I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A. Major Progress Indicators

1. Management Training

- a. Staff support and consultative efforts helped one institutional strategic development plan through approval processes of the institution's Board, and its parent Ministry. Strategic plans for two other institutions were seen through their final drafts and are awaiting completion of final versions.
- b. DSTP consultants designed and/or implemented eight courses, or modules within courses, in different institutions reaching approximately 160 participants.
- c. A Materials Development Workshop and a Training of Trainers course were presented for active professional trainers.
- d. Seven faculty members from various institutions attended special U.S. training courses for their professional development.
- e. Management Training Specialist Dick Vittitow completed his two year term. John Tabor, University of Connecticut Institute of Public Service, identified to replace him.

2. English as a Second Language

- a. Curriculum for Intensive English for Academic Purposes courses revised with listening, structure and reading sections expanded to include emphasis on speaking, writing, and study skills.
- b. IEAP teachers trained and two classes initiated in Peshawar for TIPAN project candidates.

c. Nine open candidate TOEFL tests administered to 331 Government of Pakistan candidates in six locations. Eighteen percent achieved the minimum 530 score. Almost half scored below 470.

3. Participant Training

- a. Nominations received for one hundred seventy-six participants. 125 were scheduled for short courses, 52 for long term academic degree training.
- b. One hundred eighty-eight participants departed for training.
- c. Nine participants declined placement, action suspended on three others for various official reasons.
- d. Final draft of Orientation Handbook approved for publication in early 1986.
- e. Participants' opinions of the effectiveness of their training elicited in a questionnaire sent six months after their return to Pakistan. The results are summarized in Appendix A.

4. Administration

- a. Performance standards written for all local hire positions. Performance evaluation system on which merit increases will be based put into place.
- b. Management Training Programs Manager attended Arthur D. Little Human Resources Management course as well as worked in Washington office and visited various other training institutions.

B. Problems Identified and Recommendations

1. Management Training

a. Problem: As stated in previous Reports, the lack of any coherent federal plan for the GOP training institutions, a national policy for them to follow, or even a set of requirements for the mandatory training given government officers, results in duplication, and an overwhelming lack of connection between management training and national development plans.

Recommendation: AID and AED should try again to support the Establishment Division, Training Wing, in finding a way to identify management needs and match training to those needs.

b. <u>Problem:</u> lack of professional staff in GOP training institutions remains a critical problem since appropriate full time counterparts are often not available to work with consultants.

Recommendation: The institutions should be urged by all concerned to recruit professional staff since DSTP funds are not available for consultant help unless appropriate full time staff assigned to each program as counterpart.

2. English as a Second Language

a. <u>Problem:</u> Fragmentation of efforts and effectiveness increases with the growth of activity when one person tries to cover teaching training, testing, course development, program coordination and administration in widely separated parts of Pakistan.

Recommendation: Add to permanent staff a full time professional FSL Program Coordinator position who would be site coordinator of the Center for Intensive English Language Study (CEIIS) as well as assist the ESL Specialist in testing, teacher training, and curriculum development as time permits.

3. Participant Training

a. Problem: The cumbersome approval process within the GOP results in very few days lead time before a participant should depart for a selected course. This often results in cancellation of the placement, elimination of orientation, confusion on the part of the participant, and diminishes the effectiveness of the course itself.

Recommendation: AID enforce a strict policy of not accepting GOP nominations without a reasonable mutually agreed upon lead time to allow effective placement and orientation.

II. PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS

A. Management Training

The six-month period reported on below began with a staff review of overall management training efforts, review of support to management training institutes and a redefinition of goals to place greater emphasis on the desire to leave an enhanced capability in the Pakistan training institutions at the conclusion of the project. The management training goal was restated as follows:

Institutionalization, capable of continuing beyond the end of the DST Project, of high quality professional managerial training that meets Pakistan's development goals.

Specific objectives for achieving the goal have included placing a greater emphasis on institution building, expanded effort on materials development, net-working among trainers and the training institutes, and the development of the training function in the private sector.

1. Institutional Development

Arthur D. Little and AED consultants worked with the Pakistan Institute of Management, National Institute of Public Administration, Karachi and Pakistan Audit Department to develop 3-5 years strategic plans for presentation to their respective boards.

An ADL consultant worked with the director and staff of PIM to integrate PIM's Growth Plan, Market Need Survey, previously conducted and to draw an implementation plan with financial projections to support PIM as a leader in responding to Pakistan's corporate training requirement. The plan was presented to the Board of Governors and approved for action.

