SCOPE OF WORK

21. Scope of Technical Services

A. Description The Communication Institute of the East-West Center will conduct a workshop/seminar primarily for key Asian personnel engaged in information, education, and communication activities related to population and family programs. The objective of the workshop is to improve skills related to design and execution of family planning messages, diffusion of such messages, and the testing of message effectiveness. Emphasis will also be placed on development of management expertise as applied to communication problems in population and family planning.

The training personnel will be composed of core staff and fellows of the Communication Institute, senior staff of the University of Hawaii and representatives of population/family planning organizations.

The workshop will run for eleven weeks beginning April 10, 1972, at the East-West Center and will include approximately three weeks' internship in a country other than the participant's home country for each attendee.



The programs of the Institute are designed to provide graduate and non-graduate training to Asian students, leaders and related professional experts; to carry out demographic and social science research studies; to provide assistance to LDC governments and institutions in developing an in-house capability in population dynamics; to help formulate cooperative endeavors with LDC governments and institutions; and to provide advisory services as required.

1.2. LDC population specialists and key Asian leaders generating, processing and analyzing in-house, basic demographic data in statistical organizations in at least four countries, i.e., Indonesia, Korea, Malaysia and Thailand.

2. Institutional Resources

2.1. A research and training institution in Java capable of (a) planning and undertaking research needed by Indonesian leaders to make population policies and develop strategy; (b) developing training programs and techniques for improving expertise of existant staff and expanding faculty through training programs.

2.2. A professionally adequate capability for generating, processing and analyzing in-house, basic demographic data in central statistical organizations of at least four countries (Indonesia, Korea, Malaysia, and Thailand.)

4.1. Validated data and extensive and periodically updated analysis of the demographic situation in countries of the area, developed by LDCs with Institute and donor assistance.

4.2. Understanding of trends in population growth, fertility, and mortality in the area and of the demographic determinants of such trends.

Established capabilities and selected LDCs in-depth demographic for conducting study (in Central Java) of demographic behavior in societies under particularly severe population pressures, including the study of the determinants and consequences of population growth and a comparative analysis of feasible alternative policy instruments is currently planned.

Established capabilities among selected LDCs for understanding of psychological, economic, and social motivations underlying fertility patterns in societies based on coordinated comparative research studies, including notably an expansion of the six-country Value of Children study to additional locations, such as India and Indonesia.

3. Research

3.1. The institution, in cooperation with LDC institutions, will plan and implement research studies appropriate in the investigation in the fields of psychological, economic, sociological, anthropological and management appropriation and in support of LDC family planning programs. Such studies are to be designed to meet the operation demand of AID-funded programs.

4. Review and Coordination Mechanism

4.1. Established a formal mechanism with the Institute and AID/W to formally review and evaluate the Institute's program on at least an annual basis.

4.2. The Team recommends that the Institute establish an overall policy coordination mechanism for research that includes consideration of field problems experienced by other donors such as AID and LDCs as well as Institute staff and counterpart programs.

4.3. That AID/W and the Population Institute establish formal procedures for reviewing research findings periodically and evaluating their applicability to AID/W's population problems.

5. Alumni Follow Up

5.1. That the Institute establish evaluation procedures to follow up on alumni activities and to measure the impact of the Population Studies program on alumni job performance.

6. Curriculum Development

6.1. Review annually the curriculum to determine if additional appropriation population related courses in the Schools of Public Health and Medicine and the School of Arts and Sciences can be identified and offered in the Population Studies program.

6.2. To review annually population studies courses to insure that the Institute take steps to ensure that population research findings and other information are integrated in the relevant Population Studies courses, particularly those that are not taught by Population Institute staff.

7. Evaluation

7.1. That the Institute establish procedures for the systematic review and adjustment of distribution lists for research papers and reports.

7.2. That the Institute prepare and conduct periodic evaluations to determine the extent to which its research findings are being internalized by recipients of reports and periodicals.



1. Census and Survey Measurement of Population Growth Total. . . \$133,598

Activities in this category are designed to collect, tabulate, and evaluate new and updated demographic information, principally on fertility, mortality, and population growth. In the absence of accurate and reliable vital statistics it is extremely important (1) to utilize currently available census and survey data for the purpose of generating fertility and mortality estimates and (2) to plan for the forthcoming 1980 round of censuses, with a view toward application of emerging techniques of fertility and mortality estimation.

