PROJECT AUTHORIZATION AMENDMENT NO. 4

Name of Country: Worldwide
Project Title: Tropical Disease Research (TDR)
Project Number: 931-1126

1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended, the centrally-funded project, Tropical Disease Research, was authorized on June 9, 1978. That authorization was amended November 9, 1982, to extend the life of project from five to six years and the final obligation date from FY 1982 to FY 1983. On November 1, 1983, the authorization was amended to extend the life of project to seven years and the final obligation was amended to 1984. On July 31, 1985, the authorization was amended to extend the project from seven to eight years and the final obligation date to FY 1985, and to raise the life of project cost to \$22,300,000. That authorization is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) Increase the amount authorized for the project by \$10,000,000, from \$22,300,000 to \$32,300,000, in grant funds over a five-year period from the date of this amendment subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process.
- (b) Extend the life of project from eight to thirteen years.

2. The authorization cited above remains in force except as hereby amended.

SUBJECT: Tropical Disease Research Program (WHO/TDR) 931-1126

Problem: Your approval is required to extend the life of project and increase the life of project funding for the World Health Organization's (WHO/UNDP/WB) Special Programme for Research and Training in Tropical Diseases (TDR).

Discussion: The WHO/TDR program is a multi-donor effort to find better, more economical methods for the treatment and/or control of seven major tropical diseases, namely onchocerciasis, schistosomiasis, malaria, Chagas' disease, trypanosomiasis, leprosy and leishmaniasis.

The TDR program has been very successful and is still an important part of WHO's overall research program which is consistent with A.I.D.'s long term objective to strengthen primary health care activities in LDCs through biomedical research. TDR has created a global network of scientific research institutions in both developed and developing countries. TDR has supported more than 1,180 sub-projects with over 2,000 scientists in 110 countries since 1978.

Recent major breakthroughs in biomedical research methodologies have given the world community new tools to fight the major tropical diseases. Significant achievements of the TDR program include: the discovery that the Chinese malaria herb remedy Qinhaosu contains a chemically active anti-malarial compound of high efficacy which is completely different from all the other known anti-malarials; the discovery of new sensitive field testing techniques and new effective tsetse fly traps to study sleeping sickness; the build up of an international network of laboratories to study filariasis; the discovery of new agents for biological vector controls; the successful field testing and use of new, effective and safe drugs applicable to mass treatment of schistosomiasis; and progress toward development of a new vaccine to treat leprosy.

Other donors to the TDR program include the African Development Bank, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Belgium, Canada, China, Cuba, Cyprus, Denmark, Finland, France, West Germany, India, the International Federation of Antileprosy Associations, Iraq, the Japan Shipbuilding Industry Foundation, the Netherlands, Niger, Norway, Romania, Sweden, Switzerland, the U.K., Cameroon, Wellcome Trust, the UNDP, the World Bank, and WHO. The total TDR budget for 1985-86 is approximately \$66 million.

Last year, I represented the U.S. in an effort to convince the TDR Joint Coordinating Board to permit donors to earmark a portion of their contributions for specific high-priority research. Formal TDR agreement on earmarking¹⁸ expected to be ratified at the JCB meeting in June 1986. We intend to take advantage of the increased flexibility we have won in the use of our contribution to accelerate TDR-sponsored research on the immunology, chemotherapy and field control of the major tropical diseases.

We are requesting a five-year extension of the final obligation date from FY 1985 to FY 1990, with a Life of Project funding increase of \$10.0 million. LOP will then be 13 years.

A Congressional Notification for the project is being processed.

Recommendation: That you approve the extension of the final obligation date and the increase in the life of project funding for the TDR program by signing the amended project authorization attached.