An AED consultant worked with the director and senior staff of National Institute of Public Administration, Karachi, to help facilitate the development of its strategic plan. The objective of the exercise was to help NIPA look towards its future objectively and work against set priorities for the achievement of its targets in helping support the country's overall development effort. This Plan may also serve as a model for other public sector institutes such as new NIPAs at Quetta and Peshawar. The draft plan is under review and is expected to be presented to the NIPA Board at its next meeting.

An ADL consultant worked with the management of Pakistan Audit Department to write a plan for the development of the Department's training function as part of 5-years growth plan. The objective of the Training Plan is to develop policy to guide training development in PAD and to implement specific programs to initiate and develop the new training support centre. The draft of the plan has been submitted for review. However, some of the plan recommendations are already being implemented.

Benefits:

The development of these strategic plans and their implementation will serve the following major purposes:

- o Introduce the concept and the process of strategic thinking and objective setting in Public Training Institutions in the country;
- Identify and gain agreement on specific institutional goals which management, governance, ministries, doners and staff of the institutes can collaboratively achieve;
- Allow specific proposals for DSTP support in areas where the impact on institutional development will be to the greatest advantage of the institutes.

2. Course Development

AED collaborated with the following training institutes in the development of new programs or supported the repetition of programs already developed in order to build internal capability to replicate them:

Pakistan Institute of Management, Karachi,

Two-week Financial Management program was designed, developed and delivered by an ADL consultant as part of the annual Advance Management Program. The program was well received and will be repeated in the next plan period for transfer of capability to PIM's staff.

Chief Executive Officers Conference, a one week program in corporate planning was delivered a second time to executives in Karachi. Its third and final iteration will be in the next plan period to complete the transfer to PIM staff.

National Institute of Public Administration, Karachi,

A two-week module on Executive Management skills and a one-week module on communications were delivered as part of NIPA's Advance Management Program, each for the first time. "Essentials of Management", a two week program for middle level managers, was delivered a second time to participants.

National Institute of Public Administration, Lahore,

A two week module on Management Information Systems as part of Advance Management Program was delivered a second time. A special Training of Trainers to meet the requirements of Pakistan Audit Department was specifically designed and delivered by NIPA staff with the assistance of an AED consultant.

Benefits:

These collaborative programs are designed to:

- upgrade the methodology of design and delivery of training relevant to Pakistani managers in private and public sector;
- course training capability is transferred to the participating institute staff by involving them with the consultants in all stages of program development and delivery over three repeated efforts.

3. Staff Development

Two of the NIPA Lahore staff and two of the PIM staff participated in various short term programs at ADL and Experiment in International Living at Brattleboro in USA. Three instructors from Pakistan Audit Department training institute were sent for eight weeks training in the Instructional Systems Design in USA.

A one week workshop was held in Karachi in collaboration with Pakistan Society for Advancement of Training. The workshop was designed for participants from public sector institutes and private sector nominees to work on the development of training materials. The effort was well received and some follow-up activities will be done in the next plan period.

Two other proposals for staff development at the public training irstitutes (action research and action consultancy) previously submitted to the Pakistan Administrative Staff College, were followed-up a number of times but no decision was made.

Benefits:

Staff development and materials development are among the top priority needs identified by all the institutes. Activities in these areas not only serve to develop and stimulate the professional skills of persons with training responsibility in the various institutions, they enhance morale and a feeling of participation in a live, ongoing activity.

4. Other Activities

- a. Equipment and Materials. Four institutes received training and other specialized books against orders placed in the second plan period. PIM, NIPA/Lahore also received basic equipment, such as photocopiers, overhead projectors, etc.
- b. Private Sector. Two AFD consultants worked with the Executive Development Centre, Jaffer Brothers, to assess training needs in private sector organizations for a three week Training of Trainers program to be delivered in February, 1986. The program will focus on operational as well as policy level managers to develop the trainers and the training function.

Exploratory meetings were held with the Habib Group to develop a schedule for their senior personnel officer to visit in-house training organizations in USA. This visit will provide a study of different models and help in the establishment of another private sector training organization in Pakistan.

C. AED Management Staff Development. Rahat Saghir,
Manager, Training Programs attended an 8-week course
in Human Resource Management at Arthur D. Little
Company in Boston. During his stay in USA he also
spent time in visiting various training
organizations including NTL, Coverdale, Training
Resource Group, Experiment in International Living
and spent time in AED Washington D.C. He also
conferred with a number of trainers on the east
coast.

