NARRATIVE FY 1983 ABS

I. INTRODUCTION

DIU activities are currently "suffering from success," generally indicating an increased demand for technical information from the development community and an increased awareness of DIU's services.

The AID Resources Report has jumped from 200 requests for back up materials per month to over 500 per month in less than one year, straining available resources for acquisition and reproduction.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture RSSA activity has a growing backlog of three month's requests at this writing.

As a result of increasing information demands from missions and AID/W, LDCs requests and requests from other sources are usually delayed in processing at the two Development Information Centers.

Additionally, as the missions understand the sophistication of the on-line access to over 120 scientific and technical data bases and other facilities available in DIU, their requests are becoming more sophisticated, requiring more professional attention and time.

In short, DIU is reaching a desirable point in its evolution as the Agency's central comprehensive information resources, i.e., the effectiveness and timeliness of our services has established DIU's credibility and a large percentage of these services are now demand driven. This demand is not only from the AID designers, implementors and evaluators, but also from PVOs, contractors, the Peace Corps, LDC institutions and individuals. This demand is steadily increasing and will continue to increase on its own momentum.

In addition, DIU is the only unit within the Agency's technical assistance program which provides cross-sector, integrated statistical and technical information for development enhancement.

DIU strategy in FY 1983 will present a coherent definition of an overall AID continuing policy regarding information. We are moving as rapidly as feasible to automated information processing to increase efficiency. However, information management, particularly the selection, tailoring, and tragetting function, remains a labor intensive task usually requiring professional direct hire continuity.

Additionally DIU's activities in FY 82 and FY 83 are characterized by increasing demand for the information services provided through these activities. This involves increasing costs in acquisition, reproduction, printing, mailing, etc. Added to the general inflationary trends in salaries as well as services, this increased volume of demand makes it inconceivable that DIU simply maintain its present services at the same or lesser funding than in prior years.

A comparative analysis showing three different levels of DIU operations with the funding and personnel required at each level is included as Section IV of this presentation.

It is assumed throughout the presentation that \$1.5 million will continue to be available through the operating expense account as is planned for FY 1982. This money will be used for the activities such as acquisition, indexing, cataloging, abstracting, microfilming, printing and distribution, which were formerly included under Project #931-0232, Information as a Tool in Development.

II. SUMMARY OF DIU CURRENT SERVICES

The following DIU services characterize a dynamic, modern library, interacting actively in research and innovation, in advice and consulting expertise and in cooperative development and outreach activities:

A. Reference Services

Requests for development information, both project oriented and technical, are responded to by the DIU staff. These requests may be for a single specific document, a set of statistical tables, or for more comprehensive cross-sectoral information requiring search, selection and, in some cases, synthesis. Approximately 10,000 requests are processed yearly.*

Through anticipation of demand gained from knowledge of mission programs, individual technician's areas of emphasis, project design documents from the field and interface with Regional Bureau (especially visiting mission personnel), DIU on its own initiative, selects and transmits information to the responsible project officers.

*In all of these services, DIU is supported under the DIU USDA/RSSA for agricultural information.

Special bibliographies on priority subjects (such as tropical forestry) are developed with the technical offices concerned and distributed to the field. All items listed can be provided on subsequent request from the technician in microfiche or paper copy.*

An experimental activity (under the USDA) in ten countries with AID missions, involves the selective dissemination of information (SDI) based on 12 major agriculture and agricultural related data bases which all together represent approximately one million citations a year. In response to a "user's interest profile" structured by a technical specialist (also maintained on the computer) automatic notice (printout of matched bibliographic citations) to the user is provided. Through USDA, DIU will provide any of the source documents on the list which the specialists may request.*

Reflecting the AID technical document spectrum on the RAND data base, the quarterly AID Research and Development Abstracts (ARDA) publication offers to a 7,000 subscriber mailing list (86% in LDCs) low-cost or free access to AID and selected non-AID technical information. Annually, over 20,000 documents are provided, approximately 50% in microfiche and 50% paper copy. Requestors from developed countries are offered the same items at cost.

To facilitate direct and easy access to the Economic and Social Data Base by any Agency user, including those unfamiliar with computers, a software program called the Macro Economic and Social Information Access (MESIA) system was developed. A user may go to one of the AID computer terminals and easily retrieve on line, any of a series of standard data reports via the MESIA system.

