Name of Country/Entity: Worldwide

Name of Project: Strategies for Planning Effective Educational Development

Number of Project: 936-5824

1. Pursuant to Section 105 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended, I hereby authorize the centrally funded Strategies for Planning Effective Educational Development Project involving planned obligations of not to exceed \$10,000,000 grant funds over a 5 year period from date of authorization, subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process, to help in financing foreign exchange and local currency costs for the project.
2. The project consists of the development of education sector strategies for increasing the quantity and quality of educational opportunities available to third world children within current levels of educational expenditure. The project will provide synthesis of existing research on the key determinants of effectiveness and efficiencies in educational systems and will also provide for the conduct of new research activities. Research findings will provide the empirical basis for micro-computer based simulation forecasting models designed to enable planners to choose from development alternatives and to make cost-effective trade-offs among a variety of sector inputs.
3. Special conditions of approval - None.
4. Source and Origin of Goods and Services
 - a. Each developing country where training or other assistance takes place under this project shall be deemed to be a cooperating country for the purpose of permitting local cost financing.
 - b. Goods and services, except for ocean shipping, financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in a cooperating country or in the United States except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.

c. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.

SUBJECT: Strategies for Planning Effective Educational Development PAF

Problem

Your signature is required on the attached PAF for the Strategies for Planning Effective Educational Development Project (No. 936-5824). This project will support a comprehensive program of educational research for the purpose of developing planning simulations and sector strategies for third world education systems.

Background:

At both national and regional levels educational objectives are subject to a host of financial, logistical and personnel constraints. At present planners do not have adequate information, assembled into integrated plans, for choosing among different routes to educational development. Furthermore, few planners have a means of projecting future resource needs implied by their target objectives. Interactive simulation models are needed to permit educational leaders to set realistic education targets, to make appropriate resource commitments and to rationally choose among delivery technologies and educational investment alternatives.

This project will allow A.I.D. to make a unique contribution among development agencies in educational development and planning. By combining three project elements 1) synthesis of existing knowledge regarding manipulable variables linked to educational achievement, 2) research targeted at filling important gaps in our existing knowledge about key performance-related variables and 3) application of data and research findings to the development of prototype simulation models, optimal combinations of inputs can be formulated into effective sector strategies.

Country-specific applications of the prototypes through Mission support of the extensive networking and dissemination components of the project will be encouraged.

Discussion:

This project was approved by The Human Resources Sector Council at its meeting of May 13. There was unanimous agreement that the project was technically sound. The project has also been endorsed by education sector representatives from the World Bank and IDRC.

Recommendation:

That you sign the attached PAF approving \$10,000,000 of S&T funds for the 5 year project.