4D:

B. English as a Decond Language

1. Intensive English for Academic Purposes (IEAP)

Curriculum development. The three basic IEAP course components of listening, structure and reading were expanded to include speaking, writing and study skills. Though these last three skills are not directly tested by the TOEFL test, they are critically important to academic success at an American university. The more comprehensive curriculum is in keeping with the ESL Specialist's efforts to wean both students and teachers away from a crash TOEFL course approach to language learning.

Student performance objectives were developed in each skill area to provide a framework for the teachers weekly lesson plans. A number of non-consumable classroom texts has been added to the core texts in order to support the expanded curriculum.

Teacher Orientation. Eleven teachers (eight new to the program) have been training in the use of the revised IEAP curriculum, and nine have taught or are teaching an IEAP class. The three who have completed from 100 to 240 hours of instruction have proved to be capable ESL instructors and expect to continue with the program.

The Center for Intensive English Language Study (CIEIS) in Islamabad. Preparations for the new Islamabad Center expected to open on January 12, 1986 for 45-50 participants, were carried out in November/December. The establishment of the Center is a major achievement for the ESL Program in that it will provide year-round quality intensive English courses for USAID participant training candidates on a work release basis.

IEAP Classes. Two classes for the TIPAN project of the NWFP Agricultural University of Peshawar began in late October. 17 candidates in the Agricultural Research Institute class were released from their jobs to study English 6 hours per day. After 200 hours of instruction their average TOEFL gain was 27 points, with half of the class gaining 40 or more points. The Agricultural University group has received approximately 100 hours of instruction from 2:30 - 5:30 after a regular work day. Their average TOEFL gain is 21 points with half of the class gaining 30 or more points. The average expected class gain per 100 hours of instruction is 25 points. Both classes are doing well by that indication.

- 2. Testing. Nine open candidate TOEFL tests were administered to a total of 331 GOP candidates in six locations during this four month period. A number of candidates were identified for English training through these tests. Of the 331 candidates tested, only 18% achieved the 530 minimum score for entrance into graduage school and 13% achieved over 550. Almost half scored below 470. The results of the individual tests are summarized in Appendix E.
- 3. Consulting Services/Institution Building At the request of the AED Management Training staff, the ESL Specialist spent two days at the Pakistan Audit Department in Lahore developing recommendations for improving the English proficiency of PAD Training Institute trainers.

The ESL Specialist assisted Iffat Farah of the University Grants Commission in developing a short term intensive English for Academic Purposes course for 150 GOP nominees bound for the U.S. for higher degree training in science and technology.

Work with the PACCs in Peshawar and Quetta was limited to paying a courtesy call to both directors, observing some PACC classes and trying to ascertain what degree and type of support of the PACCs by AED would be feasible.

C. Participent Training

1. Overview

a. Statistical Summary

During July-December 1985, 177 participant nominations were received and processed, bringing the total number to 607 for the project to date. Of the new nominations received, 125 were for short-term technical programs and 52 were for long-term academic programs.

b. Staffing

Program Specialists visited 46 academic and technical participants on 14 campuses and visited with university personnel including instructors, admissions officers, and international student advisors. One of the Specialists had the opportunity to actually attend some of the short course classes at a few institutions.

c. Resource Organization

Holdings of the Resource Room have increased considerably with all information filed by institution or subject and cross-referenced on an index card system. Over 175 institutions have been queried for general information as well as specific field of study information and membership and program information has been requested from more than 255 professional associations. Short course and professional seminar brochures and announcements have been incorporated into a "Conference and Short Course Schedule" which lists information alphabetically by subject. This schedule is up-dated monthly and a copy with back-up literature is sent to Pakistan. Files for cities and states, including campus maps when available, have been set up for the benefit of participants and placement staff.

d. Orientation Handbook

The final draft of a new orientation handbook was sent from Washington to Islamabad for final editing. The book contains material useful to a Participant throughout his training period. The first section, however, is for pre-departure use. It will be the basis of in-country orientation or will be given directly to Participants by USAID Liaison officers when Participants depart from Lahore or Karachi without visiting Islamabad. Washington program officers will use the other portions of the book in their more extensive orientation. The book is designed in a loose-leaf notebook format so it may be updated easily over time.

