

## I. BACKGROUND

The Cyprus-America Scholarship Program (CASP), an Agency for International Development (AID) sponsored program, was designed to strengthen the pool of trained manpower to assist Cyprus' economic and social development. This objective is being met by providing full and partial academic scholarships for Cypriot graduate and undergraduate students to attend U.S. colleges and universities to pursue degrees in development-related fields.

The program is also providing short-term technical training for mid-level professionals, in both the public and private sectors, in several areas targeted by the Cyprus Planning Bureau in accordance with the Cypriot development plan.

The program began on October 1, 1981, and will continue through September 30, 1993. It is planned that 451 full scholarship students, 292 partial scholarship students and 163 short-term participants will be trained through CASP. The program reaches both the Greek and Turkish Cypriot population, with a ratio of four Greek participants to every Turkish participant.

The focus of the program has been academic degrees due to the lack of baccalaureate awarding institutions in Cyprus. Special consideration is also given to displaced persons and needy candidates.

This report covers the period from May 1 to October 31, 1987.

## II. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

This reporting period encompassed a wide variety of project activity. May saw the graduation of 55 full and 45 partial scholars. Of that number 49 returned to Cyprus, 40 enrolled in graduate school and 11 obtained one-year practical training programs.

Program Assistant Paul Silberstein left CASP to return to graduate school. Ms. Pamela Rein was hired to replace him (Resume, Appendix A). In Cyprus, Program Coordinator Dan Cushman left to return to the U.S. Mr. Nicholas Ferro was hired as the new coordinator.

Program Director Kate Archambault traveled to Cyprus in July for the annual student orientation and meetings with CASP program staff. This year, CASP alumni in Cyprus were invited to a reunion to discuss the merits of forming a CASP Alumni Association. The alumni responded favorably to the idea of an association for professional development, networking and community outreach services that the group could provide for students from Cyprus who were planning to study in the U.S. The club would, necessarily, have to operate within both the Greek and Turkish Cypriot communities, but would meet jointly several times over the course of the year for special programs such as guest lecturers, business meetings, etc. A steering committee composed of CASP alumni, the Cyprus CASP coordinator and members of the U.S. Embassy have held various meetings to establish club guidelines.

In September, an opportunity was presented for an exchange of CASP staff between Washington and Cyprus. CASP counselor Helena Swiny returned to the U.S. for the month of September for personal reasons and while here, came to

AMIDEAST, Washington, to meet the CASP staff and to participate in a two day briefing. Senior Educational Specialist Jane Mangold was sent to Cyprus for a three week internship to assist in the CASP office while Ms. Swiny was away. The exchange was beneficial for both parties, and CASP hopes to be able to do more of these exchanges in the future.

Selection of the new scholars who will begin their studies in fall 1988 was held in September. John Viste, Director of the AMIDEAST office in Jerusalem, was sent to Cyprus as the AMIDEAST representative to the selection panel. Sixty-two full and 30 partial scholars were selected.

Forty-nine new CASP full scholars matriculated at their U.S. colleges and universities this fall. In addition, 17 new partial scholars joined the program.

AMIDEAST submitted a new budget proposal in August to incorporate an additional \$ 5,000,000 to the program. This brings the total monies to \$ 40, 855,000 scheduled to be programmed over a twelve year period.

## A. Placement

Fifty-two dossiers were submitted in this year's placement process. Each student's dossier was submitted to an average of four schools and all student placements were finalized by June.

Three students withdrew from the program for personal reasons prior to the beginning of their studies, leaving 49 students who matriculated this fall at their U.S. institutions.

## B. Partial Scholarship Program

Twenty-five partial scholarships were awarded this year; a total of eight withdrew from the program after being made aware of the terms of the scholarship. This is consistent with the experience of previous years and is the primary reason the partial scholarship awards have been reduced in number. Based on our experience in this selection and our recent selection in September, it is anticipated that the number of partial scholarships offered in subsequent years will be approximately 30.

### C. Short-term Training

The short-term training selection committees met at the end of January to choose the participants to receive training awards for 1987. Prior to this, a meeting was held in November, 1986, to discuss the Cyprus Government's short-term training priorities and the fields of training.

Participating on the selection committee were Mr. Jack Sears, Chairman, and Mr. Daniel Hjitofi, Executive Director, both of the Cyprus Fulbright Commission, and Mr. Dan Cushman, then CASP Project Coordinator. Mr. Andreas Callimachnos, Director of Labor, participated in the first two days of selection, and Mr. George Christodoulides, Director of Technical Education, served on the committee for the final day.

Interviews were scheduled according to subject area and profession whenever possible. The Committee interviewed 83 candidates; of this number sixteen Greek Cypriot participants were chosen, with six alternates.

The Fulbright Commission, the U.S. Embassy and members of the Turkish Cypriot community selected the Turkish Cypriot training priorities in February. Sixteen interviews were held, with a total of four participants and two alternatives selected.

Two of the participants withdrew from the program for personal reasons. One program in merchant shipping casualties was postponed until next year. Training with the International Auditor Fellowship Program was cancelled due to a lack of space in the Program and one of the alternate candidates was selected instead.



GPA






Partial Scholars

GPA




# of occurrences

# Field of Study Chart Partial Scholars


