

AUTHORIZATION AMENDMENT

Name of Country/Entity: Worldwide Project Number: 931-1126
Project Title: Tropical Disease Research (TDR) Grantee: World Health Organization

1. Pursuant to section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended, the centrally funded program, Tropical Disease Research, was authorized on June 9, 1978. That authorization was amended November 19, 1982, to extend the life of project from five to six years and the final obligation date from FY 1982 to FY 1983. On November 1, 1983, the authorization was amended to extend the life of project to seven years and the final obligation date to FY 1984. That authorization is hereby further amended as follows:

The life of project shall be extended from seven years to eight years. The final obligation date shall be extended from FY 1984 to FY 1985.

The authorized life of project cost is raised to 22.3 million.

2. The authorization cited above remains in force except as hereby amended.

ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR THE SENIOR ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR

SUBJECT: Project No. 931-1126, Tropical Disease Research (TDR)

Problem: Your approval is required to amend Project #931-1126, Tropical Disease Research, (TDR), to increase life-of-project funding and extend the time period for A.I.D. support.

Discussion: In 1978, the U.S. Representative to the Joint Coordinating Board of the WHO/TDR special pledging session in Geneva stated the U.S. government's intention to provide up to \$20.3 million to the program. A centrally funded project, managed by S&T/Health, was authorized by the A.I.D. Administrator in June 1978 with the first obligation of \$800,000. With a \$2.0 million obligation in FY 1984 the \$20.3 million commitment to the TDR program was met. The grant agreement with WHO expired on December 31, 1984.

The TDR program has been very successful and is still an important part of WHO's over-all research program which is consistent with A.I.D.'s long term objective to strengthen primary health care activities in LDCs through biomedical research. Its basic purpose is to find better, more economical methods for diagnosis, treatment, prevention, and control of major tropical diseases including river blindness, snail fever, malaria, African sleeping sickness, leishmaniasis, leprosy, and Chagas disease. TDR has created a global network of scientific research institutions in both developed and developing countries. TDR has supported more than 1,180 sub-projects with over 2,000 scientists in 110 countries since 1978.

Significant achievements of the TDR program include: the discovery that the Chinese malaria herb remedy Qinhaosu contains a chemically active anti-malarial compound of high efficacy which is completely different from all the other known anti-malarials; the discovery of new sensitive field testing techniques and new effective tsetse fly traps to study sleeping sickness; the build up of an international network of laboratories to study filariasis; the discovery of new agents for biological vector controls; the successful field testing and use of new, effective and safe drugs applicable to mass treatment of schistosomiasis; and progress toward development of a new vaccine to treat leprosy.

Other donors to the TDR program include the African Development Bank, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Belgium, Canada, China, Cuba, Cyprus, Denmark, Finland, France, West Germany, India, the International Federation of Antileprosy Associations, Iraq, the Japan Shipbuilding Industry Foundation, the Netherlands, Niger, Norway, Romania, Sweden, Switzerland, the U.K., Cameroon, Wellcome Trust, the UNDP, the World Bank, and WHO. The total TDR budget for 1985-86 is approximately \$66 million.

In a letter from Mr. Furth dated July 3, 1985, WHO has formally requested our continued support for the TDR program. We believe the present TDR work plan to be technically sound and worthy of further A.I.D. financing.

This amended authorization will increase A.I.D.'s life-of-project funding from \$20.3 million to \$22.3 million and will extend the year of final obligation to FY 1985.

This amended authorization will permit negotiation of a new one year, \$2.0 million international grant to WHO using FY 1985 funds. As an international organization with multi-donor support, WHO is eligible to receive an international grant from A.I.D. under the provisions of the Federal Acquisition Regulations. This grant will essentially be a renewal and continuation of the general agreement that expired at the end of last year.

A Congressional Notification has gone forward.

Recommendation: That you approve the increase in the life of TDR project funding to \$22.3 million and the one year extension of project by signing the attached project authorization amendment.