2. Long Term Placement

Long-term placement activity has increased with 85 participants expected to be enrolled in the U.S.A. by the beginning of January 1986. A total of 6 participants graduated during the past 6 months (4 in August and 2 in December), and 23 files are still in submission status for June or August/September 1986 placement.

3. Short Term Placement

The most noticeable change in the short-term placement effort has been the greater emphasis on customized training developed by corporations such as AEP, Gilbert Commonwealth, John T. Boyd Co., Roberts and Schaefer Corp. Upon AID request, training possibilities and programs in the following fields have been researched:

Construction and Construction Engineering
Heavy Equipment Maintenance
Coal Handling for mines, transportation and storage;
Coal Cleaning Technology; Coel Analysis; Coal
Purchasing; Open Pit and Underground Mining
Environmental Engineering

Combustion Testing Utilities Operations Management and Systems Planning Utilities Finance/Customer Service Management Women in Management

Institutes and organizations offering open-enrollment programs (e.g. ITOD, HID, IPS, IMI, ADL) continue to be used on a regular basis.

4. Third-Country Placement

There were 26 third country participants nominated during this 6-month period. Mr. Bing H. Chin of the Regional Computer Center at AIT Bangkok visited Washington, D.C. in October and met with Lynne Guerette, Senior Program Specialist, to discuss the PPTP program in general and specific participant related issues. He shared some ideas on other training facilities in Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, and Korea that may be viable third country training options for this project. Danilo Lunaria of AED Washington AIM and IRRI in Manila this December where he met with participants and institution staff.

5. Coordination Visit

The Program Manager from Washington, D.C., Bonnie Barhyte, visited Pakistan during November. She worked with the AED program staff and met with AID officials, GOP officials, returned participants and future participants in Islamabad, Lahore, and Peshawar.

III. CONSTRAINTS, PROBLEMS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Constraints

1. Management. Training

a. Institutional Development

Even though we have the benefit of time and experience as we move from one to another work plan, certain constraints which are the outcomes of unresolved issues, hamper efforts. Some of these issues deal directly with lack of a coherent national training policy which can serve as a guiding factor in determining the project priorities. Other more specific constraints can be attributed to structural issues around which the national training Centres were organized a couple of decades ago. In many ways this structure may be ineffective in meeting the demands posed by the requirements of the goals set for national development.

b. Management Development Programs

All planned programs were delivered with the exception of those that are pending decision with PASC and relate to staff development. The Materials Development Workshop, a program also directed towards staff development and net-working among the trainers, was in addition to the planned programs.

c. Corporate sector

All planned programs were delivered.

d. Training Development

All planned programs delivered.

2. English As a Second Language

a. Interruption in Technical Assistance

Not insurmountable but nonetheless a constraint was the interruption of training efforts. The former ESL consultant was replaced at the end of his 18 month contract. The new ESL consultant arrived almost 3 months later and required a period of time to evaluate the status of the various program activities and develop a work plan for the four remaining months of the six month period. The AID project manager was on home leave for three months during this same period so much of the momentum of initiatives undertaken by USAID with the GOP had subsided. In spite of these constraints, the volume of TOEFL testing was maintained at a high level, and considerable IEAP activity was generated.

b. Goals and Directions

In the absence of clearly defined goals and directions and without a work plan determining which initiatives of previous work plans to pick up and endeavor to carry on has been a process of guesswork. The process of clarifying short and long term program goals is well begun, but needs to he carried on and refined as opportunities for new initiatives arise.

3. Participant Training

The major and continuing constraint to the effectiveness of this program is the lack of recognition that a reasonable amount of time should be allowed to place a Participant in a university, for the Participant to put his affairs in order before he departs for training, and for the Islamabad and Washington offices to orient the Participant to his new life. The slowness of the nomination process in the Government of Pakistan is usually blamed for the lack of lead time. However, even if the GOP process does consume more time than it might, there is still the question of whether or not it is best to rush the Participant or postpone the schedule until he and the various offices have enough time to handle his placement and orientation in an effective manner. Since the GOP systems seems unlikely to change, it might be better to simply accept that condition and build in the time needed even though the entire training process will be slowed.