Another reference function involves relating AID's experience to other professional information services. DIU now has access to over 120 commercially available, scientific and technical data bases representing the major development information sources.

B. Information Management Support

DIU serves as a central resource in consultation and information management expertise. We have advised, and where requested, visited several missions (Kenya, India, Peru, Paraguay, Guatemala, Egypt, Cameroon, Mauritania, Morocco and Ghana) on matters of their information and data collection problems, carried out the evaluation of the Sahel Documentation Center, and we have been active in international fora working on the U.S. papers for the United Nations Conference on Scientific and Technical Information (UNCSTD) and the upcoming United Nations Conference for New and Renewable Sources of Energy. DIU has also provided extensive technical consultation and cooperation on information management to the Health, Agriculture and Rural Development Offices of DSB.

*In all of these services, DIU is supported under the DIU USDA/RSSA for agricultural information.

C. Facilitating Technology Transfer

Many of the reference activities described above could be characterized as "Facilitating Technology Transfer." DIU has however, initiated activities involving selection, tailoring, and targetting of development information that go beyond normal modern reference functions. (See Part III)

D. Statistical Reports

DIU's Economic and Social Data Service (ESDS) provides the country economic and social data tables required annually for the Congressional Presentation. ESDS is also responsible for the data collection, analysis and reporting required on military expenditures for the annual 620(s) Report to Congress. Last year ESDS undertook a quantitative analysis of AID-recipient countries' performance and commitment to basic human needs objectives, as required by Section 102(d) of the Foreign Assistance Act. ESDS is able to access a wide range of foreign and domestic statistical data bases in order to provide country profile reports (called ALLDATA Reports) as well as a series of sector profile reports to Agency staff upon request.

III. CURRENT PROJECT ACTIVITIES

A. Knowledge Synthesis for Policy and Field Support (Project No. 931-1093)

This project represents a major attempt to link technical and information expertise in providing "comprehensive and utilizable" information on "Environmental Health and Sanitation" at three communication levels. Working in conjunction with the Engineering and Health Offices, DIU will produce executive summaries in 13 areas tailored for the policymaker, a comprehensive technical manual for the transfer agent in three or four languages and over 250 "how to" instruction pamphlets for the implementor. A "technical profile" mailing list of some 15,000 technicians worldwide will be the target end-users. The project will be completed in 1981-82. No funding has been budgeted after 1981.

B. Science and Technology Information Transfer (Project No. 931-1114)

Under a continuing PASA with the National Technical Information Service (NTIS), Department of Commerce, DIU supports an outreach dissemination and utilization mechanism of federal sponsored research results in Asia, Africa and the Near East (LAC administers a separate project). The project assists in identifying and "starting up" cooperating agencies in the countries of the regions concerned, funds the training seminars for the key personnel in the cooperating agencies and the Application of Modern Technology to International Development (AMTID) newsletter, subsidizes some postage costs and pays some NTIS personnel.

C. Agricultural Information and Related Services (Project No. 931-0064)

This long-standing RSSA relationship with the Department of Agriculture has provided the Agency with a unique capability to respond to agriculture related information requests from the field by tapping a variety of data bases available through the National Agricultural Library and its Land-Grant University Network. However, the budgeted funding (\$300,000 minimum, \$300,000 current and \$500,000 proposed) would not cover the expenses to meet the increasing demand.

D. Field Publications Support (Project No. 936-2254)

The goal of this project is to bring about greater utilization of AID-funded resources and stimulate technology transfer among AID missions, key LDC institutions, PVOs and the Peace Corps volunteers. The project establishes a continuing mechanism to produce the following publications:

AID Resources Report

A bi-monthly, four-page publication, the Resources Report offers a wide ranging series of five/seven articles per issue. Each article represents a development technique or technology pre-selected (by DIU with the technical divisions) for easy rapid applicability in the field. Each article has detailed back up "how to" information available free on request by the reader, as well as the technical officer to contact for further information. The targetted audiences are AID professionals, AID contractors, the Peace Corps and PVOs. In the month of March 1981, from a mailing to just under 4,000 individuals, a total of 656 individuals requested nearly 3,000 documents. All requests were answered with the documents and a personal letter within one week of receipt.

Development Experience Reviews

Based on field experience, types of requests from the field and AID policy, certain, more general, subjects are researched and treated in-depth for field use. Rather than an expression of policy, these reviews represent a synthesis of AIU and other development experience and expression on a subject of general interest. One review, "Appropriate Technology" (155 bound pages) was printed in April, and "Integrated Rural Development" is tentative for a later date.

