Continued work for equipment orders, work plans, and request by Eng^o Réfega for more paper. With Finberg and Watkins met with Rente and Granadeiro. Should be useful for future relationships with MAP and Fundação Eugénio de Almeida. Helpful role of AID in facilitating these contacts.

Met Secretary of State Cardoso at Embassy party. Heady was on his thesis committee. He requested that Heady give a seminar at Oeiras. Visit from Purnell and Black to UE and PROCALFER. Agreement that PROCALFER would send their people to UE seminar and that Heady and possibly other UE people would go to a one or two day PROCALFER seminar in Lisbon.

Another day with Gabriela and Helena Estudante in Almo-creva on the LP work. Agreement reached on Manuela's program for her to also spend three to five weeks in North Carolina State learning about practical aspects of running a soils lab to help develop a service attitude towards farmers and other government agencies.

Had a follow-up meeting with Eng^o Rente, who now seems to be interested in closer ties between MAP and UE. Helped Figueira and Reitor with project proposal to MEU - AID for supplementary funds.

Took off for almost a month in States to see family and to write paper for Indonesia conference. Have probably now used up



vacation for the two year contract. Finished and sent paper to Japan before returning. Barely made the deadline.

On return much controversy over the American-Australian choice for forage specialist with a fairly strong preference for Carter at UE. Thing heated up but worked out well with excellent support from Vivian Rider. Did background work and planning for forage consultant. Pedro Silveira has really been helpful. David Crespo also excited and planning several days in Elvas.

EIPO paper was presented well to national conference on forage and pastures in Troia. I further confused various issues by helping Leonor respond to questions. Was happy that the group made several improvements on paper while I was in States. Finally convinced Leonor right before presentation not to read it. This early version will be published by this association later in the year. We'll still do a longer bulletin on the technical and economic results of different sheep breeding times and carrying rates.

Good progress on wheat price series by Salgueiro but little work yet on fertilizer data from Natercia. Should be able to make estimates soon of the welfare costs of Portuguese tariffs on wheat over time. Good progress by Gabriela on the LP matrix for analyzing farming systems in southern Alentejo.

Attended several meetings of Conselho Científico on University organization. Broke the 17 minute barrier on my 3.5 Km daily run and then started doing it regularly.



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