1.a. <u>Population Census Training</u>	Total. . . \$ 86,098

The EWPI will serve as a regional center for population census training by providing technical assistance to those regional countries scheduled to participate in the 1980 round of censuses. Census training will be performed through workshops/conferences, seminars, graduate study, internship and professional development programs. The census workshop/conference scheduled for November 1976 will bring to the East-West Center, census directors and specialists from the countries of Asia (1) to discuss plans for the 1980 round of censuses and (2) to share technical information about improvements in training, collecting, editing, processing, and evaluating the census

data. The training needs of individual countries will be identified as the basis for planning internships, special courses and workshops in FY 77, FY 78, and FY 79 in preparation for the 1980 round of censuses.

Most of the cost of this activity is travel and subsistence for participants/interns, consultative staff travel, and computer services.

1.b. Intercensal Population Survey - Indonesia Total . . . \$29,000

By the end of FY 76, the collection and processing of Indonesia's major intercensal population survey will be completed. Analysis of the survey data for estimating measures of fertility will require a great deal of cooperative work with the staff of the Central Bureau of Statistics, BKKBN, and other research institutions in Indonesia. Some of the basic tabulation work will be done in Jakarta, but much of the refined and rigorous analysis involving the Indonesians will be done in Honolulu. The analytic work will (1) provide current estimates of fertility and mortality for the nation and minor geographical areas; (2) validate previous estimates from other sources for the overlapping periods; (3) provide KAP data for family planning programs for selected samples; (4) produce estimates of fertility change that will be used as dependent variables in evaluating the impact of the family planning program.

Estimates of fertility and mortality will be available to AID/W by the end of 6/30/77.

The major costs are for travel and subsistence in Hawaii for two interns and a senior co-investigator from Indonesia for eight months of the year plus computer services.

1.c. Nuptiality from Census Data Total . . . \$7,000

It is proposed here that the own-children method of fertility

estimation be extended and applied in Pakistan and the Philippines to obtain estimates of age-specific marital fertility by characteristics. A final report will be submitted to AID/W by 6/30/77 with a preliminary report available by January, 1977. Results will be especially valuable for evaluating the effects of family planning programs, the principal impact of which is on marital fertility.

It is notoriously difficult to evaluate family planning programs when information on nuptiality and marital fertility is lacking, because overall age-specific birth rates are influenced by age at marriage and proportions marrying as well as by marital fertility. Thus, it may happen, as for example among West Malaysian Malays between 1960 and 1970, that the Crude Birth Rate and most age-specific birth rates may fall, due to rise in age at marriage and decrease in proportions married in the prime reproductive ages, while age-specific marital birth rates at these same ages rise. The research proposed here will allow separation of nuptiality effects and marital fertility effects on overall fertility, allowing a more precise analysis of the impact of family planning programs.

Detailed tabulations of age-specific birth rates by socioeconomic characteristics, possible only with the large census samples to which the own-children method is applicable, will add even more precision to such evaluation. When such tabulations are available for two censuses, it is possible to decompose the overall change in the birth rate into a series of compositional components, reflecting changes not only in marital status composition but also in socioeconomic composition (rural-urban residence, education, occupation, etc.), as well as a component due to changes in marital fertility specific for these same socioeconomic characteristics. It is

from the mid-decade censuses and as preparations continue for the 1980 round of censuses.

The total cost divides almost equally between printing and postage for 1,500 copies of the Newsletter which is published quarterly.

l.e. National Demographic Surveys - Philippines Total. . . \$5,000

The National Demographic Surveys (NDS) of 1968 and 1973 are important sources of demographic information on the Philippine population. While the 1968 survey report has been published, reporting on the 1973 survey is still underway. Basic estimates of fertility levels and changes, estimates of nuptiality differentials and changes, and discussions of mortality and internal migration have already appeared, but much valuable work remains to be done.

This activity will include the following steps towards detailed exploration of the 1973 NDS:

1. preparation of core WFS-type tabulations and preparation of a detailed descriptive report available to AID/W not later than 6/30/77 and a report on the preliminary findings by January, 1977 on population composition and demographic parameters. This core report, modelled upon the WFS's recommended format, will: (a) include comparisons with findings from the 1968 survey and a review of evident changes over the five-year period; (b) provide a baseline with which to compare WFS results when that survey is conducted in the Philippines in 1977 or 1978. Thus, a decade-long series of survey results, tabulated in a consistent fashion, will be available covering fertility, mortality and migration processes.

2. several detailed "special" analyses of 1973 NDS materials.

Results of these analyses will be made available to AID/W not later than 6/30/77.

