I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The primary objectives of this project are essentially unchanged since its inception in 1964. They are to develop a healthy industrial economy in Korea and to improve and increase the country's exports. The main methods being used to accomplish these objectives are: (a) modifying the traditional business procedures of the private industrial sector of Korea; (b) upgrading management operations; (c) streamlining marketing and distribution channels; and (d) developing a true understanding of the benefits of quality control. These steps are necessary to enable Korean industry to meet the growing demands of the maturing domestic market and to participate in the rapidly expanding international Asian market.

II. SPECIFIC DESCRIPTION

One of the specific objectives of this project is to continue development of the management consultation section of the Korean Productivity Center (KPC) into a fully-qualified organization capable of providing competent professional services to Korean businesses and industries. This is being accomplished through the contract services of experienced American management consultants who trained and work directly with the KPC staff on specific consultant assignments received from private industry clients.

During the past three years, the services of metal working and foundry experts and two short-term specialists were financed by USAID in order to assist the KPC in providing technical services to firms in Taegu, Pusan and Kwangju. In addition, four contract specialists were provided by USAID to work with the KPC national headquarters in Seoul. The services provided by these experts were in business management, cost and quality control, industrial engineering, and marketing. The contract was completed in August 1969.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT

Since channeling U.S. technical assistance through this organization has proven effective and has helped KPC become well established and nationally recognized, this project is to continue to use KPC as the vehicle for disseminating industrial services. During fiscal year 1970, this project is to finance the services of two contract specialists for a period of two years. Two additional specialists were financed in fiscal year 1969. It is planned that the services of these four specialists will be provided by a U.S. firm or institution, or personal services contracts negotiated directly between KPC and the American institution/contractor involved. In addition, limited assistance will be supplied by furnishing KPC short term contract consultants well-qualified in financing small plants, long-term corporate planning or in other fields of technology, as the demand arises.

Another facet of this project is the training of KPC-sponsored participant teams for top leaders of Korean business and industry, to enable them to observe American business methods and operations and to hold discussions with American industrialists. The participants are selected among chairmen and presidents of outstanding Korean private companies. The teams are composed of approximately ten participants for five-week tours arranged by AID/Washington. Two teams of ten each are to be financed under this project during fiscal year 1970. All travel and living expenses are to be borne by the participants. This project will finance the AID/Washington training costs and interpreter services. In addition to the top management teams, this project will finance the training of Koreans in middle management levels, who are to be sent to the USA for observation of wholesale/retail marketing, industrial standards, testing of products, and management. Since the project for Improvement of Transportation Capabilities was closed out at the end of fiscal year 1969, the Industrial Development project is absorbing the training of two Radar Air-Traffic Controllers. He will be responsible for contract and overall project activities.

Specific project targets for fiscal year 1970 and 1971 include: (a) assist KPC improve the quality of its consulting services to private industry; (b) assist private steel companies maintain their current growth pattern; (c) correlate the efforts of the Federation of Korean Industry, Korean Chamber of Commerce, and the Korean Productivity Center to establish an "on-going" alliance to maintain industrial technical assistance between Korean and U.S. industries after the AID program is terminated, and (d) help KCI develop and improve the Korean methods of marketing and distribution, primarily in the establishment of chain stores and supermarkets.

III. U.S. CONTRIBUTIONS

The United States Government (through the Agency for International Development) will provide the funds specified in Annex B to this Project Agreement.

In addition, the services of a direct-hire specialist assigned to USAID/Korea and funded under other documentation, will be provided to advise the Korean Government in the modernization of industrial plants, plant expansion, and management, and to administer the industrial development operations.

IV. ROKG CONTRIBUTIONS

1. In regard to the contract to be signed between KPC and a U.S. firm, the ROKG agrees to the following:

(a) The Korean Productivity Center, through the Ministry of Finance, ROKG, will provide the U.S. dollar foreign exchange required to finance all dollar costs in Korea incident to the furnishing of contract services, with the understanding that the Ministry of Finance will be reimbursed by USAID for all such dollar expenditures. Administrative procedures for reimbursement will be mutually agreed to between KPC and the USAID Controller. USAID will charge all dollar costs for the contract against the following PIO/Ts: 489-606-3-00023, 489-606-3-00024, 489-606-3-00025, 489-606-3-90067, and 489-606-3-90063.

