Description of Activity: The Government of Guinea-Bissau is desirous of establishing a national population policy but before this can be done studies must be made to determine basic demographic data. A United Nations funded census will provide gross population data but as it is a quick study, will not provide important statistics requiring more time to develop such as birth rates, and infant mortality rates. The Commissariat of Economic Development and Planning has designed a pilot project in each of the country's eight regions to teach village level officials to make simple demographic reports on specially prepared forms. The Commissariat has asked the Embassy to finance this pilot project by providing means of transport for and administrative support to five Guinean technicians who will teach local officials how to complete the forms.

U.S. Contribution: The Embassy will finance up to \$7,340.00 for the purchase of small motor bikes, spare parts, gasoline, paper and for administrative expenses.

Gubnan Contribution: The Commissariat of Economic Development and Planning will provide all the necessary supervision of the project, the salaries of the project director and technicians, transport of the materials from point of purchase to Bissau and will prepare a report to be submitted to the Embassy on the completion of the project.

This will enable the MFPA to eliminate the expenditure on rent with the view to becoming self-sufficient in accordance with one of the policies of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), of which the MFPA is an affiliate. The MFPA will raise funds to meet part of the expenditure on this project, but is in need of assistance for the purchase of construction materials.

U.S. Contribution: The Embassy will finance up to \$10,000.00 for the purchase of construction materials.

Mauritian Contribution: The Government of Mauritius will provide land for the building and the MFPA will raise the balance of funds required for construction.