These analyses include: (a) a study of patterns of "wanted" versus "unwanted" fertility in periods and cohorts, disaggregated for a series of social and economic sectors; (b) an analysis of differentials in marital fertility additional to the urban/rural and regional differentials which have thus far been reported; (c) a birth interval analysis linking timing behavior to family planning and other determinants; (d) a report on patterns of internal migration utilizing questions on place of residence five and eight years before the survey and on reasons for migrating.

Costs are largely for travel and subsistence for an intern from the Philippines and computer services.

2. Demographic Situation and Profiles for Selected Countries Total . . \$40,000
(tentatively Malaysia, Pakistan, Philippines, and Thailand)

Major population changes are taking place in the countries of Asia and the Pacific which collectively comprise a majority of world population. There has been very little effort in the past to document, update, and analyze systematically their demographic experience within the larger framework of socioeconomic and ecological change. Work on demographic profiles to be completed during the period 7/1/76 - 6/30/77 is an important basis for national and regional policy deliberations.

Major population changes are taking place in the countries of Asia and the Pacific. Since many of these changes are rapid, periodic updating is necessary to assess the current situation in each country of the region. This assessment is needed to evaluate the effect of family planning programs in relation to other possible determinants of fertility, to assess urbanization and other trends in population composition (many of which affect fertility), and to determine recent changes in mortality levels and differentials.

An earlier paper on Malaysia ("The Demographic Situation in Malaysia" by James A. Palmore, Dorothy Fernandez, and Ramesh Chander (in Population and Development in Southeast Asia, John F. Kantner and Lee McCaffrey eds.), Massachusetts: D.C. Heath and Company, 1975, pp. 57-82) now needs updating to take account of new census results and vital statistics appearing since that earlier paper was published.

Currently at EWPI are six interns from Pakistan and Dr. Robert Gardner has just returned from a six month consultancy to their Central Bureau of Statistics. With recent 1972 census and 1973 housing, economic and demographic survey results, EWPI intends to provide an up-to-date picture of the demographic situation in Pakistan.

EWPI has many ongoing projects in cooperation with various Philippine agencies. In cooperation with appropriate agencies there, EWPI intends to use the latest information (including the 1973 National Demographic Survey and new Census tabulations) to provide a current assessment of demographic trends in the Philippines.

Dr. Fred Arnold, now a resident advisor to the National Statistical Office of Thailand, will prepare a current review of demographic facts in Thailand. Ongoing institutional cooperation with the NSO, including interns here at EWPI, will facilitate the preparation of an up-to-date summary.

In all of the four countries mentioned, as well as other Asian/Pacific nations, EWPI is singularly well placed for making the best possible assessment of the current demographic situation in similar formats with somewhat standardized approaches. Cooperative relations with appropriate agencies and scholars in each of the four countries named enable the EWPI and its co-investigators in those countries to obtain the latest information, interpret it intelligently with intimate knowledge of that country's data, and

produce careful analyses of the demographic situation. For examples see EWPI Papers no. 28, "The Demographic Situation in Indonesia," by Geoffrey McNicoll and Si Gde Made Manas, 1973, 66 pp., and no. 29, "The Demographic Situation in the Republic of Korea," by Lee-Jay Cho, 1973, 52 pp.

Planners, policy makers and managers need such comprehensive analytical reports of demographic and related socioeconomic conditions.

The major cost for each country is to bring and maintain in Hawaii a co-investigator for analysis and writing, for staff travel to the cooperating country, computer services, and printing costs.

3. Demographic Methodology for Estimating Fertility and Mortality From Incomplete Data Total . . . 580,500

EWPI has become a major center for developing and refining techniques for estimating fertility and mortality from presently available incomplete demographic data based on censuses and surveys. We would like to continue this work, which has a great potential for major innovation and breakthrough in using the currently available and future census and survey information for estimating badly needed refined measurements of fertility and mortality. The dissemination of the techniques and training in this area also constitute a very important component.

The Workshop on the own-children method of fertility estimation

brings to the Institute statisticians and computer programmers from those countries in Asia that do not have good vital statistics. The principal aim of the Workshop, scheduled for February or March, 1977, which lasts about three weeks, is to further the development and application of a general computer package that would be easily adaptable to individual censuses in different countries for producing fertility tabulations based on the own-children method. The Workshop consists of (1) lecture-type introduction to the own-children method and problems that need to be considered and resolved and (2) computer experimentation with actual sample data.

Except for computer services the cost of this activity are for travel and subsistence for approximately 15 participants.