B. Problems and Recommendation

1. Management Training

a. Problems

(1) As noted in the Constraints section, the lack of national guidelines or goals and objectives for the government's training institutions remain a constant and most important problem. Equal in its impact on the effectiveness of DSTP technical assistance is the lack of adequate numbers of permanent professional faculty at the government training institutes. If these two conditions persist DSTP will be forced to choose between two alternatives. One is to emphasize individual modules or stand alone short courses which, although helpful in the short run, neither meet the long term development needs of the country nor provide for a collaborative effort on the part of the various government institutes. The second alternative is to place greater emphasis on assistance to training institutes in the "nation building" agencies as well as the private sector with a corresponding lessening ing of aid to the present group of institutes.

b. Recommendations

(1) To USAID

Solutions to the two problems above have remained elusive to both USAID and its contractor. Since the end of this six-month period marks the close of the project's second year, it is a reasonable time to review with GOP and ask again for a collaborative exploration of possible solutions to these problems. It is AID's role to take the lead in this redoubled effort with GOP, and NED urges them to do so.

(2) To Establishment Division

After two years of close relations with the GOP training institutions, it is the contractors' conclusion that though they defend their status as autonomous institutions, they would welcome guidelines from the federal government—especially concerning goals for the Advanced Management Course which the government has made mandatory for its officials. Without such direction, not only do the institutions operate by instinct instead of data, they tend to duplicate each other's efforts and lack an incentive for cooperative, collaborative efforts.

The Establishment Division is the logical GOP entity to help the institutions by giving them goals for their courses, and criteria by which performance may be evaluated. The Establishment Division should begin a major effort to enhance the training of its officials by assuring that the institutes plan training toward established goals with final results objectively evaluated. A first step in this overall effort should be insisting the institutions recruit and hire qualified professional staff.

To the Contractor

Increase efforts to find new ways and more productive channels to involve the federal GOP, USAID and the training institutes in collaborative efforts, networking, and shared resources and responsibility for Pakistan's development.

2. English As a Second Language

a. Problem

(1) Effectiveness of Specialist's Efforts

One person covering teacher training, testing, course development, program coordination and administration in widely separated parts of Pakistan produces logistics problems and fragmentation of efforts that no amount of planning and energy can overcome.

b. Recommendations

(1) To USAID

Add a full time, permanent professional ESL Program Coordinator position to the staff. The assistant would be the onsite coordinator of the Center for Intensive English Language Study in Islamabad in addition to assisting the ESL specialist in such varied activities as testing, teacher training, and curriculum development, as time permits.

Continue the process of clarifying long term ESL Program goals. Immediate goals and priorities in the following order have been clarified during the past month. As the contractor understands them, they are:

- To provide intensive EAP training to selected government officials who are nominated for higher education in the U.S.
- To administer Institutional TOEFL tests to selected government officials.

(2) To the Contractor

Continue to assist USAID in the analysis of future ESL needs and definition of long term goals.

In view of the fact that only 18% of the 331 GOP candidates tested by the Institutional TOEFL (in Quetta, Peshawar, Lahore, Byderabad and Islamabad 10/85 - 12/86) achieved the 530 minimum score entrance to graduate school, and that almost half of those tested have scores below 470, obtain expert consultant assistance to design longer ESL program to serve high priority candidates with low English proficiency.

3. Participant Training

a. Problems

- (1) Many Participants still arrive in the U.S. without formal briefing about such things as allowance rates, services available in the U.S., housing arrangements, and most of all their change of status to that of students. This leads to misconceptions and unrealistic expectations. The lack of lead time, Participants departing from other places than Islamabad, continue to cause this problem.
- (2) The sparse information available to PPTP, Washington, concerning Third Country Participants makes it difficult to maintain a file and monitor progress. Overseas telephone calls, telexes, and letter do not always produce the information needed nor have they always been effective in clarifying details to Participants.

- (3) Misinformation and misunderstanding concerning TCEFL, GRE and GMAT requirements continues to slow down the placement process. The few schools that do not require these tests are exceptions to the rule but the fact they exist confuses the Participants and makes it difficult to convince them they really are necessary.
- (4) The increase during the past semester in "tailor-made" short term programs emphasizes the need for specific, detailed training objectives and work statements. If these are not received it is most difficult to work with well meaning but largely inexperienced firms which are able to offer the highly technical training often requested.

b. Recommendations

(1) To USAID

Utilizing the Document Check List prepared for HRT, AID should increase emphasis on the necessity of TOEFL, GRE or GMAT, for all long term participants.

Efforts should continue to persuade all levels of government involved in the nomination process that the effectiveness of the training depends on having time to make intelligent choices.

(2) To GOP

To make the best placement, specific training objectives should continue to be stressed to GOP offices responsible for collecting nomination papers for Participants.

