Block 10 - Special Provisions - (Continued)

An amendment increasing dollar funding under this agreement will be concluded at a later date after GOI requests for new FY-1970 funded training have been reviewed to assure that these meet training priorities of the Five Year Development Plan (REPELITA).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project aims at providing non-project oriented training required for Indonesia's economic and social development. It aims at strengthening the Government of Indonesia's varied administrative, technical, and institutional support capabilities required for development, particularly for the effective execution of the new Five Year Plan. This activity also seeks to enlarge the role of the Indonesian private sector in development by improving its managerial and technical skills.

General Participant Training is organized into three principal areas of activity (1) U.S. and third country training, (2) preparatory English language training, and (3) a follow-up program for returned participants. All contribute to the goal of increasing the skills of those needed to guide and direct development efforts. The training activity emphasizes academic and practical training. Intensive English language training is given to participants to provide them with the language proficiency they require preparatory to training. The U.S. Government has trained altogether over 4300 participants. An extensive, well organized and administered follow-up program for all returned trainees is essential to (1) supplement and up-date formal training with the provision of technical research materials, professional journals, and a quarterly newsletter, and (2) maintain contact with the trainees to be able to evaluate the contributions each is making in the development processes.

A. As used herein, the term "AID" refers to the Agency for International Development, any component agency, or any successor agency. References to "this Project Agreement" shall mean the original Project Agreement as modified by any revisions which have entered into effect.

B. (1) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Annex A, as required by Block 5 hereof. In addition, as may be further specified in Annex A, AID will, subject to the availability of funds and (where required by AID procedures) as provided for in Project Implementation Orders (PIOs) issued by AID in accordance with its procedures, make available funds (a) to pay costs of furnishing technical services to be performed by United States Government employees in connection with the project, (b) to pay a share of the costs of providing training outside the cooperating country in connection with the project for qualified persons from the cooperating country, and (c) to pay such additional costs as may be specified.

(2) The Cooperating Government Agency will make available the amounts specified in Block 9 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may further be described in Annex A. The Cooperating Government Agency will also make, or arrange to have made, additional contributions of property, services, facilities and funds required for carrying out the project as may be specified in Annex A, or as may subsequently be agreed upon by the two parties.

C. AID and the Cooperating Agency may obtain the assistance of other public and private agencies in carrying out their respective obligations under this Project Agreement. The two parties may agree to accept contributions of property, services, facilities and funds for purposes of this Project Agreement from other public and private agencies, and may agree upon the participation of any such third party in carrying out activities under this Project Agreement.

D. AID shall not be required to make any contribution after the expiration of six months following the estimated final contribution date (Block 13 of the Project Agreement form AID 1330-1) or any amended final contribution date specified herein. Except as otherwise specified herein or subsequently agreed

by the parties, all contributions of the Cooperating Agency pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made on or before said estimated termination date, or amended date. A contribution of goods or services shall be considered to have been made when the goods or services, provided or financed by the contributing party, are delivered in accordance with commercial practice.

E. The procurement of commodities and contract services to be financed in whole or in part by AID may (where so required by AID procedures) be undertaken only pursuant to PIOs issued by AID in accordance with its procedures.

F. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, the procurement of commodities financed with the AID contribution referred to in Block 8 of this Project Agreement shall be subject to the provisions of AID Regulation 1.

G. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, title to all property procured through financing by AID pursuant to Block 8(c) of this Project Agreement shall be in the Cooperating Agency, or such public or private agency as it may authorize. This provision is inapplicable to any property which may be used in connection with the project but is not financed pursuant to said Block 8(c).

H. Any property furnished to either party through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement shall, unless otherwise agreed by the party which financed the procurement, be devoted to the project until completion of the project, and thereafter shall be used so as to further the objectives sought in carrying out the project. Either party shall offer to return to the other, or to reimburse the other for, any property which it obtains through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement which is not used in accordance with the preceding sentence.

I. (1) If AID and any public or private organization furnishing commodities through AID financing for operations hereunder in the cooperating country, is, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for customs duties and import taxes on commodities imported into the cooperating country for purposes of carrying out this Project Agreement, the Cooperating Agency will pay such duties and taxes unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

(2) If any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United

States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement, are, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for income and social security taxes with respect to income upon which they are obligated to pay income or social security taxes to the Government of the United States of America, for property taxes on personal property intended for their own use, or for the payment of any tariff or duty upon personal or household goods brought into the cooperating country for the personal use of themselves and members of their families (not including such personal or household goods as may be sold by any such personnel in the cooperating country), the Cooperating Agency will pay such taxes, tariff, or duty unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

J. Any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperating Agency and AID, and shall be under the general direction of the Director of the Mission to the cooperating country.

K. If any commodity is furnished to the Cooperating Agency, or any public or private agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, on a grant basis through financing by AID pursuant to this Project Agreement under arrangements which will result in the accrual of proceeds to the Cooperating Agency or any authorized agency and if the applicable agreement between the two governments referred to on the first page of this Project Agreement does not provide for the establishment of a Special Account and the deposit therein of currency of the cooperating country, the Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary to establish a Special Account and to deposit therein currency of the cooperating country in amounts equal to such proceeds, in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

L. The Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary so that funds intro-

duced into the cooperating country by AID or any public or private agency for purposes of carrying out obligations of AID hereunder shall be convertible into currency of the cooperating country at the highest rate which, at the time the conversion is made, is not unlawful in the cooperating country.

