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Additional paragraphs to be inserted in the PROP on page 4 after the second full paragraph on that page

The Bank in addition has requested staff assistance for a period of six months by a senior systems analyst familiar with the preparation of macro-economic models. He will be expected to assist the staff of the Bank in integrating the models presently in use by the planning ministries of the partner states into a model for the whole East African economy and in the ~~partner states~~ development of compatible models for the industrial sector of the partner states and the composite East African economy. The initial models will serve to help define the parameters of each individual industry study the results of which will in turn be incorporated into a refinement of the model. The models are intended to serve as a means of integrating not only the work of the team of experts now being assembled by the Bank but also to serve as a framework for the identification of priorities for further study by the more permanent staff of the Bank.

The Bank staff has already gathered most of the data necessary to the formulation of the initial models so that the services of this consultant to direct its organization and manipulation are now urgently required.

The Bank has identified a competent expert for the purpose who appears to be available to meet the Bank's early requirement for assistance in this field. It is estimated that the services of this consultant can be had for six months at a total cost including international transportation of \$25,000 plus the same subsistence and travel allowance provided by the Bank in local currency for the other consultants financed by AID.
