1. Pursuant to Section 531 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Suez Community Health Personnel Training Project for Egypt was authorized on February 22, 1980, and amended on July 21, 1980. I hereby authorize, in addition to amounts previously authorized, funding for the Project involving a planned obligation of not to exceed Four Hundred Thousand United States Dollars (\$400,000) in grant funds over a one-year period from the date of this Amendment, subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process, to help in financing the foreign exchange and local currency costs of goods and services required for the Project.

2. The Project Grant Agreement Amendment which may be negotiated and executed by the officer to whom such authority is delegated in accordance with A.I.D. regulations and Delegations of Authority shall be subject to such terms and conditions as A.I.D. may deem appropriate.

3. Based upon the justification set forth in the Project Paper Amendment, I hereby determine in accordance with Section 612(b) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, that the expenditure of United States Dollars for the procurement of goods and services in Egypt is required to fulfill the purposes of the Project; the purposes of the Project cannot be met effectively through the expenditure of U.S.-owned local currencies for such activities; and the administrative official approving local cost vouchers may use this determination as the basis for certification as required by Section 612(b) of the Act.

4. The authorization, as amended, cited above, remains in force except as hereby amended.


16. AMENDMENTS/NATURE OF CHANGE PROPOSED

The project purpose remain the same. The original project paper calls for an amendment at the end of an 18-month Phase I, which will incorporate new program activities and add Phase II funding. A non-funded extension of the Cooperative Agreement; accomplished by AID/W, extended project activities until January 15, 1982. This amendment provides funding for an additional extension, until March 15, 1982.

Recommendation to Purchase Egyptian Pounds with U.S. Dollars

Phase I (18 months) of the project authorization provided \$626,000 to be used to support local currency expenditures that the Egyptian Government will make for specific items in support of the project. This amendment adds \$94,000 for pound costs associated with the amendment. These funds will be issued, through the Cooperative Agreement with Boston University in association with GOE disbursements of Egyptian pounds for the costs of the travel, per diem, related project support costs, such as Egyptian participants, rental of office space and procurement of secretarial and interpreting services; the costs of the Suez Canal University/Faculty of Medicine temporary supplementary staff; and related miscellaneous costs. The Mission will purchase Egyptian pounds with U.S. dollars provided by the Project. The Egyptian pounds will in turn be made available, through the Cooperative Agreement, to the appropriate Egyptian entity(s) responsible for project implementation for disbursement in accordance with the agreements reached between USAID and the GOE in the Project Agreement, and USAID and Boston University in the Cooperative Agreement.

All U.S.-owned Egyptian pounds available to the Mission have already been programmed and are not available for this project. Given this, and the fact that the Suez Community Health Personnel Training Project is consistent with the Congressional Mandate of the Foreign Assistance Act to undertake activities designed to improve the economic position and quality of life of the poor majority, we have concluded that Project costs should be dollar funded.
