

1. Pursuant to Section 106 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Energy Technical Service Support Project, which is centrally funded, was reauthorized and amended on August 22, 1980. That amendment is hereby amended as follows:

a. to authorize an incremental obligation for Fiscal Year 1983 of \$245,000 and a planned obligation in FY 1984 of up to \$300,000, subject to availability of funds and AID's normal allotment procedures; and

b. to extend the DOE RSSA and to exempt this agreement from the Provisions of OMB Circular A-76 because: (1) it is for the provision of technical assistance, and (2) the facilities and resources of the Department of Energy are particularly suitable for the technical assistance to be provided and not competitive with private enterprise.

2. The authorization cited above remains in force except as hereby amended.

Problem: Your approval is needed to authorize FY 1983 and FY 1984 funding for and continuation of the Energy Technical Service Support Project and the DOE RSSA.

Background: This project provides access to scientific, technical, engineering and management expertise in energy areas required by AID Bureaus, Missions and the Office of Energy and offered by the Department of Energy, the national laboratories administered by DOE, and other selected organizations.

Usage of this project to provide technical support has covered a wide variety of activities including: data and planning services for Tunis and Morocco; energy assessment for Liberia; services of an assistant energy advisor for LAC Bureau; mounting of an energy policy and planning conference for LDCs; arranging an energy conservation and management seminar in West Africa for regional states; evaluation of a range of Africa renewable energy projects; evaluation of a centrally funded energy management training project, and short term training in petroleum management in the Sudan. Over the past 3 years of the project the S&T Energy Office has been the principal user of services rendered with 36% attributable, the Africa, Asia and Near East Bureaus aggregating some 61%, and LAC Bureau using the remainder of services at 3%.

The DOE RSSA has been operating on prior year funds throughout FY 82. Although an incremental funding was scheduled late in FY 82, it failed due to the rejection of a Congressional Notification on shifting of accounts by the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Planned FY 83 obligations under the initial Continuing Resolution are set for \$100,000 in December with subsequent obligations under the second (and final?) Continuing Resolution at \$145,000 for the remainder of the year.

Recommendation: That you authorize FY 83 funding and planned obligations for FY 84 by signing the PAF, Part II attached; and clear the required Congressional Notification by indicating your clearance on the reverse side of the Advice of Program Change.
