## HUIXQUILUCAN PROJECT SUMMARY

Less than 10% of rural Mexico's 20 million people are presently linked to any system of health care delivery. Of these, 12 million people live in some 12,000 localities of 500-2500 inhabitants. The Health Ministry of Mexico (Secretaria de Salubridad y Asistencia) has accorded highest priority to the development and implementation of a health care and family planning delivery system to reach its rural population. The first step in achieving its objectives is to establish a pilot facility to pretest the models for health care and family planning delivery before these are instituted on a national scale.

The basic objective of the proposed project is to demonstrate a health care and family planning delivery system that can be extended throughout the rural countryside through existing and projected facilities that will serve to improve the capacity of the present national health delivery system without serious increase in cost, personnel, or construction.

The model to be tested in the pilot zone consists of five components: 1) the physical plant; 2) the health committee; 3) the volunteer health worker; 4) the nearest health center; 5) the health promoter. By combining community participation with technical assistance provided by the Mexican government, the model will provide the organization and infrastructure for state and federal health services, including family planning, to reach small, often remote communities of rural Mexico.

The model will be tested in the municipio of Huixquilucan, State of Mexico, where the Health Ministry, in collaboration with the University of Wisconsin, has been developing the program under an agreement of June, 1968.

**This revision will provide funds to contract with the University of Wisconsin to assist the Ministry of Health, Government of Mexico, to design, implement and evaluate a demonstration prototype for the delivery of family planning and associated maternal and child health care services in Huixquilucan, as explained on page 6, second paragraph of the original Noncapital Project Paper (PROP) and in the attached Project Summary.**

**Funding under this revision will provide the necessary core support at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, and additional support for the development and testing of the project for the first year of a proposed three year project plan. It is understood by the University of Wisconsin that a formal project submission will be made to the UNFPA for the additional two years funding within 30 days of the signing of the contract.**