M. AID shall expend funds and carry on operations pursuant to this Project Agreement only in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations of the United States Government.

N. The two parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this Project Agreement. Either party during the term of the Project and three years after the completion of the project, shall further have the right (1) to examine any property procured through financing by that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such property is located, and (2) to inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. Each party, in arranging for any disposition of any property procured through financing by the other party under this Project Agreement, shall assure that the rights of examination, inspection and audit described in the preceding sentence are reserved to the party which did the financing.

O. Upon completion of the project, a Completion Report shall be drawn up, signed by appropriate representatives of AID and the Cooperating Agency, and submitted to AID and the Cooperating Agency. The Completion Report shall include a summary of the actual contributions by both AID and the Cooperating Agency to the project, and shall provide a record of the activities carried out, the objectives achieved, and related basic data. AID and the Cooperating Agency shall each furnish the other with such information as may be needed to determine the nature and scope of operations under this Agreement and to evaluate the effectiveness of such operations.

P. The present Agreement shall enter into force when signed. Either party may terminate this Project Agreement by giving the other party 30 days written notice of intention to terminate it. Termination of this Project Agreement shall terminate any obligations of the two parties to make contributions pursuant to Blocks 8 and 9 of this Project Agreement, except for payments which they are committed to make pursuant to non-cancellable commitments entered into with third parties prior to the termination of the Project Agreement. It is expressly understood that the obligations under paragraph H relating to the use of property shall remain in force after such termination.

Block 5 - Project Description

Goal:

This project is to provide AID funded non-project-oriented training required in support of Indonesia's economic and social development. It encompasses both the public and private sectors. It aims at strengthening the Government of Indonesia's varied administrative, technical and institutional support capabilities required for the effective execution of the current Five Year Economic Development Plan (1969-1974).

Implementation:

Each candidate or group of candidates proposed for training will be screened and accepted on the basis of his or their qualifications to perform at the level required for the training.

All candidates accepted for training under this project must meet one or more of the guideline criteria listed below.

The sponsoring agency must state concisely how it will benefit from the training.

Guidelines:

In accordance with priorities which are set forth in the Government of Indonesia's 1969-1974 Five Year Plan (REPELITA), the General Participant Training Project will:

1. Assign overall highest priority to training in applied administration and management for Government of Indonesia agencies, institutions, and enterprises which have major policy and/or implementing responsibilities for REPELITA. Such training includes: O&M, Personnel, Accounting, Budgeting, Auditing, Industrial Management, Planning Supply Management, and Bid & Contract Studies.
2. Assign high priority, in the selection of candidates, to those employed in enterprises or sectors which are already receiving AID capital loans or where capital loans are planned. Generally, this training will be financed under this project only until a loan, with a training component, can be developed and approved. Capital loans are currently under consideration in the following sectors/areas: Agriculture, Water Resources, Power, Transportation (Civil Air, Roads, Railroads) and Education.

3. Assign priority to programs in the Agriculture and Education sectors which fall outside the conceptual framework of USAID's technical assistance projects in these sectors, but which assist in achieving REPELITA targets.

USAID is not in a position to entertain training requests which are not in accord with REPELITA priorities or which otherwise are contrary to USAID and AID training policies. Included in this prohibition are requests to train in other aid donor countries, religious training, space research, training and atomic energy training unless the latter has practical, peaceful application.

From time to time USAID will review, as a result of continuing consultations, with the Coordinating Committee for Foreign Technical Assistance and other donor representatives, the training outlined in the guidelines listed above. The purpose of these reviews will be to determine whether, from the standpoint of the Government of Indonesia's priorities and another donor's primary commitment to a sector, field or enterprise, it would not be preferable to exclude training in that sector, field or enterprise from USAID support. Reviews will also be held to give further refinement to these guidelines.

(1) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Annex A, as required by Block 5 hereof. In addition, as may be further specified in Annex A, AID will, subject to the availability of funds and (where required by AID procedures) as provided for in Project Implementation Orders (PIOs) issued by AID in accordance with its procedures, make available funds (a) to pay costs of furnishing technical services to be performed by United States Government employees in connection with the project, (b) to pay a share of the costs of providing training outside the cooperating country in connection with the project for qualified persons from the cooperating country, and (c) to pay such additional costs as may be specified.

J. Any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperating Agency and AID, and shall be under the general direction of the Director of the Mission to the cooperating country.

K. If any commodity is furnished to the Cooperating Agency, or any public or private agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, on a grant basis through financing by AID pursuant to this Project Agreement under arrangements which will result in the accrual of proceeds to the Cooperating Agency or any authorized agency and if the applicable agreement between the two governments referred to on the first page of this Project Agreement does not provide for the establishment of a Special Account and the deposit therein of currency of the cooperating country, the Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary to establish a Special Account and to deposit therein currency of the cooperating country in amounts equal to such proceeds, in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

L. The Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary so that funds intro-

N. The two parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this Project Agreement. Either party during the term of the Project and three years after the completion of the project, shall further have the right (1) to examine any property procured through financing by that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such property is located, and (2) to inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement, are, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for income and social security taxes with respect to income upon which they are obligated to pay income or social security taxes to the Government of the United States of America, for property taxes on personal property intended for their own use, or for the payment of any tariff or duty upon personal or household goods brought into the cooperating country for the personal use of themselves and members of their families (not including such personal or household goods as may be sold by any such personnel in the cooperating country), the Cooperating Agency will pay such taxes, tariff, or duty unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

J. Any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperating Agency and AID, and shall be under the general direction of the Director of the Mission to the cooperating country.