Special Publications

As a service function, DIU offers to any AID requestor, information management consultation, editing, reproduction and dissemination/distribution of documents depending on their content, purpose and priority to the Agency. Recent negotiations with the Rural Development Division at their request, are leading to DIU providing information management support for 9-11 research projects involving possible newsletters, bibliographies, and offers of technical assistance based on research results.

Directory of Development Resources

The Directory is an easy-to-use detailed 400-page compilation of data banks, newsletters, information clearinghouses, and research and training institutions in the U.S. and overseas which offer a wide range of development-related technical information and/or support services. It is updated periodically and distributed worldwide in English, French and Spanish editions.

Directory of Technicians On Call for Development

The Directory is an academic and experience profile of each of over 100 DSB technicians available for AID mission consultation on design, implementation and evaluation matters. It is to be updated periodically and expanded to include all AID technicians who wish to be included. It is distributed to AID personnel only.

Directory of Indefinite Quantity Contracts (IQCs)

Suggested by the field, this Directory provides pertinent information (purpose, experience base, project officer, etc.) on all current IQCs. This should enable AID field personnel to make preliminary judgments, rapid inquiries, and utilize this flexible resource more effectively. It is distributed to AID personnel only.

E. Surveys and Evaluation Support (Project No. 936-2256)

This project with the U.S. Bureau of the Census provides for technical assistance services of the Surveys and Evaluation Unit, International Statistical Programs Center. The SEU provides statistical assistance to AID/W, USAID missions, host-country institutions and AID contractors in the broad areas of survey and census design and data collection, processing and analysis. Specific tasks include providing technical assistance and developing host-country capability in carrying out data collection and processing in support of project design implementation and evaluation, assisting in the evaluation of existing data needs and developing and evaluating proposals to meet data needs (including survey design, questionnaire design, sample design, data processing plans, quality control measures, etc.).

F. Agricultural Production Indices: Data Support USDA
(Project 936-2257)

This project with the U.S. Department of Agriculture provides for professional services of the Economics, Statistics and Cooperative Service to meet AID's special needs for agricultural production indices to be incorporated into its Congressional Presentation and other reports. AID receives updates of long-term trend data on production of the principal food and non-food agricultural commodities in each of some 75 less developed countries. Indices of food and agricultural production are provided on a total and per capita basis for each country covering the period 1950-1979.

IV. COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF DIU OPERATIONS

In terms of the central information management functions of the Agency there are several levels of degrees of activity that DIU could maintain in fulfilling this function. These levels bear directly on the cost and personnel levels required by DIU.

A. Central Library and Reference Function

(1) Library, Reference and Response Functions

To be funded with \$1.5 million as an operating expense. Includes publication of ARDA (AID technical materials) and expansion and further development of the AID development information data bases.

The Development Information Centers will continue to provide information on demand using automated assistance and contractor assistance to the extent feasible. Publications will be limited to catalogue or awareness documentation involving available AID services only.

(2) USDA RSSA

Maintains response functions on agricultural information requests. Funding Minimum \$300,000, Current \$300,000, Proposed \$500,000.

(3) ESDS

Maintains Economic and Social Data Base, continues to acquire and update data and responds to AID requests for statistical information. USDA PASA, Minimum \$80,000, Current \$100,000, Proposed \$100,000

(4) Field Publications Support

Provides yearly updates of IQC Directory and Technicians On Call Directory as services to AID only. Estimated costs, Minimum \$100,000, Current \$100,000, Proposed \$100,000.

B. Central Library and Reference Plus Selected
Dissemination and Outreach

1. Same as in (A) ,(\$1.5 million OE funds)
2. Same as in (A) Minimum \$300,000, Current \$300,000, Proposed \$500,000.
3. ESDS - In addition to the response functions described in (A) ESDS will create and disseminate various data oriented publications for mission use. Additionally the RSSA with the Census Bureau will provide centralized technical support to regional bureaus and missions in country data collection activities and institutional development and training in host countries. (See detailed description in Section II)

USDA RSSA, minimum \$80,000, current \$100,000, proposed \$100,000.

BuGen , Minimum \$520,000, Current \$700,000, Proposed \$700,000.