U.S. dollar expenditures accrued and payable in the USA incident to recruitment, processing, shipment of household effects (including automobiles one-way), round trip international travel, and other related contract expenditures will be paid directly by USAID/Korea and charged against the afore-mentioned PIO/Ts.

(b) KPC will supply the Won funds necessary to finance local currency costs for housing, furniture, utilities, ^{and} maintenance. It is understood that KPC will be reimbursed for such Won costs from the USAID Trust Fund under administrative procedures mutually agreed to between KPC and the USAID Controller.

2. The ROKG will arrange that the U.S. personnel provided for by this document, and their dependents, will be exempt from all requirements for customs duties and import taxes on personal property (including motor vehicles) and household goods; and from any income and social security taxes assessed by ROKG or its political subdivisions. If not so exempted, ROKG shall pay directly all costs thereof from other than counterpart funds or funds provided by the U.S. Government.
3. The ROKG will provide through its budget sufficient local currency to cover necessary in country transport, licensing, installation and maintenance costs of all equipment and supplies financed by AID under this project (other than those vehicles utilized by U.S. personnel). The ROKG will make proper and timely installation and use of equipment or material furnished this project.
4. The RKC assures that full-time qualified Korean counterparts will be either in training or working closely with U.S. technicians on the project, and that these counterparts will be available when considered necessary by the USAID. These counterpart services will be entirely financed by the RKC from its own budget.
5. Costs of international transportation for participants listed in Annex B to this Project Agreement will be provided by the ROKG.
6. The ROKG assures that Koreans trained under this project, either on-the-job or under the AID participant program, will be retained and assigned to positions suiting their capabilities so that the knowledge gained may be applied to the continuing benefit of the sector being assisted through this project.

I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The primary objectives of this project are essentially unchanged since its inception in 1964. They are to develop a healthy industrial economy in Korea and to improve and increase the country's exports. The main methods being used to accomplish these objectives are: (a) modifying the traditional business procedures of the private industrial sector of Korea; (b) upgrading management operations; (c) streamlining marketing and distribution channels; and (d) developing a true understanding of the benefits of quality control. These steps are necessary to enable Korean industry to meet the growing demands of the maturing domestic market and to participate in the rapidly expanding international Asian market.

II. SPECIFIC DESCRIPTION

One of the specific objectives of this project is to continue development of the management consultation section of the Korean Productivity Center (KPC) into a fully-qualified organization capable of providing competent professional services to Korean businesses and industries. This is being accomplished through the contract services of experienced American management consultants who train and work directly with the KPC staff on specific consultant assignments received from private industry clients.

In the past, the services of metal working and foundry experts and two short-term specialists were financed by USAID in order to assist the KPC in providing technical services to firms in Taegu, Pusan and Kwangju. In addition, four contract specialists were provided by USAID to work with the KPC national headquarters in Seoul. The services provided by these experts were in business management, cost and quality control, industrial engineering, and marketing. This portion of the project has been completed.

Since channeling U.S. technical assistance through this organization has proven effective and has helped KPC become well established and nationally recognized, this project is continuing to use KPC as the vehicle for disseminating industrial services. During fiscal year 1970, the services of four contract specialists were forward financed for a period of two years. The services of these four specialists are provided by personal services contracts negotiated directly between KPC and the individual American contractors involved. In addition, limited assistance, prior year funded, will be supplied by furnishing KPC short-term contract consultants well-qualified in financing small plants, long-term corporate planning or in other fields of technology, as the demand arises.

Another facet of this project is the training of KPC-sponsored participant teams for top leaders of Korean business and industry, to enable them to observe American business methods and operations and to hold discussions with American industrialists. The participants are selected among chairmen and presidents of outstanding Korean private companies. The teams are composed of approximately ten participants for five-week tours arranged by AID/Washington. Two teams of ten each are to be financed under this project during fiscal year 1971. All travel and living expenses are to be borne by the participants. This project finances the AID/Washington incidental training costs and interpreter services. In addition to the top management teams, this project finances the training of Koreans in middle-management levels, who are sent to the USA for observation of chain store marketing, Bureau of Standards procedures, industrial engineering consulting in the private sector, machining practices, and management. All participants except the Bureau of Standards team will be selected from the private sector. Since the project for Improvement of Transportation Capabilities was closed out at the end of fiscal year 1969, this Industrial Development project is absorbing on-the-job training of a radar technician, VOR/TAC technician and a flight inspection pilot (See Annex B).