K. If any commodity is furnished to the Cooperating Agency, or any public or private agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, on a grant basis through financing by AID pursuant to this Project Agreement under arrangements which will result in the accrual of proceeds to the Cooperating Agency or any authorized agency and if the applicable agreement between the two governments referred to on the first page of this Project Agreement does not provide for the establishment of a Special Account and the deposit therein of currency of the cooperating country, the Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary to establish a Special Account and to deposit therein currency of the cooperating country in amounts equal to such proceeds, in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

L. The Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary so that funds intro-

duced into the cooperating country by AID or any public or private agency for purposes of carrying out obligations of AID hereunder shall be convertible into currency of the cooperating country at the highest rate which, at the time the conversion is made, is not unlawful in the cooperating country.

M. AID shall expend funds and carry on operations pursuant to this Project Agreement only in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations of the United States Government.

N. The two parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this Project Agreement. Either party during the term of the Project and three years after the completion of the project, shall further have the right (1) to examine any property procured through financing by that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such property is located, and (2) to inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. Each party, in arranging for any disposition of any property procured through financing by the other party under this Project Agreement, shall assure that the rights of examination, inspection and audit described in the preceding sentence are reserved to the party which did the financing.

O. Upon completion of the project, a Completion Report shall be drawn up, signed by appropriate representatives of AID and the Cooperating Agency, and submitted to AID and the Cooperating Agency. The Completion Report shall include a summary of the actual contributions by both AID and the Cooperating Agency to the project, and shall provide a record of the activities carried out, the objectives achieved, and related basic data. AID and the Cooperating Agency shall each furnish the other with such information as may be needed to determine the nature and scope of operations under this Agreement and to evaluate the effectiveness of such operations.

P. The present Agreement shall enter into force when signed. Either party may terminate this Project Agreement by giving the other party 30 days written notice of intention to terminate it. Termination of this Project Agreement shall terminate any obligations of the two parties to make contributions pursuant to Blocks 8 and 9 of this Project Agreement, except for payments which they are committed to make pursuant to non-cancellable commitments entered into with third parties prior to the termination of the Project Agreement. It is expressly understood that the obligations under paragraph H relating to the use of property shall remain in force after such termination.

2. Specific skill-oriented training which has immediate application to the work in which the participants will be involved upon their return to Indonesia.

B. Evaluation of training requests and selection of candidates includes the following considerations:

1. Review of Indonesian development priorities established by BAPPENAS in various planning documents, such as Indonesia's Five Year Plan and in annual technical assistance reviews held by BAPPENAS and the various government departments with donor countries.

2. Advice and consultation with USAID and other technical assistance specialists and review of their reports.

3. Analysis of the relevance of training requests to other USAID capital loan and technical assistance project training requirements.

4. Relationship to the primary commitments and interests of other donors in a given sector, field, or enterprise.

C. Pre-departure orientation and English-language teaching and testing will be provided in order to assist the participant candidates to benefit more fully from their overseas training experience.

D. The effectiveness of the training provided and the degree to which it is utilized will be evaluated upon the participants' return to Indonesia.

III. Specific Training Activities

A. Department of Finance

Technical advisors from the Harvard Development Advisory Service (HDAS) are providing some assistance to the Department to carry out administrative and organizational improvements in day-to-day operations, but the work of the small staff of qualified administrators is handicapped by the shortage of well-trained middle-level personnel. There is a need to build a cadre of such personnel who will eventually be capable of filling policy-making and administrative positions. Although a definitive manpower plan for the Department is not yet available, the areas of tax planning and administration, finance and budgeting, and customs have been identified for priority attention. It is expected that up to seven candidates for long-term training and six candidates for short-term training in the above areas will be selected in FY 1972.

B. National Development Planning Agency (BAPPENAS)

This agency also has a critical shortage of middle-level personnel required for implementing policy decisions and programs and eventually moving up into higher, policy level, administrative positions. Working with USAID, HDAS consultants are assisting BAPPENAS officials to identify priority training requirements and well qualified candidates. This year up to five candidates will be sent to the U. S. for graduate level training in economics and project planning and several other candidates will be given short-term training in planning and evaluation.

C. The Department of Finance and BAPPENAS depend heavily upon several other GOI agencies for planning data, policy recommendations, and

program implementation. Paramount among these are 1) the Department of Trade, 2) the National Logistics (Commodity) Board (BULOG), and 3) the Cabinet Secretariat.

1. Department of Trade

The Department of Trade plays a crucial role in establishing the GOI position on a variety of domestic and international trade issues. To do this job effectively, additional middle-management will require varying amounts of offshore training. During FY 72 two candidates are planned for the World Trade Institute courses in export development.

2. BULOG

BULOG is charged with implementing price support and stabilization policies for basic commodities. As the economy expands, increasing sophistication will be required of BULOG as it formulates and implements policies in this area. The Board is just beginning a manpower development program to upgrade its staff. To support this effort, in FY 1972 USAID will provide academic training for at least one candidate.

3. Cabinet Secretariat

Among other things, the Cabinet Secretariat is charged with coordinating technical assistance provided to all levels of the government. Development project proposals must be analyzed for economic feasibility, management capabilities of the sponsoring agencies, and availability and timeliness of appropriate resources. To improve the Secretariat's capability in this important role, several staff members will be provided short-term non-degree training in management and project analysis.

