In accordance with the provisions of Title II, P.L. 480, as amended, Section 1-201 of Executive order 12220 and International Development Cooperation Agency Delegation No. 5 effective June 27, 1980, the Commodity Credit Corporation is hereby authorized to transfer and deliver agricultural commodities to the Government of Botswana in an amount estimated at \$2,321,700 pursuant to the following instructions:



6. Program Objectives: Use of Commodity and Conditions of Transfer:

A. The commodities authorized herein are contributed by the Government of the United States to the Government of Botswana for free distribution to vulnerable groups through the Government of Botswana's World Food Program supported Vulnerable Group Feeding Program in drought affected areas and recovering from the drought. As such, WFP will direct the in-country commodity transfer in lieu of the USG.

- B. The USG will supply the commodities at no cost to the Government of Botswana and the USG will pay all ocean freight and overland transport costs from the point of discharge to the designated point of entry in Botswana. The designated point of entry, for the purposes of this agreement, will be Ramatlabama.
- C. The GOB agrees to pay all costs related to storage, internal handling, distribution and transport costs after receipt of the commodity at the points of entry.
- D. The World Food Program will arrange and monitor the overland transport and handling from the port of discharge to final destination at Francistown, Lobatse, Sebelo, Selebi-Phikwe, Palapye and Mahalapye under an Agency agreement with the Agency for International Development.
- E. The Government of Botswana agrees to use the commodities for direct free distribution to eligible recipients within the GOB/WFP Vulnerable Groups Feeding Program. The provision of commodities is consistent with plans developed last year on the phasedown/phaseout of U.S. provided CSM.
- F. The Government of Botswana agrees to keep USAID fully informed concerning the status of commodity receipts and distribution and will provide USAID with regular reports regarding the same, and complete details as requested. The GOB will permit the USG to audit and have access to all records pertaining to the use of the commodities provided. The GOB further agrees to submit to USAID a quarterly report which will include the following:

- (a) Beginning Stocks
- (b) Arrivals
- (c) Distribution
- (d) Damaged Stocks
- (e) Ending Stocks

7. Amendment

The above terms may be amended upon request of the GOB, with the concurrence of USAID, and with the cabled concurrence of AID/W.

8. Loss/Damage

Irrespective of transfer to the cooperating sponsor of title to the commodities donated pursuant to this transfer authorization CCC shall have the right to initiate and prosecute, and retain the proceeds of all claims against ocean carriers for cargo loss and damage arising out of shipment of commodities transferred or delivered by CCC hereunder for which A.I.D. has contracted for ocean and inland transportation.