(3) To Contractor

Additional efforts should be made to increase communications between the Washington office and Third Country institutions. The monitoring system should be improved and appropriate research into new programs undertaken. If possible, onsite visits to Third Country institutions should be scheduled on a regular basis.

The new Orientation Handbook should be used as a tool to coordinate orientation in Pakistan and Washington.

SUMMARY OF ANSWERS

Questionaire to Returned Participants, 1985

The attached questionaire is sent by the Islamabad Participant Training Office to each participant six months after his return to Pakistan. The purpose of the questionaire is to elicit information about the training experience after the participant has returned to his regular work.

The number of participants who returned a completed questionaire is somewhat below expectations. Forty completed forms were returned from 103 sent during the latter half of 1985. To try to stimulate returns in the future the AED Participant Training office plans a reminder mailing if a completed questionaire is not received within a month?

In general, those who returned the questionaire were positive about their experience. Many answered questions 4 and 5, which asked for descriptive comment, in detail. Copies of those answers are on file in the Islamabad office if readers wish to have a greater grasp the participants' comments. The tabulation of forty completed questionaires is as follows:

- Answer 2) The following aspects of Malaria Control Program
 Thailand were appreciated and the efforts will
 also be made to implement them in Pakistan.
 - recentralization of Laboratory Services for the examination of blood smears for malaria parasites.
 - ii) Well-established Voluntary Collaborator system at village level for screening the malaria cases among the population.
 - iii) Methods of handling the problem of P.falciparum resistance to Chloroquine/Fensidar.
 - iv) Integrated vecto- control methods.
- Answer 3) The idea about women participation in Farming is not very common and appreciable in Pakistan and those women who belong to the higher status are not involved in Farming and they don't study in the agricultural or vaterinary science in the agricultural universities due to segregation of sexes and old tradition and customs.

After attending the program my idea about women in agriculture is changed and I think women do play a significant role in farming and they should participate in agriculture in a country like Pakistan.

The time was not enough to learn skills and technologies but the skill and technologies which the women of China, Thailand, Phillipine, India and Sri Lanka were using, shows that they are much advance in science and technology and are even using heavy machinery and tractors. The main objective of the workshop was to reduce the drugery and hardship of the women in agriculture and introduce time and energy saving devices.

Answer (4) gained knowledge of general management principals and its application.

Identify problems of primary health care administration and their solution

- Identify the impelling forces and their best use in promoting PHC.
- Planning and implementation of appropriate programmes.
- Identify means or best ways for utilization of health's financial resources.
- Sharing ideas and gaining insight into health management of the countries of other participants of the course i.e. Egypt, Sudan, Ghana, Guetemala, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, China with Pakistan and of course that of U.S.A.
- Make best use of limited available sources, improve the quality of management, administration and health services.
- Learnt skills in management of health services in force of constraints

Answer 5) I learnt that human factor plays a very important role in the productivity of the organization. Therefore, the supervisor must inculcate in the employees the sense of belongingness to the organization. Besides, I learnt new techniques of problem solving, decision making, interviewing and also how to generate ideas by train storming

Question por What things Technical/Social/Cultural)

- Answer 1) Apart from the tramendous technological advances made by America (with its de-humanisation effects) the most impressive thing for me was the system of instruction and education. Unlike in Pakistan there was no straightforward lecturing but participative discussion throughout the course. I had the impression that the lecturers too generally wanted to learn from our varied background. There was nothing completely right or completely wrong in whatever one said in the class. Since truth is usually somewhere in the middle the effort to understand and appreciate everybody's viewpoint even though on the surface it may appear to be absurd, was the most remarkable thing I noticed about the educational system there. Socially and culturally I found the Americans open-minded with very little racial discrimination and extremely enterprising. There was of course intense pride in whatever they were doing which sometimes bordered arrogance.
 - The malaria control workers in Thailand were found to be dedicated worker and technically sound. The public were found to be quite health oriented. Education among population has been found to be common and high.
 - 3) The technical advancement in the field of agriculture especially, women of different countries mostly impressed me. Women in Pakistan mainly perform agricultural activities by hand which consume most of their time and energy.

The Thai people are very social and hospitable and the time I spend there I never felt homesick and they are helpful and always welcome the foreigners.

Their cultural heritage is very rich and colourful. Most of them are Budhist but other communities are also residing there. Many Budhist temples and shrines are situated there and one can see the old historical, cultural background of the Thai people.

The commodities are so cheap that one can't resist to buy. Their dresses and shoes making industries are very famous and cheap.