D. Economic and Investment Law Program

The purpose of this program is to train government officials and private sector professionals in the legal aspects of economic development, including public and private investment, concession licensing, and contracting. During the past four years, the Ford Foundation and professors from the University of California at Berkeley, have designed and conducted a

program at the request of the Chairman of the National Investment Board of Indonesia. In FY 1971 the program was expanded with USAID assistance.

In FY 1972, USAID will finance an estimated ten participants in the long-term (12 months) program, and approximately five participants in the short-term program, as well as part of the University of California's overhead costs. The Ford Foundation continues to finance special consultants at Berkeley, Indonesian research and program support, library equipment, supplies, and some of the institutional overhead.

E. Higher Education Centers of Excellence

The purpose of this program is to support the GOI plan for the development of higher education based on its system of university consortia which have been established for each of the major academic disciplines. Graduate level training will be provided for staff from centers of excellence in the consortia for economics and for science and technology.

1. Economics Consortium

The Faculties of Economics at the University of Indonesia and Gadjah Mada University are the Pembina Faculties, or Centers of Excellence in this Consortium. USAID will provide training for up to ten people chosen from either the Pembina or non-Pembina faculties within the Consortium. This training will be arranged through the American Economic Consortium consisting of the Universities of California (Berkeley), Harvard and Wisconsin. The U. S. Consortium was established and is maintained with Ford Foundation assistance to help select candidates and to design advanced training programs appropriate for Indonesia's requirements.

2. Consortium of Science and Technology

This Consortium with USAID assistance is currently conducting a survey of the status of education in the field of science and technology in order to establish plans for the GOI Second Five Year Plan. The Centers of Excellence are at the Technical Institute of Bandung and Gadjah Mada University. As a head start to the further development of these institutions, USAID will provide about ten members of their staffs with

F. The Indonesian Institute of Sciences (LIPI)

LIPI is the national institution concerned with the development of the nation's natural, scientific, technological and social sciences capabilities and the application of these as efficient and effective tools for national development. Among its functions are listed:

1. Mission (applied) oriented research and development on problems which are not clearly within the responsibility of any ministry.
2. Mission oriented research and development on problems which are related to the responsibilities of several ministries, to provide a more comprehensive and coordinated effort than could be conducted individually or collectively by the ministries.
3. On a contract basis, research, surveys and studies for the National Planning Agency, ministries and industries.
4. Scientific and technological back-up to technological research institutes of the various ministries.
5. Collect and disseminate scientific and technical information and facilitate its effective application for public benefit.
6. Establish and maintain national standards of measurement of the various physical quantities.
7. Provide central services for scientific tests and measurements of all kinds.

In performing these functions LIPI has three national institutes for the natural sciences, two institutes for the social sciences and humanities and five institutes for Technology, plus the National Scientific Documentation Center. The five technology institutes are to be merged and developed into one multidisciplinary technological research institute named the National Technological Research Center.

The development of the science and technology of a nation is determined by research activities, qualitatively and quantitatively. The principle element is the research worker exempted from administrative and management duties so he may concentrate his attention on scientific tasks.

During FY 1972 USAID will assist LIPI to develop and upgrade its manpower to undertake research, and provide administrative and management backstop as follows:

One librarian for the National Scientific Documentation Center, designated the national information and documentation center for the field of science and technology. It has the task of coordinating and directing the information services of the special libraries in this subject field and of making available to scientists throughout Indonesia the literature and information they require (long term Master's degree).

Three researchers, one each from the following LIPI Institutes, for advanced (Ph. D) degrees:

a) The National Institute of Electronics (Technology)

This Institute is the only Institute in Indonesia investigating the use of materials in the field of electricity and electronics for the potential use of Industry. The Institute devotes itself to functions 1 and 3 listed above.

b) The National Biological Institute (Natural Sciences)

This Institute, consisting of four affiliate institutions has the task of collecting and investigating the flora and fauna of Indonesia for economic potential, ecological research and the improvement of genetic characteristics to increase economic value. In assisting a primary industry of Indonesia (Agriculture) it performs functions 1, 3, and 4 listed above.

The Institute is also a key organization in the implementation of regional cooperation. The National Biological Institute provides facilities and staff for the SEAMEO Center for Tropical Biology.

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c) The National Institute of Oceanology (Natural Sciences)

Until 1970 this institute was an affiliate of the National Biological Institute. The Institute of Marine Research is its core. It conducts research in marine biology, physical and chemical oceanography, marine geology and marine meteorology. There is major coordination with the Ministries of Education and Agriculture. In assisting a primary Industry of Indonesia (Agriculture), it performs functions 2, 3, 4 and 5 above.

Centralized Management and Administration

As a "headstart" for the multi-disciplinary technological research center, two candidates will receive administrative training in the techniques of quantitative methods for science policy for a short, non-degree period.

G. Law Enforcement Agencies

The USAID has responded to the various requests of the Police Department for training in areas defined in the U. S. as belonging to the civilian sector. Several police have been or are being sent to the civilian oriented International Police Academy in Washington, D. C. Recognizing the parallel role of the Office of the Attorney General in bringing police cases to court, similar short programs are being offered to members of that office. Training subjects include the following: Police patrol operations, criminal and security investigation, instructor training, records management, firearms training, traffic and narcotics and dangerous drugs law enforcement.

