The American Public Health Association (APHA) retained Ronald G. Wilson as a consultant to the Lampang Health Development Project. As part of the assignment, which lasted from December 17 to December 19, 1980, Mr. Wilson traveled to Washington, D.C., where he met with various officials from the Agency for International Development (AID) and the APHA.

Purposes of the Consultancy

The purposes of this consultancy were:

- To consult with DS/HEA staff on technical matters and to report on the plans for and problems of documentation on the Lampang project, including discussion of the costs of producing reports for AID/W and for distributing those reports among the regions.
- To present a seminar at the American Public Health Association and to report on the progress of the Lampang Health Development Project.
- To be available for discussions with DAA/DSB staff, including the director and deputy director of the Office of Health/DSB.
- To prepare a written report that provides estimates of the costs of producing documentation on the Lampang project.

### Results

The consultant was asked to prepare a written estimate of the costs for printing a series of documents on the Lampang project. This report, entitled "Estimated Printing Costs for LHDP Documentary Series" (see Attachment 1), will be useful in estimating the relative costs (excluding packing and shipping) of printing six volumes of information on the project. These six volumes will comprise the Final Report on the Lampang Health Development Project.

Mr. Wilson also prepared an outline (see Attachment 2) of the Lampang Health Development Project Documentary Series. This outline has been refined and incorporates the revisions suggested during technical discussions with DS/HEA staff.

Attachment 3, a timetable for the production of the documentary series, includes revisions suggested at meetings with staff in Washington and at follow-up meetings with senior staff of the Lampang project. As is indicated in Attachment 3, editorial assistance will be needed for 4-6 weeks in February and March and for 2-4 weeks in June and July. The consultant discussed with the interested parties the various alternatives to meet this need.