4. Field Publications Support

In addition to the AID only directories described in (A) the unique 400 page compendium of development information resources available worldwide (Directory of Development Resources), will be published in English, French, and Spanish (See description in Part II). In addition, the bi-monthly AID Resources Report newsletter will be maintained (see description in Part II). This offers selected "how-to" and immediately applicable technology primarily to a target audience of project designers and implementors in the field. Other special publications on selected high priority subjects will also be issued to serve the same target audiences. Minimum \$300,000, Current \$600,000, Proposed \$600,000.

5. Science and Technology Information Transfer (NTIS PASA)

NTIS will continue to strengthen the capability of institutions in LDCs to select and utilize scientific and technical information (see description in Section II). Minimum \$300,000, Current \$300,000, Proposed \$400,000.

C. Extended Information Service Outreach and Awareness Activities.

None of these activities are presently funded but represent logical extensions of our program to move toward innovative and professional development information management.

Implementor to Implementor Network

A proposal to provide "Experience Application Packages" from one field implementor to another. PVOs have had decades of experience in the application of appropriate technology worldwide. In conjunction with ATI, DIU proposed to finance the preparation, editing and dissemination of complete experience packages by selected individual PVOs. These "packages" would be disseminated to other implementors with possibilities of technical assistance and small grants to assist in adaptation and implementation by the recipients if desired.

Approximate AID Funding \$250,000 year

Regional Resource Centers

In cooperation with the Regional Bureaus and Missions as well as, possibly, with other donors (IDRC Canada for example) DIU would create in selected LDCs Regional Resource Centers or clearinghouses which would have mini-computer storage and retrieval capacity, plus microfilming and reproduction facilities. These centers then could receive AID and other computerized information files plus selected microfiche back up. In some cases this activity might be able to build on existing institutional capacities. Assigned Regional Resources Officers would initially provide technical assistance in dissemination, marketing and other regional coordination activities.

Approximate Cost - Feasibility Survey \$250,000

Expansion of NTIS Activities

At a considerable economy in AID direct hire personnel, NTIS could expand its activities to include more direct assistance to host country institutions in terms of equipment etc., and also increase seminars, training activities, and technical assistance to these institutions to increase the level of information management and marketing activities. Subsidies could be provided in the provision of information to poorer recipients (based on the NTIS/LA project experience) and information centers. Approximate cost \$200-400,000 year.

Expanded DIU Consultative and Support Role

As an observer at the RAC (or equivalent) DIU would be aware of all research activities and be able to provide consultative support on information requirements. Additionally working with the project manager and the implementor, DIU would participate in reproduction and dissemination of research results including development of target audience mailing lists, assuring feedback results, etc., as well as its usual function of abstracting, cataloging and storing the results. Costs: To be included in each project.

Background and Progress to Date: A.I.D. receives many requests for agricultural information and assistance from A.I.D. missions and LDC technicians. The number of requests has increased over recent years and requests are more complicated involving more sophisticated searches. At the same time, the demand for other assistance to host countries and A.I.D. missions has grown -- for project and program design, and implementation and evaluation of agriculture programs. To fulfill these requests for information, A.I.D. has contracted with the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Since this program began, over 8,000 inquiries from A.I.D. field missions and LDC technicians have been answered. These responses have dealt with the U.S. agricultural experience and expertise, literature searches, document retrievals and the distribution of technical agricultural reference publications.

Host Country and Other Donors: None

Beneficiaries: A.I.D. field staff and LDC food and agriculture development institutions.

Purpose: To strengthen the capability of institutions in less-developed countries (LDCs) to select, transfer, adapt and assimilate scientific and technical information highly relevant to national economic development in those countries.

Background and Progress to Date: This project evolved from a successful pilot effort which has established a growing LDC network for effective transfer of science and technology information to such LDCs. Under this project, the National Technical Information Service (NTIS) at the U.S. Department of Commerce provides access to scientific and technical information resulting from U.S. Government-sponsored research and development (R&D), from R&D efforts in other countries, and from the U.S. private sector. This is done through agreements with local cooperating agencies (CAs) in Indonesia, Korea, Nepal, Pakistan, Sudan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Tanzania and Thailand. Negotiations are in progress to expand this technical information network to include: Bangladesh, Botswana, Egypt, Ghana, Jordan, Morocco, Senegal, Zaire, Zambia, Zimbabwe, and a Sahel network headquartered in Mali. Specifically through this project, NTIS is responsible for: (1) increasing LDC interest in and demand for U.S. technical information by sponsoring seminars in project countries to broaden awareness of information availability and foster closer ties between CAs and their own local end-users; (2) conducting workshops at NTIS for technicians of CAs to provide them with know-how concerning both the acquisition of U.S. scientific and technical information and the operation of a national technical information service; (3) providing technical advisory services, including user education and marketing support; (4) publishing and periodically disseminating English and French editions of "Application of Modern Technology to International Development" (AMTID) to CAs as a bulletin listing available NTIS publications in LDC interest areas; (5) developing case studies for assessment of program benefits in selected LDCs; (6) translating wide-interest appropriate technology documents from English and Spanish into French for use in Francophone Africa countries; and (7) conducting, in an LDC, an annual directors conference to be attended by each CA director from Africa, Asia, and Near East regions, and selected NTIS and A.I.D. personnel.

