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PROJECT GRANT AGREEMENT

AMENDMENT NO. 2

AMENDMENT Number 2 between the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, acting through the Agency for International Development ("A.I.D.") and the Government of Jamaica:

WHEREAS, the Government of Jamaica and A.I.D. entered into a project Grant Agreement, dated September 15, 1986 ("Agreement"), which was amended on March 20, 1987, and

WHEREAS, the Government of Jamaica and A.I.D. desire to amend the Agreement to reflect the obligation of an additional US\$500,000 in grant funds;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto hereby agree that the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

1. Section 3.1 The Grant is deleted in its entirety and replaced by the following:

"Section 3.1. The Grant. To assist the Grantee to meet the costs of carrying out the Project, A.I.D. pursuant to the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, agrees to grant to the Grantee under the terms of the Agreement an amount not to exceed Two Million United States Dollars (\$2,000,000). The Grant may be used to finance foreign exchange costs, as defined in Section 6.1, and local currency costs, as defined in Section 6.2., of goods and services required for the Project."

2. Annex 1, "Project Description," is hereby amended by the addition of a revised "Project Financial Plan," appended hereto as Attachment 1 and by the addition of an "Annex 1 Supplement," appended hereto as Attachment 2.

Except as amended herein, the Agreement dated September 15, 1986 and Amendment Number 1 dated March 20, 1987, thereto between the Government of Jamaica and A.I.D. remain in full force and effect.

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ANNEX 1 SUPPLEMENT

The following should be added to Part I following Section D. on page 3 of Annex I of the Project Agreement (Amplified Project Description):

"Laws of Jamaica"

"Funds will be provided to finance the publication of 1,000 sets each of the Laws of Jamaica and related subsidiary legislation. The Government of Jamaica will utilize 500 sets of the main laws of Jamaica and 500 sets of the subsidiary legislation enacted under the main laws for the purpose of dissemination throughout the various Resident Magistrate courts and legal offices in Jamaica. The remaining 500 sets each of the main laws and subsidiary legislation will be sold by the Government of Jamaica to various legal institutions such as private law firms, the Norman Manley Law School, the UWI Faculty of Law and private attorneys. The proceeds from the sale of these volumes will be deposited in a revolving fund administered by the Ministry of Justice and will be used to effect further regular updates of the laws as well as be replenished from further sales of laws. The Ministry of Justice will obtain approval from the Ministry of Finance for the establishment of this separate account, accessible to the Ministry of Justice for the purpose stated above, as a first step in the implementation of this activity."

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