H. Other Training Programs

In addition to the assistance outlined above, USAID will:

1. Provide training opportunities from time to time in other areas which are mutually agreed to be particularly useful to Indonesia's social and economic development. This will include participants from both the public and private sector, as appropriate, in programs developed by AID/W, other U. S. public and private agencies and third countries in various technical and managerial fields as well as programs in Civic

IV. Responsibilities of the Government of Indonesia

In signing this Project Agreement, the Government of Indonesia has agreed that for at least a two year period following his return, each participant will be employed in an area which utilizes his training, unless in a particular case USAID and the GOI specifically agree that a different assignment will better serve the development needs of Indonesia and provide for more effective use of the new skills. A reassignment or transfer without regard to the foregoing policy consideration jeopardizes future training opportunities under this project. Some funds will also be added to on-going programs to reflect higher costs in the USA than originally estimated.

In addition, professional society memberships, journals and publications will be provided for returned participants from this and other projects to help upgrade their skills and to supply them with technical information needed to fulfill their training objectives. Contingent upon the availability of funds and the identification of qualified Indonesians, further amendments increasing both the dollar amount and numbers under this Agreement may be concluded at a later date.

I. PROJECT GOAL

The purpose of this project is to help Indonesia meet its large and critical need for skilled personnel. The project focuses on meeting the training needs of selected personnel whose improved capabilities are important for Indonesia's over-all technical and economic development goals.

II. GENERAL PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- A. Two types of training (sometimes combined) in the United States and/or appropriate third countries are:**
1. Broad educational opportunities in specific fields which it has been agreed will form the basis for the long term development of the participants and for their contribution to the growth and improvement of the institutions to which they return.
 2. Specific skill-oriented training which has immediate application to the work in which the participants will be involved upon their return to Indonesia.
- B. The evaluation of training requests and the selection of candidates include the following considerations:**
1. Review of Indonesian development priorities established by the National Planning Agency (BAPPENAS) in planning documents such as Indonesia's Five Year Plan, and in annual technical assistance reviews held by BAPPENAS and the Coordinating Committee for Foreign Technical Assistance (the Cabinet Secretariat).
 2. Advice and consultation within USAID and with technical assistance specialists and review of their reports, particularly in regard to the absorptive capacity of target institutions.
 3. Analysis of the relevance of training requests to A.I.D. capital loan and technical assistance project training requirements.
 4. Relationship to the primary commitments and interests of other donors in a given sector, field, or

enterprise, and the quality of U.S. response capability compared to other donors.

- C. Pre-departure orientation and English language training and testing will be provided in order to assist the participant candidates to benefit more fully from their overseas training experience.
- D. The effectiveness of the training provided and the degree to which it has been or will be utilized will be evaluated upon the participants' return to Indonesia.

III. SPECIAL TRAINING ACTIVITIES

A major effort in FY 1973 is directed to those GOI Departments and Agencies having primary responsibility for planning, developing and administering the economic and social development programs of Indonesia.

A. The Department of Finance and Banking Institutions both Public and Private.

- 1. Technical advisors from the Harvard Development Advisory Service (HDAS), in coordination with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), continue to provide the Department of Finance and the Bank Indonesia assistance in carrying out administrative and organizational improvements in day-to-day operations. In FY 1972, USAID began a formal program of training assistance to the Department and the banking institutions related to it, including the Bank Indonesia. In FY 1973, USAID will continue to finance training programs to build a cadre of personnel who will eventually be capable of filling policy-making and administrative positions throughout the Department. In addition to the Directorate Generals of Taxation and Finance for which USAID provided training assistance in 1972, the Department has requested overseas training for key personnel to strengthen the Bureau of Planning and Research, and similar but more modest support to the Directorate Generals of Budget, Accounting and Audit.

USAID undertakes to finance approximately ten long-term participants and six to eight short-term participants for the Department and Bank Indonesia.

2. Agency for Money and Capital Market Development.

Indonesia has adopted a policy in favor of developing an expanded variety of financial institutions and broad based financial markets as factors leading to the more efficient marshalling of savings into productive effort. In pursuit of this policy, a special study team was created in 1968 to prepare recommendations for the desired development. This study led to formation of the Agency for Money and Capital Markets in January 1972 and to a Decree of the Minister of Finance authorizing the formation of new types of financial institutions, including investment banks.

The new Agency's responsibilities include the following:

- a. Establishment of appropriate market institutions required for the issuance and exchange of short-term, private and public monetary instruments.
- b. The eventual creation of long-term debt and equity instruments and the definition of institutions and their functions necessary to handle the issuance and trading of these.
- c. The building of the infrastructure for a money and capital market through the provision of training in such areas as corporate finance, financial analysis, and accounting.
- d. The strengthening of an appropriate regulatory framework for the money and capital markets with a view to creating the necessary public confidence in the new system.

In FY 1973, USAID will initiate a planned two year program to send seven officers each year to third countries with similar capital market institutions to review their organizational frameworks, operational methods and problems, regulations, and so on.

from the Department of Finance and Bank Indonesia, both of which are expected to have major regulatory functions in the institutions being planned.

3. Bankers from the Private Sector.

Concurrent with the strengthening of the public sector in finance, there is the necessity to strengthen private sector banking institutions which have an essential role to play in economic development. Training is particularly required for the key positions of credit managers, who are responsible for evaluating loan applications and managing the banks' loan portfolios. Over a period of three to four years, USAID will assist these institutions by financing on the job training for two to three private sector bankers a year in a third country in principles of financial analysis, credit policy, credit controls and management of loan portfolios.

