SCHEDULE

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this Grant is to provide support for the Grantee's program of technical training to members of peasant communities of Yauyos as more specifically described in Attachment 2 to this Grant entitled "Program Description."

B. Period of Grant

The effective date of this Grant is the date of its signature. The expiration date of this Grant is December 31, 1986.

C. Amount of Grant and Payment

1. A.I.D. hereby obligates the amount of \$15,500 for purposes of this Grant.

2. Payment shall be made to the Grantee in accordance with procedures set forth in Attachment 4 - Optional Standard Provision 2, entitled "Payment--Cost Reimbursement."

D. Financial Plan

The following is the Grant Budget, including local cost financed items, which is authorized up to \$15,500 and other contributions to the Project. Revisions to the Grant Budget shall be made in accordance with Attachment 3, Mandatory Standard Provisions of this Grant, entitled "Revision of Grant Budget."

E. Reporting

1. At the end of the training program PROSIP/IRVG shall submit to USAID, a report presenting findings, recommendations and conclusions comparing actual accomplishments with project objectives.

F. Special Provisions

1. The following Optional Standard Provisions, (Attachment 4), apply to this Grant 2, 8, 17 and 20.

2. PROSIP and IRVG are jointly and severally liable and responsible to A.I.D. for the performance of every obligation of the Grantee and compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

A. Background

The "Instituto Rural Valle Grande" has been working for 21 years in training activities in Yauyos in the Sierra. However only since 1979 have they had an organized program with a regular presence in the zone. In the seven years since 1979 they have initiated programs in potato seed, small irrigation and the development of community technicians. This last program was started as a result of a need to spread the experiences acquired in the zone of Nor-Yauyos to the rest of the province.

In October of 1985, with assistance from CARE, Valle Grande initiated background studies in a sample of 15 peasant communities located in the three valleys which make up the Yauyos province (Mala, Omos, and Cañete). The purpose of this study was to define the most important training needs, the role of the technicians and how the technician could perform in the community.

From May to June of this year Valle Grande carried out its first course for community technicians in the area of cattle production. The technicians began to work in their respective communities immediately after the course and initial reports appear to be very positive. Valle Grande is planning other courses in Andean agriculture, sheep husbandry and horticulture. There will also be follow up courses in each of the areas.

B. Purpose of the Grant

The purpose of this grant is to provide technical training to members of peasant communities of Yauyos so that they can provide technical assistance and training to the rest of the community.

C. Specific Objectives

During a four month period, the project will carry out:

1. A 60 day training course in Andean agriculture for 20 community technicians.
2. A follow-up course for the technicians who attended the first course in cattle production.
3. On the job follow-up with the community technicians in evaluation and in technical and logistical support in coordination with community leaders.

D. Project Implementation and Responsibilities

This project will be implemented by PROSIP/Instituto Rural Valle Grande over a four month period.

Specifically the grantee will:

1. Contract qualified specialists and prepare training materials for the intensive and follow-up course.
2. Carry out monthly follow-up visits with community technicians who have received training.
3. Provide logistic support including furniture, audio-visual and other equipment, classrooms, telephones, transportation and board and room for participants.
4. Comply with reporting requirements as stated in Attachment 1, Section E.
5. Collect a U.S. \$43.00 equivalent fee from each student for the intensive course and a \$17.50 equivalent fee for each student for the follow-up course. These fees will be used to defray costs of the courses.