3.b. Incomplete Data Workshop Total . . . \$24,000

To disseminate recent methods developed at the EWPI, appropriate professional development activities are needed. Among many recent methodological innovations for estimation developed at the Institute are:

- (a) revised regression equation methods for estimating fertility from census data, using minimal data from the census;
- (b) methods for estimating accurate fertility measures from incomplete vital statistics;
- (c) methods for analyzing under-reporting errors in census data on children ever born and children surviving;
- (d) methods for estimating-mortality trends from census data on children ever-born and surviving.

A one-month workshop is scheduled during February or March, 1977, to explain and discuss the application of these methods to selected Asian countries. Each participant would be selected to be trained so that he or she could subsequently train additional persons in his or her country

in using the new methods.

Entire cost is for travel and subsistence for approximately 15 participants.

3.c. Evaluation and Analysis of Vital Registration Systems Total . . \$25,500

The completeness and validity of vital registration data, and the speed and efficiency with which the data are gathered, processed, published and used depend on the characteristics of the society from which they come, including the nature of its administrative system (e.g., its degree of centralization, the social distance between administrators and populace), its cultural background (e.g., concepts of birth, death, sex, marriage, divorce, truth, science, propriety, privacy), its demographic characteristics (geographic and social distribution of the population, age-sex distribution of vital events, etc.), and the degree of similarity between objectives of the populace, the administration and other users of the data. The procedures and objectives of the registration system have two aspects: the official, ideal or formal way it should operate, and the unofficial, actual way it does operate. The objectives of the registrar, registrees and users of registration data are not always congruent, especially with regard to the informal operation of the system.

This activity will investigate the current status of the vital registration systems in Asia and will examine the quality of statistical information they produce for the purpose of preparing a monograph report covering most of the countries in Asia. Initially, resource materials available at the Institute will be examined and summarized, and in a later stage will fill in the gaps by field contacts and observations. This volume when complete will outline the nature of the basic problem of incomplete data

techniques for estimating vital statistics. By the end of 6/30/77, about four countries will have been examined: Philippines, Indonesia, Korea, and Thailand. A preliminary report will have been submitted to AID/W during January, 1977.

The costs are for graduate research/intern assistance and staff travel to the area as described above.

4. Small Area Analysis

Total . . . \$20,000

The purpose of this study is to measure and evaluate the impact of the national family planning program upon recent fertility trends, controlling for changes over time of social, economic, and community variables in Korea. The study will use the own-children estimates of fertility for about 200 small areas, based on the 1960, 1966, and 1970 censuses as dependent variables, with family planning acceptance statistics and socio-economic and community characteristics for the same small areas as independent variables. Lee-Jay Cho has worked for several years to develop these fertility estimates from the recent censuses and at the same time to compile small-area community data and family planning acceptance statistics for assessment of the impact of family planning programs. A monograph on Korea will be ready before 6/30/77. Preliminary results of the study will be submitted to AID/W during January, 1977. In the latter part of 1977 work on the small-area community and socioeconomic data and family planning acceptance statistics for Indonesia will also begin.

The major costs are for travel and subsistence of one intern from each country, computer services, and graduate student assistants.

5. WFS Analysis

Total . . . \$50,000

The World Fertility Survey has now been taken in many countries of the Asia/Pacific region. Many of these countries will undertake the first round tabulations recommended by WFS but will be unable to undertake more detailed analyses due to a shortage of available funds, computer time and/or trained analytical staff. To meet the need for more detailed analyses, those specifically required for each country and also appropriate comparative analyses, the East-West Population Institute is prepared to cooperate in the analytical phase by undertaking appropriate computer runs and analyzing these data. Several countries have indicated a tentative interest in working with EWPI on such analyses (Malaysia, Thailand, Korea) and are willing to cooperatively analyze their WFS data. Analytic topics will be agreed upon in advance by the participating country, AID/W, WFS and the EWPI.

Except for computer services and publication costs, all costs in this project are for travel and subsistence in Hawaii for one intern and one co-investigator from each country.

6. Causes of Differential Fertility

Total . . . \$38,000

This activity will examine the causes of differential fertility with particular reference to the following: (a) the influence of mortality on fertility using 1970 Korean census data, (b) interrelations between migration and fertility using 1970 census data from Thailand, and (c) application of input minimization and output maximization techniques to evaluate the population programs in countries like Korea, Indonesia, and Thailand.

The major costs are for travel and stipend allowances for researchers, staff travel, and computer services.

7. Graduate Degree Study Scholarships Total . . . \$91,995

The graduate degree study scholarships support approximately 20 Asian students who undertake research which are directly related to ongoing EWPI project activities and are integrated with their formal graduate degree program. The major costs are for the students' stipends and allowances, and travel.

1.
