

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## I. BACKGROUND

The Cyprus-America Scholarship Program (CASP), an Agency for International Development (AID) sponsored program, was designed to strengthen the pool of trained manpower to assist Cyprus' economic and social development. This objective is being met by providing full and partial academic scholarships for Cypriot graduate and undergraduate students to attend U.S. colleges and universities to pursue degrees in development-related fields.

The program is also providing short-term technical training for mid-level professionals, in both the public and private sectors, in several areas targeted by the Cyprus Planning Bureau in accordance with the Cypriot development plan.

The Program began on October 1, 1981, and will continue through September 30, 1991. It is planned that 356 full scholarship students, 282 partial scholarship students and 120 short-term participants will be trained through CASP. The program reaches both the Greek and Turkish Cypriot population, with a ratio of four Greek participants to every Turkish participant.

The focus of the program has been academic degrees due to the lack of baccalaureate awarding institutions in Cyprus. Special consideration is also given to displaced persons and needy candidates.

This report covers the period from May 1, to October 31, 1986.

## II. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

The Cyprus-America Scholarship Program reached a milestone during this reporting period, when the first group of undergraduate scholars who began their programs in 1982 were graduated from their respective institutions in May. They were among the fifty-seven full and thirty-seven partial scholars who received degrees this year as of October.

The final placement and matriculation of the new scholars at their colleges and universities were the main activities of this period. Fifty-eight full scholarship students were placed by CASP staff at AMIDEAST and one hundred twenty-four partials were processed and counseled on their university choices by the CASP staff in Cyprus. In addition, nineteen short-term trainees were programmed.

Program Director Kate Archambault traveled to Cyprus in July to conduct the orientation for the new scholars. A two-day program was planned for the partial and full scholarship recipients. Unfortunately, due to political problems at the time of the orientation the borders between the North and South of the island were closed and the Turkish Cypriots were unable to attend the program. This is the first year the the Orientation was not held as a bi-communal event. The borders were re-opened a few days after the event, and another program was held for the Turkish Cypriots.

The format for each of the orientation programs was similar to previous years. Speeches were made by Daniel Hadjitofi, Executive Director of the Cyprus Fulbright Commission; Jack Sears, PAO and Tom Carolyn, DCN, both of the U.S. Embassy. A panel of CASP students spoke on selected topics of concern to the new scholars and answered questions.

Ms. Archambault also met with the Cyprus CASP staff to discuss program issues and procedures.

Several staff changes were made on CASP during this period. Outgoing Cyprus Coordinator Micki Andrews was replaced by new project Coordinator Dan Cushman (resume Appendix A) in June. Partial scholarship student counselor Chris Freres left CASP to return to graduate school and Mr. Bill Carroll (resume Appendix A) was hired as the new counselor.

CASP was saddened by the loss of former Executive Director of the Cyprus Fulbright Commission, Renos Kamenos, who died in June. Renos was instrumental in the planning of the scholarship program and remained active in determining program guidelines and policy. Mr. Daniel Hadjitofi, former Fulbright counselor under Renos, was recently named the new Executive Director of the Cyprus Fulbright Commission. CASP welcomes Daniel in his new role and looks forward to a productive working relationship.

AMIDEAST recently submitted a new budget proposal to AID to incorporate an additional \$4.355 million into the program. This brings the total monies to \$35,855,000, scheduled to be programmed over an eleven-year period.

**A. Placement - Full Scholars**

Fifty-eight dossiers were submitted in this year's placement process. Each student's dossier was submitted to an average of four schools and all students were placed in a college or university by June. One student withdrew from the program to accept a scholarship from Cambridge University. Two additional students were later added for reasons of financial hardship, giving CASP a total of fifty-nine students who matriculated at their institutions this fall.

The following charts outline the 1986 placement experience and list the schools the scholars are currently attending.

## B. Partial Scholarship Program

This year one hundred twenty-four partial scholarships were awarded; a total of thirty-five students withdrew from the program after being made aware of the terms of the scholarship. Since the program experienced the same situation last year, this would suggest that the number of partial scholarships currently awarded is too large. Moreover, it would seem that scholarships are being given to students who do not need assistance simply to fulfill the numbers. The exception to this is the Turkish Cypriots, many of whom withdrew for financial reasons.

Therefore, the consensus of CASP and the Fulbright Commission in Cyprus is that the number of partial scholarships awarded be reduced to allow the scholarship selection committees to be more selective. Moderation in numbers has proven very successful with the full scholarship program - every year CASP plans for approximately fifty scholars.

The partial scholarship program has already been limited this year due to reduced funding levels from previous years. It is anticipated that twenty-five partial scholarships will be awarded this fall in the annual scholarship selection.

### C. Short-term Training

The short-term training selection committee met in January to choose the participants to receive training awards for the year. Prior to this, a meeting was held in October to select the fields of study. Participating were Mr. Jack Sears, Chairman and Mr. Renos Kamenos, then Executive Director, both of the Cyprus Fulbright Commission; Ms. Micki Andrews, then CASP Project Coordinator and Mr. Panayiotis Hadjipavlou, Director of Coordination Offices of the Planning Bureau. One hundred sixty-six requests for training were submitted by the Cyprus Planning Commission. This list was narrowed down to twenty-two fields in which applications were accepted. The committee used the following criteria in deciding which fields were to be selected:

1. Relation of the project to Cyprus's development goals.
2. Whether or not the training could have a "multiplier" effect within the Department or Ministry.
3. If CASP had previously funded a grant in this area, and if further funding was necessary.









FIELD OF STUDY CHART


