**19. Scope of Technical Services**

**A. Objective for which the Technical Services are to be Used**

The technical services are to support a cooperative AID/IBRD Appraisal Mission to be conducted in Lesotho to evaluate a loan request of the GOL for support of the Thaba Bosiu Development Project.

**B. Description**

The participating agency will provide the services of one (1) qualified specialist who will accompany and be a member of a three (3) man AID team to the Kingdom of Lesotho. The specialist will be responsible to a senior AID project coordinator and will perform the following tasks:

1. Consistent with the guidelines derived from the broad conceptual framework which will be developed by the AID team for a possible future national conservation/erosion control program, he will work closely with the IDA/IBRD Chief of Mission and the AID team. Within this framework, he will provide the narrative portion, cost estimates and economic justifications for the conservation/afforestation portion of the IDA/IBRD Appraisal Mission report.

The technician will prepare a report for the IDA/IBRD Mission as noted in Para 1, Block 19B. Ten copies of this report, with any additional recommendations with regard to a nation-wide erosion control program, will be furnished to AID.

An earlier study on conservation and related activities has been performed by the USDA. The technician will be briefed on these findings as they are relevant to the purpose of this investigation. A copy of the Thaba Bosiu Development Project Proposal will be made available immediately upon commencement of his services.

The technician will be requested to spend one day or more at AID/W prior to departure and several days at various times at AID/W following his return for briefing and de-briefing. If desirable, he may be requested to visit IDA/IBRD staff in Washington and enroute, in Nairobi, Kenya, during this period of service.
