BACKGROUND

With the informal permission of Bureau for Near East management the Bureau Environmental Coordinator approached the International Institute for Environment and Development (IIED) to explore the receptiveness of Arab Donors, especially the Kuwait Fund, to become to host or participate in a regional donors conference on environment and natural resources. IIED was selected because of its outstanding performance in activities of this nature, an international rather than "American" association, its previous work with Arab Donors and the unique personal expertise of its Senior Fellow, Brian Johnson.

Exploratory meetings held in Washington and London between representatives of the A.I.D., IIED, Kuwait Fund and World Bank since July have demonstrated the feasibility of holding a technical conference within the next year. Mr. Abladif al Hamad, Director General of the Kuwait Fund has expressed his personal interest in the concept.

PROPOSED ACTIVITY

It is requested that \$25,000 in PD&S funds be allocated to support advance activities for the proposed "Near East Regional Development Aid Donor's Conference on Environment and Natural Resources". Funds would be used to assist IIED in advance preparation of a technical level conference between representatives of Western and Arab Donors active in the region. It is anticipated that the conference itself will be hosted and funded by an Arab Donor, probably the Kuwait Fund, once adequate advance work has been completed and a certain momentum achieved. It is anticipated that at such point the Arab Donor would retain IIED to manage the conference and following regional tradition would provide per diem, internal travel and possibly international travel costs of conference participants.

The conference would emphasize the need for the environmental analysis of development projects, especially in the capital sector, which has been the focus of Arab Donor activity. The conference would examine methods by which environmental concerns can be incorporated into project designs and implementation plans. It is anticipated that the conference will



result in an increased awareness of Arab Donors of environment and natural resource issues and an improved understanding of practical measures which can be adopted to address them.

A major objective of the conference would be the identification of opportunities for increased cooperation and coordination between donors in addressing regional and project specific environment and natural resource problems. Development of cooperation in this area would both increase the interest and willingness of Arab Donors to provide funding for environmental aspects of jointly funded projects and should serve to expand the regional market for environmental control equipment, training and consulting services, an area in which the U.S. has a predominate capability.

The concept of the meeting and its objectives has the support of Alexander Shakow, Assistant Administrator for Policy and Program Coordination and Albert C. Printz, Jr., A.I.D. Environmental Affairs Coordinator.

TRANSFER OF FUNDS

Funds can be directly transferred to IIED for this activity, they are currently receiving A.I.D. funds through DS/ST activities. It has been informally agreed that funds allocated for this activity would not be specifically identified in IIED's annual report or similar documents, but, rather reported in aggregate with other funds received from A.I.D. The contact at IIED, Washington for this project is Henry Gruppe (462-0900), formerly an executive with A.I.D.

**ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR THE DEPUTY ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR

**Problem:** Your approval is needed for the attached PAF, Part II, authorizing the obligation of funds in the amount of \$25,000 under the specific support grant, AID/DSAN-G-0047 to A. T. International (ATI). This increases the total funding approved in FY 1981 to \$4,125,000 and the total authorized funding under the grant to \$18,725,000.

**Background:** The Near East Bureau has determined that ATI was interested in supporting the planning of the proposed "Near East Regional Development Aid Donor's Conference on Environment and Natural Resources". ATI plans to support the International Institute for Environment and Development (IIED) in planning the conference. As a result, the Near East Bureau has transferred \$25,000 to the DSB budget earmarked for the support of ATI. The attached Memorandum to B. Langmaid, NE/DP from S. Lintner, NE/PD/PDS dated November 20, 1980, details the background. ATI had met with Mr. Gruppe of IIED and had independently decided to support the effort if funds could be made available.

**Recommendation:** That you sign the attached PAF, Part II authorizing an additional \$25,000 for the partial support of the third year of grant AID/DSAN-G-0047 to A. T. International.
