for the Agency access to the EWA Data Bank on international activities of U.S. universities and colleges.

Course of action is to provide financing in collaboration with others to the EWA program and to organize an Agency system for putting data in the bank and for making use of it.

Accomplishments to Date

AID's participation is just beginning and of itself can report no accomplishment. However the EWA activity has already "banked" data on about 2,000 international programs or activities involving some 1,500 universities and colleges. Plans for the bank include provisions for keeping information current.

FY 72 Program and Future Targets

Principal program and targets include work to make adequate use of the bank, both by getting AID's data input into the system and by helping AID entities make good use of it.

It is a continuing activity that will have few modifications from year to year.