B. National Development Planning Agency (BAPPENAS).

BAPPENAS has a critical shortage of middle-level personnel required to implement economic development policy decisions and programs and eventually to move into higher policy level administrative positions. Working with USAID, HDAS consultants have been assisting BAPPENAS officials for the past two years to identify priority training requirements and well qualified candidates. Only three of the eight programmed for academic degree training have returned. The remainder are still in training. In FY 1973, USAID will send four candidates to the United States for graduate-level degree training in project planning and economics and two or three additional for short courses in these fields.

- C. The Department of Finance and BAPPENAS depend heavily upon several other GOI agencies for planning data, policy recommendations, and program implementation. Primarily these are (1) The Department of Trade, (2) The National Logistics Commodity Board (BULOG), and (3) The Cabinet Secretariat.**

1. The Department of Trade.

The Department of Trade has a key role in establishing the GOI position on a variety of issue related to domestic and international trade. During FY 1972, two members of the Department received training at the World Trade Institute's program in export development.

In FY 1973, another two Department members are expected to attend a similar course. In addition, a member of the Minister's personal staff who is also a member of the BAPPENAS Bureau of Fiscal and Monetary Affairs, will undertake a graduate degree program in economics.

2. BULOG.

This agency has responsibility for implementing price support and stabilization policies for basic commodities, particularly rice. As the economy expands, increasing understanding of these sophisticated and complex mechanisms will be required of BULOG as it formulates and implements policies in this area. The Board is just beginning a manpower development program to upgrade its staff. To support this effort one employee began academic degree training under the FY 1972 program in agricultural economics. In FY 1973 an additional candidate for similar degree training is again planned.

3. The Cabinet Secretariat.

The Cabinet Secretariat is charged with coordinating technical assistance provided to all levels of the Government. Development project proposals must be analyzed in terms of economic feasibility, the management capabilities of sponsoring agencies, and availability and timeliness of appropriate resources. The Secretariat also sits on the councils of BAPPENAS to assure that technical assistance will complement the national priority goals. To improve the Secretariat's capabilities in this role, approximately three to four staff members will be given short-term, non-degree training in administrative management, project analysis and administration.

The agencies included in sections III. A.B. & C. above are responsible for coordinating each of their inputs into the national planning and management process. To facilitate this coordination, it is planned in FY 1973 to take advantage of short course offerings in management and administration for interdisciplinary groups which would include representatives from BAPPENAS, Bank Indonesia, BULOG, Finance and the Cabinet Secretariat.

D. Transportation, Communications and Power Sectors.

The Transportation, Communication and Power Sectors are a vital ingredient for Indonesia's further socio-economic development. The geographic configuration of this archipelago nation calls for extensive transportation and power systems if political and social integration is to continue and the economic potential of the various regions drawn into the mainstream of a modern economy.

1. The Department of Communications

a. Transportation Management/Economics.

There is a great need for continuous transportation planning, operation and administration based on scientific analysis and rational decision-making. Furthermore there is a need for the development of research capabilities to find optimal solutions for the Indonesian transportation problems. Expenditures for transportation and communications constitute the largest sectoral share in the budget and constitute a considerable share of the requests for foreign aid. There is the danger that allocations of these vast amounts of public funds are not optimally made. This danger increases if the supply of highly trained transportation specialists is not increasing. Presently there are only three qualified Indonesian transportation planners trained overseas and two of these are in semi-retirement. Therefore, most of the analytical, technical and managerial expertise is contracted from foreign consultants. Effective transfer of knowledge is impeded by the fact that

a foundation of knowledge in scientific analysis, rational decision-making and transportation economics, technology and management is missing.

The following measures for manpower development at the Department are envisioned:

- (a) Systematic utilization of foreign experts for the transfer of knowledge and skills in informal and formal training efforts.
- (b) Ongoing in-service training programs, conducted under the auspices of the Department while the trainees continue to attend to their regular duties.
- (c) Ad hoc seminars and workshops on specific subjects.
- (d) Training programs organized for Department personnel and conducted under the auspices of existing institutions of higher education in Indonesia.
- (e) Degree and non-degree training programs for selected personnel at foreign institutions.

Most of the above efforts for manpower upgrading depend on the availability of a cadre of highly qualified Indonesians who can exert leadership in establishing new norms and can disseminate their know-how to a wider range of personnel. To create this cadre in the Department, the fastest and most effective way is overseas training at established institutions.

In FY 1973 it is planned that up to five candidates drawn from the Department's Planning and Analysis Bureau and the Directorates of Land Sea and Air Communication will be selected for long-term academic degree training and up to two for shorter training. The training will be targeted either towards one, or a combination of the following objectives.

- (1) Exposing a cadre of higher ranking officials to the many aspects of transportation planning (economic, technical, managerial) and the basic elements and techniques of scientific analysis, synthesis and decision-making. Such officials should become better informed generalists who would be better enabled to exert leadership and guidance along the entire process from planning to implementation.
- (2) Creating a cadre of middle-level officials with skills in applying techniques of analysis and decision-making specifically in the context of transportation planning, and management.
- (3) Creating a cadre of officials who could effectively disseminate knowledge and skills in transportation planning in formal and informal training programs.

b. Ground to Air Communications.

The GOI is preparing to build a new International Airport and to upgrade existing airports to receive faster and larger airplanes at more frequent intervals. This up-grading will include the latest radar equipment, to be supplied and installed by Texas Instruments Inc. at an airport in Jakarta. USAID will assist the GOI to up-grade the air traffic control staff responsible for the efficiency and safety of Indonesia's major airports by the world's airlines.

