2. Evaluation of Contractor Performance

A. Understanding of Objectives

The Contractor has a clear understanding of the Contract objectives.

B. Short Term Goals

Completion of the Foundry Building in Dacca and Carrago in Karachi.

Improvement of Vocational and Skilled Training Program.

Development of Instructors' Training program.

Recruitment of local instructional staff.

Planning the shops and laboratories as per standard practices so as to ensure maximum efficiency and safety.

Ordering and installation of equipment so as to bring equipment upto full complement

Evening Trade Extension Classes.

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Coordination with industry through advisory bodies.

Recommendation to the Project Directors for staff organization at the centers.

C. Progress Toward Achievement of Goals and Objectives

Preparations and plans have been made to meet the short term goals. The trainees in both the Centers moved into the second year phase of their training. A great deal of progress was made during the period under review. So far as the physical plant is concerned the major item of unfinished business is the construction of long waited pattern-foundry buildings at both centers. The construction of foundry building has actually begun in Dacca. Construction work at the Karachi Center has not started and action by the Government of West Pakistan is still awaited. These two buildings are the part and parcel of a modern industrial skills training program.

An annual audit has been made; but no audit was made during the reporting period. The Contractor has performed the work with dispatch and promptness. Delays which have occurred are in no way the fault of the contractor.

D. Difficulties Hindering Achievement of Objectives:

The main difficulty encountered is the construction of Pattern-Foundry building in West Pakistan which is still awaiting the sanction of funds from Government of West Pakistan. The allocation of funds for this, is the responsibility of the Provincial Government. The Pattern-Foundry building is almost complete at the Dacca Center. However, efforts are being made to expedite the sanction.

E. Contractor's Staff

The Contractor's outgoing Chief of Party was very competent and had done a tremendous amount of work for achievement of the various goals and objectives. The new Chief of Party is also very competent specially in Teachers' Training program. The present staff at the Center is technically competent and know their jobs very well. The new advisor, Mr. Uyematsu, will provide added strength in Auto Mechanics.

Mr. Gelinsky, an expert in Refrigeration and Air-conditioning, is looking after both Karachi and Dacca Centers and is working very hard to cope up with the job.

The Project Advisor is working in close cooperation with the Hawaii Group and the cooperating country for their day to day problems.

L. Additional Comments

The very fact that the COP and AID are discussing further extension of the Contract is indicative that the performance of the Contractor has been very satisfactory and commendable.