FY 83 Program: Project activities will continue emphasis on "appropriate technology" information transfer, with particular attention given to facilitating country-wide awareness and use of NTIS services by small and medium size private enterprise entities. An extant A.I.D./NTIS comprehensive appropriate technology bibliography will be expanded in content and distribution, especially distribution outside of the major cities of participating LDCs.

Purpose: To inform host country, A.I.D. and other development personnel about new effective technologies, products, project experience and economic and social conditions in LDCs.

Background and Progress to Date: Developing countries need technical information in all fields of development. They need to know about past project experience, where to obtain technical services, and how to obtain data for their special requirements. This project provides such information by preparing and issuing four types of end user-oriented technical publications: (1) Resources Reports, (2) Development Experience Reviews, (3) Directories of available services, and (4) special technical reports and syntheses. Production and issuance of each kind of publications has begun. The AID Resources Report is now distributed bi-monthly to some 4,000 recipients and in response to each issue 3,000 documents are supplied to about 700 user-requestors. A special Agriculture issue has also been distributed. The first Development Experience Review (Appropriate Technology) has now been distributed to AID personnel. The Directory of Indefinite Quantity Contracts (IQCs) is now in its second edition and the second edition of the Directory of Development Resources is now in preparation. With the transfer of the Economic and Social Data Services Division to DIU, other publications drawing upon the computerized Economic and Social Data Bank (ESDB) will be forthcoming, publications under consideration include Country Profiles, Sector Profiles, Social Indicator Reports, Economic and Social Trend Reports and CP Economic and Social Data Reports.

Host Country and Other Donors: None.

Beneficiaries: Severe budget restrictions have forced a limitation of publications for this year. This will result in a greater emphasis on beneficiaries as AID/W and USAID mission personnel and a lessening of benefit to other U.S. Government agencies, i.e., Peace Corps, contractors and LDC individuals and institutions. The primary beneficiaries remain those who use or promote information to meet the basic human needs of the poor.

FY 1983 Program: In FY 1983 the contractor will continue to produce and issue Resources Reports, Development Experience Reviews and Directories, and will research, write and distribute a number of new syntheses and reports on development methods. The publications will be translated and issued in French and Spanish as well as English when demand warrants.

Purpose: To provide centralized technical support to regional bureaus and missions for assisting host governments (1) in collection and compilation of demographic, economic, social and environmental information on their poor majorities, and (2) for institutional development and training of individuals in areas of computerized data collection, processing and analysis.

Background and Progress to Date: During FY 81 this project funded purchase of computer services from NIH and technical services of 32 professionals in areas of survey and mathematical statistics, and data processing, from the Surveys and Evaluation Unit (SEU) of BUCEN. Prior to 1978 SEU activities were funded under several small interagency agreements which led to excessive paperwork and inadequate management control. These activities are now centrally managed by DS and are joint funded by DS and the regional bureaus permitting the Agency to use the SEU resource more effectively.

Over the past year SEU provided A.I.D./Washington and some twenty missions with assistance in collection and compilation of data for project and program planning, implementation, and evaluation. For example, SEU is working with ministries of agriculture in Guyana, Rwanda and Bolivia in collecting agricultural sector data. In Indonesia and the Philippines it is advising local government and private contractor personnel in determining target-group impact for potable water as well as supporting the evaluation of rural electrification projects. Tunisia and Morocco are receiving assistance in assessing their energy needs and support was provided to Jordan in processing its population and housing census.

The typical "product" and major objective of SEU's involvement in A.I.D. sponsored data collection efforts is both the tabulated data and trained local personnel capable of carrying out similar data collection and tabulation themselves. SEU cooperates fully with the UN and other donors sponsoring related data collection and training programs.