In FY 1973 three air traffic controllers will be trained in the FAA advanced radar Air Traffic Control System for assignment at strategic airports. Three others will be trained to handle the system being introduced through the GOI purchase of equipment from Texas Instruments, Inc.

2. The Department of Public Works and Power.

ing projects involving land transportation, particularly roads, and power generation, transmission and distribution. This is a sector with major capital assistance inputs from A.I.D. and other bilateral and multilateral assistance donors. The Department of Public Works and Power will be assisted to strengthen its corps of engineers. Upward to five engineers will be programmed for academic degrees in the United States or Thailand in road and bridge engineering and hydraulic engineering. To support the heavy capital loan program in the power generation and distribution sector, USAID plans to finance up to five electrical engineers for short programs in project administration and management or for academic degree work as appropriate.

E. Economic and Investment Law Program.

The purpose of this program is to train government officials and private sector professionals in the legal aspects of economic development, including public and private investment, concession licensing, and contracting. During the past five years, the Ford Foundation and professors from the University of California at Berkeley have designed and conducted a program in Indonesia at the request of the Chairman of the National Investment Board of Indonesia. In FY 1971 the program was expanded with USAID supporting the major training program at the University of California at Berkeley.

In FY 1973, USAID will finance an estimated 12 - 15 participants in the long-term (12 months) non-degree program. The Ford Foundation continues to finance special consultants at Berkeley, Indonesian program support, library equipment, supplies, and institutional overhead. An evaluation of the program will be undertaken in FY 1973 to assess the impact 15 returnees from this program are making, and an effort will be made to further institutionalize the group in Indonesia to enhance opportunities for research and teaching others.

F. Higher Education Centers of Excellence (Education Sector).

for the development of higher education based on the system of university consortia established for each of the major academic disciplines. Graduate level training will be provided for staff from the Centers of Excellence in the Consortia for Economics and for Science and Technology. Where appropriate, and as agreed by the consortia, similar training will be offered to other university faculties in the same disciplines.

1. Economics Consortium.

The Faculties of Economics at the University of Indonesia and at Gajah Mada University are the Centers of Excellence in this Consortium. They are particularly concerned that other faculties within the Consortium be given opportunities for upgrading, especially since graduates of several of these faculties have become involved in regional development planning work. In FY 1973, USAID will provide training for up to ten faculty members chosen from either the Centers of Excellence or other faculties within the Consortium. USAID and AID/W arrange this program through the U.S. Economic Consortium consisting of the Universities of California, Berkeley, Harvard and Wisconsin.

The U.S. Consortium was established and is maintained with Ford Foundation assistance to provide lecturers for Indonesian faculties of economics, to help select candidates for U.S. training, and to design advanced training programs appropriate for Indonesia's requirements.

2. Consortium of Science and Technology.

The Institute of Technology at Bandung (ITB) and the Faculties of Science and Engineering Technology at Gajah Mada University are the Centers of Excellence of this Consortium. The Consortium, with USAID assistance, recently completed a survey of the status of education in the field of sciences and technology in order to establish plans for the GOI second Five Year Plan. One point the survey highlighted was the need for continuing improvement of the faculty

members of the two Centers of Excellence if they are to upgrade their institutions to the level of awarding internationally accepted M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in the various science and engineering disciplines. To continue the development of these institutions, USAID will provide about ten members of their staff with advanced training at the graduate level in FY 1973 with about five candidates coming from each institution.

3. Education Administration.

In addition to assistance to the two Consortia, USAID plans to assist selected Centers of Excellence to train staff as administrators. At the moment, all university administrators are from specific academic disciplines and have little or no training for their positions as administrators. In FY 1973, it is planned to program four to five university faculty members in very short, intensive courses on university administration and organization and another two to three in longer (12 months) non-degree programs.

G. Law Enforcement Agencies.

The USAID has responded to the various requests of the Police Department for training in areas defined in the U.S. as belonging to the civilian sector. Several police have been or are being sent to the civilian oriented International Police Academy in Washington, D.C. In FY 1973, several ^{will} alternatively attend the Academy of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Recognizing the parallel role of the office of the Attorney General in bringing police cases to court, similar short programs are being offered to members of that office. Training subjects include the following: Police patrol operations, criminal and security investigation, instructor training, records management, firearms training, traffic and narcotics and dangerous drugs, law enforcement. The total number to be trained in FY 1973 is approximately sixteen.

In addition to narcotics as a law enforcement problem, USAID plans to provide training for approximately eight GOI officials interdisciplinary short courses in FY 1973 dealing with narcotics as a social and mental health problem. H. Other Training Programs.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF INDONESIA

In signing this project agreement, the GOI has agreed that for at least a two year period following the return of each participant, he will be employed in the area for which he was trained, unless USAID and the GOI specifically agree that a different assignment will better serve the development needs of Indonesia and provide for more effective use of the new skills. A reassignment, transfer or resignation without regard to the foregoing policy consideration jeopardizes future training opportunities under this project.

The GOI will cooperate in developing necessary information on the utilization and effectiveness of returned participants, as may be requested by USAID.

V. U. S. FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

A. Participants (\$840,000)

Funds in this agreement will provide training for about 65 new participants plus approximately 60 extensions. New programs will include approximately 35 long-term, (usually academic) programs and 30 short-term (six months or less) programs. Some funds will also be added to on-going programs to reflect higher costs than originally estimated.

A. As used herein, the term "AID" refers to the Agency for International Development, any component agency, or any successor agency. References to "this Project Agreement" shall mean the original Project Agreement as modified by any revisions which have entered into effect.

