The Project Grant Agreement dated 27 April 1981 between the People's Republic of Bangladesh ("Grantee") and the United States of America ("Grantor"), acting through the Agency for International Development ("A.I.D."), is hereby amended by this Amendment No. 1, dated May 6, 1982.

1. Article 3: Financing, SECTION 3.1. The Grant: Delete "...not to exceed four-million-two-hundred-forty-nine-thousand-five-hundred-eighty-one United States (U.S.) Dollars, 4,249,581 ("Grant")." Substitute: "...not to exceed eleven-Million-three hundred-eighty-thousand-three-hundred-forty-three United States (U.S.) Dollars, 11,380,343 ("Grant")."

2. Article 5: SECTION 5.2, Covenants, of the Grant Agreement is amended to include the following:

(d) The Grantee agrees to make available sufficient quantities of the USAID provided contraceptives, voluntary sterilization reimbursements, and medical supplies, in a timely manner, to meet the needs of the approved family planning/maternal and child health programs of the following non-governmental organizations:

1. Population Services International
(Social Marketing Project)
2. Family Planning Services and Training Center
3. The Asia Foundation
4. The Pathfinder Fund
5. Bangladesh Family Planning Association
6. Family Planning International Assistance

7. International Program of the Association for Voluntary Sterilization
8. Subprojects operating under the Local Family Planning Project
9. Any other PCFPD approved non-governmental organizations and their approved family planning/maternal and child health programs.

3. To the budget on Page 2 Annex 1 of the Grant Agreement is hereby added the sum of \$7,130,762.00 (Seven-million-one-hundred-thirty-thousand-seven-hundred-sixty-two dollars), for the budget categories following:

I. Participant Training \$344,000

Funds for participant training will be used for training field level supervisors in Indonesia and short-term professional and academic training.

II. Operations Research \$200,000

Funds for operations research will support research projects to either evaluate existing components of the family planning/maternal and child health program or to test new approaches to the delivery of family planning/maternal and child health services.

III. Printing \$15,000

Funds for printing will be used to print approximately 5,000 copies of the IUD Manual, 2,000 copies of the booklet Population Growth

in Bangladesh, and to reprint The Manual for Sterilization Operations or selected portions thereof.

IV. Clinical Supplies and Equipment \$700,000

Funds for clinical supplies and equipment will be used to procure equipment and other supplies essential to improve the quality of sterilization services.

V. Maternal and Child Health Training Materials \$200,000

These funds will be used to finance the production costs of essential training and educational materials for use by fieldworkers and trainers in delivering maternal and child health care services.

VI. Contraceptive Prevalence Surveys \$100,000

These funds will support surveys of national prevalence of contraceptive use. These surveys are the principal means of evaluating the project.

VII. Local Costs for the Voluntary Sterilization Program \$1,757,762

Funds for the voluntary sterilization program will support fees for physicians, clinic supporting staff, fieldworkers' compensation, client costs for food, transportation, surgical apparel, and wage loss.

Funds will also support periodic audit of the voluntary sterilization program.

VIII. Local Family Planning Projects \$200,000

Funds for local family planning projects will be used to support small projects initiated by program personnel in the field or by community leaders. These projects are ones not presently financed by the main scheme.

IX. Family Planning Services and Training Center (FPSTC) \$350,000

Funds for FPSTC will support: about twenty-five subprojects of indigenous private voluntary organizations; a share of the FPSTC core costs for management of these subprojects; staff-development through short-term training of FPSTC staff and Project Coordinators.

X. Increasing Demand for Family Planning Services \$556,000

Funds in this budget category will be used to support innovative projects within the family planning sector, such as increased use of mass media or new approaches to service delivery in order to increase demand for family planning. Funds may also be used to develop a better understanding of the determinants of fertility in areas which seem

to hold the most promise for project development.

Small scale projects "beyond family planning"

may also be funded.

XI.	<u>Contraceptive Commodities</u>	\$2,658,000
XII.	<u>Evaluation</u>	\$50,000

A mid-term project evaluation will take place in June, 1982, in order to provide information for the design of a new project and/or for needed changes in the current project activities. The evaluation team will consist of expatriate consultants and Bangladesh Government officials.


In addition, contraceptive commodities valued at \$8,394,000 are intended to be made available to the Grantee from AID Washington centrally funded allotments for distribution to clients of the Grantee's family planning program and to clients of approved non-governmental organizations.

4. All other terms and conditions of the Project Grant Agreement No. 388-0050 dated 27 April 1981 shall remain in full force and effect.



Amendment No. 1

To

Grant Agreement Between

The Agency for International Development

and

The International Project of the Association for Voluntary Sterilization.

This amendment dated February 10, 1982 between the International Project of the Association for Voluntary Sterilization ("IPAVS") and the Agency for International Development ("AID") amends the Grant Agreement between the parties dated March 24, 1981.

1. Whereas IPAVS has identified project activities for utilization of additional funds to those provided under the present Grant Agreement, and whereas funds are available, the Grant Agreement is hereby amended to increase the amount provided by One Million One Hundred Thousand U.S. Dollars (U.S. \$1,100,000), so that the total amount of the grant is now One Million Six Hundred Thousand U.S. Dollars (U.S. \$1,600,000). These additional funds will be utilized for the purposes agreed to in the Grant Agreement according to the illustrative budget in Annex A, attached.
2. In accordance with Contract Information Bulletin 81-34, Annex B of the Grant Agreement, Standard Provisions, is amended to include Section 25, Disputes, which reads as follows:

DISPUTES

- (a) Any dispute arising under this Grant, which is not disposed of by agreement, shall be decided by the AID Grant

Officer who shall reduce his decision to writing and mail or otherwise furnish a copy thereof to the Grantee.

(b) Decisions of the AID Grant Officer shall be final and conclusive unless, within 30 days of receipt of the decision of the Grant Officer, the Grantee appeals the decision to the Administrator, AID. Any appeal made under this provision shall be in writing and addressed to the Administrator, Agency for International Development, Washington, D.C. 20523; a copy of any such appeal shall be concurrently furnished to the Grant Officer.

(c) In connection with any appeal proceeding under this provision, the Grantee shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of its appeal.

(d) A decision under this provision by the Administrator or his duly authorized representative shall be final and conclusive, unless determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be fraudulent, capricious, arbitrary, an abuse of discretion, or based on clearly erroneous findings of facts or conclusions of law.

Except as hereby amended the Grant Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