Host Country and Other Donors:

Although neither the involved host countries or other donors contribute directly to this project, SEU activities funded by other donors are of substantial benefit to this project. The UN provided funding to SEU to develop (1) a series of courses in data collection and processing including attendant course materials and lecture notes and (2) a paper on data processing considerations in implementing a continuing household survey in the LDC context. In addition, the World Bank funded a paper on the design and use of household rosters. These courses and papers are directly and immediately applicable to many of the technical assistance and training activities carried out under this project.

Beneficiaries: This worldwide project directly benefits selected host country governmental organizations by enhancing their data collection, processing, and analysis capabilities in support of project and program planning, design, and evaluation. It indirectly benefits the poor target groups in these countries by improving the quality and relevance of services they receive from cooperating host country institutions. For example in El Salvador data collected by the Bureau of the Census led to a better understanding of the causes of the rural-school repeater and dropout problem. Students were found to be repeating grades or dropping out altogether not because of lack of intelligence or lack of interest but because of inadequate school facilities in the higher primary grades. Now that the extent of unsatisfied demand for continuing education is fully understood, the government is planning a significant school construction and teacher training program. The El Salvador model is now being implemented in Kenya on a regional basis.

FY 83 Program: Continued provision of technical assistance for data collection efforts to A.I.D. Missions and host country organizations in support of their project development and evaluation needs.

Major Outputs: Most of the activities began in Fy 80 and subsequent years will reach completion or produce substantial intermediate outputs in FY 83. Examples of outputs which will be produced are the results of the first nationwide agriculture area and production survey in Rwanda, the preliminary output of the Moroccan population and housing census, the fieldwork for the second Rural Farm Household Survey in Guyana, an Indonesian rural roads project evaluation, and the implementation and analysis of a survey of medical records done with the Jamaican Ministry of Health.

Purpose: To provide A.I.D. with data on agricultural production in the less developed countries.

Background and Progress to Date: USDA furnishes the Agency with long-term trend data on output of the principal individual food and non-food agricultural commodities (both subsistence and cash crops) in each of some 75 less developed countries. Indices of food production are provided on a total and per capita basis, for the less developed world as a whole, by region, and by country, covering the period 1950-1979. Indices of total agricultural production are provided on a similar basis. Preliminary data are made available for A.I.D. use in the Congressional Presentation (CP), and final figures are provided at a later stage. In addition to the CP, these data are used by A.I.D. for such needs as policy and program design, P.L. 480 determinations, responding to Congressional and other inquiries, studies of country needs and progress, and information for top management and the general public. For these uses, the USDA data provide A.I.D. with definitive historic and current information on agricultural output in countries receiving bilateral U.S. economic aid, not available elsewhere. The data are compiled by USDA commodity and country specialists on a basis that meets accepted concepts and definitions, that are comparable among countries and that meet A.I.D. administrative definitions of aid regions. The indices are computed using unique individual country price weights developed by USDA. Preliminary data meet A.I.D.'s deadline for use in the CP, and USDA provides year-round backstop services to A.I.D. in its use of the data.

Host Country and Other Donors: The USDA collects a large portion of the basic data from the agricultural attaches in the field (who may obtain information from the agriculture ministries), and releases in part on publications of host countries, the FAO and other donors to prepare the indices.

Beneficiaries: Area benefitted is worldwide. Primary users of the data are A.I.D. staff (Washington and Posts), although it is available to the U.S. executive agencies including the State Department, Embassies and the CIA. USDA shares its information with the FAO. The data are disseminated in various USDA and A.I.D. publications and are available to researchers, the academic community, and business and trade groups. Through the automated economic data system of A.I.D., interested inquiries are served with more detailed information. Agriculture in general, and food production in particular are sectors that Congress has mandated A.I.D. to give the highest order of priority and emphasis.

FY 83 Program: Continued provision of commodity output data and indices of food and total agricultural production by country, region, and LDC world as a whole. Also, USDA provides worldwide summaries of crop production data for such major crops of interest to A.I.D. as wheat, rice, and other grains; and yield data for important crops, by country.

Major Outputs: Reports on major agricultural commodities including rice, corn, wheat, potatoes/cassava, coffee, sugar, fruits, meat, dairy products and wool. One hundred copies of each regional publication are supplied to A.I.D. in addition to a computer tape containing the data.