B. (1) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Annex A, as required by Block 5 hereof. In addition, as may be further specified in Annex A, AID will, subject to the availability of funds and (where required by AID procedures) as provided for in Project Implementation Orders (PIOs) issued by AID in accordance with its procedures, make available funds (a) to pay costs of furnishing technical services to be performed by United States Government employees in connection with the project, (b) to pay a share of the costs of providing training outside the cooperating country in connection with the project for qualified persons from the cooperating country, and (c) to pay such additional costs as may be specified.

(2) The Cooperating Government Agency will make available the amounts specified in Block 9 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may further be described in Annex A. The Cooperating Government Agency will also make, or arrange to have made, additional contributions of property, services, facilities and funds required for carrying out the project as may be specified in Annex A, or as may subsequently be agreed upon by the two parties.

C. AID and the Cooperating Agency may obtain the assistance of other public and private agencies in carrying out their respective obligations under this Project Agreement. The two parties may agree to accept contributions of property, services, facilities and funds for purposes of this Project Agreement from other public and private agencies, and may agree upon the participation of any such third party in carrying out activities under this Project Agreement.

D. AID shall not be required to make any contribution after the expiration of six months following the estimated final contribution date (Block 13 of the Project Agreement form AID 1330-1) or any amended final contribution date specified herein. Except as otherwise specified herein, or subsequently agreed

by the parties, all contributions of the Cooperating Agency pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made on or before said estimated termination date, or amended date. A contribution of goods or services shall be considered to have been made when the goods or services, provided or financed by the contributing party, are delivered in accordance with commercial practice.

E. The procurement of commodities and contract services to be financed in whole or in part by AID may (where so required by AID procedures) be undertaken only pursuant to PIOs issued by AID in accordance with its procedures.

F. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, the procurement of commodities financed with the AID contribution referred to in Block 8 of this Project Agreement shall be subject to the provisions of AID Regulation 1.

G. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, title to all property procured through financing by AID pursuant to Block 8(c) of this Project Agreement shall be in the Cooperating Agency, or such public or private agency as it may authorize. This provision is inapplicable to any property which may be used in connection with the project but is not financed pursuant to said Block 8(c).

H. Any property furnished to either party through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement shall, unless otherwise agreed by the party which financed the procurement, be devoted to the project until completion of the project, and thereafter shall be used so as to further the objectives sought in carrying out the project. Either party shall offer to return to the other, or to reimburse the other for, any property which it obtains through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement which is not used in accordance with the preceding sentence.

I. (1) If AID and any public or private organization furnishing commodities through AID financing for operations hereunder in the cooperating country, is, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for customs duties and import taxes on commodities imported into the cooperating country for purposes of carrying out this Project Agreement, the Cooperating Agency will pay such duties and taxes unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

(2) If any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United

States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement, are, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for income and social security taxes with respect to income upon which they are obligated to pay income or social security taxes to the Government of the United States of America, for property taxes on personal property intended for their own use, or for the payment of any tariff or duty upon personal or household goods brought into the cooperating country for the personal use of themselves and members of their families (not including such personal or household goods as may be sold by any such personnel in the cooperating country), the Cooperating Agency will pay such taxes, tariff, or duty unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

J. Any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperating Agency and AID, and shall be under the general direction of the Director of the Mission to the cooperating country.

K. If any commodity is furnished to the Cooperating Agency, or any public or private agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, on a grant basis through financing by AID pursuant to this Project Agreement under arrangements which will result in the accrual of proceeds to the Cooperating Agency or any authorized agency and if the applicable agreement between the two governments referred to on the first page of this Project Agreement does not provide for the establishment of a Special Account and the deposit therein of currency of the cooperating country, the Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary to establish a Special Account and to deposit therein currency of the cooperating country in amounts equal to such proceeds, in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

L. The Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary so that funds intro-

duced into the cooperating country by AID or any public or private agency for purposes of carrying out obligations of AID hereunder shall be convertible into currency of the cooperating country at the highest rate which, at the time the conversion is made, is not unlawful in the cooperating country.

M. AID shall expend funds and carry on operations pursuant to this Project Agreement only in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations of the United States Government.

N. The two parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this Project Agreement. Either party during the term of the Project and three years after the completion of the project, shall further have the right (1) to examine any property procured through financing by that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such property is located, and (2) to inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. Each party, in arranging for any disposition of any property procured through financing by the other party under this Project Agreement, shall assure that the rights of examination, inspection and audit described in the preceding sentence are reserved to the party which did the financing.

O. Upon completion of the project, a Completion Report shall be drawn up, signed by appropriate representatives of AID and the Cooperating Agency, and submitted to AID and the Cooperating Agency. The Completion Report shall include a summary of the actual contributions by both AID and the Cooperating Agency to the project, and shall provide a record of the activities carried out, the objectives achieved, and related basic data. AID and the Cooperating Agency shall each furnish the other with such information as may be needed to determine the nature and scope of operations under this Agreement and to evaluate the effectiveness of such operations.

P. The present Agreement shall enter into force when signed. Either party may terminate this Project Agreement by giving the other party 30 days written notice of intention to terminate it. Termination of this Project Agreement shall terminate any obligations of the two parties to make contributions pursuant to Blocks 8 and 9 of this Project Agreement, except for payments which they are committed to make pursuant to non-cancellable commitments entered into with third parties prior to the termination of the Project Agreement. It is expressly understood that the obligations under paragraph H relating to the use of property shall remain in force after such termination.


