

ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

SUBJECT: Project Authorization for Operational Program Grant to the Centro San Lucas -- Expanded training of Rural Community Health Volunteers

Your approval is required for an Operational Program Grant of \$49,241 from Section 104 Health and Population appropriations to El Salvador for the Centro San Lucas (519-0273).

Discussion: Centro San Lucas (CSL) is a Salvadorean-based private and voluntary organization (PVO) registered with AID on January 11, 1980. CSL has applied to USAID/El Salvador for an 18-month, \$49,241 OPG. Total LOP funding is requested in FY80. This funding by AID will represent 73.6% of the estimated total project costs of \$66,930. The remaining 26.4% or \$17,689 will be borne by cash or in-kind contributions by CSL or other sources. The Goal of the project is to improve the quality of life in rural poor communities by diminishing the incidence of disease and by making basic health care available to an increased number of inhabitants of poor rural areas. The project will support sixty-six weeks of CSL training for 1,200 Rural Health Volunteers as Health Promoters, Midwives and Family Planning Instructors who will return to their respective communities after training and actively promote community health programs. Additionally, the OPG will provide additional administrative capacity to the CSL to permit improved follow-up and support of trained volunteers and to facilitate greater coordination with Ministry of Public Health efforts.

The CSL OPG Proposal was circulated for Mission Review on December 13, 1979. At that time, two outstanding issues required resolution prior to a firm recommendation of approval. These issues were:

- a. Assurance of Coordination of this program with the Ministry of Public Health and,
- b. Assurance of continuing self-financed support for the project by the Diocese of San Miguel at the end of AID-financed portion of the activity.

Father William Gibbons, Director of the CSL Project has since provided USAID with confirmation of coordination with the Ministry of Public Health and the Bishop of San Miguel has confirmed that continued operation of the project will be provided by the Diocese of San Miguel following the termination of AID-support.

1. Pursuant to the Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as Amended, I hereby authorize the Expanded Training of Rural Community Health Volunteers of the Centro San Lucas for El Salvador involving planned obligations not to exceed \$49,241 in grant funds over an 18-month period from the date of authorization, subject to the availability of funds in accordance with A.I.D. OYB/Allotment processes, to help in financing foreign exchange and local currency costs for the project.

2. The project consists of the training of approximately 1,200 Rural Health Volunteers as Health Promoters, Midwives and Family Planning Instructors and the development of an improved administrative structure to permit greater coordination and follow-up of Rural Health Volunteer efforts. The OPG aims at improving the quality of life in poor rural communities by diminishing the incidence of disease and by making basic health care available to an increased number of inhabitants of those communities. Over the life of the project it is expected that:

- 44 weeks of classes per year training an average of 25 Rural Health Volunteers each week will be conducted with an estimated total of 1,200 for the LOP.
- 2,000 rural community inhabitants will have participated in health workshops conducted by Rural Health Volunteers during the LOP.
- Community projects to include the provision of community health kits, latrines, potable water, medical injections and others will have been initiated by Rural Health Workers.
- A more rational and even distribution of Rural Health Volunteers throughout the region will have been effected through improved planning and coordination with the Ministry of Public Health.
- Increasing numbers of rural community inhabitants will be guided into the existing Ministry of Public Health network.
